REPORT.

STATE OF NEW JERSEY, ADJUTANT GENERAL'S OFFICE, TRENTON, November 30, 1868.

To His Excellency, Marcus L. Ward, Governor, and Commander-in-Chief:

SIR:—I have the honor to submit the following report of this Department for the year 1868:

During the past year the clerical force of the office has been constantly employed in perfecting the records of our volunteer soldiery during the war period. This work has been laborious and at times very perplexing, but the task has thus far been executed with great

care and precision, and the result is highly satisfactory.

The routine office business has, as usual, been promptly performed. Correspondence on every conceivable subject relating to the war has daily received our attention. Both War and Pension Departments still demand of us sundry data, which require our most careful research. During the year scarcely a claim in behalf of a disabled or dead soldier has been audited by the Treasury Department unless this office had been first applied to for the record, or at least for the address of the officers of the company and medical staff of the regiment. As every voucher in the office has been accurately endorsed, and is always found in its proper place, we are enabled to furnish all information with despatch.

"Certificates of record" are in constant demand by discharged volunteers of this State. These documents have been found of service for purposes of naturalization; of great value in lieu of lost discharges, and for the collection and settlement of property claims

in Europe. We have, thus far, in every case, been able to give a

complete and accurate official record.

Since the last report there have been thirteen hundred and eightyeight copies of the "Testimonial" issued in the name of the honorably discharged or deceased soldiers and sailors of the State. This makes a total of sixteen thousand and three (16,003) copies issued since the passage of the resolution by the Legislature of 1866. They are highly prized by the men themselves and by their families, and their gratitude therefor is always expressed when they acknowledge its receipt.

The persons entitled thereto are:

First.—All soldiers, officers or enlisted men, honorably discharged, who served in New Jersey volunteer organizations, or their heirs, if deceased.

Second.—Residents of New Jersey, honorably discharged from volunteer organizations of other States, United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps or Colored Troops, on forwarding their discharges. If such men are deceased, official evidence of service and death must be furnished.

Application must be made, stating name, rank, company and or-

ganization, with post office address.

The question of credits given and received by townships and wards has occupied much of our time, and demanded close investigation. A

summary of facts relating thereto will not be unimportant:

From April, 1861, to August, 1862, inclusive, all men who joined the army from this State were volunteers. In September, 1862, they were counted in gross, and were credited to the State at large, and not to sub-districts. The enrollment and draft act was passed by Congress, March 3, 1863, (amended February 24, 1864), from which time until July 16, 1864, credits were kept by name in this office. At the latter date they were transmitted to the custody of the Acting Assistant Provost Marshal General for this State, and subsequently by him sent to the Enrollment Branch of the War Department. Recruits for the navy were not credited by name prior to February 24, 1864, from which date to July 16, 1864, credits therefor were kept by name in this office. Those who had enlisted prior to February 24, 1864, were credited to sub-districts by a Haval Commission, authorized by act of Congress, approved July 4, 1864. The record of these credits and of those made subsequent to July 16, 1864, are now on file in the Naval Bureau of Equipment and Recruiting at Washington. Colored men were taken from this State in the summer of 1863, and although some localities attempted to trace them, they met with indifferent success. The State lost credit for most of them. Those who were sent to Camp William Penn, Philadelphia, in most cases obtained their credit. Those enlisting between December 31, 1863, and July 16, 1864, are credited by name on the books of this office. Credits made subsequent to this date are now in possession of

the War Department. Certificates of muster and credit can and will be obtained by us upon application. There is at this time no reason why one of the four copies of these credits and musters now in the Enrollment Branch of the War Department should not be in possession of this State.

Very few applications for State pay have been filed during the The State is still largely indebted to naval volunteers and colored troops. It appears singular that these cases have remained so long unsettled. The public, as well as the interested party, must certainly be ignorant of both the number and value of these claims.

The act of the last Legislature (Pamphlet Laws '68, p. 830, chapter 367), requiring me to ascertain the amount of money expended by the county of Burlington to men of the 10th New Jersey Volunteers and 1st New Jersey Cavalry, has been complied with, and the same certified to the Comptroller for his action.

A compend of the "Act for the relief of such portion of the militia as may be called into service," and its various supplements, judicial

opinions and official decisions may be stated thus:

I. State pay to the wife, dependent children or widowed mother of enlisted men (including drafted men and substitutes) in New Jersey volunteer organizations, is due from date of enlistment to date of discharge, death or desertion, provided they resided in this State when the soldier enlisted.

II. State pay to the wife, dependent children or widowed mother of enlisted men credited to New Jersey, who joined the United States Navy, Marine Corps or United States Colored Troops, is due from March 31, 1865, (date of passage of the act), to date of discharge, death or desertion, provided they resided in this State March 31, 1865.

III. State pay to the wife, dependent children or widowed mother of enlisted men credited to New Jersey, who reënlisted in the United States Army or volunteer organizations of other States, is due from date of reënlistment to date of discharge, death or desertion, provided they resided in this State at the time of said reënlistment.

IV. State pay to the dependent mother of enlisted men credited to New Jersey, is due from March 31, 1865, to date of discharge, death or desertion, provided she resided in this State March 31, 1865. Evi-

dence by affidavit setting forth the facts must be furnished.

In all cases the honorable discharge or certificate from commanding officer showing date of death or desertion, together with evidence that the claimants actually resided in this State at the dates specified in the foregoing paragraphs, must be forwarded to this office.

Application for State pay to single men or non-residents should be

made to the Comptroller of the State.

Considerable interest and value is still attached to the records of the war of 1812, now on file in this office. They need, however, arrangement and compilation, and should be printed as a part of the

history of the State. This could easily be done, were I so directed. It appears eminently proper that such a work should be given to the

public.

And here, may I not call upon the returned soldiers of this State to send me lists, taken from grave stones, of comrades buried in their neighborhood. I should have such a record from every township, and

I respectfully urge it upon their attention.

The roster of officers and enlisted men in the volunteer organizations of this State during the late war is completed. Much time and the most careful research has been given to this work, and I feel confident it will be found unequalled in its arrangement, and in its minute and correct details of the more than eighty thousand men of this State

who served in the army and navy of the country.

It is useless for me to indicate the inconsistenties in the present Militia Law. I attempted to point out a few of them in my last official report. I would again respectfully urge the recommendations then made, and simply add that the opinion then expressed I still entertain. The defeat of the law proposed by the officers of the active militia last session, had a disastrous effect upon all the organizations. Most keenly was it felt by those who had used so much exertion to frame a law which could be made operative. Each officer was then obliged to use every personal effort to prevent his command from disbanding. It is absolutely necessary that some concise law, which can be made efficient, be immediately passed by the Legislature.

If, as the Constitution says, "a well regulated militia is necessary to the security of a free State," certainly every effort made to have the duty well performed, should be fostered in every possible way. If the protection of property from a foreign foe, or from destruction by riot at home be ever necessary, the available force should at all

times be ready.

A fine military spirit now pervades the State. Applications for new organizations in thickly settled districts are filed almost daily. It has been found impossible, however, from the condition of the finances, to give them the encouragement to which they are entitled.

GENERAL:—I have the honor to report that no steps have been taken, during the past year, to organize the reserve militia of the State, under the law now in force.

I have received returns from the assessors of Franklin township, in Gloucester county; from Maurice River township, in Cumberland county, and from Manalapan township, in Monmouth county, of the number of white male citizens between the ages of eighteen and forty-five years, liable to military duty. No other townships of the two hundred and sixty or more existing have made returns, and therefore I am unable to furnish even an approximate of the number of citizens now in the State liable to perform said duty.
