Report of the Board of Shell Fisheries

To the Honorable Walter E. Edge, Governor:—

Having had only a period of eight months as the time of the fiscal year just closed, we are at a loss to know just how to make our report, as the close of the fiscal year comes at a time when the season is practically closed for the catching and shipping of oysters and at a season when it is impossible for the planters and growers of oysters to make any estimate as to their crops of marketable oysters for the ensuing oyster year, which opens September 1st. One thing, however, we can and will report with a great deal of regret, is that the terribly cold and stormy winter caused a very heavy death rate and that, together with the heavy northeast storm of the late spring, killed more oysters and ruined more planting ground than was ever experienced by the oldest planters and in some parts of the State caused a very heavy death rate on the natural beds. In consequence of this condition, we fear that there will be a scarcity of oysters for the season 1918-1919, whereas in our report of last year, we predicted that New Jersey would increase her output.

In our report of last year we called attention to the fact of the hazardous nature of the business, not dreaming that the coming winter would entail the greatest loss we had ever sustained, but this is a case of taking the bitter with the sweet, but most unfortunately for the coast section it has been a case of getting the bitter only for several years and as it costs much more to handle a crop where the death rate is so heavy, it has been unusually hard for the planters.

As if to completely discourage the planters on the coast, the drum fish come during the planting season in May and June and destroy what has just been planted and a large part of what had formerly been planted, and which escaped the winter and storms. Then, when the planters ask permission to use dynamite to try and drive the drum fish away as they enter the inlet, thereby saving a small portion of their crops,

a howl of complaint goes up to the Fish and Game Commission that the food fish are being destroyed. There was no foundation for the complaints, however, as those who used the dynamite were instructed to use the utmost care in exploding the same and to watch for the shoals of drum fish as they entered the inlets. By exploding the charges when the drum fish were directly over them the fish were either killed or so badly frightened that they put to sea and in that way are kept out of the bays and away from the oyster beds. As no other fish travel with or near the drum fish, we claim that no damage is done to the food fish by the use of dynamite, and in 1903, when they dynamited and killed thousands of drum fish there were no food fish killed, neither was fishing in our bays affected.

For the purpose of getting in closer touch with the method of shellfish culture in other parts of the country, arrangements were made by the Director with the members of the Shellfish Commission of Rhode Island and Connecticut for a meeting with the Commissioners of those States for a trip of inspection of their shellfish grounds. This trip was made by starting for Providence, R. I., on Monday, July 22, 1918, arriving there about 5:30 o'clock Tuesday morning, where we were met at 8 o'clock A. M., by Hon. Edward Atchison, Mr. William T. Lewis and Dr. Milton Duckworth, Commissioners, and a number of the leading oyster planters of the State. The Commissioners had made arrangements with the State Engineer to use his cruiser for the trip. This was a wise selection, as we discovered after going aboard, where we were very hospitably entertained. We spent most of the day looking over the shellfish grounds of Providence River and Narragansett Bay, visiting the State Lobster Hatchery and discussing, and comparing with ours, their methods, laws, rules and regulations. One thing that they brought very forcibly to our attention was what is known on the Jersey coast as soft clams. These are gathered in great quantities throughout that section where there is a great demand for them as they are considered very delicious. The demand has been so great that the grounds on which they grow and for which there was no protection

became depleted to a very great extent. In consequence of this the Commissioners of Shell Fisheries closed a small section of this producing ground for a period of time sufficient to allow the small set mature. They pointed this plot of ground out to us and said they had opened it up to the public about six weeks before and that forty-five thousand bushels of clams were gathered in the first three weeks. They also said that notwithstanding the fact that the closing of this small piece of ground has resulted in this most wonderful increase in the product, still many of those who were benefitted were loud in their condemnation of the closing of the grounds but that it was the purpose of the Commissioners to continue to close portions of these producing grounds each year. Wednesday and Wednesday evening was spent in New Haven and surrounding cities with Mr. Howard Marshall, Secretary of the Shell Fish Commission of Connecticut, visiting various oyster opening, packing and shipping houses and points of interest.

Thursday, the 25th, we met several other officials of the Shell Fish Commission of Connecticut and went on board the State guard and inspection boat. Here we found the State Engineer, who is also a Biologist, and the Captain, who is somewhat of an expert from a practical standpoint. These men were carrying on extensive experiments in propagation, both from a scientific and practical standpoint; they were thoroughly interested in their work and seemed to feel that they had a very good chance to solve the problem as to why they have had no set or growth of young oysters in those waters for three years. This also was a most delightful and satisfactory trip and we feel that the trip as a whole has been time well spent and an expenditure of money that was very justifiable, as we came back to our State feeling that we have the greatest opportunity for developing this industry of any section of the country, due in a very great measure to the laws that have been passed for the protection of the industry and the fairly good encouragement of the same.

Again referring to the soft clam, we desire to call your attention to the fact that the State of Massachusetts leases these grounds for the cultivation of these clams and in this

way the quantity has been greatly increased and the quality very much improved.

New Jersey has several thousand acres of bar grounds suitable for soft clam culture where these clams do not grow natural to any extent, also several hundred acres where these clams do set in enormous quantities. Unfortunately, the grounds where this natural growth occurs are not sheltered and protected from the elements as are the grounds of Connecticut, Rhode Island and Massachusetts. They are located around the inlets on our Coast and are exposed to the fury of the storms from the ocean which annually occur and destroy the young growth by covering them with the shifting sands, sometimes to a depth of from one to two feet. We believe that by leasing the grounds that are sheltered from these dangers, planting thereon the great quantities of small clams that could be gathered from the exposed grounds before the season when the heavy storms occur, an industry could be built up that would far exceed in quantity the hard clam industry of the State. We would, therefore, recommend that legislation be enacted that would open up for leasing, for this purpose the grounds that are suitable in various sections of the State which are now reserved from lease for any purpose, as these reservations contain possibly one-half of the grounds of the State that are best suited to this purpose.

We desire to call your attention to what we consider one of the most valuable shell fish producing grounds in our State. This consists of portions of Raritan and Sandy Hook Bays, which we consider as of especial value for oyster culture, but because of the sentiment of that element of the people who want to depend on nature to furnish them a livelihood, and a more or less sympathetic public, this exceptionally valuable oyster ground has been held as a public clam ground. These grounds, if made available through legislation for leasing for oyster culture, would, we believe, produce a revenue of at least Ten Thousand Dollars, and possibly Fifteen Thousand Dollars, and develop an industry of possibly one-third to one-half the magnitude of the Maurice River Cove Department. We do earnestly recommend that such legislation be enacted at the coming session.
