Fireworks safety for the July Fourth holiday!

When it comes to fireworks, there's a "child" hidden inside every one of us. Never mind how old you are; there is something about the boom and brightly colored flashes that brings the child out in us. There are 9,000 injuries each year through fireworks-related accidents. Enjoy your Fourth of July, but do it safely.

ALWAYS REMEMBER:

- ❖ Use fireworks and sparklers only outdoors.
- ❖ Only persons over 12 years of age should handle sparklers of any type.
- ❖ Fireworks and alcohol do not mix. Have a designated "shooter."
- ❖ Obey local laws. If fireworks are not legal where you are, don't use them.
- ❖ If drought conditions mean a ban on fireworks, follow the law.
- ❖ Only use fireworks as intended. Don't try to alter or combine them.
- ❖ Don't allow young children to play with fireworks.
- ❖ Supervise older children.
- ❖ Light fireworks away from homes, dry leaves, grass or flammables.
- ❖ Keep a bucket of water nearby for emergencies and pour on "dud" fireworks.
- ❖ Be sure people are out of range before lighting fireworks.
- ❖ Never ignite fireworks in a container - especially one made of glass or metal.
- ❖ Never lean over skyrockets or other flying fireworks as you light them.
- ❖ Don't experiment with homemade fireworks.

Camp for children who have lost a loved one

What is a Freedom Loan?

- * Up to \$10,000
- * Annual APR 6%
- * Term: 5 years (no pre-payment penalty)
- * Unsecured Loan (no collateral required)

Who is eligible to apply?

NJ residents who are:

- * Members of the National Guard or Reserve
- * Mobilized for one year or longer to fight in the Global War on Terrorism (GWOT) - excluding routine training.

Or

- * Served 90 or more consecutive days in the GWOT on federal or state active duty (excluding routing training) and have received orders extending cumulative active duty a year or longer.

How do I apply?

- * Contact participating banks. Call or visit your local branch office to obtain an application.
- * Guardmembers, Reservists, or family members with Power of Attorney must submit copies of current mobilization orders with the bank's Freedom Loan application.

State employees will start new deduction from paycheck

Effective July 7, 2007, employees covered under labor agreements with the CWA, AFSCME, and IPFTE, and employees not covered by a labor agreement, are required to contribute 1.5 percent of their annual base salary for health and/or prescription drug coverage under the State Health Benefits Program. Employees affected by this agreement will see the new deduction beginning with pay period #15, and a check date of July 27, 2007.

Honor Guard program searching for people

Looking for a way to serve and get some satisfaction at the same time? The Honor Guard program is looking for members of the Army and Air Guard to join the team to perform honor guard duties at the funerals of veterans. There is an initial eight hours of training for all new enrollees, with on-going sustainment training. As an honor guard member, you will receive a day of pay for each day's mission, minimum of \$50, and traditional drilling Guard members receive a retirement point for each day's duties.

Teams are split geographically throughout the state and volunteers can stay busy. In April 2007, the teams conducted 205 services for deceased veterans. By May15, there were 120 funerals where the team performed their duties. Retired Sgt. Maj. Ed Goetschius, who oversees the program, believes that there will be at least 2,000 services where the honor guard has served by the end of the year.

Family Readiness Council offers Tier I and II grants

The New Jersey National Guard State Family Readiness Council has expanded its Family Grants Program to include an additional grant. There are now two levels of Family Grants; TIER I is the \$2,500 grant that has been in place for the past couple of years. The TIER II opens family grants to New Jersey Army and Air National Guard non-deployed service members who were on State Active Duty or State Missions (e.g., hurricanes, floods, border missions) for more than 20 consecutive days. Service members meeting these criteria are eligible to apply for a financial hardship grant up to \$1,500.
