



Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 07




NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 07







Enrollment by Grade, in Full Time Equivalent






Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup






Proficiency Trends - Math






