REPORT.

To the Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

I have the honor to submit herewith the annual report of the operations of this department.

Since the terrible and mysterious destruction of the U. S. battleship *Maine* in the harbor of Havana in February last, followed by a declaration of war against Spain, the limited force of the Department has been taxed to the utmost in preparing for the field, our volunteer troops called into the service of the United States. By reason of the enlistment, in almost their entirety, of the First, Second and Third Regiments, and many companies from the Fourth, Sixth and Seventh Regiments and Gatling Gun Company B, the National Guard has been practically disorganized, and the military stores of the State, comprising arms, equipment, clothing, camp equipage and materials and quartermaster's stores, have been turned over to the four volunteer regiments raised in New Jersey for the army of the United States in the war with Spain.

While the National Guard was well equipped for active service within the borders of our own State, it was not in condition in point of equipment for a sudden call to the field under a tropical sun, and the work of putting it in light marching order required much time and expense, the general government being in this respect in little better condition than New Jersey.

The cost of mobilizing, arming, equipping and generally maintaining the four volunteer regiments raised in this State cannot be definitely stated at this time, as the State military authorities were without sufficient funds at their disposal for this purpose. There are a large number of outstanding and unsettled bills awaiting payment, before the war expenses of New Jersey can be properly classified.

SPANISH WAR CLAIMS.

A "First Instalment" of claims aggregating ninety-three thousand, nine hundred and three dollars and thirty-three cents (\$93,903.33) has been filed with the Secretary of the Treasury of

the United States, through the Auditor for the War Department, under the Act of Congress approved July 8, 1898, for reimbursement to the Governor of the State, of the reasonable costs, charges and expenses that have been incurred by him in aiding the United States to raise the Volunteer Army in the war with Spain.

Numerous explanations are called for, based on differences arising out of the examination of these claims. These explanations have to be submitted before final adjustment of the claims can be made. They involve much clerical labor, and with but a single assistant, one of my clerks being seriously ill, the work has been somewhat retarded.

In addition to the expenditures covered by this claim there are unsettled bills chargeable to the same account, aggregating some \$115,000.00.

The State appropriations for military purposes becoming exhausted and further supplies being necessary, they were purchased and obligations therefor contracted through this Department, by order of the Commander-in-Chief. There being no State appropriations available for the liquidation of these obligations, payment thereof is necessarily suspended until there is received back from the United States the \$93,903.33, covered by the above mentioned claim, which could be applied toward their payment, or, until special provision therefor is made by the Legislature.

CAMP VOORHEES.

Sea Girt was designated as the camp of mobilization for the troops of this State, both before and after their acceptance into the service of the United States, and as a point of rendezvous for the First and Second Regiments after their return from Camp Alger, Virginia, and Camp Cuba Libre, Jacksonville, Florida. Its occupancy by the troops covered a period of more than five months, and its sanitary conditions during this time were superior to any of the large camps in the country. This was fully evinced by the splendid condition of health sustained by the troops during the unusually wet and inclement weather of May and June, followed by the intense heat of the later Summer months.

When the lamentable conditions attendant at other camp grounds, both north and south, are considered, with their long lists of sick and dead, the direct results, as it has been charged of imperfect sanitary arrangements and alleged mismanagement and negligence in feeding and caring for the troops, it is obvious that the people of this State have much reason for congratulation upon the selection of the healthful camp grounds at Sea Girt for our troops.

QUARTERMASTER-GENERAL'S REPORT.

RECEIPTS FROM THE UNITED STATES.

Stores to the value of \$18,527.31 have been drawn during the year under the Federal Government act for arming and equipping the militia of the States and Territories, leaving a balance of \$8,686.25 to the credit of this State on the books of the War Department.

The balance standing to the credit of the naval militia of this State on the books of the Navy Department is \$5,438.16.
