Descriptions of Tables for updates of the 2002 Community Services Waiting List Initiative, the 2002 Community Transition Initiative and the FY2002 Nursing Home Initiative

Table 1. Status of Each Community Services Waiting List Initiative

1. **Number in the Initiative.** Shown here are the number of people on the Urgent Category of the waiting list from each Region who are included in each respective initiative. Also presented for the Waiting List Initiatives are counts of these individuals and the reason they were included in each initiative: e.g., residing in a crisis respite home, aging out of an educational or DYFS program, by the date they first became urgent, or by court order or settlement agreement.
2. **# in Interim Placements.** People from # 1 above who are being served on an interim basis outside of their families' homes. These individuals are not represented in the "Placed" category below.
3. **# Still in Development.** People who are not in categories 4 through 8 below. The Regional Offices are continuing to work with these individuals and their families to develop acceptable plans with provider agencies.
4. **# Removed from the Initiative and Not Replaced.** This group includes people who have decided they do not wish to be placed at this time, but want to remain on the waiting list. Also included here are individuals who have been removed from the waiting list for other reasons, e.g., moved out of state, discharged from services, etc. These people have not been replaced by another person from the waiting list yet.
5. **# Requesting to Stay in their Current Placement.** These numbers reflect the people who initially expressed a desire to stay in their current place of residence (e.g., Bancroft, Devereux, etc.) and are waiting for DDD approval.
6. **# Referrals Sent to Agencies (Outstanding).** The numbers of outstanding referrals with agencies for people in each respective initiative are shown here.
7. **# With a Specific Plan Agreed to.** Individuals from #1 above who have a placement identified and moneys committed for the placement are shown here.
8. **# Placed.** Individuals from #1 above who have been placed as part of each respective initiative are counted here.

Table 2. Status of Each Community Services Waiting List Initiative - Agency Designation

1. **# Requesting to Stay in their Current Placement.** These numbers reflect the people who initially expressed a desire to stay in their current place of residence (e.g., Bancroft, Devereux, etc.) and are waiting for DDD approval. Counts of people by their current type of residence are shown here.
2. **# Referrals Sent to Agencies (Outstanding).** This row gives counts of the number of referral packages for people in each respective initiative that have been sent to each of the agencies listed.
3. **# With a Specific Plan Agreed to.** Counts by agency of the individuals in each respective initiative who have a placement identified and moneys committed for the placement are shown here.
4. **# Placed.** Counts by agency of the individuals in each respective initiative who have been placed are listed here.

Residential Waiting List on April 30, 2007

There are 3 categories of the Residential Services Waiting List: the most urgent called Priority, the Priority Deferred and the General Waiting List. At the end of April there were 7,797 people in these categories.

3,765 people were in the Priority Category, living at home with their families actually waiting for services from the Division.

167 individuals were in the Priority Category and part of a current placement initiative.

661 people were in the Priority Category living outside the family home, often in a DDD funded placement.

367 people were in the Priority Deferred category. These individuals had been offered placement in the past and declined.

2,837 individuals were in the General Waiting List category. These individuals have expressed an interest in receiving residential services sometime in the future.
