

CONTAINERS FOR SWEET CORN, STRAWBERRIES AND BLUEBERRIES

Adopted April 28, 1954

By virtue of authority granted under Section 4:10-3 of the Revised Statutes, the State Board of Agriculture adopts the following regulations and recommends their adoption by the Division of Weights and Measures in the Department of Law and Public Safety:

On and after November 30, 1954, the following containers are hereby standardized and established as legal in the State of New Jersey:

- 1. A container for sweet corn, having the designation and to be known as the Corn Crate, with inside dimensions of: Length, $21\frac{7}{8}$ inches; width, 12 inches; and height, 9 inches.**
- 2. A container for strawberries, having the designation and to be known as The 16-Quart Strawberry Crate, with inside dimensions of: Length $22\frac{1}{8}$ inches; width, 11 inches; and height, $8\frac{1}{2}$ inches.**
- 3. A container for blueberries, having the designation and to be known as The 12-Pint Blueberry Crate, with inside dimensions of: Length, 18 inches; width, 13 inches; and height, $3\frac{3}{8}$ inches; and to include a $\frac{1}{2}$ inch center divider.**
