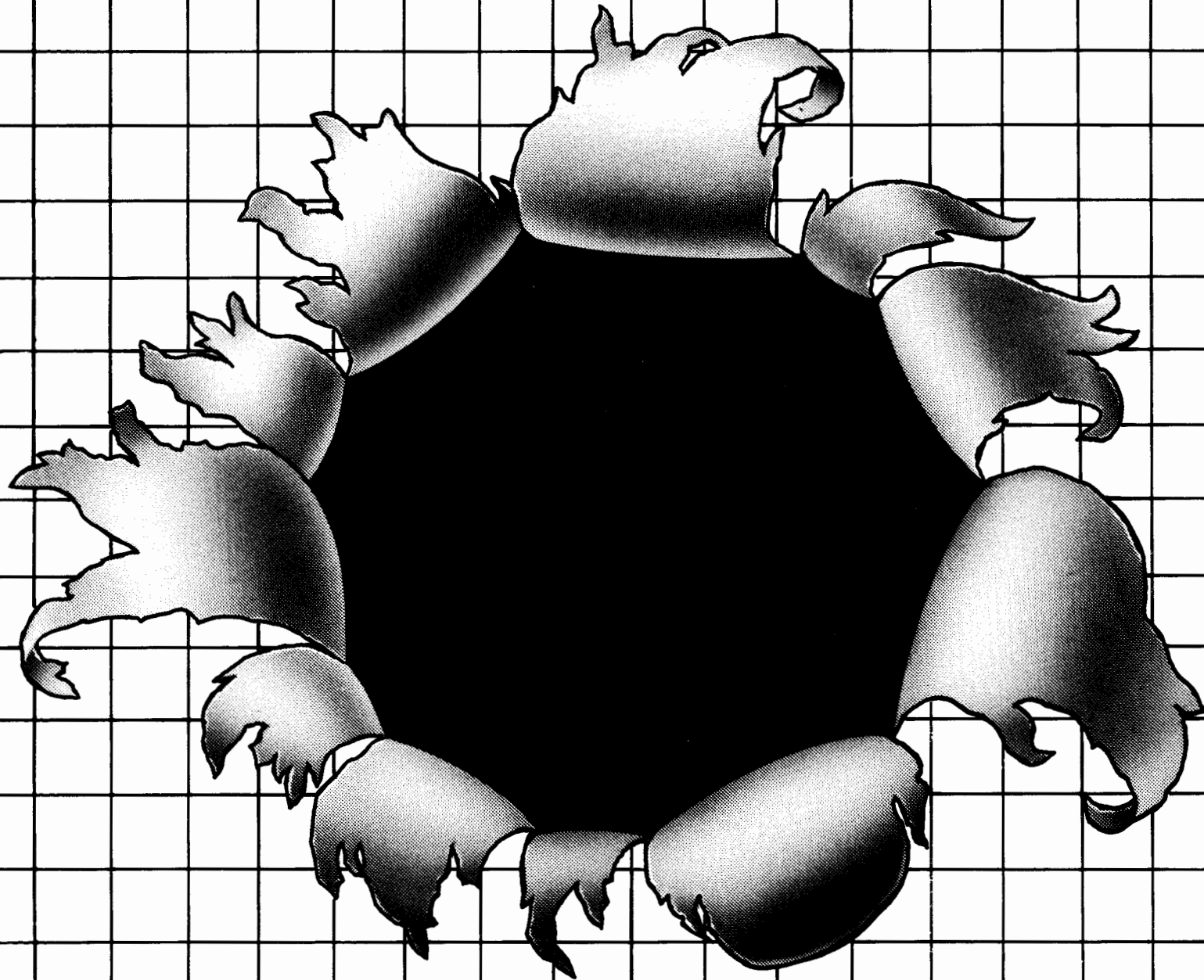

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PREFACE

The 1986-87 edition of Vital Educational Statistics II is the thirteenth in a series which began in 1974-75. The annual fall survey Certificated Staff Employed and Non-Certificated Staff Employed data collection instruments, supported with detailed illustrated instructions, were the sources for the data aggregated for this publication.

THIS IS THE THIRD YEAR THAT THE REPORTED CERTIFICATED STAFF EMPLOYED DATA INCLUDES THE COUNT OF CLASSROOM TEACHERS ON APPROVED PAID LEAVES OF ABSENCE. IN THE PUBLICATIONS PRIOR TO THE 1984-85 EDITION, THOSE TEACHERS WERE INCLUDED IN THE COUNT OF TEACHERS LEAVING UNDER OFFICIAL LEAVES OF ABSENCE. THEREFORE, THE USERS OF THIS REPORT ARE CAUTIONED TO BE AWARE OF THIS CHANGE.

County data analysts reviewed the data from school districts before transmitting them to the New Jersey State Department of Education. For a comprehensive overview of the condition of education it is recommended that both Volumes I & II be used as a set. Volume I contains school district and school data, including enrollments, dropouts and graduates. Each of the sections has narrative as well as data tables to accommodate reader and user preferences. The data in the Vital Educational Statistics series are descriptive and were designed to serve as a core database for reporting on the condition of education in New Jersey.

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INTRODUCTION

This introduction provides trend characteristics of the full-time certificated and non-certificated staff employed in the public elementary and secondary schools of New Jersey between 1982-83 and 1986-87. The data reported are of the last school day in September in each of the respective school years.

CHANGING STAFF PROFILES

- * An increase of 2,661 in the number of certificated staff were employed between 1982-83 and 1986-87. This was an increase of 2.84% over the 93,687 reported certificated staff in 1982-83.
- * Classroom teachers make up 78.4% of the total full-time certificated staff with educational support services personnel accounting for 13.8% and administrators/supervisors 7.8%. Since 1982-83, the percentage of administrators/supervisors increased by two-tenths of one percent from 7.6% to 7.8% and educational support services personnel increased by seven-tenths of one percent from 13.1% to 13.8%.
- * There was an increase in the number of minorities employed in full-time certificated staff positions. Minorities increased from 11.3% of the full-time administrators/supervisors certificated staff in 1982 to 12.1% in 1986. Likewise, minority classroom teacher certificated staff increased from 11.5% in 1982 to 12.1% in 1986 and minority educational support services personnel increased from 10.7% to 11.9% over the same period.
- * The trend from 1982-83 to 1986-87 shows a decrease in the male and an increase in the female full-time certificated staff. In 1982-83, males accounted for 37.1% and females 62.9% of the total full-time certificated staff. In 1986-87, males represented thirty-four percent (34%) of the total full-time certificated staff and females accounted for sixty-six percent (66%).
- * The full-time non-certificated staff positions increased by 2.7% (1,116 positions) between 1982-83 and 1986-87. Between these two school years, the number of minorities employed increased by 3.2% from 19.4% in 1982 to 22.6% in 1986.

SECTION I

CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

CERTIFICATED STAFF INFORMATION

This section contains twenty (20) tables which show the current status of the certificated staff employed full and part-time in the public elementary and secondary schools in New Jersey. For the purposes of reporting, the certificated staff is divided into three categories that generically define the major assignments or positions in education. The categories are: administrators/supervisors, classroom teachers, and educational support services personnel. The tables report the staff in these categories by location of assignment (system-wide or central office, elementary and secondary), sex, racial/ethnicity, age, experience, level of academic preparation, type certification and mobility (entering and leaving).

TABLE I: FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME CERTIFICATED STAFF EMPLOYED BY COUNTY AND MAJOR ASSIGNMENT. This is the basic table in this series. On September 30, 1986, 96,348 full-time certificated staff members were employed in the public schools of New Jersey. This was 1,691 more than were reported on September 30, 1985. Between 1985 and 1986, the number of administrators and supervisors increased by 3, the number of classroom teachers by 1,322 and the number of educational support service personnel by 366.

The number of part-time certificated staff decreased by 58 from 4,184 in 1985 to 4,126 in 1986. Of the part-time certificated staff, 54.9% or 2,266 were classroom teachers, 44.4% or 1,832 were educational support service personnel and 28 or 0.7% were administrators/supervisors.

TABLE II: FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME CERTIFICATED STAFF ASSIGNED SYSTEM-WIDE BY MAJOR POSITION ASSIGNMENT AND COUNTY. Certificated staff in this category refers to those individuals who are employed in the district central office and/or are itinerant with an assignment that covers two or more schools. Of the 96,348 full-time certificated staff, 10,651 or 11.1% were reported in system-wide positions and of these positions the highest percentage, 40.8% or 4,341, were in the educational support services personnel category. The second highest percentage, 36.9% or 3,929 were reported in the category classroom teacher and the remaining 22.4 or 2,381 were administrators/supervisors.

Of the 1,311 part-time certificated staff in system-wide positions, 61.7% or 809 were in support services positions and 37.2% or 488 were classroom teachers with the remainder, 1.1%, in administration/supervision.

TABLE III: FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME CERTIFICATED STAFF ASSIGNED TO ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS BY MAJOR POSITION ASSIGNMENT AND COUNTY. This table shows that 53.3% or 51,389 of the total 96,348 full-time certificated staff and 52.6% or 2,169 of the total 4,126 part-time certificated staff are assigned to the elementary schools. The 2,362 full-time administrators/supervisors reported in elementary school positions represent 31.5% of the total 7,503 administrators/supervisors; of the 75,558 reported classroom teachers, 58.3% or 44,074 were elementary teachers; and 37.3% or 4,953 of the 13,287 full-time certificated educational support services personnel were in elementary schools.

Of the total full-time certificated elementary staff, 4.6% are administrators/supervisors, 85.8% are classroom teachers and 9.6% are educational support services personnel. The above percentages have been stable over the past five years with no significant changes.

The total number of full-time certificated elementary staff increased for the third year. From 1985 to 1986 there was an increase of 1,624 in the total staff. The largest number, 1,297, were in the classroom teachers category. Educational support services increased by 305 and administrators/supervisors increased by 22. The part-time elementary certificated staff increased by 28 from 2,141 in 1985-86 to 2,169 in 1986-87.

TABLE IV: FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME CERTIFICATED STAFF ASSIGNED TO SECONDARY SCHOOLS BY MAJOR POSITION ASSIGNMENT AND COUNTY. This table shows that 35.6% or 34,308 of the total full-time certificated staff and 15.7% or 646 of the total part-time certificated staff are employed in the secondary schools. Of the 34,308 full-time certificated staff, 8.0% or 2,760 were administrators/supervisors. The 27,555 classroom teachers represent 80.3% of the full-time certificated secondary staff and the 3,993 educational support services personnel represent 11.6%. The 27,555 classroom teachers was a decrease of 1 from the 27,556 reported in 1985 and the 3,993 educational support services personnel were an increase of 18 over the 3,975 reported in 1985.

The number of part-time certificated staff in secondary schools decreased in classroom teaching and educational support services positions.

Classroom teachers decreased by 33 from 541 to 508 in 1986; and educational support services personnel decreased by 37 from 171 in 1985 to 134 in 1986.

TABLE V: SEX, HIGHEST DEGREE AND CERTIFICATE HELD BY ADMINISTRATORS AND SUPERVISORS BY COUNTY. This is the first of three (3) tables which show the sex, academic degree, and certificates of the full-time certificated staff in the public schools by major position assignment.

Approximately 76.1% or 5,712 of the administrators/supervisors are male and 23.9% or 1,791 are female. Between 1982-83 and 1986-87 the number of female administrators/supervisors increased from 1,425 to 1,791, an increase of 366 or 25.7%. The number of males in administrator and supervisor positions in this period increased by 23 from 5,689 to 5,712.

The degree status of administrators and supervisors improved between 1982-83 and 1986-87. The number of no degrees reported in 1982-83 was 38 while in 1986-87 it was 23, a decrease of 15 or 39.5%. Administrators and supervisors holding bachelor's degrees decreased by 46; from 315 in 1982-83 to 269 in 1986-87. On the other hand, the number holding the master's degree increased from 6,039 to 6,317. There was an increase of 26.1% from 677 to 854 in the number holding the doctorate degree in the five-year period and 99.7% of the total administrators and supervisors held regular certificates in 1986-87.

TABLE VI: SEX, HIGHEST DEGREE AND CERTIFICATES HELD BY CLASSROOM TEACHERS BY COUNTY. This table shows the status of classroom teachers and follows a trend similar to that reported for administrators and supervisors. In this category, 68.4% or 51,667 of the 75,558 reported full-time classroom teachers are female and 31.6% are male. Between 1982-83 and 1986-87, male classroom teachers decreased by 2,051 and female classroom teachers increased by 3,306. Thus the percentage of females in this period increased from 65.1% of the total in 1982 to 68.4% in 1986 and the percentage of males decreased from 34.9% to 31.6%. When the sex composition of the total 1986-87 full-time certificated staff reported is compared to 1982, the male classroom teacher's category shows a decrease. In 1982, male classroom teachers represented 27.7% of the total 93,687 reported full-time certificated staff and in 1986, the male classroom teacher represented 24.8% of the total 96,348 full-time certificated staff.

The degree status of classroom teachers parallels the administrators/supervisors. Whereas the percentage of full-time certificated classroom teachers holding bachelor's degrees decreased from 63.3% in 1982 to 62.8% in 1986, the percentage having master's degrees increased from 34.9% in 1982 to 35.8% in 1986. The number holding doctorates increased by 120 from 368 in 1982 to 488 in 1985. 98.6% of the full-time certificated classroom teachers held a regular certificate.

TABLE VII: SEX, HIGHEST DEGREE AND CERTIFICATES HELD BY EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES PERSONNEL BY COUNTY. This table shows the status of the full-time certificated educational support services personnel.

Of the 13,287 reported educational support services personnel, 10,016 or 75.4% are female and 24.6% male. The percentage of males decreased 0.9% from 25.5% of the educational support services personnel in 1982 to 24.6% in 1986.

The degree status of the full-time certificated educational support services personnel shows a decrease in the number of none and increases in the numbers of bachelors, masters and doctoral degrees. There was a decrease of 89 from the 282 no degrees reported in 1982 to 193 in 1986. The percentage of full-time certificated educational support services personnel holding bachelor's degrees increased from 34.1% in 1982 to 34.4% in 1986, the percentage holding master's degrees increased from 60.4% in 1982 to 60.7% in 1986 and the number holding doctorates increased by 89, from 300 in 1982 to 389 in 1986, an increase of 29.7%.

Of the 13,287 full-time certificated educational support services personnel, 13,023 or 98.4% held regular certificates.

TABLE VIII: RACIAL/ETHNIC DISTRIBUTION OF FULL-TIME CERTIFICATED ADMINISTRATORS AND SUPERVISORS BY COUNTY. This is the first of three tables showing the racial/ethnic distribution of full-time certificated staff. Of the administrators and supervisors serving full-time, 6,669 (88.9%) were white, 736 (9.8%) were black and 89 (1.2%) were Hispanic. The number of minority staff members in administrator/supervisor positions continued to increase with the number of black administrators/supervisors increasing from 630 in 1982 to 736 in 1986 and Hispanic from 57 in 1982 to 89 in 1986.

TABLE IX: RACIAL/ETHNIC DISTRIBUTION OF FULL-TIME CERTIFICATED CLASSROOM TEACHERS BY COUNTY. The minority full-time certificated classroom teachers increased in 1986. Of the 75,558 reported classroom teachers, 66,381 (87.9%) were white; 7,384 (9.8%) were black; 1,505 (2.0%) were Hispanic; and 288 (0.3%) were American Indian/Alaskan Native, Asian or Pacific Islander. Between 1982-83 and 1986-87, the percentages of black and Hispanic increased, American Indian/Alaskan Native and Asian/Pacific Inslander were unchanged and whites decreased.

TABLE X: RACIAL/ETHNIC DISTRIBUTION OF FULL-TIME CERTIFICATED EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES PERSONNEL BY COUNTY. Of the 13,287 reported educational support services staff, 11,709 (88.1%) were white; 1,310 (9.9%) were black; 222 (1.7%) were Hispanic; and 46 (0.3%) were American Indian/Alaskan Native Asian or Pacific Islander. As with the classroom teachers between 1982-83 and 1986-87, there was an increase in the percentages of black and Hispanic, no changes in American Indian/Alaskan Native and Asian/Pacific Islander, and a decrease in white.

TABLE XI: AGE DISTRIBUTION ADMINISTRATORS AND SUPERVISORS BY COUNTY. This is the first of three tables which show the distribution of the full-time certificated staff by position and age. The administrators/supervisors 48.6 years median age in 1986-87 is the highest of the three reported classifications and is an increase of 2.6 years over the median age of 46.0 that was reported in 1982. Of the 7,503 administrators/supervisors, 60.1% or 4,540 are between the ages of 42 and 57 years and 24.4% or 1,833 are younger than 41-years-old.

TABLE XII: AGE DISTRIBUTION CLASSROOM TEACHERS BY COUNTY. As the administrators and supervisors group represented the oldest of the three position assignments, the classroom teachers represent the youngest with a median age of 39.6 years. Of the 75,558 full-time certificated classroom teachers, 38,885 or 51.5% are between the ages of 26 and 41 years. There are 5,243 or 6.9% who are 58 years and over. The classroom teachers median age increased by 2.6 years from the 1982 median of 37.0 to 39.6 years in 1986.

TABLE XIII: AGE DISTRIBUTION EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES PERSONNEL BY COUNTY. The median age of the full-time certificated educational support services personnel was 45.2 years. In this category of 13,287 full-time certificated staff, 5,279 or 39.7% are between 18 and 41 years of age and 6,235 or 46.9% are between the ages of 41 and 57. Educational support services personnel median age increased by 2.2 years from 1982 when the median age was 43 years.

When the total certificated staff is viewed, Essex and Union counties would appear to staff the oldest in terms of median year and the youngest staffs would appear to be in Hunterdon, Salem and Sussex counties.

TABLE XIV: TOTAL EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCE OF ADMINISTRATORS/SUPERVISORS BY COUNTY. This is the first of three tables which show the distribution of the full-time certificated staff by position and years of experience.

The increasing degree status and median age for the administrators/supervisors full-time certificated staff is reflected in years of experience.

The median year of experience in education for the administrators/supervisors in 1986 was 22.9 years--an increase of 3.7 years from the median of 19.2 years in 1982. Of the 7,503 full-time certificated staff in this category 4,922 or 65.6% fell between the range of 15 and 29 years of educational experience. Of the total administrators/supervisors, 346 or 4.6% had fewer than 10 years of experience.

The administrators/supervisors category has the highest median age, has the highest percentage of higher degrees held and has more years of experience in education than either the classroom teachers or the educational support services personnel.

TABLE XV: TOTAL EDUCATION EXPERIENCE OF CLASSROOM TEACHERS BY COUNTY. The teachers' median years of experience have increased from 1982 by 2.6 years to 13.0 years in 1986. Of the 75,558 full-time certificated classroom teachers, 15.1% or 11,431 had fewer than five (5) years of experience and 3.3% or 2,688 were in their first year. 3.6% or 2,496 had more than 29 years of experience. The data show that the median age of teachers has increased. They hold higher degrees and have more experience.

TABLE XVI: TOTAL EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCE OF EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT SERVICES PERSONNEL BY COUNTY. The full-time certificated staff median years of experience increased by 3.9 years from the median of 11.0 years in 1982 to 14.9 in 1986. Of the 13,287 full-time certificated educational support services personnel, 1,656 or 12.5% had fewer than five (5) years of experience and 675 or 5.1% had more than 29 years of experience.

TABLE XVII: CERTIFICATED PERSONNEL ENTERING AND LEAVING BY MAJOR POSITION ASSIGNMENT AND COUNTY. The table summarizes the mobility of the full-time certificated staff into and out of the public schools of New Jersey. It is a count of certificated individuals who were reported in a position in a school on September 30, 1985 but were not in that school on September 30, 1986 (Leaving). Entering is the count of those individuals who were not reported in a school on September 30, 1985 but held a position in that school on September 30, 1986 (Entering). Twenty-one (21) reasons have been coded for entering and for leaving to provide users with data to study the supply and demand of certificated staff in the public schools of New Jersey.

The statewide data show more certificated staff entering than leaving. In the 1986-87 school year, the entering rate was 14.0% (approximately 14 full-time certificated staff per 100 employed). The statewide leaving rate was 12.4% (approximately 12 full-time certificated staff per 100 employed). Previous to this year, the entering and leaving rates of certificated staff were lowest during the 1985-86 school year, when the entering rate was 13.0 full-time certificated staff per 100 employed and the leaving rate 12.0 per 100 staff employed.

Whereas the entering rate exceeded the leaving rate in seventeen (17) counties in 1984-85, there were twenty (20) counties in 1985-86 in which the entry rate exceeded the leaving rate.

TABLE XVIII: NUMBER OF FULL-TIME CLASSROOM TEACHERS EMPLOYED BY SUBJECT AND COUNTY. Of the 75,558 full-time classroom teachers employed, 36.8% were elementary teachers and 63.2% were in fields which required specialized endorsements to the instructional certificates.

Of those 63.2% or 47,769 teachers, 34,842 or approximately 72.9% were employed in the following six fields:

- 1. English..... 17.5%
- 2. Special Education..... 16.9%
- 3. Health & Physical Education.... 11.1%
- 4. Mathematics..... 10.7%
- 5. Science..... 8.4%
- 6. Social Studies..... 8.2%

Approximately 21.3% were divided among: music (5.3), foreign languages (4.3), industrial arts (3.9), art (3.9), and business (3.9).

TABLE XIX: NUMBER OF FULL-TIME BEGINNING AND RE-ENTERING TEACHERS BY SUBJECT AND COUNTY. Of the 10,805 reported entering teachers, 38.3% or 4,136 were either beginning or "reentering" (returning to the classroom after leaves of absences or other employment) teachers. Of these 4,136 teachers, approximately 82.9% were either elementary (38.2%) or teachers in the following fields.

- 1. Special Education 16.9%
- 2. English 11.3%
- 3. Mathematics 7.0%
- 4. Science 4.9%
- 5. Health & Physical Ed. 4.6%

The remainder of these teachers were distributed among the disciplines as follows:

- 1. 7.1% were divided among art, foreign languages and music.
- 2. 5.6% were divided between social studies and vocational.
- 3. 4.0% were divided among business, home economics and industrial arts.

TABLE XX: NUMBER OF FULL-TIME CLASSROOM TEACHER SEPARATIONS BY COUNTY. There were 3,101 teachers or 33.2% of the reported 9,343 leaving teachers who left classroom duties during the 1985-86 school year.

Approximately seventy-seven percent (77.5%) of these 3,101 classroom teachers were either elementary (30.6%) or teachers from the following fields:

- 1. Special Education 13.6%
- 2. English 11.2%
- 3. Mathematics 6.6%
- 4. Science 6.2%
- 5. Health & Physical Ed. 4.9%
- 6. Social Studies 4.4%

The remaining 22.5% of these teachers were divided among art (2.4), business (3.4), foreign languages (3.5), home economics (1.5), industrial arts (3.1), music (4.2), and vocational (4.0).

NON-CERTIFICATED STAFF

This section contains three tables reporting data on the personnel employed in public elementary and secondary education in assignments which do not require a State Board of Education issued certificate to hold that position. The tables provide data by support services assignment areas, the racial/ethnic non-certificated support and sex distribution of both full-time and part-time, and reports the distribution of the full-time non-certificated personnel by county.

TABLE XXI: FULL-TIME AND PART-TIME NON-CERTIFICATED SUPPORT SERVICES STAFF EMPLOYED BY RACIAL/ETHNIC DISTRIBUTION, SEX AND ASSIGNMENT. This is a composite table which reports the number of individuals employed in full-time and part-time non-certificated support services positions. A total of 55,001 persons were employed in support services in New Jersey public elementary and secondary education. Of this total, more than three-quarters (78.5%) were employed full-time; slightly more than two-thirds (69.5%) were female; and one-fifth (19.3%) were minority.

TABLE XXII: FULL-TIME NON-CERTIFICATED SUPPORT SERVICES STAFF EMPLOYED BY COUNTY, ASSIGNMENT AND SEX. In the 1986-87 school year, there were 43,193 full-time non-certificated support services personnel employed in public elementary and secondary local education agencies. Of this total, Sex 90.6% or 39,131 were employed in the assignments of service worker, secretarial/clerical and teacher aide. The largest number, 20,069 or 46.5%, were in service work assignments with the next largest number, 11,245 or 26%, in secretarial/clerical assignments.

The smallest number, were reported 504 or 1.2% in technician assignments.

TABLE XXIII: RACIAL/ETHNIC DISTRIBUTION AND SEX BY COUNTY OF FULL-TIME NON-CERTIFICATED SUPPORT SERVICES STAFF EMPLOYED. Of the total 43,193 full-time non-certificated support services staff employed, 22.6% or 9,780 were minority. Of the full-time non-certificated support services staff employed, 18.3% or 7,889 were black, 1,681 or 3.9% were Hispanic and 210 or 0.5% were other minorities.

Of the total assignments, 28,335 or 65.6% were reported as being held by females and 14,858 or 34.4% were held by males.

GLOSSARY

Assignment: The specific group of activities for which a staff member has been given responsibility.

Business or Secretarial School: A non-degree granting, post-secondary institution offering courses of varying length in preparation for technical business occupations.

Certificate: The legal document giving authorization, from the New Jersey State Board of Examiners, to perform the services to which the person is assigned.

Clerical/Secretarial Staff: Staff members in full-time positions requiring skills and training in all clerical-type work including activities such as preparing, transcribing, systematizing or preserving written communications and reports of operating such mechanical equipment as bookkeeping machines, typewriters and tabulating machines. Include bookkeeping, messengers, office machines operators, clerk-typists, stenographers, secretaries, hearing reporters, statistical clerks, dispatchers, payroll clerks and kindred workers.

College (four-year): A post-secondary institution offering a four-year curriculum and empowered to confer a bachelor's degree.

Degree: A title conferred by an approved college or university as official recognition for the completion of a course of study. (Only the highest degree conferred should be used in this report.)

Entering: The source from which a staff member new to the school or district was recruited.

Experience: Whole year of professional, educational employment (excluding current year) in a public school, college or university.

Full-Time: The period of time in each day required for full-time certificated staff employment shall be the number of hours prescribed by the local board of education, but shall be not less than (4) clock hours.

Full-Time Equivalent: The amount of time for a less-than-full-time activity divided by the amount of time normally required for a corresponding full-time activity.

Laborers: Staff members in full-time positions performing manual labor and not classified in another activity assignment classification.

Leaving: The relocation of a staff member from the site reported in the previous year.

New Hires: Refers to persons who were hired for the first time or after a break in service for full-time employment in the district and who appear on the payroll for the first time between July 1 and October 1. DO NOT COUNT PERSONNEL RETURNING FROM OFFICIAL LEAVES OF ABSENCE GRANTED BY THE DISTRICT.

Non-Certificated Professional Staff: Staff members in full-time positions for which a certificate issued by the State Board of Examiners is not required for the performance of professional services in the school or district. Includes persons engaged in administration such as accountants and attorneys, in health services such as doctors, dentists and psychiatrists, in facilities planning and operation such as architects and engineers.

Part-Time: A certificated staff member whose total current assignments require less than his or her full-time services. A part-time staff member may be employed full-time for part of the school or academic year or part-time for part or all of the school or academic year.

Racial/Ethnic Groups: A staff member may be included in the group to which he or she appears to belong, identifies with, or is regarded as belonging to in the community. However, no person should be counted in more than one racial/ethnic category. The categories are: white, Not of Hispanic Origin; black, Not of Hispanic Origin; Hispanic, American Indian or Alaskan Native and Asian or Pacific Islander.

Rate: The total hourly, daily, weekly, or monthly wage, to be paid for services rendered.

Salary: The total amount, specified by contract, to be paid for services rendered.

School Year: The school year begins on July 1 and ends on June 30.

Social Security Number: The unique identification number assigned to a person by the Social Security Administration.

Service Workers: Staff members in full-time positions performing paraprofessional services in cafeteria, maintenance, transportation, etc. Include paraprofessionals and non-supervisory personnel in cafeteria and transportation work, custodial workers with the responsibility for cleanliness of buildings, maintaining and operating equipment such as heating and ventilating systems; preserving the security of school property and keeping the school plant safe for occupancy and use.

Skilled Crafts: Staff members in full-time positions performing jobs which require special manual skill and a thorough and comprehensive knowledge of the processes involved in the work which is acquired through on-the-job training and experience or through apprenticeship or other formal training programs. Includes mechanics, carpenters, electricians, plumbers, heavy equipment operators, stationary engineers, skilled machinery operators, compositors, typesetters and kindred workers.

Teacher Aides: Staff members in full-time positions performing assigned activities which assist a staff member to perform professional-educational-teaching assignments. Includes persons such as teacher aides, library aides, playground aides, guidance aides, etc.

Technicians: Staff members in full-time positions requiring a combination of knowledge and manual skill which can be obtained through approximately two years of post-high school education, such as is offered in many technical institutes, junior colleges and/or through equivalent on-the-job training. Includes computer programmers and operators, film inspectors, projectionist, graphic artists, draftsmen, technicians (medical and dental) and similar occupations which cannot be properly classified in other activity assignments.
