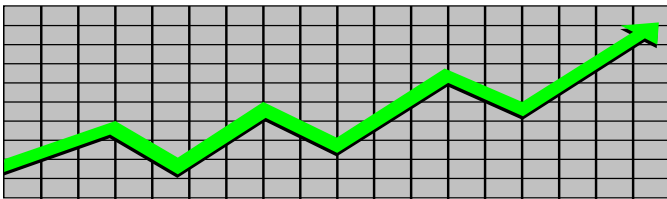

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## **DIVISION OF FAMILY DEVELOPMENT CURRENT PROGRAM STATISTICS NOVEMBER 2012**

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Each month the Division of Family Development publishes its program statistics for: WFNJ/TANF, NJ SNAP, Emergency Assistance, General Assistance, and Child Support Services. When possible, information is provided separately for children and adults. Many tables also provide trend data with information broken down by county for readers to consider. This report is compiled and prepared by The Bureau of Research & Reporting.

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### **WFNJ/TANF**

- As of the end of November, the TANF caseload had decreased by 1,464 cases, from 41,199 in November 2011 to 39,735 in November 2012, a decrease of 3.6%.
- The counties with the highest family caseload percentage increase since November 2011 include Passaic (7.2%), Ocean (6.6%), and Warren (5.1%).
- The counties with caseloads that decreased since November 2011 were Morris (-13.8%), Bergen (-13.8%), and Hunterdon (-25.4%).
- Of the WFNJ/TANF cases, 8,302 or 20.9% were child-only in November 2012.
- The counties with the most child-only cases were Essex (1,344), Camden (1,111), and Hudson (1,036).
- Essex (21,493), Passaic (13,014), and Camden (11,620) counties had the greatest number of persons receiving TANF in November 2012.

### **NJ SNAP (formerly FOOD STAMPS)**

- In November 2012, there were 419,247 households receiving NJ SNAP benefits. The number of NJ SNAP households increased by 33,070, or 8.6%, since November 2011.
- There were 842,384 persons receiving NJ SNAP benefits as of November 2012, an increase of 59,160 or 7.6% since November 2011.
- The three counties having the highest caseload increase since November 2011 are Middlesex (19.1%), Monmouth (18.2%), and Ocean (13.5%).

### **EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE**

- There were 6,270 families receiving Emergency Assistance (EA) in November 2012, a decrease of 804 or 11.4% since November 2011.
- In November 2012, EA payments were made for 1,520 SSI recipients.

**GENERAL ASSISTANCE**

**GA Emergency Assistance**

- There were 5,818 Emergency Assistance payments made to GA cases in November 2012, a decrease of 1,340 or 18.7% since November 2011.
- The three counties that show an annual percent increase in emergency assistance payments are Gloucester (37.9%), Cumberland (37.3), and Middlesex (24.6%).

**GA Program**

- The total numbers of cases receiving GA has decreased from 45,121 to 40,259 since November 2011, a decrease of 10.8%.
- There were 27,485 Employable GA and 12,774 Unemployable GA cases in November 2012.
- In November 2012, GA cases showed a 3.1 percent decrease since October 2012.

**CHILD SUPPORT SERVICES (Quarterly Report)**

- The total collection for the Child Support Services Program was about \$305 million from July 2012 to September 2012, a decrease of 1 percent over the same period for FFY 2011.
- Total distributions increased over 0.1% from September 2011.

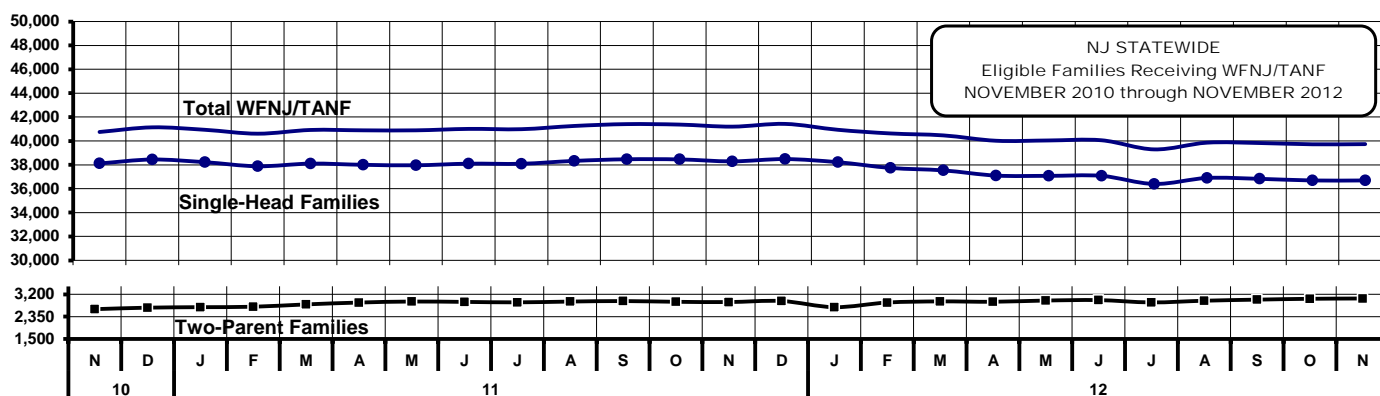
**WORK FIRST NEW JERSEY (WFNJ)**

- During the report month of November 2012, there were 4,288 families in which at least one member was employed and an additional 716 families whose WFNJ assistance cases were closed due to employment - related earnings.
- The three counties with the greatest number of employed active WFNJ recipients were: Essex (964), Camden (514), and Hudson (513).
- There were 3,554 former TANF cases receiving post-TANF support in the form of child care assistance.

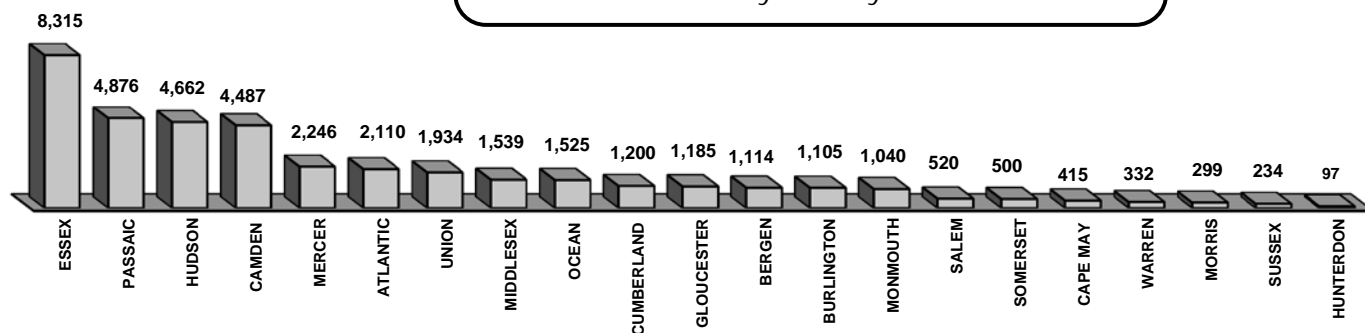

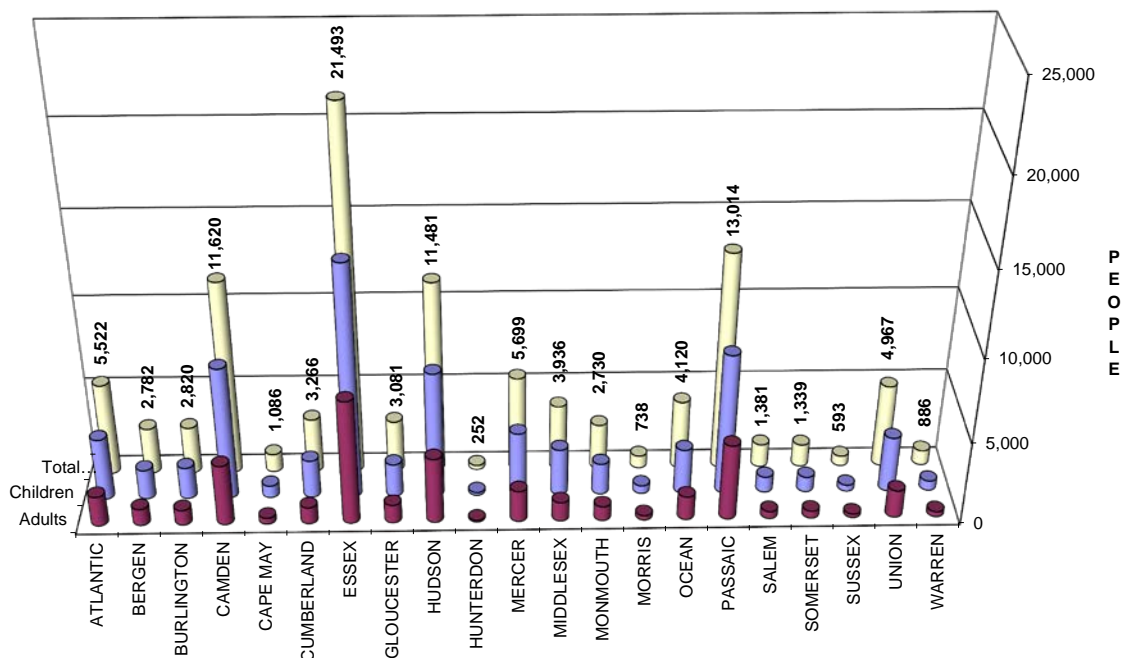

Ending With NOVEMBER 2012**

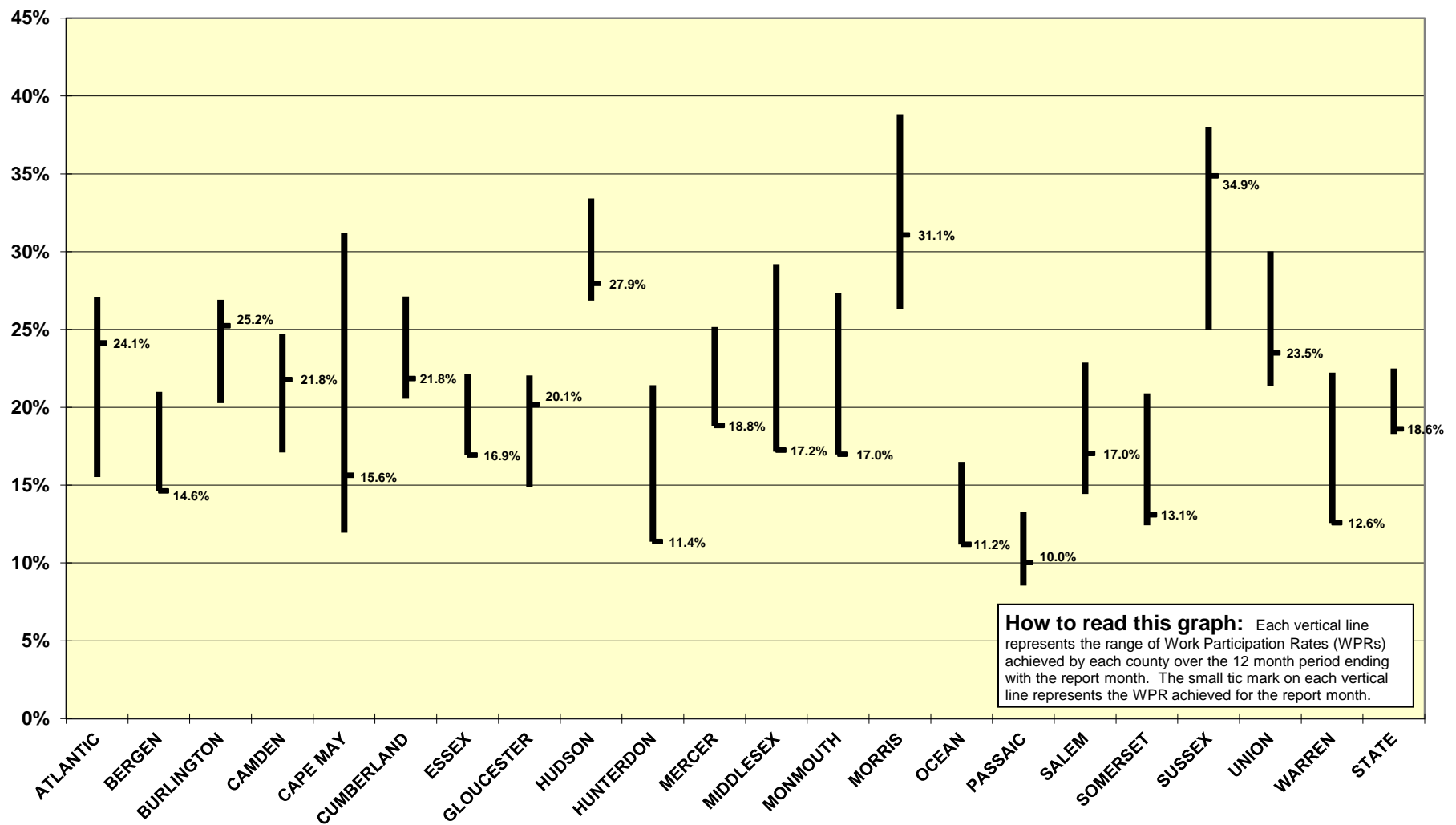
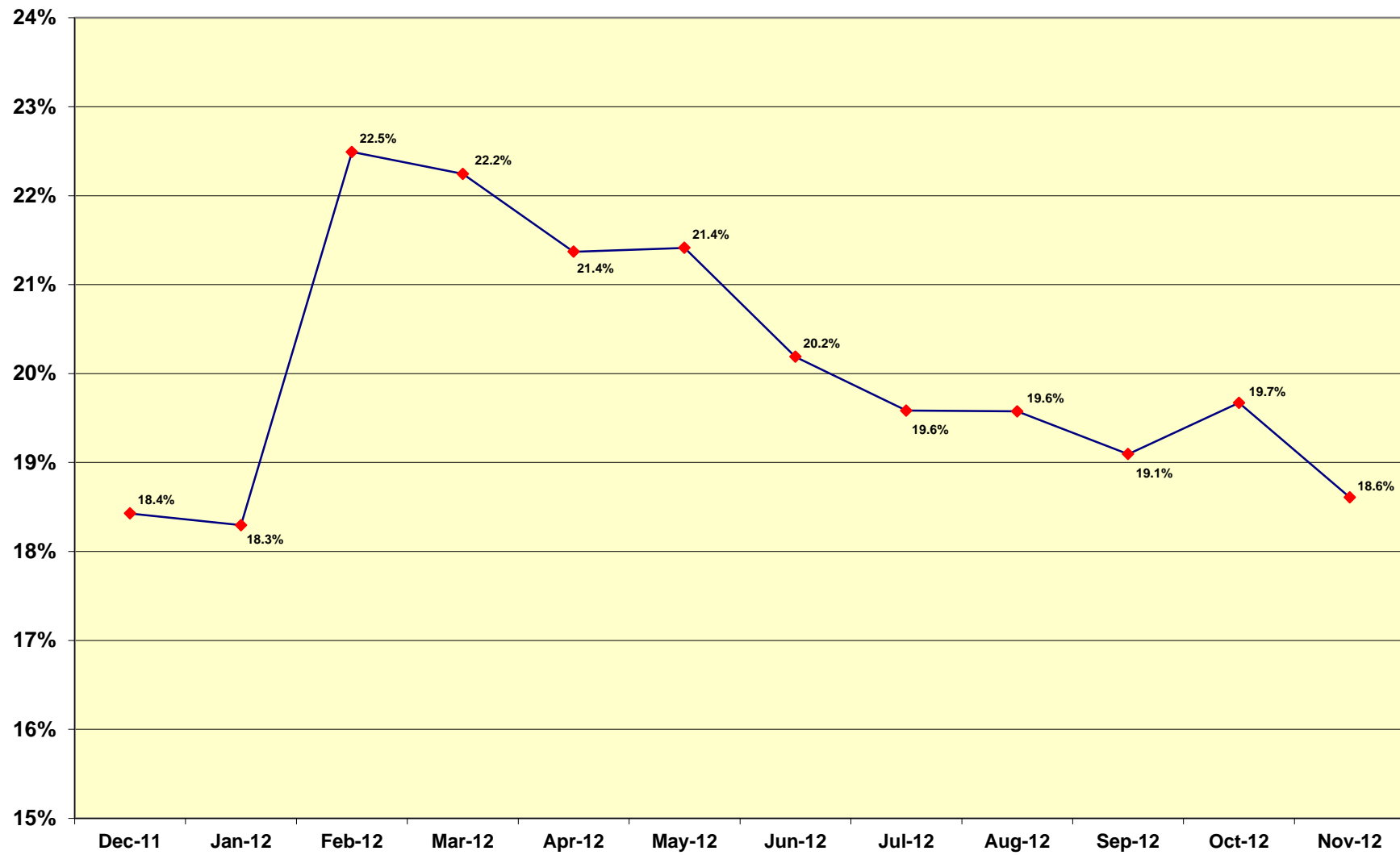

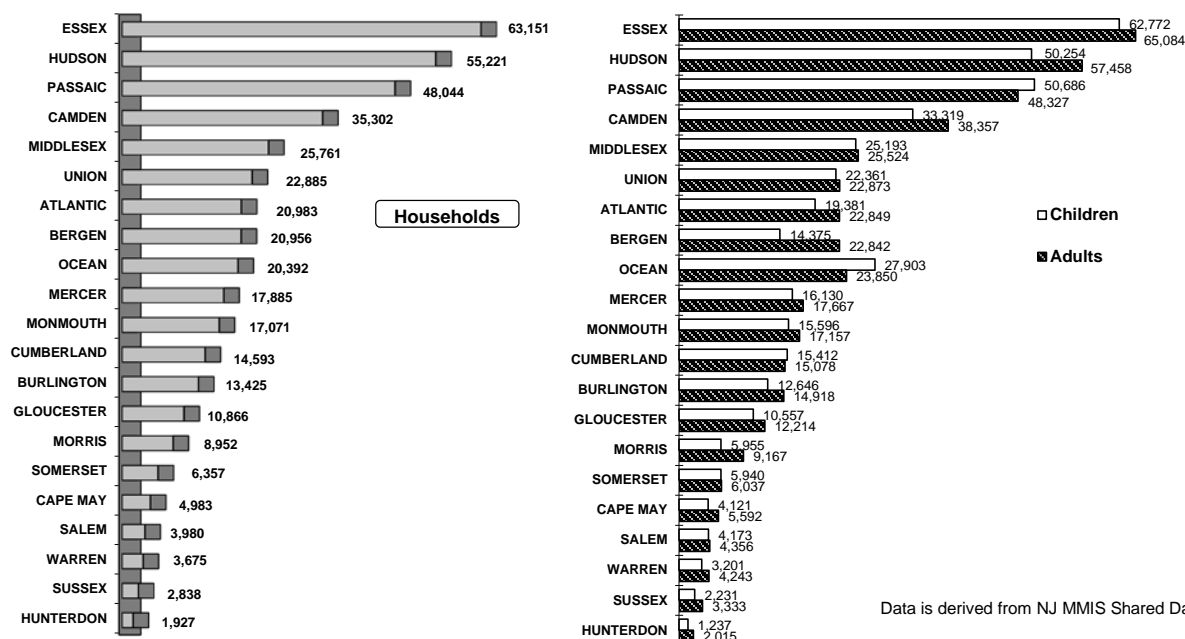
**TABLE 6: NJ SNAP (FOOD STAMPS)

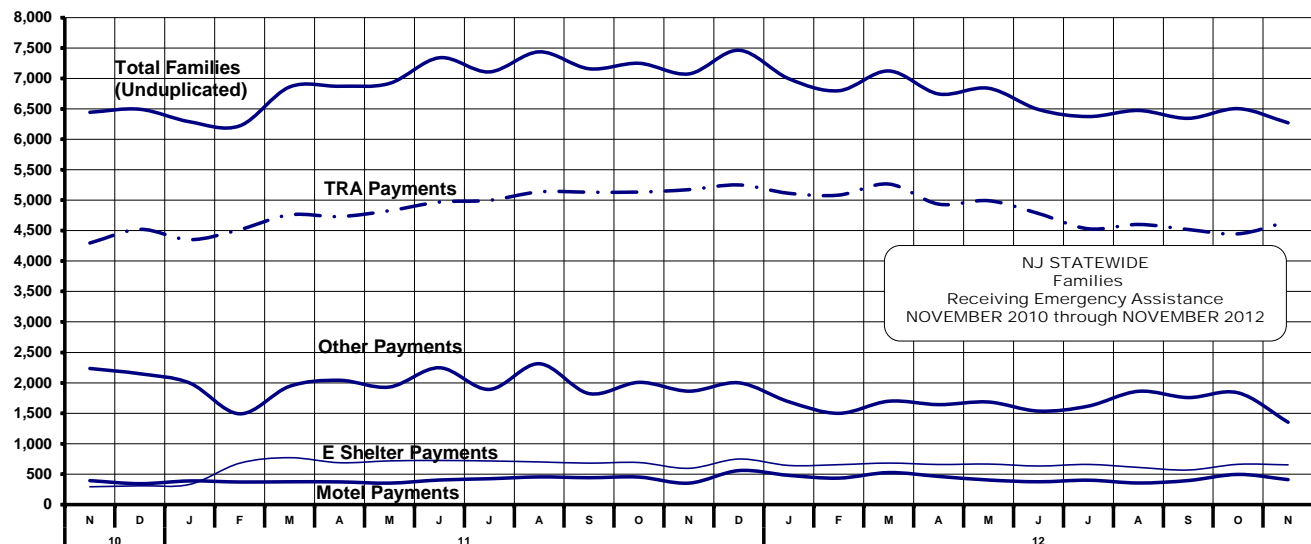

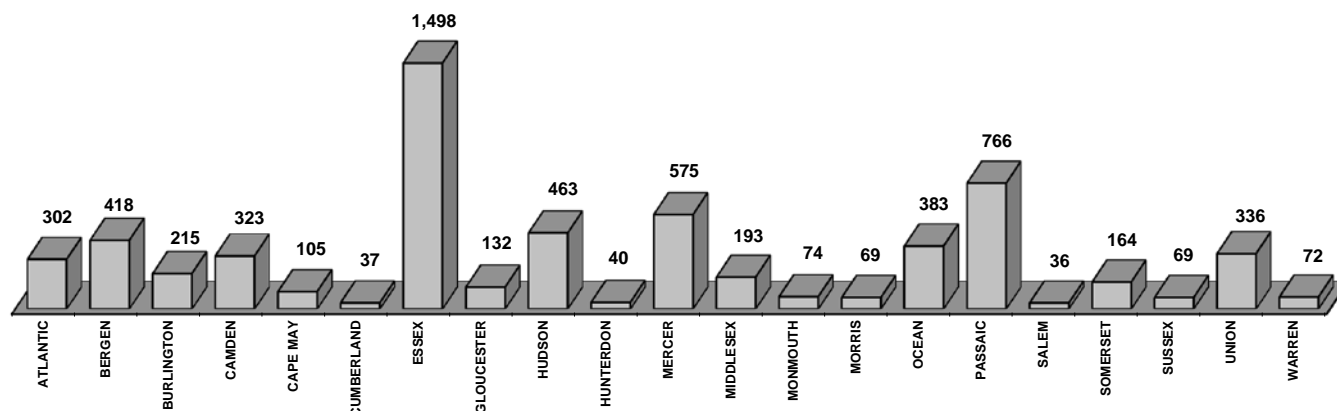
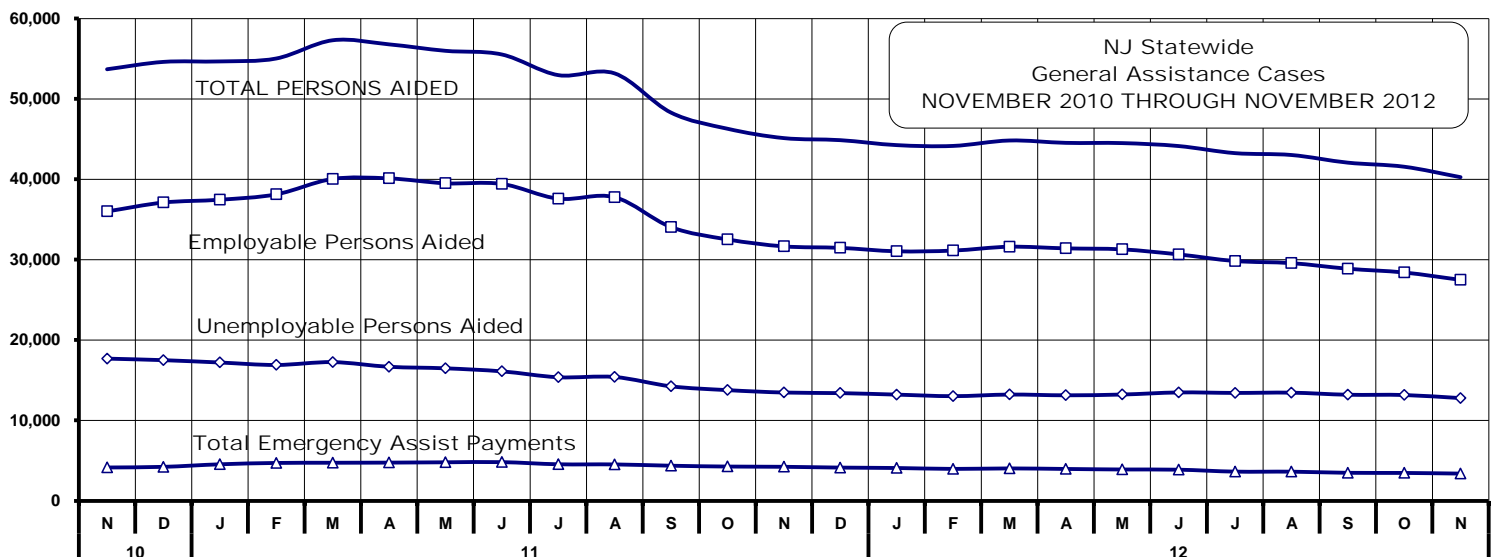

## **ACRONYMS**

**CASS:** Consolidated Assistance and Support System

**EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE (EA)** - Payments to those eligible for WFNJ/TANF or WFNJ/GA, authorized during the 30 consecutive days immediately following the emergency (defined as a substantial loss of shelter, food, clothing, or household furnishings by fire, flood or other similar disaster) or if eligible individual or family is in an imminent or actual state of homelessness.

**NJ SNAP** - Formerly the Food Stamp Program, now known as **NJ SNAP** (NJ Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program) authorized by Congress as a nutritional supplement program to provide low income households with more food of greater variety and better nutrition. Program eligibility is based on household income, resources, and expenses for medical, shelter, and dependent care. CWA staff refers certain recipients to the New Jersey Department of Labor for participation in the Food Stamp Employment and Training Program.

**FAMIS:** Family Assistance Management Information System

**GAAS:** General Assistance Automated System

**NJKiDS:** New Jersey Kids Deserve Support (Child Support Information Management System)

**NJ MMIS SHARED DATA WAREHOUSE:** The Shared Data Warehouse (SDW) is the repository for New Jersey's DFD and Medicaid data. Since 2003, OptumInsight has administered the SDW and provided access to the data through a reporting tool known as Business Objects.

**OMEGA:** Online Management of Economic Goal Achievement

**SSI-EA:** Supplemental Security Income-Emergency Assistance

**WFNJ:** Work First New Jersey - Fully implemented July 1, 1997, this is New Jersey's welfare reform program which responds to the requirements of the Federal Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (**PRWORA**) of 1996. PRWORA established Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (**TANF**) as the replacement for AFDC cash assistance. WFNJ includes two segments, **WFNJ/TANF** for families with children, and **WFNJ/GA** (General Assistance) for single adults and couples without dependent children. WFNJ emphasizes achieving self-sufficiency and limits lifetime receipt of financial assistance to a total of five years.
