The NJCCIC assessed with high confidence that profit-motivated cyber extortion schemes such as ransomware and ransom-demanding distributed denial of service (DDoS) threats are likely to persist as effective and lucrative criminal tactics into 2016, with cumulative US losses likely to continue climbing into the hundreds of millions of dollars.
