

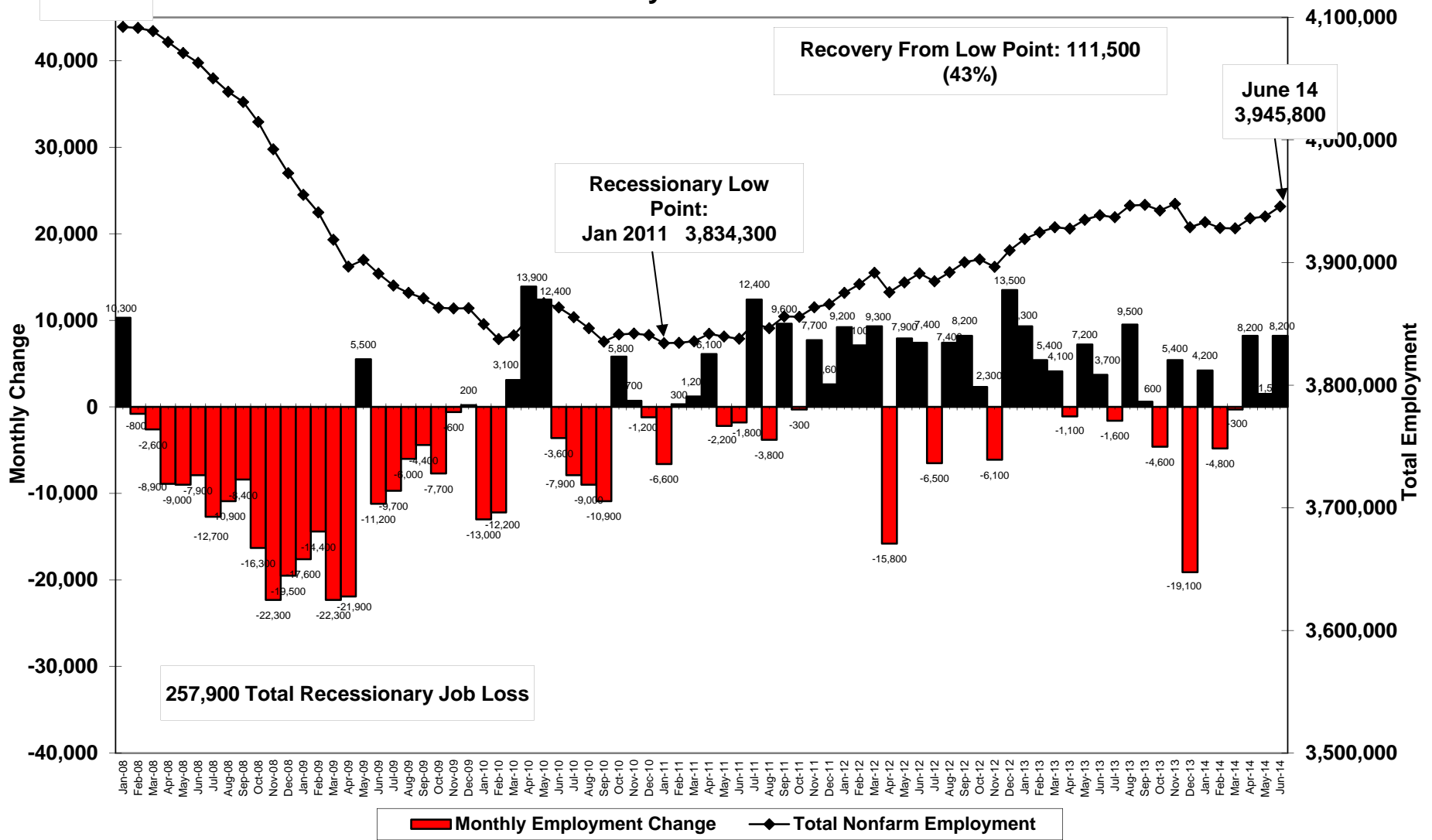

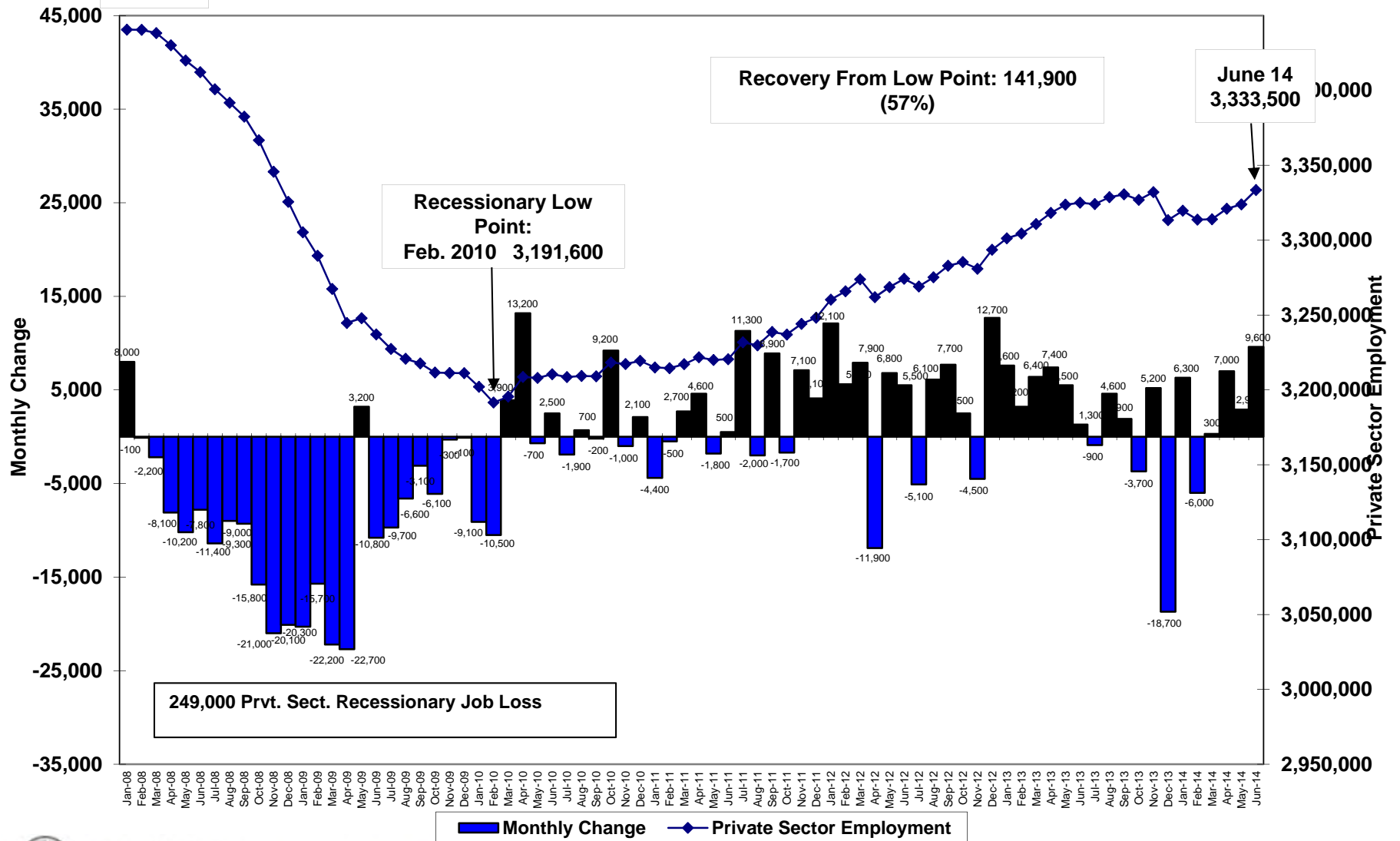

## New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - June 2014



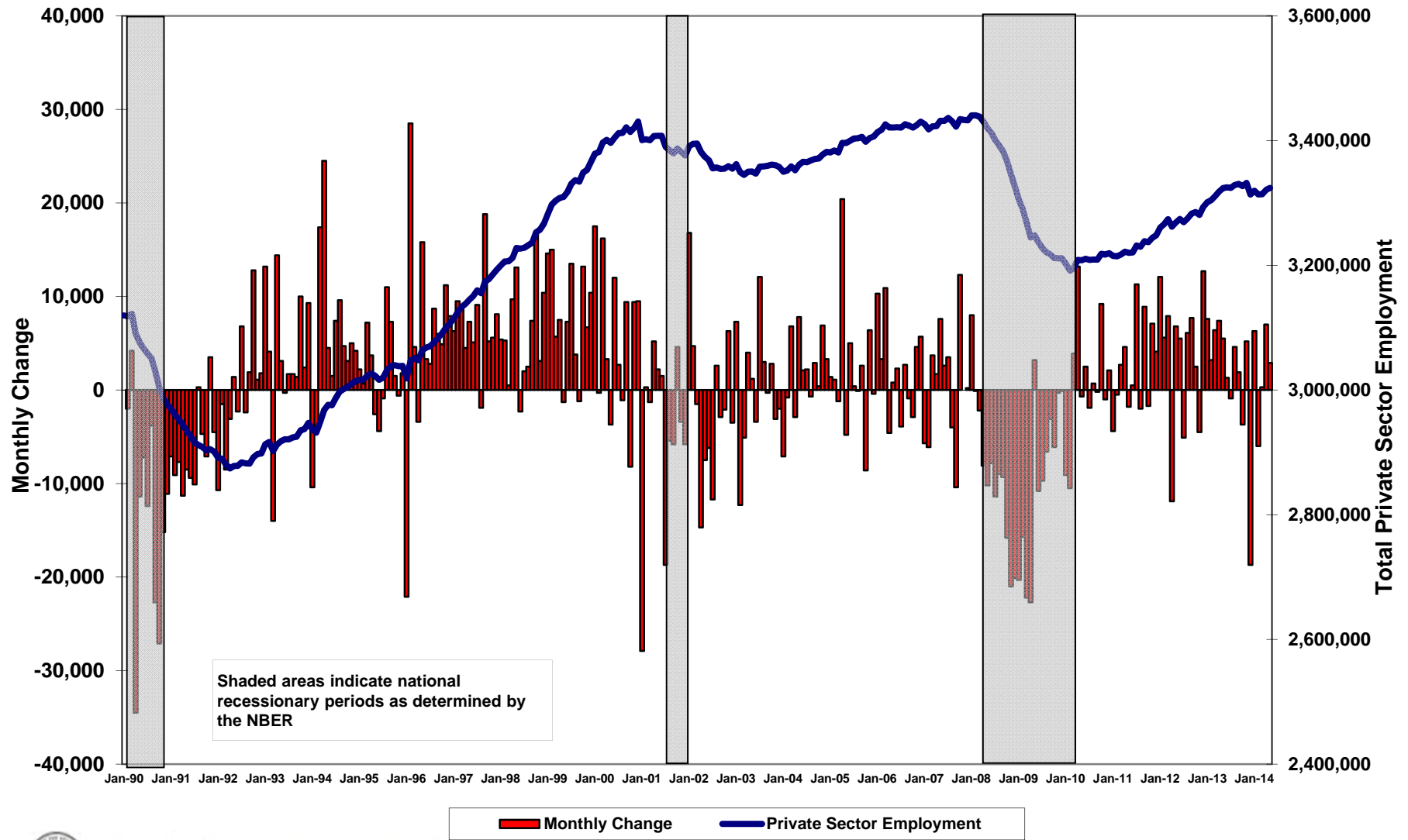
## New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - June 2014



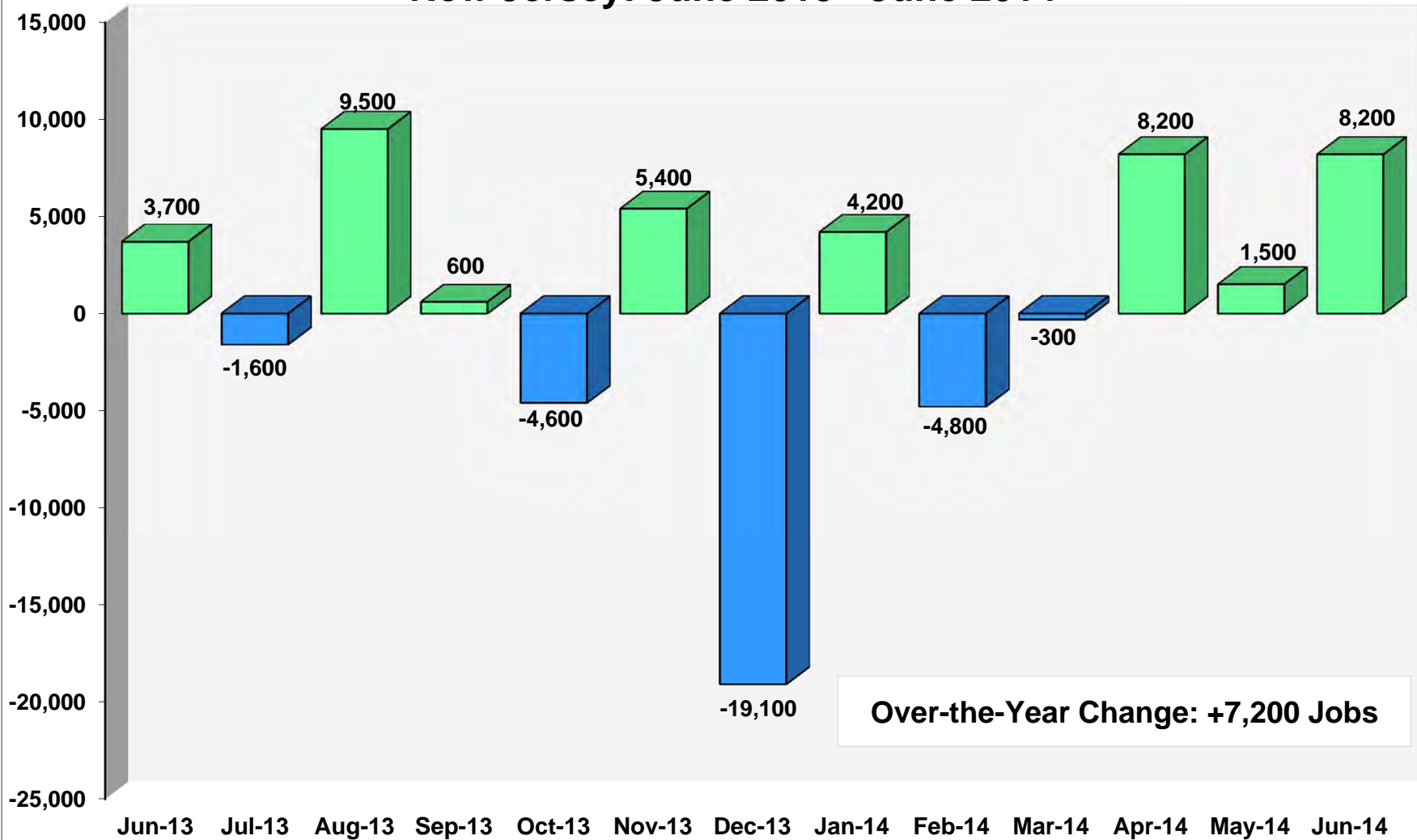

## New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 1990 - May 2014



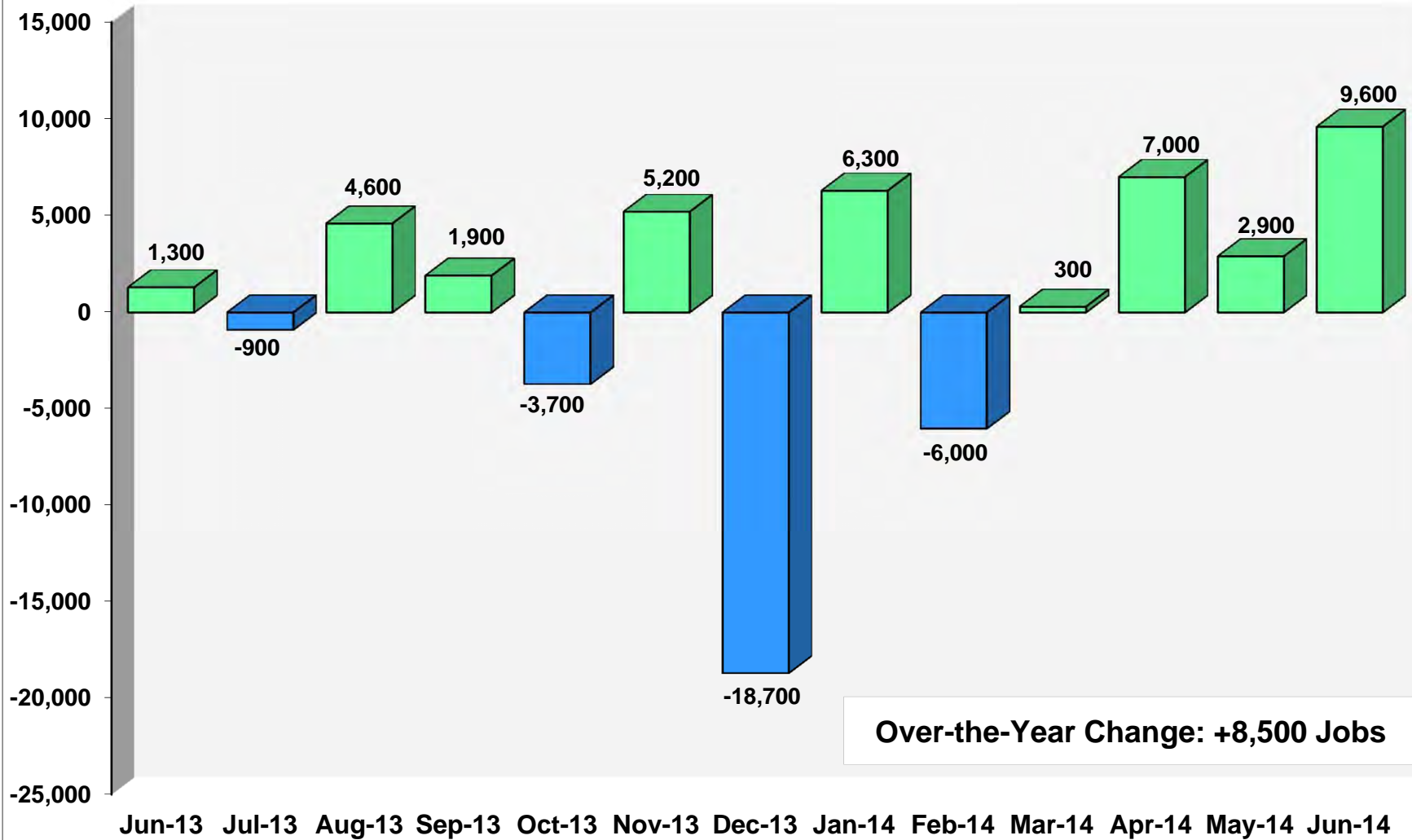
## Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: June 2013 - June 2014

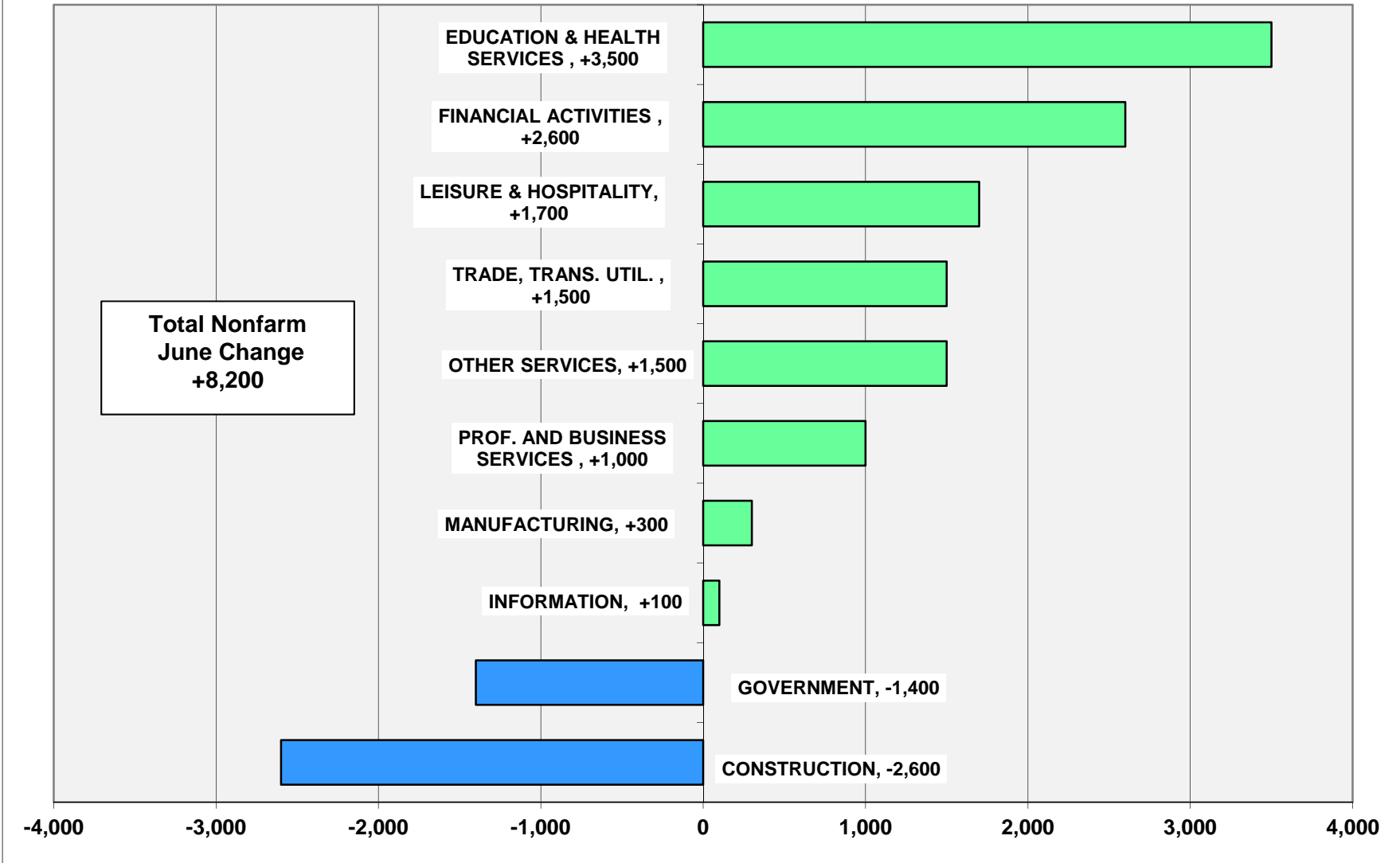
## Monthly Private Sector Employment Change June 2013 - June 2014

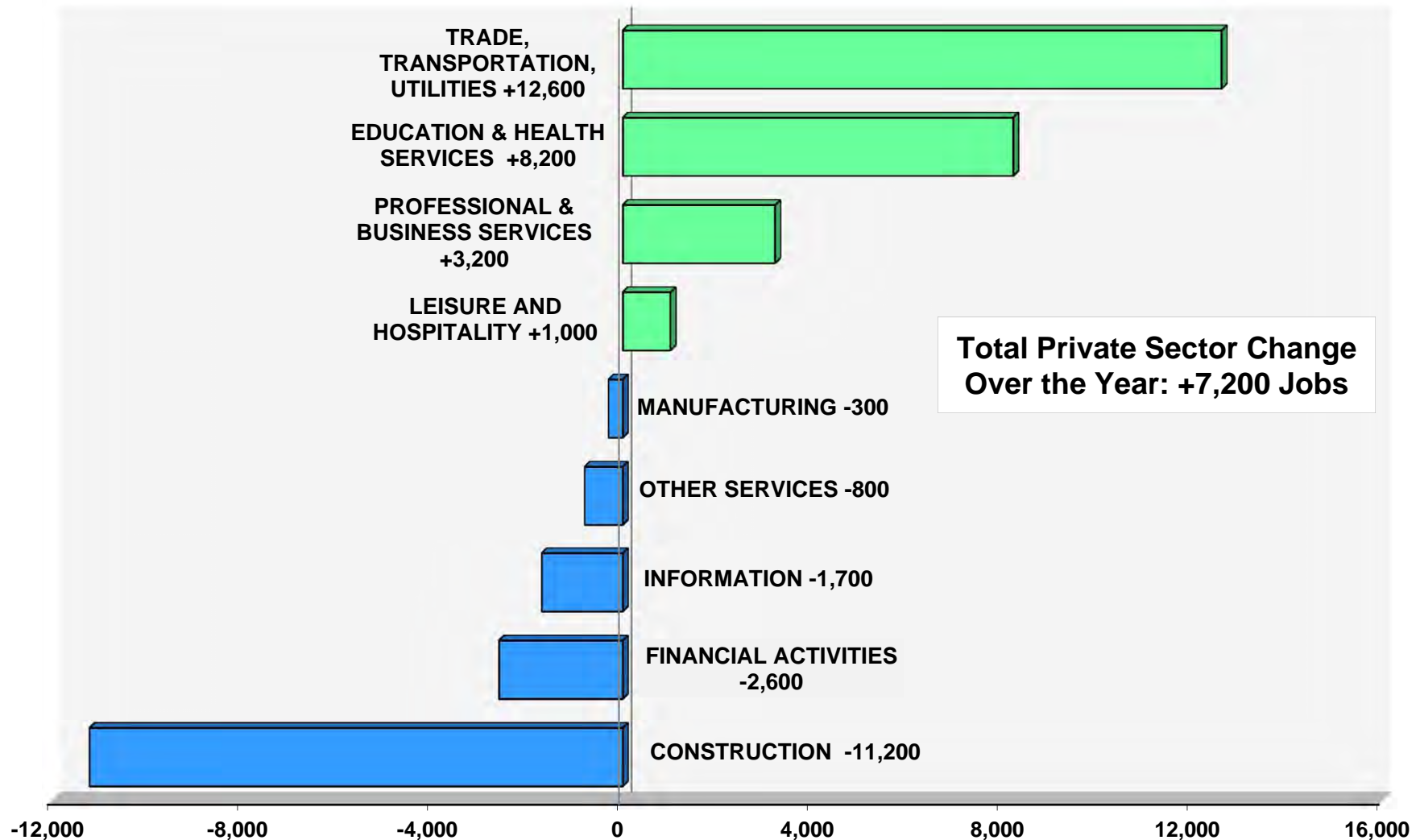
## Monthly Employment Change: June 2014

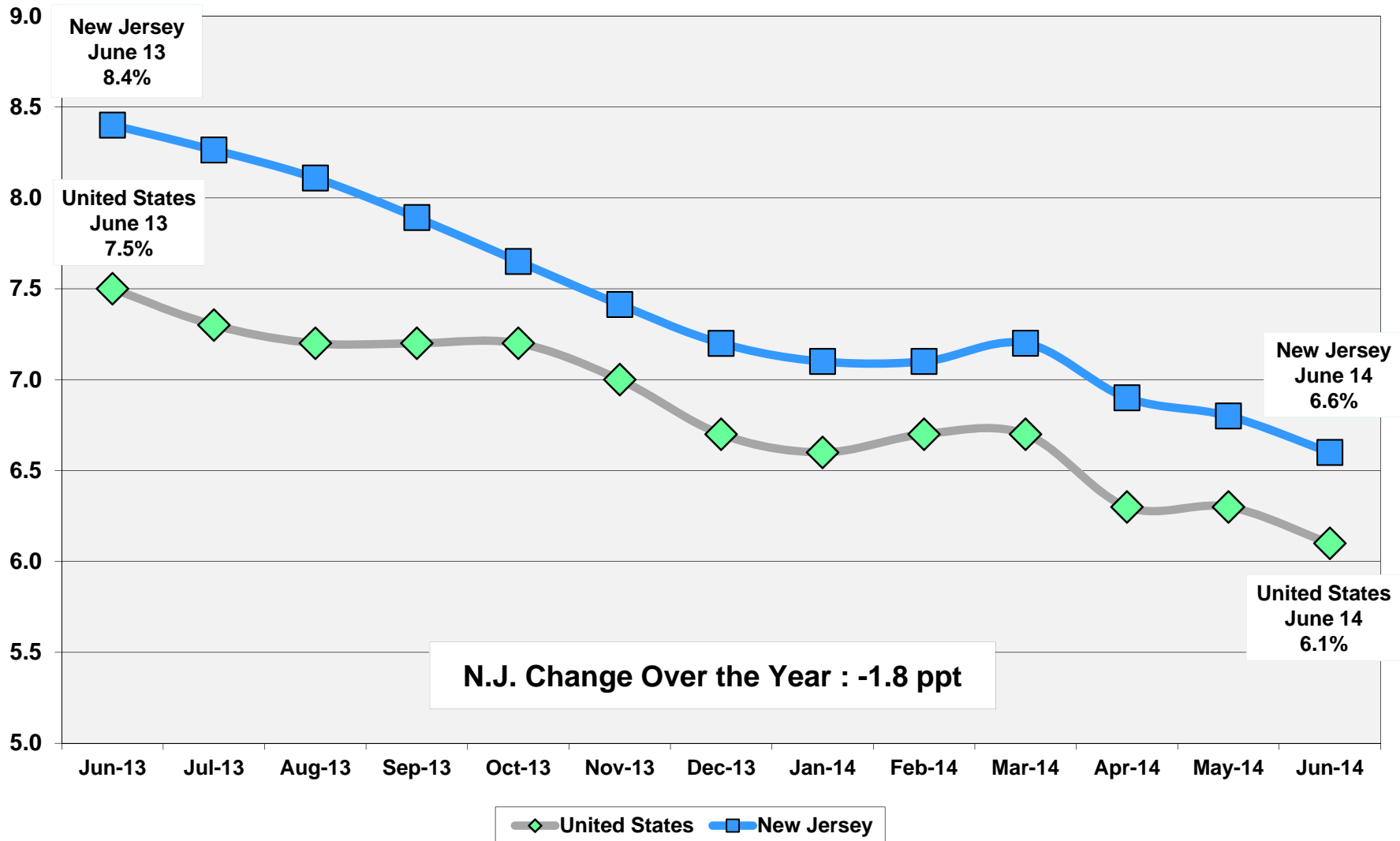
## New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry June 2013 - June 2014



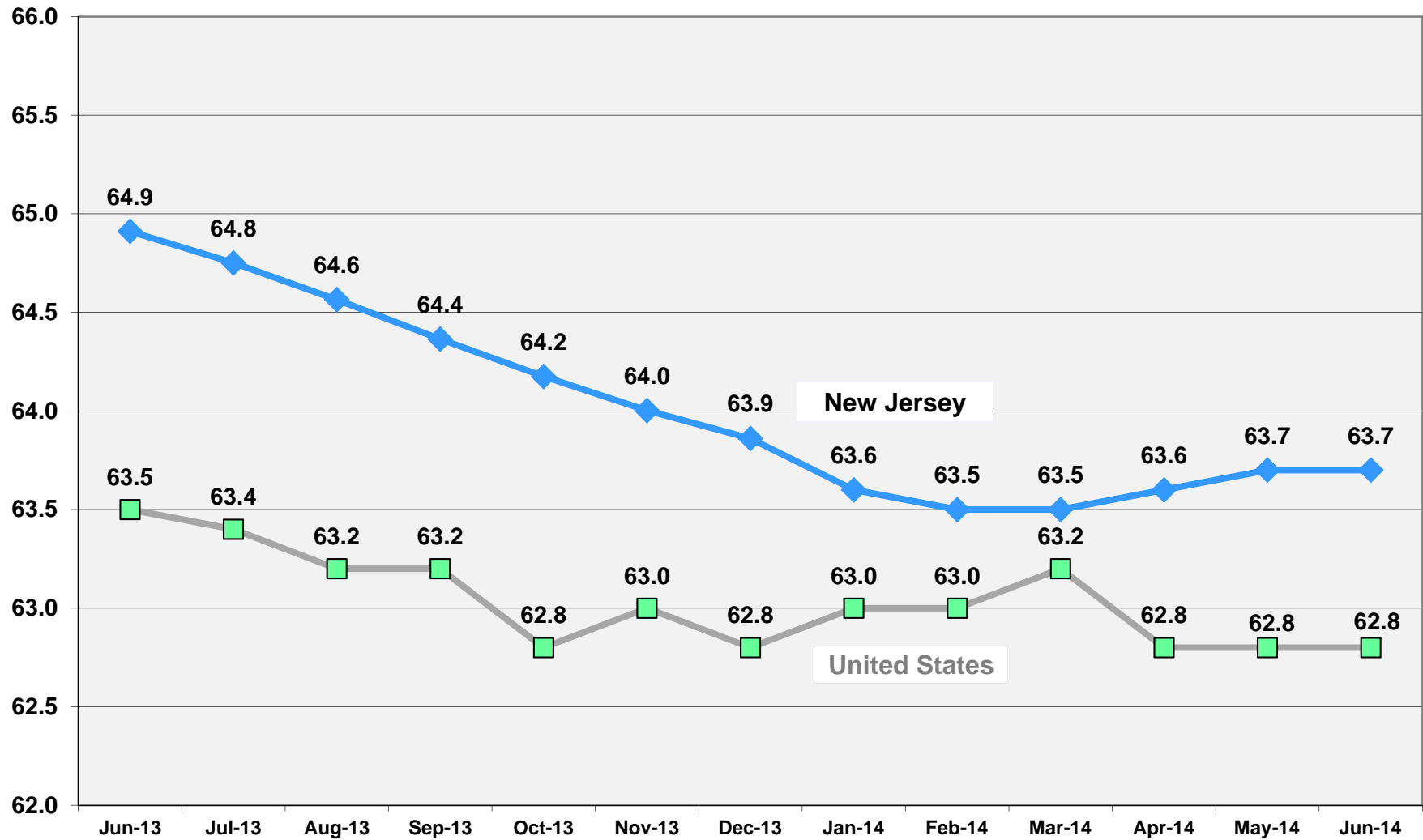

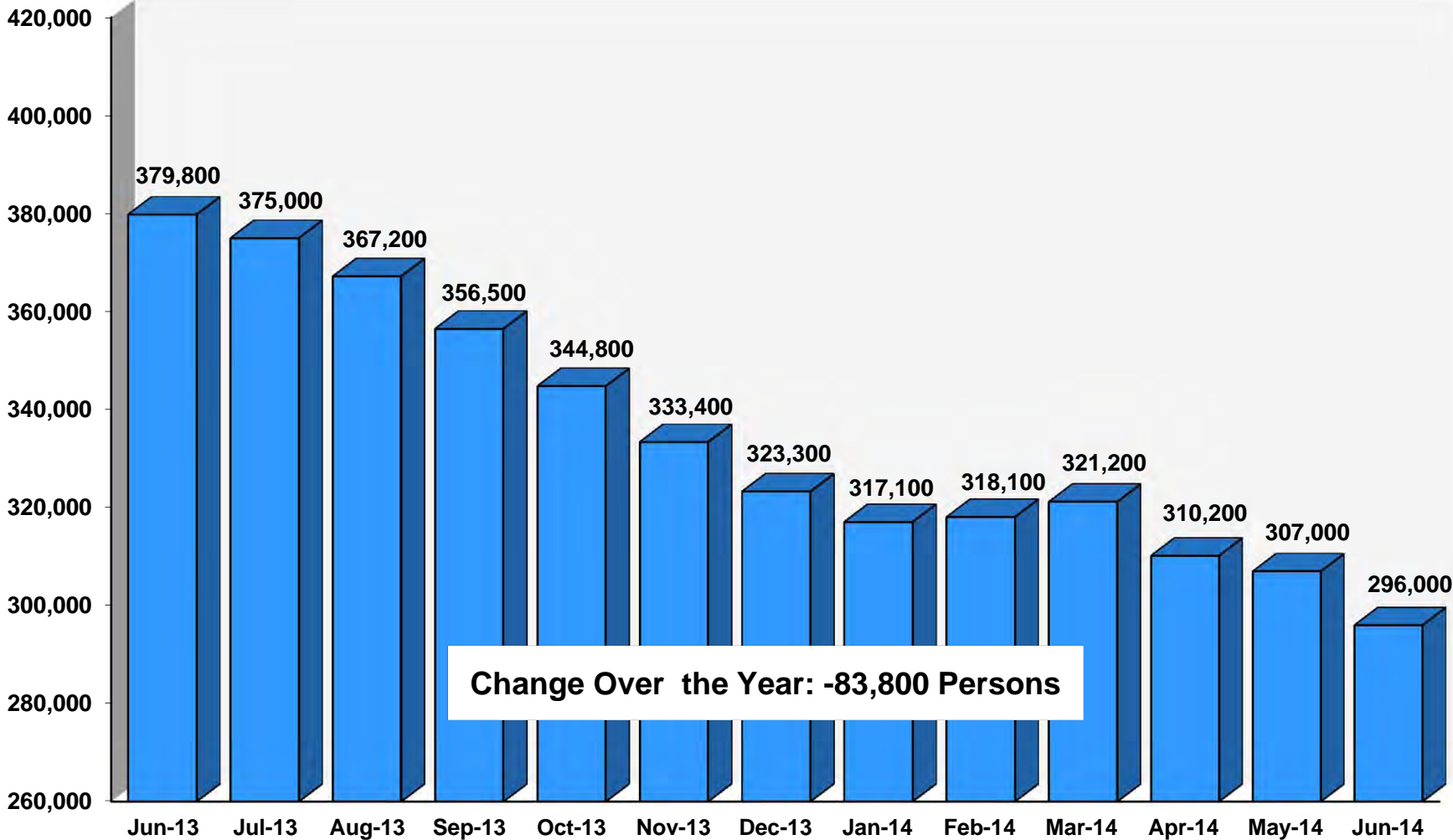
## Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: June 2013 - June 2014



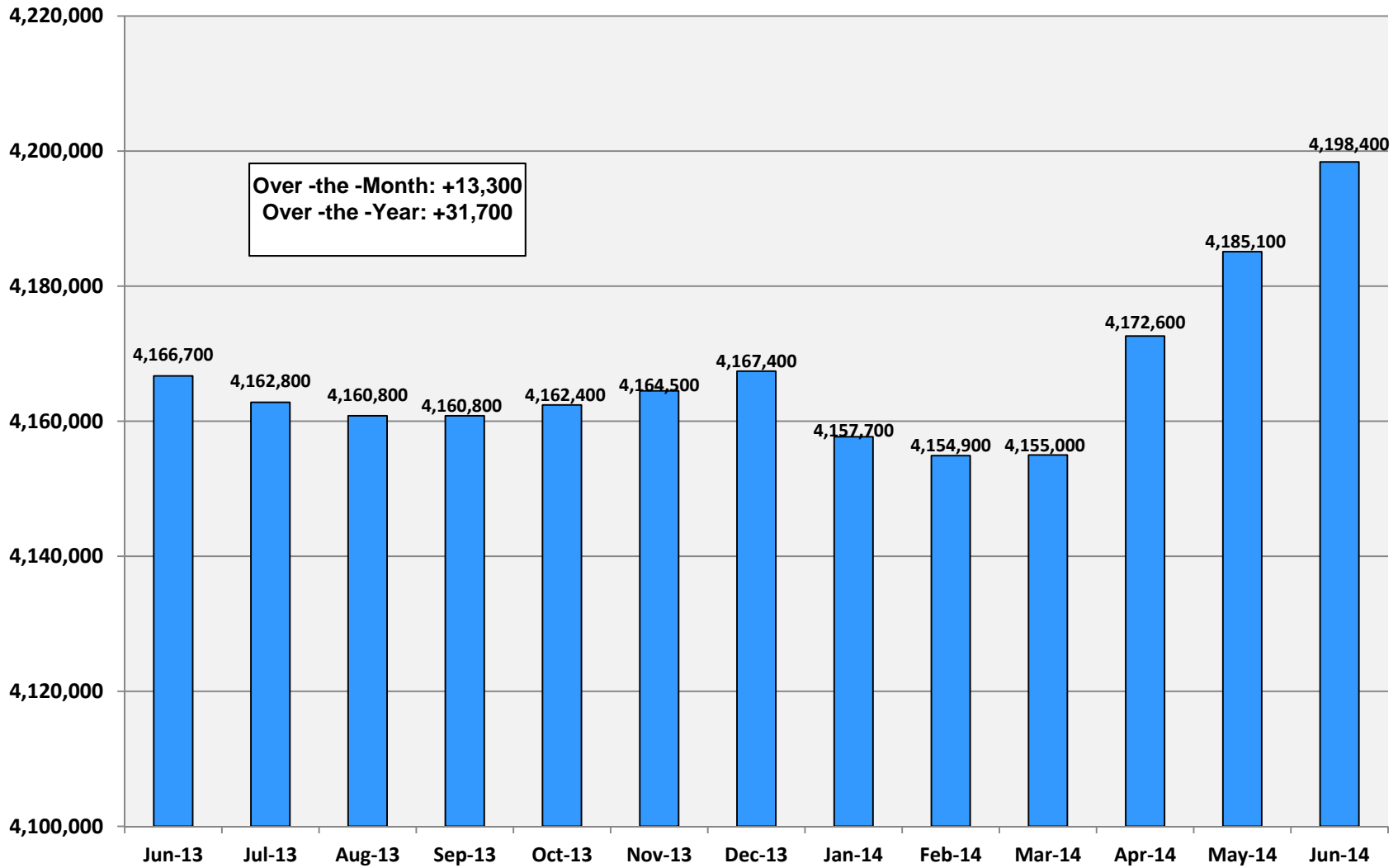
## New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: June 2013 - June 2014



# Unemployed New Jersey Residents June 2013 - June 2014



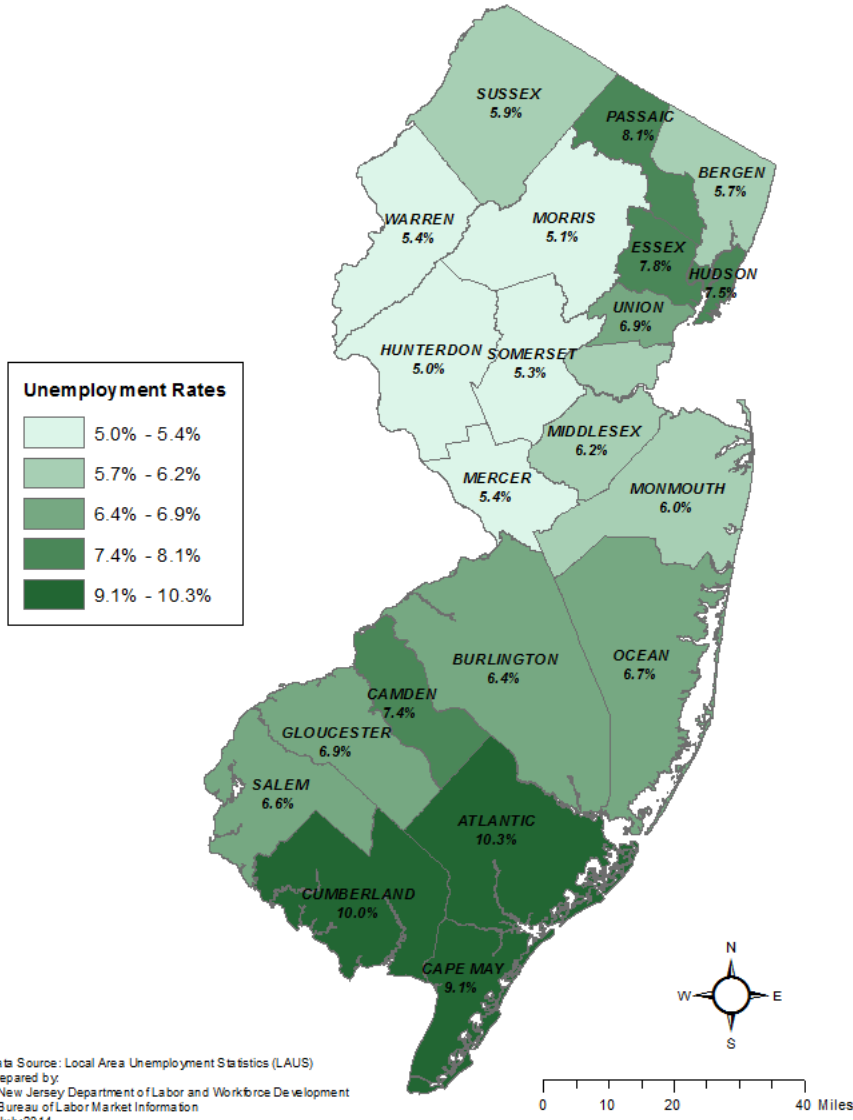
## New Jersey Employed Residents: June 2013 - June 2014

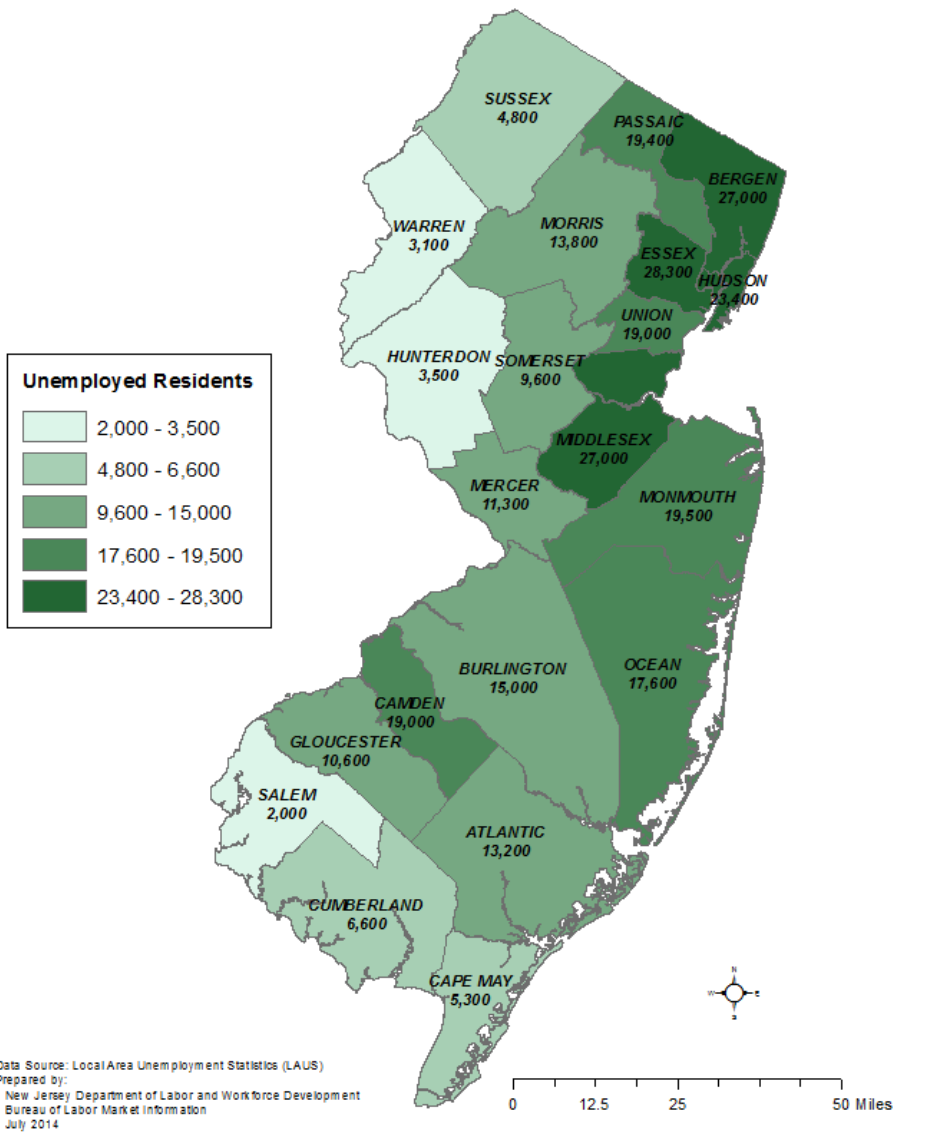

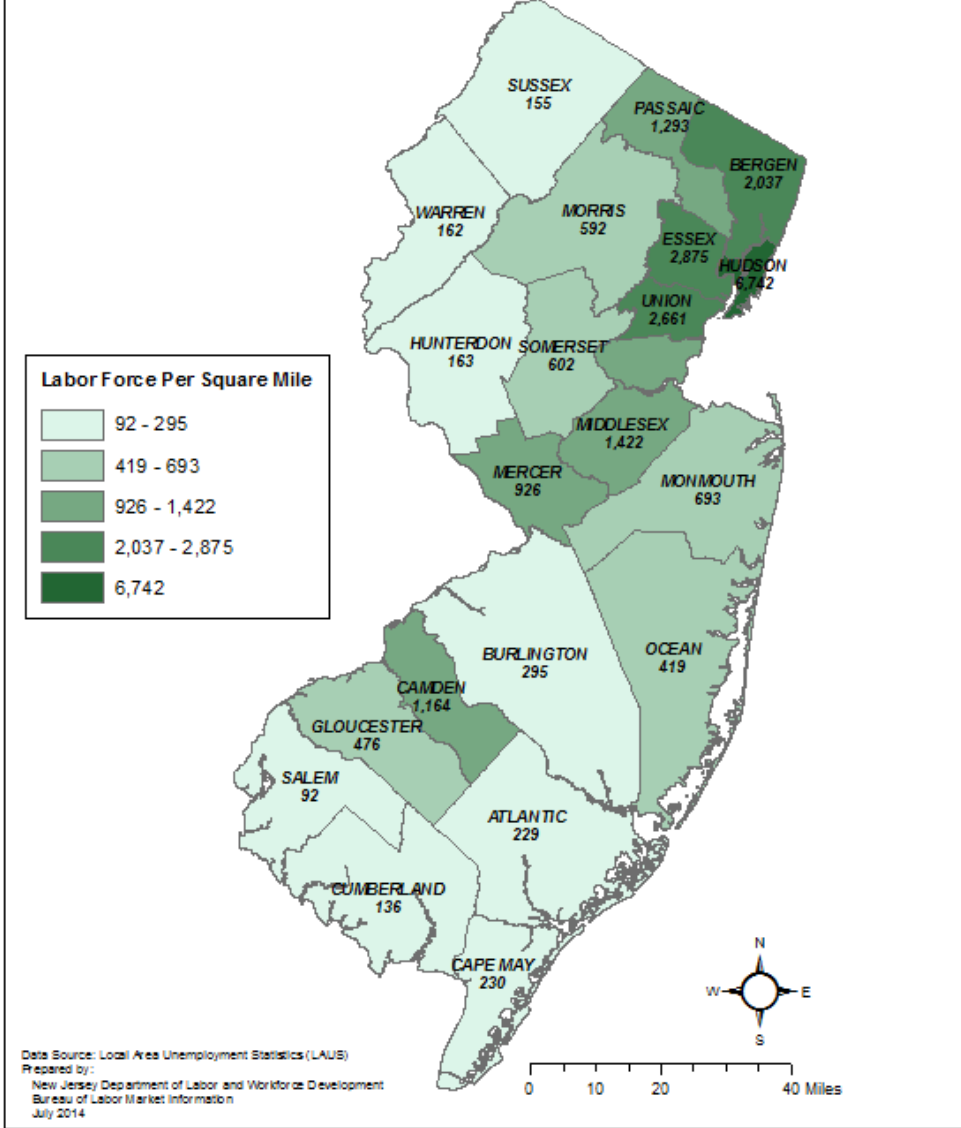

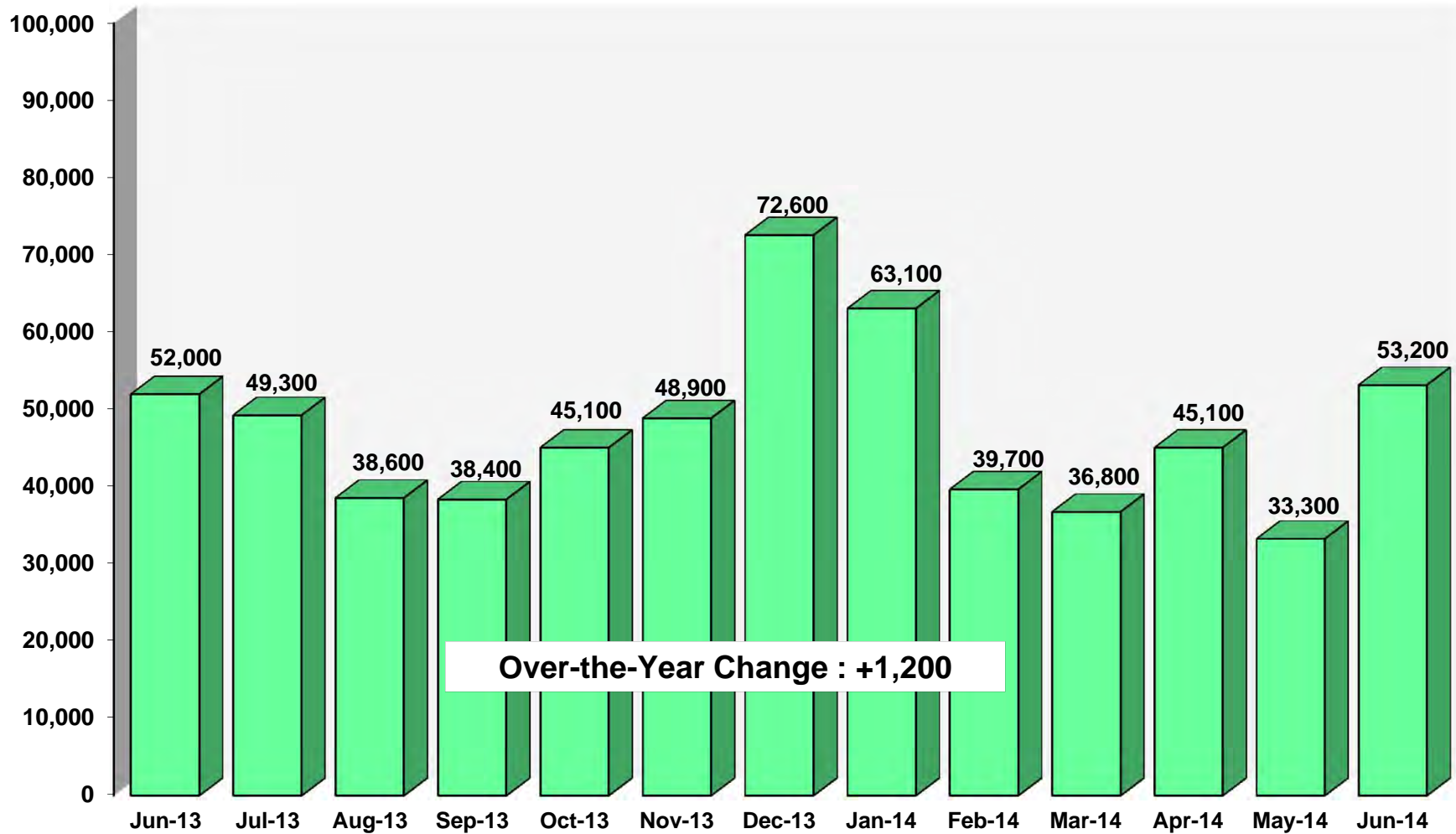


**New Jersey Counties**
