Spread the News that New Jersey Families Can Get \$1,000 per Child Through SimpleFile

The state of New Jersey has just launched SimpleFile.NJ.gov, a website that makes it easy for eligible New Jerseyans to receive a \$1,000 cash benefit per child under 6 years old.

New Jersey needs your help to ensure non-filers can apply for the credit to pay for food, housing, child care, and other essentials. You're invited to join the outreach campaign and help connect more families to the money they're owed. Ready to get started? Become an outreach partner in three simple steps:

1. Join the campaign.

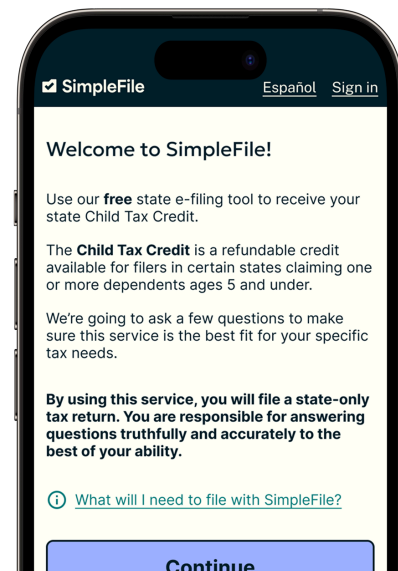
2. Share with the families you serve.

[The SimpleFile Outreach Toolkit](#) is available in 14 languages. Use the materials in whatever ways work best for your library—text messages, emails, websites, newsletters, benefits portals, social media, or printed materials. Research shows that direct outreach, especially text messages, is the most effective way to reach eligible families.

3. Track your impact.

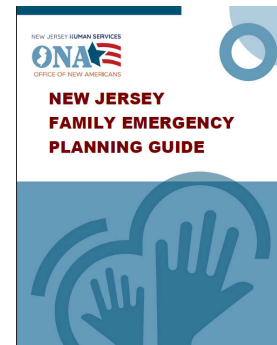
After you receive your referral link, you'll gain access to a partner dashboard where you can see how many families your outreach reached, how many returns were submitted and accepted, and the impact your library is making.

Program Overview: Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian (LB21) projects build a library and archival workforce that can meet the information needs of communities and increase the institutional capacity of libraries, archives, and library and information science graduate programs across the country.

Children's Book Project Grant for Rural Libraries

The Children's Book Project Program Grant from The Pilcrow Foundation helps rural libraries expand their children's collections with new, quality hardcover books. The program provides a 2-to-1 match for libraries that raise \$200–\$400 from local sponsors, allowing them to receive up to \$1,200 in



children's books selected from a curated list of hundreds of award-winning titles. Applications are accepted from independent rural public libraries, tribal libraries, and libraries within county, regional, or cooperative systems that serve rural communities and have limited operating budgets.
