### Employers Can Obtain NJ Workplace Posters for Free; Available on the Internet or Upon Request

**TRENTON, June 27, 2007** – The posters that New Jersey employers are required to display by the Department of Labor and Workforce Development (LWD) are easily accessible and free of charge.

“It is important that workers know their rights and we want to make it easy for employers to get the posters that provide this information,” said Labor Commissioner David J. Socolow. “Employers can call (609) 777-3200 to have a package with the postings mailed to them, free of charge. The package also includes a guide with information on how to get other posters required by other state and federal agencies such as the U.S. Department of Labor and the New Jersey Division on Civil Rights.

“LWD posters also can be downloaded over the Internet. Clicking on the button that reads “Employer Poster Packet” on the bottom left of the LWD home page [www.nj.gov/labor](http://www.nj.gov/labor) will take you to the poster site,” Socolow added.

The Department’s Wage and Hour Compliance inspectors carry supplies of the posters and will either provide them for free or guide the employer to the webpage to download the required posting if they do not have one with them.

While all of the posters are available for free, there are companies that sell a consolidated poster so that an employer does not have to obtain separate posters from individual agencies.

However, any private vendor who implies that failing to display their product will expose an employer to fines is gravely misleading the public. Furthermore, it is a crime to impersonate a federal or state government official. Employers who receive such misinformation from vendors selling these kinds of posters should call their local police department to report the event.
