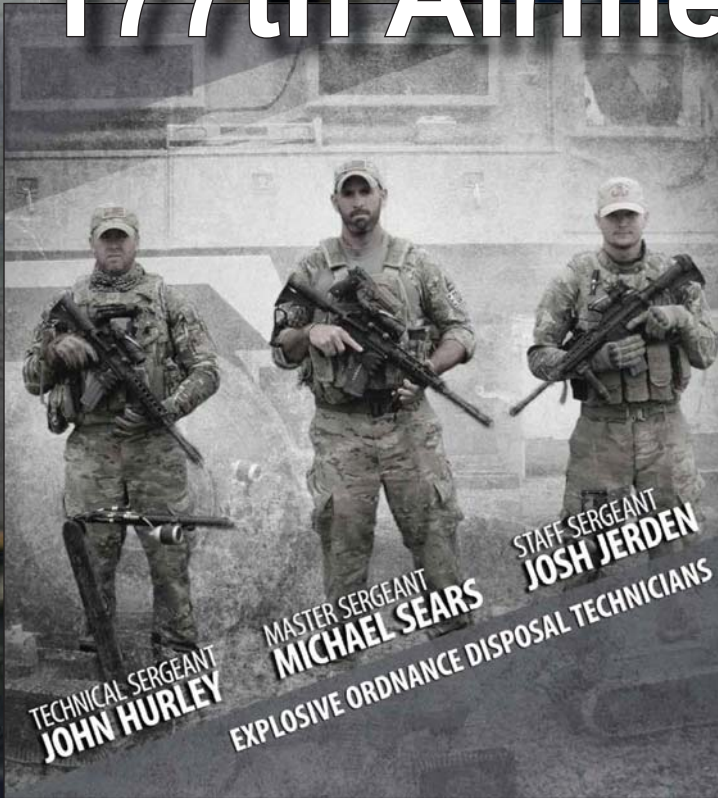

WING CHOOSES AIRMEN OF THE YEAR



Air Force highlights 177th Airmen



The 177th Fighter Wing's Master Sgt. Michael Sears and Tech. Sgt. John Hurley were featured in the Air Force's Portraits in Courage series this month.

The two Airmen were part of three-man Explosive Ordnance Disposal team that included active duty Air Force Staff Sgt. Josh Jerden.

On Sept. 29, 2012, the team found itself in the middle of an ambush in Ghazni province, Afghanistan. During the two-hour firefight, Hurley delivered cover fire from the EOD vehicle's turret while Sears provided life-saving aid to a fallen coalition soldier from Poland. Jerden moved the EOD vehicle to provide cover for Sears and the wounded soldier.

Twice, Sears escorted medics to the wounded soldier across 100-foot wide open area while under continuous fire.

The attacking insurgents were foiled and the wounded soldier was moved to Bagram Airfield Hospital.

Sears received the Silver Star and Purple Heart. Hurley and Jerden were both submitted for the Air Force Commendation with Valor.

108th Wing chooses Airmen of the Year

Master Sgt. Amanda L. Marotta, Tech. Sgt. John C. Hoffecker and Senior Airman Tyshawn G. Jenkins.

Marotta serves with the 108th Civil Engineer Squadron as an emergency management specialist.

Hoffecker is a senior intelligence analyst with the 204th Intelligence Squadron.

Jenkins works as a fuels systems technician with the 108th Maintenance Squadron.

What do they have in common?

They were chosen as the 108th Wing's Airmen of the Year.

These individuals' skills, training and volunteerism epitomizes the 108th.

According to 108th Civil Engineer Squadron commander, Lt. Col. Paul E. Novello, Marotta is a motivational leader, who transformed an inexperienced Emergency Management Shop into a premiere fight that was lauded by the Air Mobility Command inspectors during the Unit Effectiveness Inspection where the Wing received a highly effective rating. In addition, she was handpicked as the Ancillary Training Tiger Team subject matter expert. Marotta also works with Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst units to improve emergency management capabilities base-wide.

Hoffecker, notes Lt. Col. Robert Kelly, the 204th Intelligence Squadron commander, was specifically chosen for a Title 10, active duty tour where he served as an intelligence instructor. During the tour, he trained 300 intelligence and security forces Airmen. He also served as the noncommissioned officer in charge of the 607th Air Operations Cell in Exercise Ulchi Freedom Guardian in South Korea. Finally, Hoffecker was chosen to develop the National Guard Bureau's 20 lesson, 40-hour anti-terrorism level II mobile training course, which filled a national level need for force protection training certification for the Air National Guard.

Maintenance Squadron commander Col. Steven F. Jamison said that Jenkins is an outstanding role model for peers and demonstrated his organizational skills by creating new safety books for all shops assigned to the Wing's Accessory Section. He assists in the training of newly assigned personnel and in retraining personnel. Jenkins was part of a group that created an annual confined space training program that emphasized emergency procedures.

In addition to these accomplishments, the Airmen embody the characteristics that define how the Air National Guard and specifically, the 108th is an integral part of the community.

Hoffecker volunteers with the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs support program by driving five veterans who have no means of transportation to their appointments at VA hospitals.

Marotta was recognized during National Volunteer Week for dedicating more 100 hours to the Salvation Army of Mercer County.

Jenkins is a member of the Wing's Honor Guard, which serves as a visible example of the Air Force in ceremonies ranging from change of commands to funerals for veterans.

They also represent what is unique to the Guard – a dedication to education.

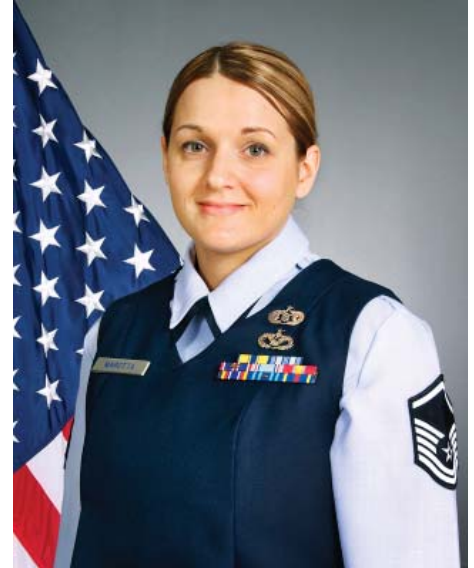
Jenkins is working on his master of business administration degree. He currently has a 3.7 grade point average, all while at the same time passing the Air Force Officer Qualifying Test.

Marotta not only earned a bachelor's in work force education, but also made the dean's list with a 4.0 grade point average. She is currently working on her master's degree in homeland security. To top that off, she completed the senior non-commissioned officer correspondence course and was selected for the SNCO academy class.

Hoffecker has four associate degrees from the Community College of the Air Force, the fourth being in intelligence studies. While attending the Defense Intelligence Agencies Counter Terrorism Analysis Course, he was the honor graduate.

These three individuals have set an impressive benchmark.

Recruiters get new leader

He began his military career as an Army field artilleryman and then joined the New Jersey Army National Guard, where he held nearly every non-commissioned officer position in the Recruiting and Retention Battalion.

But when word came to Sgt. Maj. Thomas Dwyer that the promotion his career had been building to had arrived, he was in the dentist chair. He didn't stay there for long. Dwyer made his way immediately to Joint Force Headquarters, where he met with top leaders, who broke the news that Dwyer would be taking over as the supervisor of all of the state's field recruiters.

"I wouldn't be in this position without you," Dwyer told the state's two dozen recruiters who gathered Feb. 4 for his promotion ceremony at the National Guard Training Center in Sea Girt.

Dwyer will report to Command Sgt. Maj. Robert Huster, who took the battalion's top enlisted spot in August.

Dwyer is taking over an important job in a state that's had one of the most successful sustained recruiting efforts in the National Guard.

"He's got the future strength of the National Guard on his shoulders," said Maj. Andrew Lazarchick, the commander

of the Recruiting and Retention Battalion.

Brig. Gen. Michael Cunniff, The Adjutant General, said recruiting is the lifeblood of the National Guard.

"The recruiting battalion makes the National Guard work," Cunniff said.

Have a chimney? Save money by blocking it.

Did You Know...

All this snow and cold weather might be making you want to snuggle up to a cozy fire.

But always remember to block your chimney after you're done using it!

If you forget, heat will go up the chimney, and your heating bill will go up with it. If your chimney isn't blocked, you could lose more than \$200 worth of heated air during the course of a year. If you never use your chimney, you can cap it, or if you use it occasionally, you can block the draught with an inflatable chimney balloon.
