ABOUT THE FUTURE OF WORK TASK FORCE

The Future of Work Task Force was established by Governor Murphy via Executive Order 41 to evaluate how technological advancements will shape the future of New Jersey's economy and workforce, and produce an evidence-based policy roadmap to prepare the state for the future of work.

Specifically, the Task Force is charged with the following objectives:

- Determine which technologies will impact work in New Jersey, which industries and sectors will be affected and to what extent.
- Identify the groups of residents in New Jersey likely to be most affected by these changes and how effects will vary based on differing demographics, including gender, race, income, location, and education.
- Explore the ways in which the same innovative technologies might improve workplace conditions, create different jobs, and grow the state's economy.
- Devise innovative, impactful and cost-effective strategies for what State government, universities, private corporations, non-profits and individuals can do to prepare for these changes and ensure a prosperous and equitable future.
- Produce an evidence-based policy roadmap for New Jersey to prepare for the future of work.

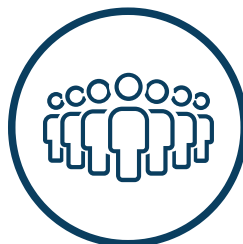
