SUBJECT: Increased Income Eligibility Standards; New Jersey
Care...Special Medicaid Programs and NJ KidCare

This is to advise that the federal poverty level guidelines for 2000 were published in the February 15, 2000 issue of the Federal Register. Attached are the corresponding new income standards for the New Jersey Care...Special Medicaid Programs and NJ KidCare. These new standards are retroactively effective to January 1, 2000 for both programs.

The county board of social services (CBOSS) shall immediately review all cases that would otherwise have been terminated from New Jersey Care as a result of the Social Security cost-of-living increase. No action is required for those cases that remain eligible under the new income standards. Any of the continued cases which are not eligible under the new standards shall be terminated effective May 1, 2000. Adverse action requirements must, of course, be met.

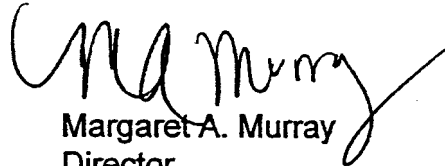
Because these standards are retroactively effective to January 1, 2000, the CBOSS shall review all New Jersey Care and NJ KidCare cases denied for excess income since that date to determine which would be eligible under the new standards. Any case found to be eligible shall be accreted to the eligibility file with an effective date of January 1, 2000 or the date of application, whichever is later.

NJ KidCare cases found to have income in excess of 133% of the 2000 federal poverty level shall be forwarded to the State designated eligibility determination agency for processing as NJ KidCare Plan B, Plan C or Plan D. Please mail these cases to:
