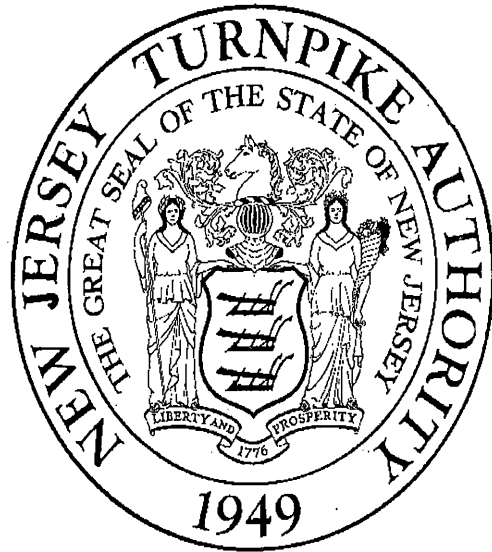

The Authority maintains a property insurance program for the protection of its physical assets on the Garden State Parkway and New Jersey Turnpike including business interruption insurance that protects against an interruption to its business income. This program currently insures all property encompassing all structures on both roadways and provides sufficient limits of coverage, subject to certain sub-limits. Approval of this item would renew the Program for one (1) year.

2026-05-128 Authorization to Accept Settlement from XL Specialty Insurance Company on the Performance Bond Issued on Behalf of Rapid Armored Corporation for Armored Car Services

Rapid Armored Corporation ("Rapid"), the vendor that provided the Authority armored car, banking and money counting services at toll locations on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway abruptly ceased operations on September 12, 2025. The Authority immediately began seeking emergency replacement services on a temporary basis, as well as calling on the performance bonds issued on behalf of Rapid. The surety company that issued the bond for the armored car services is XL Specialty Insurance Company ("XL"). Following settlement negotiations, XL has offered to settle the Authority's claim against XL's bond for an amount of \$558,706 in exchange for a full release of further claims on the bond relating to the armored car services. Approval of this agenda item would authorize the Chief Operating Officer to accept this settlement on behalf of the Authority, and execute any documents necessary to effectuate the settlement.

RE: Authorization for the Chief Operating Officer to Renew the Excess Liability Insurance Program and the Excess Workers' Compensation Program for One (1) Additional Year

(1) Excess Liability Insurance - Self-Insured General Liability and Automobile Liability Insurance Program (June 15, 2026, to June 15, 2027)

(2) Excess Workers' Compensation insurance (June 15, 2026, to June 15, 2027)

Budget Code: 10-822-441010

Amount: not to exceed \$6,345,740

The Authority maintains Excess Liability and Excess Workers' Compensation insurance programs, which will expire on June 15, 2026. The Authority's broker of record, Willis Towers Watson ("Willis") has been tasked with renewing these programs for one or more additional years, upon the same terms and conditions as the expiring policies.

**(1) Excess Liability Insurance – (Self-Insured General Liability and Automobile Liability Insurance Program) (June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2027)**

The Authority maintains \$100 million of Excess Liability Insurance above its \$5 million self-insured retention ("SIR") for General Liability, Automobile Liability and Police Protective Liability claims (the "Program"). After reviewing all quotations for the primary layer, it was determined that, considering price and quality of coverage, Safety National provided the best quotation for the primary layer. With Safety National as the primary insurer, Willis continues to market the remaining layers of the program, upon the same terms and conditions, for up to the full \$100 million limit. Markets that quote will be evaluated by Willis and BGIA, the Authority's insurance and risk management consultant, for price and quality of coverage.

After consulting with BGIA and Willis, the Authority has determined that it would not be in its best interest to increase the deductible, nor to alter the Program in a significant manner. With that consideration, Willis continues to negotiate with the various underwriters to achieve the best program, considering both price and quality of coverage.

The renewal is proposed at a cost not to exceed \$5,750,000 which represents a premium increase and includes all mandatory New Jersey Property Liability Insurance Guarantee Association ("PLIGA") surcharges and other applicable taxes. Willis will continue to market the program up to the renewal date to achieve additional premium savings and enhanced coverage.

Accordingly, authorization is requested for the Chief Operating Officer to renew the Excess Liability Insurance coverage, upon substantially the same terms and conditions as expiring, including Terrorism Risk Insurance Act ("TRIA") coverage, at a total premium, including all applicable state taxes and surcharges including New Jersey PLIGA and New Jersey Excess & Surplus line taxes for a total amount as indicated above.

**(2) Excess Workers' Compensation Insurance (June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2027)**

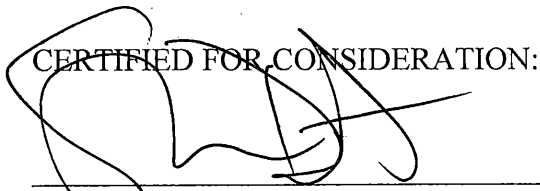
The Authority maintains Excess Workers' Compensation insurance (Statutory) and Employers Liability insurance (\$2,000,000 each accident and each employee for disease) with an SIR of \$1,250,000, with Safety National Insurance Company ("Safety National") that will expire on June 15, 2026. Willis was tasked with soliciting renewal quotations for coverage as expiring. It is recommended that coverage be renewed with the incumbent, Safety National. Safety National did not increase the current rate of \$0.2710 per \$100.00 of payroll for the renewal; and with the increase in payroll, this will result in an annual premium of \$595,740. This premium reflects a 0% increase in rate, and an approximate 3% increase in payroll, and includes TRIA coverage. It is recommended that the Commissioners authorize renewal coverage to be bound for one (1) year as set forth above in an amount not to exceed \$595,740, subject to audit at the end of the policy period.

Safety National has also provided the same terms and conditions, including price and rate, for a one additional renewal year from 6/25/27 to 6/15/28. Authorization is also requested for the Chief Operating Officer to renew the excess Workers Compensation program for a second additional year, upon the same terms and conditions, including premium rate.

It is therefore requested that the Commissioners authorize the Chief Operating Officer to renew the insurance policies and coverages as outlined above. It is further requested that the Commissioners authorize the Chief Operating Officer to take all such actions and to execute all such documents after review and with the recommendation of the Law Department to effectuate the authority set forth above.

**RE:** Authorization to Renew the Authority's Property Insurance Program for Property located on the Garden State Parkway and the New Jersey Turnpike (the "Program") for one (1) year from June 15, 2026 to June 15, 2027, upon the same terms and conditions  
Budget Code: 010-822-121010  
Amount: Not to exceed \$ 13,000,000

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") maintains a property insurance program for the protection of its physical assets and business income (the "Program"). The Program currently provides an All Risk policy which covers all property on both roadways with a total insurable value ("TIV") of \$29,429,245,499 via a primary quota share \$600,000,000 layer. This is supplemented by an excess layer which provides an additional \$200,000,000 layer of coverage. The Program is subject to specified sub-limits for different categories and/or exposures and is subject to a \$2 million per occurrence deductible. Standalone terrorism coverage is provided through Lloyd's of London, which provides broader coverage than insuring Terrorism through the Federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (TRIPRA).

Marsh USA, Inc. ("Marsh"), the Authority's broker of record, was asked to seek quotations for a one (1) year renewal, based on a TIV of \$30,103,332,719 which represents an increase of approximately 2.3% from the prior year's values. As this coverage is complex and the current insurance environment very challenging, Marsh approached the incumbent carriers and sought out new markets, many of whom declined to quote for a variety of reasons that were specific to their individual risk appetite. Markets that quote will be evaluated by Marsh and BGIA, the Authority's insurance and risk management consultant, for price and quality of coverage.

After consulting with BGIA and Marsh, the Authority has determined that it would not be in its best interest to increase the deductible, nor to alter the primary Program in a significant manner. With that consideration, Marsh continues to negotiate with the various underwriters to achieve the best program, considering both price and quality of coverage.

With respect to the \$200 million limit of excess coverage, this renewal would be the second year in a three-year rate plan that Marsh negotiated, with the 2027 premium at \$453,250. Similarly, for the excess terrorism layer, Marsh secured a three-year rate guarantee at \$38,600 for this renewal

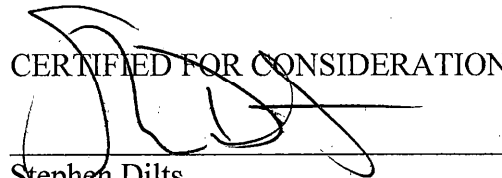
year, and with respect to the standalone Terrorism layer, the renewal rate during for this renewal year will be \$173,684.

It is therefore recommended that the Commissioners authorize renewal of the Authority's Bridge and Non-Bridge property insurance program as set forth above, for a total premium not to exceed \$13,000,000 for all primary excess and terrorism layers of the program as indicated above. It is further recommended that the Chief Operating Officer be authorized to approve the final placement of the various underwriters, after review with the Law department and BGIA. It is further recommended that the Chief Operating Officer, after consultation with the Authority's Law Department, be authorized to execute all documents and to take any and all further actions to effectuate the renewal of the Program as indicated herein.



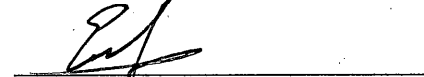

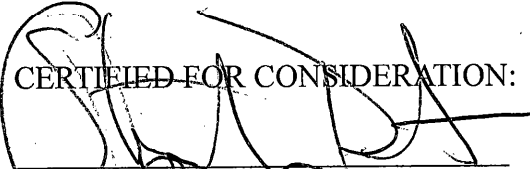
Rapid Armored Corporation ("Rapid") was contracted by the Authority to provide armored car, banking, and/or money counting services at ten (10) Garden State Parkway toll locations and twenty-eight (28) toll locations on the New Jersey Turnpike (the "Services"). On September 12, 2025, Rapid provided notice to its clients that it was permanently ceasing its pickup and delivery services at the end of the day, abruptly ceasing all services to the Authority. The Authority immediately began seeking emergency replacement services on a temporary basis and called on the performance bonds issued on behalf of Rapid. XL Specialty Insurance Company ("XL"), a subsidiary of AXA XL Insurance Reinsurance Company, issued the performance bond as surety for the armored car services contract with Rapid. Following a detailed analysis of damages and extensive settlement negotiations, XL has offered to settle the Authority's claim against XL's performance bond in the sum of Five Hundred Fifty-Eight Thousand, Seven Hundred Six and 00/100 Dollars (\$558,706.00), in exchange for a full release of further claims on the performance bond (the "Release").

Pursuant to the Release, XL and the Authority agree that XL will pay the Authority a settlement of \$558,706.00 within thirty (30) days of receiving the fully executed Release. In consideration for this payment, both XL and the Authority release each other and their related entities from all claims arising out of the contract, services, claim, or bond, except for obligations under the Release. XL further agrees to indemnify and defend the Authority against any claims made by Rapid relating to the same matters, with the right to control the defense and the obligation to notify the Authority if it disputes the indemnification. Both parties agree to cooperate in the handling of any claim raised by Rapid.

Settlement of this matter is advisable given that it delivers financial and operational certainty for the Authority in the resolution of this claim. Acceptance of this fixed amount ensures immediate recovery by the Authority for Rapid's abrupt cessation of services and, crucially, the funds can be deployed by the Authority to secure replacement services and to cover financial expenses resulting from Rapid's unanticipated breach. In addition, acceptance of this settlement offer preserves Authority resources and eliminates the financial costs inherent in a protracted legal dispute.

Based on the foregoing, the Law Department requests the Board of Commissioners approve this settlement pursuant to the terms set forth above and authorize the Chief Operating Officer to execute any and all documents and take all necessary steps to fulfill the intent and purpose of this settlement.

This Agreement will provide for the purchase of mitigation credits to fulfill compensatory requirements for up to 9.664 acres of riparian zone and wetlands impacted by proposed operational improvements to the Garden State Parkway between Mileposts 78.8 to 84.5. The Webbs Mill Branch Mitigation Bank, owned and operated by Evergreen Environmental, LLC, was verified by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to be the only bank within the project's watershed that has available riparian zone and wetland mitigation credits. Procurement will be a sole source, pursuant to the Authority's regulations.

It is, therefore, recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to execute Agreement No. 238-26 with Evergreen Environmental, LLC, to purchase riparian zone and wetland mitigation credits at a cost not to exceed \$7,500,000.00 pursuant to the terms outlined above. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

This Agreement was procured under the sole source procurement authorization of N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1, promulgated under N.J.S.A. 27:23-1 et seq., the Authority's enabling legislation. A resolution, as required by N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1, is attached hereto.

**WHEREAS**, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection CAFRA / Flood Hazard Area & Waterfront Development Permit and Freshwater Wetlands Individual Permit (NJDEP Permit #1500-22-0002.2 LUP240001 and NJDEP Permit #1500-22-0002.2 LUP240002) issued for the Project will require construction of a mitigation site, site preservation, or the purchase of mitigation credits from riparian and wetland mitigation banks within the local watershed to mitigate impacts to the riparian zone by the Project; and

**WHEREAS**, such aforementioned permits will allow the Authority to purchase riparian and wetland mitigation credits from Evergreen Environmental, LLC; and

**WHEREAS**, as of December 2, 2025 the Webbs Mill Branch Mitigation Bank operated by Evergreen Environmental, LLC located in Lacey Township, Ocean County, New Jersey was verified by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to be the only currently approved mitigation bank with riparian mitigation credits servicing Watershed Management Area 13; and the Great Bay Mitigation Bank operated by Evergreen Environmental, LLC located in Bass River Township, Burlington County, New Jersey was verified by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, to be the only currently approved mitigation bank with wetland mitigation credits servicing non-Pineland areas in Watershed Management Area 13; and

**WHEREAS**, the Engineering Department has determined that the purchasing of mitigation credits is found to be the most cost-effective method of mitigation and will allow for the Project to proceed on schedule; and

**WHEREAS**, the Authority’s regulations, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1 promulgated under N.J.S.A. 27:23-1, permit sole source procurement when only one source for the required product exists.

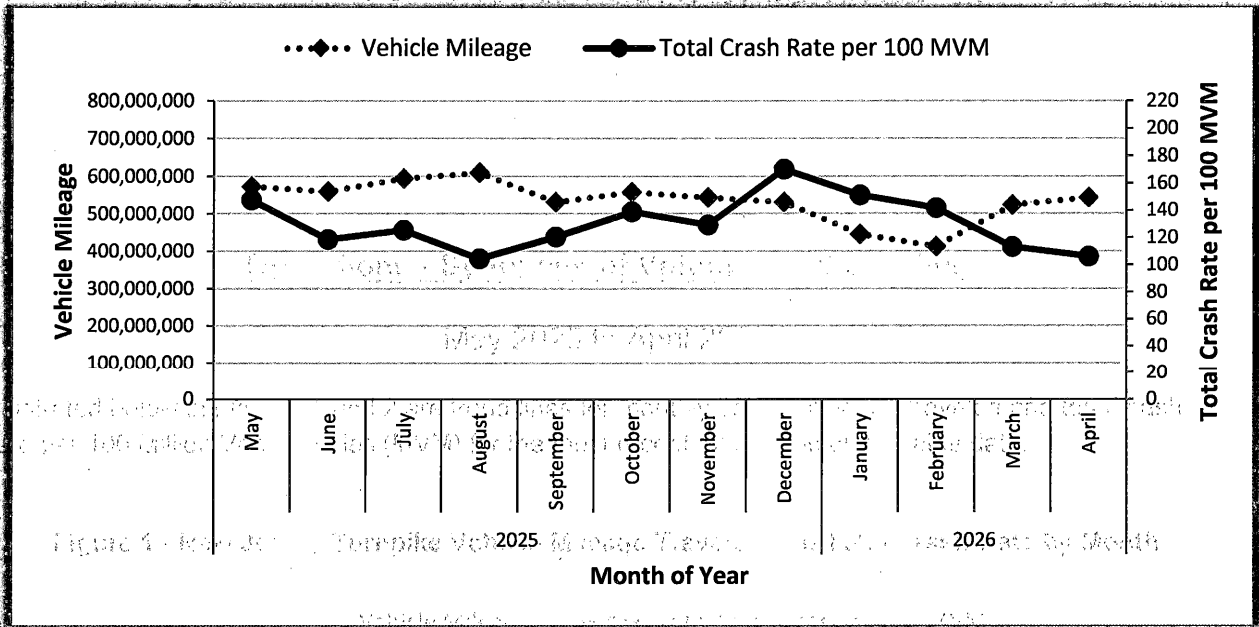

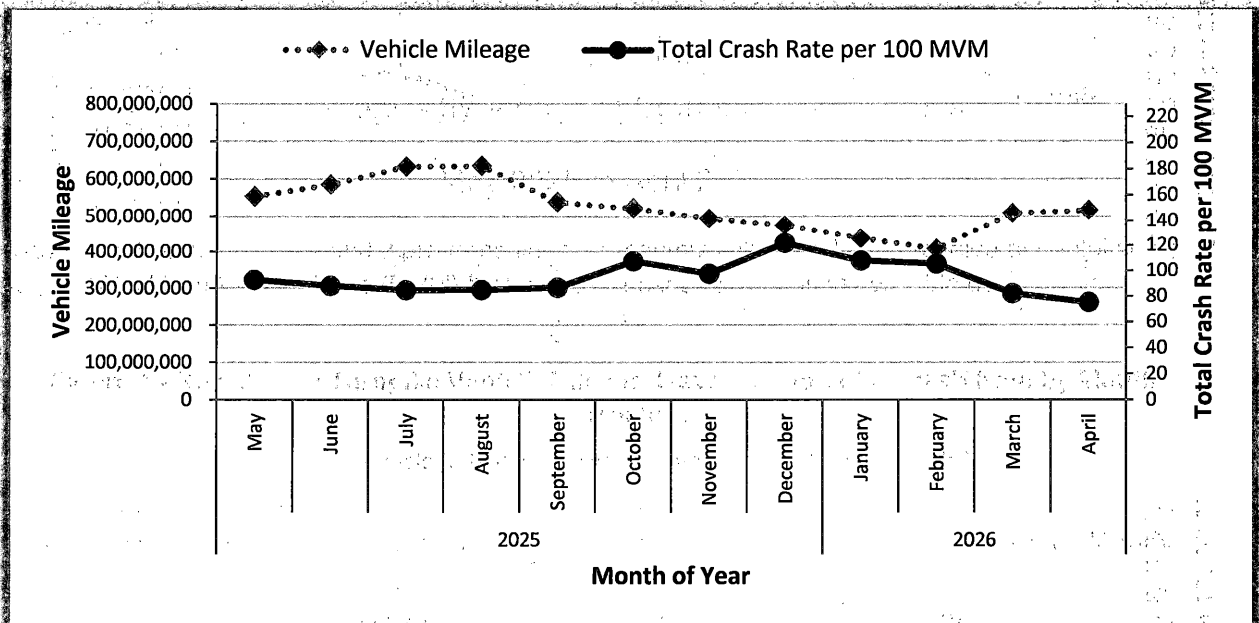

**Figure 1 - New Jersey Turnpike Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month**

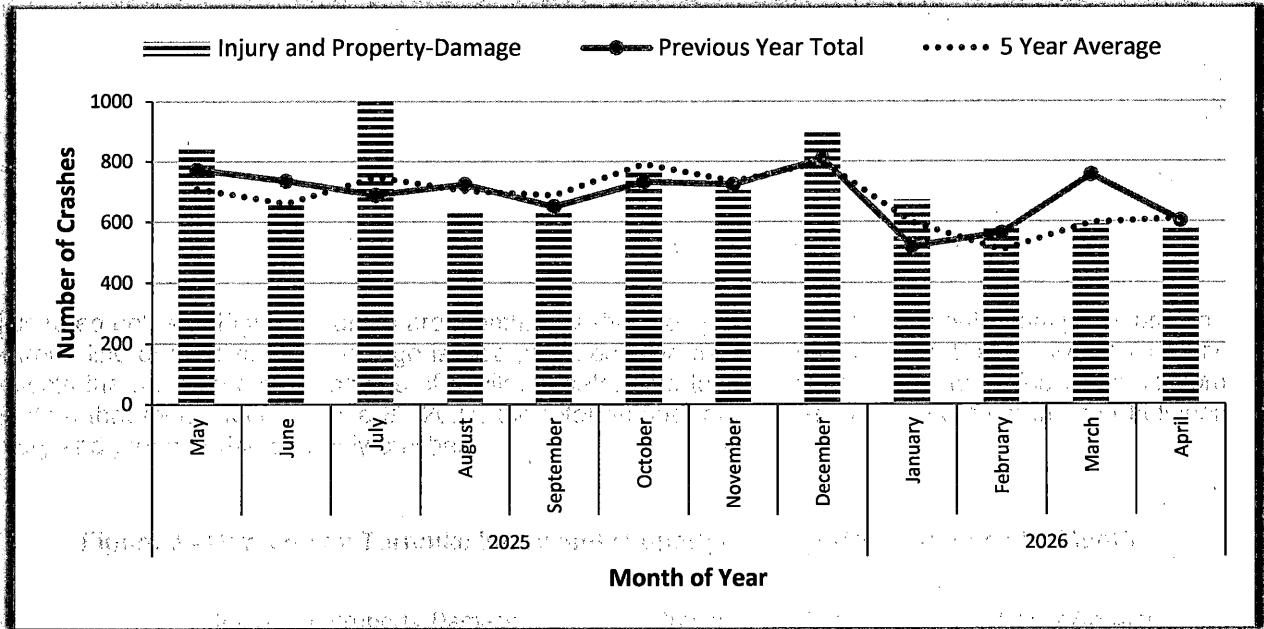


**Figure 2 - Garden State Parkway Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month**

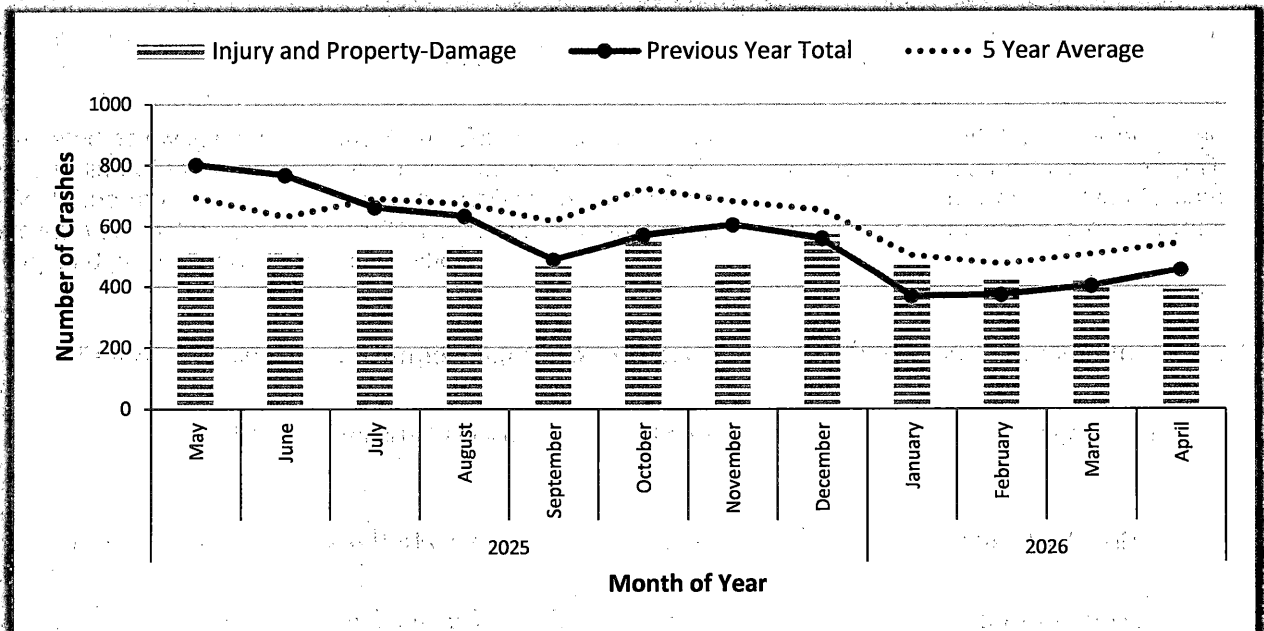

The following un-audited results are for the four months ended April 30, 2026.<sup>1</sup> Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2026, the Authority is projected to have a debt service coverage ratio of 2.02 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.54.

The Authority's total revenue for the four months ended April 30, 2026, was \$868,241,000, which is \$11,341,000, or 1.3% above the 2026 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$730,622,000, which is \$1,378,000, or 0.2% below the 2026 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was below budget due to the impact of five snow-related events, including two State of Emergencies. Gas prices averaged \$0.95/gallon higher in 2026 compared to the same period in 2025, and when compared to March 2026, gas prices in April increased \$0.53/gallon. Investment income was \$7,520,000, or 25.5%, above budget due to higher invested balances. Fees were \$2,821,000, or 5.4% above the budget, due to a change in projected trends.

For the four months ended April 30, 2026, toll transactions on the New Jersey Turnpike decreased 0.8% and toll revenue increased 1.6% compared to the same period in 2025. The decrease in toll transactions is primarily attributable to severe winter weather. The increase in toll revenue was driven mainly by the 3% annual toll rate indexing, which went into effect on January 1, 2026. The 2026 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) New Jersey Turnpike System 2025 Draw Down Letter dated April 29, 2025. CDM Smith projected a 0.2% decrease in traffic and a 1.6% increase in revenue as compared to the prior year. The actual results for the four months ended April 30, 2026, were below CDM Smith's traffic projections and met its toll revenue projections. Through April 2026, the E-ZPass system usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 93.9%, an increase from 93.5% for the same period in 2025.

For the four months ended April 30, 2026, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway decreased 0.3%, while toll revenue increased 2.9% when compared to the same period in 2025. The decrease in toll transactions is primarily attributable to severe winter weather. The increase in toll revenue was driven mainly by the 3% annual toll rate indexing, which went into effect on January 1, 2026. CDM Smith projected a 1.2% increase in traffic and a 3.6% increase in revenue as compared to the prior year. Actual results for the four months fell short of both traffic and revenue projections. Through April 2026, the E-ZPass system usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 92.6%, an increase from 91.8% for the same period in 2025.

Operating expenses for the four months ended April 30, 2026, totaled approximately \$253,433,000, which is \$6,820,000, or 2.6% below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses were primarily lower than budget due to lower salaries resulting from Authority-wide vacancies and reduced electronic toll collection costs reflecting lower-than-expected processing costs. This was partially offset by higher health benefit costs associated with Direct Access Plans, driven by increased utilization and higher costs for treatments and medications. Through April 2026, the Authority spent a total of \$52,327,000 on snow and severe weather costs, representing the highest annual snow related costs in the Authority's history, with \$17,266,000 spent from the operating expense budget and \$35,061,000 spent from the General Reserve Fund. In addition, the 2025-2026 snow season, which runs from October 2025 through April 2026, represents the highest cost to the Authority in its history with a cost of \$63,867,000. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund except for extraordinary weather events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. New Jersey declared two State of Emergency events as of April 2026. When excluding snow/severe weather costs and its budget, operating expenses for the four months are 2.8% below budget for 2026.

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds and is funded primarily through revenue and to a much lesser extent bond proceeds (capitalized interest). For the four months ended April 30, 2026, Debt Service totaled \$342,753,000, which was \$8,333,000, or 2.4% below the year-to-date budget as the 2026 Budget assumed a \$1.0 Billion bond issuance in March 2026, which to date has not been required. Debt service through April included \$205,416,000 in interest payments and \$137,337,000 in principal payments. Net debt service (funded from revenue, net of capitalized interest) was \$321,750,000 for the four months and meets the budget. The 2026 annual debt service budget includes approximately \$965,250,000 of debt service funded from revenue (net debt service), and the remaining \$104,677,000 of debt service funded from bond proceeds (capitalized interest), for a total debt service budget of \$1,069,927,000.

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$245,700,000 for the four months ended April 30, 2026, which was \$10,784,000, or 4.6% above the year-to-date budget due to State of Emergency snow events in January and February 2026. Spending consisted primarily of \$164,974,000 for New State Transportation Funding Agreement, \$35,061,000 for Extraordinary Events, and \$7,333,000 for Transportation Trust Fund. Also included are \$16,667,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the four months ended April 30, 2026, total expenditures were approximately \$69,091,000, which was 44.0% of the 2026 year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$4,776,000 for GSP Bridge Repairs along Mileposts 0-126 (2025), \$4,394,000 for TPK Bridge Repairs along Mileposts 92-122 NBHCE (2026), and \$2,900,000 for GSP Bridge Repairs along Mileposts 126-172 (2025). In addition to these expenditures, there are open commitments totaling approximately \$384,220,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2026-2030 Capital Improvement Program and the 2019 Capital Improvement Program. For the four months ended April 30, 2026, total expenditures were approximately \$136,973,000, which was 66.2% of the 2026 year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures include \$20,759,000 for TPK Capacity Enhancements Section 2 NBHCE, \$12,848,000 for TPK Interchange 17 Ramp Bridge Replacements, and \$10,491,000 for TPK Deck Rehabilitation Westerly Bridges. In addition to these expenditures, there are open commitments totaling approximately \$1,956,635,000.
