COMMISSIONERS' REPORT.

To His Excellency, Franklin Murphy, Governor of the State of New Jersey:

SIR.—As required by law, the State Board of Riparian Commissioners beg leave to submit their annual report for the year ending October 31st, 1903.

For detailed information in regard to the operations of the Board, your Excellency is referred to the accompanying report of Mr. John C. Payne, the Secretary and Engineer.

The total receipts for the year from grants, leases and licenses, aggregated \$204,944.27, being the largest in any year for over a decade. The increase is largely due to the advantages offered great industrial and commercial enterprises on the Hudson River, on the Kills, on Raritan River and on other good waterways in the vicinity. Several of these, employing in the aggregate several thousand men, and representing investments of millions of dollars, have located on these waters within the past few years.

The westerly shore of Newark Bay, from Arthur Kill Sound to the mouth of the Passaic River, a distance of about twenty-five thousand feet, would also be in demand for similar plants, and would soon be the scene of great manufacturing and commercial activity, if the plan of improving the shore by extending the lines were adopted as suggested by the Commissioners and the Engineer last year. Along this shore, between the points named, is a mud flat about three thousand feet in width, a very large part of which is bare at low water. The plan of the Engineer, indorsed by the Board, is to extend the lines and provide for the filling in of a certain proportion of these shoals and of dredging the rest.

Until this is done that shore, which would offer alluring attractions to capital and enterprise, if thus made accessible to vessels, must remain undeveloped. There is no doubt at all that it would soon teem with industry and thrift if this improvement were made. It is known to the Commissioners that plans of extensive improvements in that vicinity are held in check by this obstacle.

The plan of improving the shore has been laid before the New York Harbor Line Board, but that body's only response has been that the proposed filling in of these mud flats would destroy "the beauty and advantage of the bay and the picturesqueness of the abounding shores." The abounding, picturesque shores consist of a wide extent of level salt marsh. The Commissioners respectfully suggest that your Excellency join with them in bringing this matter to the attention of the New Jersey representatives in Congress.

A question that promises soon to confront the Commissioners and that may call for action on the part of the Legislature and your Excellency, is the steady encroachment the fish pounds located in the ocean off the New Jersey coast, are making towards the shore. In several instances they have extended their contrivances several hundred feet inside the riparian lines. It is probable that application will be made to the Legislature at its next session for the creation of a Board of Salt Water Fish Commissioners, clothed with authority to regulate these pounds and to adopt rules as to their size, distance apart, distance from the shore, etc. If this is not done, the Riparian Commissioners will probably take action as to those which are intruding upon the State's riparian property.

It will be observed by the report of the Secretary and Engineer that about six million dollars worth of the State's riparian lands have so far been disposed of by grants, leases and conversions.

There are still remaining undisposed of over twenty millions of dollars worth of such lands, at present prices. Most of this is in localities not yet developed, and their value will, of course, increase with time. Some projects of great magnitude, in connection with the development of the extensive stretch of meadows between Jersey City and Newark have been brought before the Board, and will doubtless materialize in the not very remote future.

The statement shows an increased revenue of about \$86,000, from conveyances of lands under water made by the Commission during the past fiscal year, over that of last year, and the location and character of the conveyances made, mark a continuance of the demand for water front property over the entire riparian front of the State.

Appended to the report will be found a statement of Grants, Leases and Licenses of lands under water made by the State of New Jersey from April 1st, 1864, to October 31st, 1903. This statement shows that the total amount received from grants in fee during this time has been \$3,554,833.21. The total receipts from licenses has been \$11,262.50; and the total amount of leases now outstanding, upon which a rental of seven per cent. is paid, is \$796,652.25. During this period there has been received by the State rentals on leases made, some of which have been converted into grants, about \$1,650,000, making the total receipts from Grants, Licenses, and Rentals paid on leases, \$5,216,095.71. In addition, the principal sum of leases outstanding, upon which a rental of seven per cent. is annually paid, is \$796,652.25.

CHANGES IN EXTERIOR LINES.

The Board has been called upon, during the past year to consider the necessity of modifying and changing the Exterior Lines for Solid Filling and Piers on different parts of the tidal waters of the State. These changes are necessitated by the increasing demands of commerce and the use of longer and deeper draught vessels, to meet the same, and the Board has endeavored to meet these necessities without unduly encroaching upon the waterways affected.

HUDSON RIVER.

During the year application was made by an important industry, for a grant on the Hudson River at Edgewater, but it was found that the distance between the shore line, along which ran a public road, and the Exterior Line for Solid Filling, was not sufficient to warrant the expense of filling in the same, and the board was asked to extend the right to fill solid, to the existing Pier Line, making an addition of three hundred feet of solid filling without encroaching on the waterway of the river, and the board granted the request. Upon presenting the matter to the Secretary of War it was referred to the New York Harbor Line Board, and after a public hearing, at which the board was represented, the Harbor Line Board reporting favorably, the Secretary of War, on April 7th, 1903, approved the action of the Riparian Commission. The result was that the grant was taken, and in the near future an important industry will be established in that locality which would otherwise have been driven to seek some other locality outside of the State.

Another matter which has engaged the attention of the board is the application of the New York Dock Department for an extension of the Pierhead Line on the Hudson River between Canal Street and West Thirtieth Street in New York City. The extension asked for is opposite Castle Point and at the narrowest part of the Hudson River. The Pierhead Line on the New Jersey shore at this point admits of piers of only two hundred feet in length, while the present length of piers on the New York side of the river is seven hundred feet. The natural formation of the New Jersey shore at this point is a high, rocky, promontory and practically incapable of excavation, while the New York shore has been extended by filling in with light filling and a greater length of piers can be secured by dredging into this filled in land. The Riparian Commission has petitioned the Secretary of War, if any extension is granted, that the Pierhead Line on the New Jersey shore be advanced equally with that on the New York side.

KILL VON KULL.

The board has also petitioned the Secretary of War to approve an extension of the Pierhead Line on the Kill von Kull between Constable's Hook and Port Johnston. This extension, if granted,

will leave a waterway of over 1,000 feet, with a practically straight channel, while the improved waterway of the Staten Island Sound, through which the greater part of the traffic of the Kill von Kull passes, is to be only four hundred feet wide. There has been some opposition to this extension from one of the towing companies, and from the shore owners on the Staten Island side of the Kill. It is not believed that the opposition of the Staten Island shore owners is made upon grounds sufficiently sound to have any weight; the Staten Island shore is not capable of the commercial development necessitating the use of extensive piers and docking facilities, while the development of the New Jersey shore is a part of the great commercial growth of the country and every facility should be afforded for its development and maintenance. The objection from the towing interest is based upon the ground that the present waterway is only sufficient to accommodate the length of tows as now made up, but it is the opinion of those interested in the use of these waterways that these tows, as made up, are a serious interference with navigation and will necessitate their being modified and shortened greatly, removing any difficulty in their own management and removing the objection to the modification of the waterway.

NEWARK BAY.

The attention of the board is again called to the importance of the extension of the lines for improvements on Newark Bay. The matter was referred to in the report of your Engineer for last year and the necessity of an extension of the lines for improvement on the westerly shore of Newark Bay pointed out. No attempt has since been made to establish any industry on the westerly shore of the Bay, where there is a mud flat about two thousand feet in width outside of the present Exterior Line fixed by the Government, while on the easterly side of the Bay, where there is a sufficient depth of water at the Exterior Line, several important industries have been established. Your Engineer is convinced that it would have a beneficial effect on the navigable waterway of the Bay if the exterior line on the westerly side of the same was advanced to the six foot curve, and would bring the front of Newark and Elizabeth into commercial use.

CONDITIONAL GRANTS.

Reference was made in the last annual report to the practice of the board in allowing a rebate from the rate fixed, upon the condition that certain fixed improvements should be made within a stated time, and this practice is still adhered to. In one case a lease for \$22,994 was made upon the completion of the expenditure of three hundred thousand dollars; and in another case, where the grantee had failed to comply with the conditions of the grant, the rebate of \$1,000 with interest, was forfeited and paid by the Commission into the State Treasury.

FREEHOLDERS' LICENSES.

The board is frequently confronted with the question of the status of improvements made under the Wharf Act of 1851. In the Commissioners' report of last year, attention was called to a class of cases where only a partial reclamation, or reclamations of a flimsy character, had been made under recent Freeholders' Licenses, and in dealing with these, the board had no difficulty in arriving at a conclusion under the ruling of the Chancellor in the case of the American Lucol Company, which was fully set forth in the report of the Commission for 1902 on page 15, etc.

Another class of cases coming to the attention of the board is that where improvements authorized under Freeholders' licenses have been fully completed, but the owners, in attempting to dispose of their property, find the Title Companies unwilling to guarantee the title without a direct grant from the State through the Riparian Commission. The board is now considering a case of this kind, the applicant denying that the State has any interest in the land in question, but still desiring a confirmatory grant through the Riparian Commission.

STATE BOUNDARY LINE REPAIRS.

During the year some of the repairs to the monuments marking the Boundary Line between the States of New York and New Jersey, referred to in the last annual report as needing attention, have been carried out.

The Permanent Monument in Raritan Bay has been repainted

and relettered, and one hundred cubic yards of rip rap carefully placed around the same, so that it will not need any attention for some years to come. Plans and estimates for the erection of a permanent beacon on the south shore of Raritan Bay, in line with Romer Shoal Light and the Permanent Monument, were prepared and preparations made for erecting this, when it unfortunately transpired that the State of New York had made no provision for meeting its share of the expense attending its construction; consequently, the money appropriated for use during the present fiscal year for this purpose and not used, will have to be reappropriated next year, when it is hoped that the State of New York will co-operate in the construction of this most important aid to the location of the Boundary Line between New York and New Jersey in Raritan Bay. The general knowledge of the location of this Boundary Line has already resulted in a diminution of the friction and contention that once took place between the oystermen of the two States, owing to a lack of knowledge of the definite location of this Boundary Line. With this Range Beacon placed on the shore, it will be possible for those operating in the Bay to locate the Boundary Line by sight at once.

Two monuments at Suffern have been planted and the line is effectually established in that place.

With the co-operation of the State of New York and the reappropriation on the part of our State, the balance of the repairs to the Boundary Line Monuments referred to in the last annual report will be carried out.

DEATH OF HONORABLE MILES ROSS.

At a meeting of the Board held February 26th, 1903, the following resolutions were adopted:

"The death of Honorable Miles Ross, former Riparian Commissioner, having been brought formally to the attention of the Commission, the board desire publicly to testify to the ability and fidelity with which he administered the duties of Riparian Commissioner of New Jersey.

"Originally appointed by Governor Leon Abbett in 1884, he was several times re-appointed, and served through the successive administrations of Governor Robert S. Green, the second term of Governor Leon Abbett, Governor George T. Werts and Governor John W. Griggs. In 1899, during the administration of Governor Foster M. Voorhees, he resigned, owing to impaired health.

"In all this long period of fourteen years of service, during which many questions of importance and of financial interest to the State were disposed of to the credit and financial benefit of the State, his ripe judgment and extensive knowledge of affairs in general, and of those of the State in particular, were of inestimable value to the State, and facilitated greatly the operations of the board.

"His uniform courtesy and careful consideration of the questions brought before the board will be long remembered by those directly interested therein, as well as by his associate members of the board, and by the employees of the board.

"The Board of Riparian Commissioners of the State of New Jersey respectfully tender to his bereaved family their heartfelt sympathy, and order this expression of their appreciation of the character and services of their former associate to be spread in full on the minutes of the board, and copies of the same to be sent to the family and to the newspapers of New Brunswick and Jersey City."

ROUTINE WORK.

The year's business shows a very general and lively interest in the development of the water front lands of the State, and the uses to which the grants are to be put are varied. In one case a grant was made covering the creeks and thoroughfares of that part of Cape May County lying west of Sewell's Point. This is part of the great development of this section planned by the Cape May Real Estate Company and contemplates the reclamation of a considerable area of salt meadow, and the formation of an artificial lake in connection with the improvement of Cold Spring Inlet. The board, in fixing the consideration in this grant, was influenced by the benefits to inure to that section of the State by the improvements contemplated and by the improved value it would add to the remaining riparian rights in that locality.

The meetings of the board have been largely attended by applicants and their attorneys, and the various questions arising have received careful attention from the Commission and from the Counsel of the Board, Mr. George L. Record.

APPENDIX.

DIRECTIONS FOR APPLICANTS TO THE RIPARIAN COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY FOR LANDS UNDER WATER.

Applicants for lands of the State under tide water will observe the following directions:

First.—Furnish a description by metes and bounds of the lands owned by the applicant in front of which the lands applied for lie, accompanied by a map and survey of the same made by a competent surveyor, showing the exact frontage of said land on the shore at mean high water mark, and the names of the owners of the adjoining lands.

Second.—State whether the lands under water applied for are now or are hereafter to be used for commercial or other purposes, and if so, what; whether they have been improved in whole or in part, or are authorized to be improved under any grant or license protected by the provisions of the supplement of the Riparian act of March 31st, 1869; also, if any oyster land, fishery or privilege therefor is embraced within the limits of the land under water applied for.

Third.—State whether a grant in fee simple, or a lease in perpetuity, with privilege to convert the same into a fee, is desired.

(*Note.*—For a grant in fee simple, the principal sum is required to be paid. For a lease, a rental at the rate of seven per cent. per annum on the principal sum is payable semi-annually, in advance to the State Treasurer).

Fourth.—An abstract of the title to the land owned by the applicant, prepared by a practitioner of the law of this State, or by the clerk of the county in which the land is situated, must be furnished

with the application before the same will be considered by the Commissioners.
