ROLL CALL

Frank G. McCartney, Executive Director, in his capacity as Secretary for this Meeting, called the Roll, and at the conclusion thereof, reported that there was a quorum present- there being four members present from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and four members present from the State New Jersey.

WELCOMING REMARKS OF CHAIRMAN

Chairman DeGerolamo welcomed those persons whose identities are set forth hereinabove under "Appearances".

INTRODUCE ANY COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting and invited any comments from the Public on items pertaining to today's Agenda.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS REPORT

On the evening of April 1, 2011 a section of a rock cliff along the eastbound lanes of I-78 cascaded down upon the roadway. The landslide of over 350 tons of rocks, soil, and vegetation inundated the right lane and shoulder. Luckily, no injuries occurred and no vehicles were damaged. Within 2 hours, debris in the right lane was moved to the shoulder area with the right lane remaining closed as a precaution. Over the course of the next 12 hours, an action plan was put in place and then executed to remove the debris and ensure maximum safety for I-78 motorists. A.P. Construction swiftly mobilized personnel and apparatus from the Water Gap project site. Their personnel included a backhoe operator who had previous experience working

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in a quarry, which was perfect for this situation. The work crew removed 38 truckloads of debris and installed a concrete construction barrier between the right lane and shoulder. The temporary roadside barrier served as a secondary catch system while our staff worked with geo-technical engineers from French and Parello Associates to evaluate the situation and plan corrective measures to stabilize the rock outcropping. We are continuing to monitor the problem area on a regular basis and the entire rock outcropping is being further evaluated for long-term stabilization. As always, the safety of our customers is preeminent concern. I want to commend the I-78 operations and maintenance staffs, our engineering department personnel, and everyone else who helped facilitate a rapid response and bring about a satisfactory result. I should further note here that I-78 traffic was unaffected by the entire cleanup operation.

The other excavation event involving the Commission this past month may be less of an urgency, but is nonetheless important. It is an archaeological dig now fully underway on property adjacent to our Scudder Falls Bridge. The excavation is part of the environmental/cultural resources documentation process for our I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project. The work is being performed by roughly 12 archaeologists from AECOM, the Scudder Falls project's design management consultant. The archaeologists are on a slow and methodical hunt for Native American artifacts that have been buried beneath the ground for hundreds of years in an area that will be impacted when a replacement Scudder Falls Bridge is constructed. Some of the artifacts could date back to 12,000 B.C. So far, the archaeologists have unearthed some arrow heads, pottery shards, and what appears to have been a rock pit used for cooking or tool making. As you may recall, a similar dig on the bridge's New Jersey side last year produced nearly 14,000 artifacts. However, I want to caution that only a small portion of these items about 5 percent look like a discernable object to a layman. The vast majority are non-descript stones or stone chips. Just as was the case with the New Jersey dig earlier this year, this latest archaeological excavation has attracted a wave of media interest. There have been feature articles in area newspapers as well as radio and television coverage. The two digs are part of \$1.1 million worth of archaeological research the Commission is funding in accordance with the National Historic Preservation Act and with the counsel of New Jersey State Historic Preservation Office and the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission. Artifacts recovered at the Pennsylvania site will be turned over to the State Museum of Pennsylvania in Harrisburg. The items that were unearthed at the New Jersey location will be provided to the New Jersey State Museum in Trenton.

The last item I want to call your attention to is the rehabilitation project at our Upper Black Eddy-Milford Toll-Supported Bridge. Due to the frequent snow storms, persistent cold temperatures, and several severe wind storms of this past winter as well as a very rainy spring, the contractor is right up against the target date for reopening this bridge. This project was already on an extremely tight schedule due to the fact that we wanted to limit the bridge closure period and resulting economic impacts for area businesses and residents. Despite the rough weather, we remain hopeful that we will be able to reopen this bridge to vehicular traffic some time on May 17, which happens to be two weeks from tomorrow. A pivotal step for this will hopefully occur on Wednesday – the date the bridge's concrete-filled deck is expected to be poured into place. The pour is weather-dependent, so we all have our fingers crossed for good weather. As I have noted in previous reports, all project work is expected to be completed in mid-June. We will host a rededication ceremony at that juncture and we will provide you with the date and time for that event once it is established. Mr. Chairman, that concludes my report.

SAN- ARRAY UPGRADE

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the Meeting and asked the Commission Members if, after their review, there were any questions.

At the conclusion of the review, Vice Chairman Alfano moved and Commissioner Hart seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

“RESOLVED, by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, at its Regular Meeting assembled this 2nd day of May 2011, that the Commission via this Resolution, authorizes the Executive Director to issue a purchase order to ePlus for the sum of \$49,847.54 for the acquisition of the SAN Array Upgrade solution that supports the Commission’s digital document storage; and

“RESOLVED, identifies the General Reserve Fund as the source of funds required for payment and all disbursements.”

Chairman DeGerolamo invited questions on the Resolution. No questions were presented and the Resolution was unanimously adopted.

I-78 EMERGENCY ROCK SLIDE CLEANUP WORK

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the Meeting and asked the Commission Members if, after their review, there were any questions.

At the conclusion of the review, Commissioner Laurenti moved and Commissioner Hodas seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

“RESOLVED, by the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission, at its Regular Meeting assembled this 2nd day of May 2011, that the Commission, via this Resolution authorizes the Executive Director, in consultation with the Chair and Vice Chair of the Commission, to execute

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any and all appropriate and applicable contracts and/or change orders to immediately proceed with emergency cleanup work in the vicinity of I-78 Eastbound Milepost 77.1 in Pennsylvania in an amount not-to-exceed \$200,000 and identify the General Reserve Fund as the source of funds required for payment of any invoices; and

“RESOLVED, identify the General Reserve Fund as the source of funds required for payment of any invoices and;

“RESOLVED, The Executive Director is hereby authorized to approve and execute all necessary contracts on behalf of the DRJTBC.”

Chairman DeGerolamo invited questions on the Resolution. No questions were presented and the Resolution was unanimously adopted.

TOLL INCREASE

R: 3032-04-11- ADM-06-04-11

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the Meeting and asked the Executive Director McCartney to report on this item.

Executive Director McCartney addressed the meeting and said:

“Mr. Chairman. The Commission is considering today a resolution to enact a toll adjustment to provide sufficient revenue to meet our debt service obligations and raise sufficient funds to cover capital improvements in the bridge system. It's important to note that the Commission has substantially completed 91 projects over the last ten years. Additional 64 projects are under way or planned. This will help offset the lingering diminished truck toll revenue collections brought on by the 2008 and '9 recession. Truck toll collections are still below pre-recession levels of 2007. Trucks constitute approximately 70 percent of the DRJTBC revenue stream and the net effect will ultimately affect our cost of borrowing to accomplish the capital program. If the bond ratings drop, it ultimately results in higher borrowing costs.

It's important to note that in addition to the 25 cent toll increase proposed, it is 25 cents on cars which will raise the toll from 75 cents to a dollar, but that we will maintain the 40 percent commuter discount for those folks who use our toll bridges 20 times in a 35-day period. The net effect of that is it will be a 60 cent toll for those people who are commuting and going to work each day.

The commercial trucks, the increase will be 75 cents an axle taking it from 3.25 an axle to \$4 an axle for trucks with three axles or more, and from \$2.50 an axle to 3.25 for non-pickup, two axle trucks.

In addition, the Commission will maintain a ten percent discount for E-Z Pass for trucks traveling in off-peak hours.

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Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the Meeting and asked the Commission Members if, after their review, there were any questions.

Commissioner Broughal addressed the meeting and said:

I just would like to thank both governors' office for allowing us to proceed with the increase. I think it is by far most fiscally responsible thing. I just want to thank them.

Commissioner Prevotnik addressed the meeting and said:

"I would echo that sentiment. It is absolutely necessary and this has been a long time coming. This has been planned previously for many years and it is good to see it happen."

Vice Chairman Alfano addressed the meeting:

"I would like to note that we are taking this action independently as Commissioners on this entity on both sides."

Chairman DeGerolamo addressed the meeting:

"I concur with Commissioner Alfano."

At the conclusion of the review, Vice Chairman Alfano moved and Commissioner Broughal seconded the adoption of the following Resolution:

"WHEREAS, after sufficient investigation and study into the matter, the Commission has determined that it will require approximately \$1.2 billion One Billion Two Hundred Eleven Million Nine Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,211,900.00) through the year 2019 in connection with its plans to rehabilitate and renew the bridges and transportation infrastructure under the control of the Commission through the implementation of the Commission's Capital Program; and

"WHEREAS, the Commission plans to fund the Capital Program by, among other things, a previously issued 2007 bond issuance by the Commission, an additional bond issue which the Commission anticipates it will issue in 2012, and cash reserves; and

"WHEREAS, the Commissioners are committed to the Commission maintaining its current credit rating and credit worthiness (the "Credit Rating"); and

"WHEREAS, the Commission's 2003 Bond Indenture requires, among other things, that the Commission take certain steps so that the net revenue generated by the Commission from certain funding sources is at least an amount that satisfies those certain formulae set forth in detail in the Security for Bonds, Rate Covenant section of the 2003 Bond Indenture (the "Minimum Debt Service Coverage Ratio"); and

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“WHEREAS, the Commission has previously determined that the minimum targeted cash balance of the Commission should be the greater of Eighty Million Dollars (\$80,000,000.00) or fifteen (15%) percent of the Commission’s then current outstanding principal indebtedness (the “Minimum Balance”); and

“WHEREAS, commercial vehicle (truck) toll revenue collections on the Commission’s toll bridges decreased as a result of the world-wide 2008-2009 recession, and have yet to recover to pre-2008 levels; and

“WHEREAS, other toll agencies in the surrounding region increased toll rates to address financial operating and capital needs during the recession years but the Commission did not; and

“WHEREAS, the Commission’s operating budget was increased by a total of less than 2 percent over three years as a result of numerous actions, including two years of wage freezes; and

“WHEREAS, the Commission has previously determined that the Truck Tolls shall be adjusted as necessary in order to satisfy the Minimum Debt Service Coverage Ratio requirement with respect to one or more of the Bond Issues; and

“WHEREAS, after sufficient investigation and study into the matter, the Commission has determined that in order to maintain the Credit Rating, the optimal targeted debt service coverage shall be equal to or greater than 1.50 times annual debt service for each year bonds are outstanding (the “Target Coverage Ratio”); and

“WHEREAS, the actual Debt Service Coverage Ratio was below the Target Coverage Ratio in 2008, 2009, and 2010, and is currently projected to be below the Target Coverage Ratio in 2011; and

“WHEREAS, the level of the Debt Service Coverage Ratio projected by the Traffic Engineer for 2011 at current toll rates does not provide adequate assurance to the Commissioners that the Minimum Debt Service Coverage Ratio will be satisfied in the event of oil-related shocks, economic downturns, or other contingencies; and

“WHEREAS, the Commission last adjusted passenger vehicle toll rates in September 2003, effective November 2003;

“WHEREAS, the Commission last adjusted commercial (truck) toll rates in April 2007, effective May 17, 2007;

“WHEREAS, the previous toll adjustments have enabled the Commission to carry out its promise of providing the public with numerous improvements in transportation infrastructure, traffic-congestion relief, and safety and security; and

“WHEREAS, these capital program accomplishments include the rehabilitation and widening of the Trenton-Morrisville (Route 1) Toll Bridge, the rehabilitation of the Milford-Milford Montague Toll Bridge, the rehabilitation of Northampton Street Bridge between Easton, PA. and

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Phillipsburg, N.J., the stabilization and rehabilitation of the Commission's 4.2-mile segment of I-78 in New Jersey, the implementation of E-ZPass electronic toll collection, the installation of Express E-ZPass facilities at the I-78 and Delaware Water Gap (I-80) Toll Bridges, and numerous other projects including the execution 10 other bridge rehabilitation/improvement projects, and

"WHEREAS, after sufficient investigation and study into the matter, the Commission has concluded that, effective as of July 1, 2011, the appropriate amount to be charged for each automobile per Crossing on any Toll Bridge is One Dollar (\$1.00) (the "Auto Toll"), as set forth in the attached Toll Table; and

"WHEREAS, the Commission has further determined that use of the E-ZPass by commuters making twenty (20) or more trips in a thirty five (35) day period for payment of the Auto Toll should result in a savings of forty (40%) percent to such user, thereby reducing the Auto Toll to Sixty Cents (\$0.60) (the "Auto Commuter Discount"); and

"WHEREAS, the Commission has further determined that, effective as of July 1, 2011, the appropriate amount to be charged for vehicles not otherwise covered by the Auto Toll per Crossing on any Toll Bridge is Four Dollars (\$4.00) per axle (the "Truck Tolls"), with the exception of Class 2 vehicles, as more particularly set forth in the attached Toll Table (the "Toll Table"); and

"WHEREAS, the Commission has further determined that use of E-ZPass for payment of the Truck Tolls should result in a savings of ten (10%) percent to such user if used during the off-peak hours of 9:01 PM to 5:59 AM (the "Truck Discount"); and

"WHEREAS, upon review of the proposed Auto Toll, Auto Commuter Discount, Truck Tolls, Truck Discount and Toll Table, it is recommended that the Commission approve the Auto Toll, the Auto Commuter Discount, the Truck Tolls, the Truck Discount and the Toll Table and enact and implement such tolls and discounts as required and in accordance with the applicable effective dates set forth above, and take such steps and/or other actions as may be reasonably necessary in connection therewith; and

"WHEREAS, the revised toll rate structure will allow customers of the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission to pay passenger vehicle rates that are lower than any other Delaware River toll agency; and

"WHEREAS, the revised toll rate structure will enable owners and operators of commercial vehicles (trucks) to pay toll rates that are equal to or lower than the rates currently charged by any other Delaware River toll agency; and

"WHEREAS, that the Commission's efforts to maintain the Credit Rating are hereby ratified, approved and confirmed; and

"FURTHER RESOLVED, that, in connection with the Commission's debt service, the Commission's efforts in order to maintain the Minimum Debt Service Coverage Ratio, the

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Minimum Balance and the Target Coverage Ratio, be and hereby are ratified, approved and confirmed; and

TOLL TRAFFIC AND REVENUE STATISTICS (March, 2011)

Summary: The Commission experienced a decrease in total toll revenue for March 2011 in comparison to the March 2010 traffic and revenue statistics. Total toll traffic for the Commission reflected an increase for the month.

Analysis of March 2011 / March 2010 toll revenue data comparison:

- An overall toll revenue decrease of 0.33 percent was recorded at the Commission's seven toll bridges for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle toll revenue reflected a 0.84 percent decrease.
- Passenger-vehicle toll revenue generated a 1.12 percent increase.

Analysis of March 2011 / March 2010 traffic data comparison:

- Total toll traffic increased by 2,883 vehicles, or 0.09 percent for the month.
- Commercial-vehicle traffic decreased by 2,922 vehicles, or 0.71 percent.
- Passenger-vehicle toll traffic increased by 5,805 vehicles, or 0.22 percent.
- Total recorded westbound traffic volume at the 11 vehicular toll supported bridges for March 2011 decreased by 79,152 vehicles, or 2.97 percent as compared to March 2010.

Traffic analysis for 2011 YTD:

- Average daily toll traffic for the Commission's seven toll bridges for March 2011 was 99,723 total vehicles as compared to 99,630 total vehicles in March 2010, an increase of 0.09 percent.
- Recorded westbound traffic at the 11 toll supported bridges for YTD 2011 is reflecting a 2.27% decrease as compared to the same three-month period in 2010.

District 1

Total toll traffic at Trenton-Morrisville (TM) for March 2011 reflected a 6.05 percent increase as the result of increases of 33,337 cars and 4,730 trucks when compared to March 2010. At New Hope-Lambertville (NHL), an increase of 495 cars and a decrease of 22 trucks combined to generate an overall increase in total toll traffic of 0.30 percent for March 2011 as compared to March 2010.

District II

The I-78 Toll Bridge experienced an overall increase of 13.72 percent in total toll traffic for the month of March 2011 compared to March 2010 as the result of combined increases of 86,187 cars and 17,111 trucks. At the Easton-Phillipsburg (EP) Toll Bridge, decreases of 69,175 automobiles and 9,869 trucks combined to generate a 13.70 percent decrease in total toll traffic for March 2011.

District III

Portland-Columbia (PC) experienced a 0.17 percent increase in total toll traffic during March 2011 as a result of increases of 60 automobiles and 124 trucks compared to March 2010. At the Delaware Water Gap (DWG) Toll Bridge, a decrease of 39,615 passenger vehicles and a decrease of 15,038 trucks combined to produce an overall 7.11 percent decrease in total toll traffic for March 2011 as compared to March 2010. At Milford-Montague (MM), a decrease of 5,484 automobiles combined with an increase of 42 trucks to produce a decrease of 5.60 percent in total toll traffic for the month of March 2011.

STATISTICAL SUMMARY OF EXPENDITURES

This includes reports entitled **"Budget vs Actual"** covering the month of March 2011 and the three month year-to-date operations of fiscal year 2011 relative to Toll Bridges, Toll Supported Bridges and Administration departments.

Total expense plus encumbrance totaled \$3,535,854 for the month of March. For the 2011 fiscal year-to-date period, total expense plus encumbrances amounted to \$11,176,295 or 92.0% of the year-to-date operating budget. Most of the expense line items are well within their year-to-date operating budget.

There is one line item that is currently running ahead of budget on a year-to-date basis. Overtime Wage expense is 90% or \$88,000 ahead of budget due to higher than normal number of snow fall events for the months of January and February 2011. All other expense line items are within their budgets.

There were no unusual items charged to expense in the month of March.

MONTHLY PURCHASING REPORT

March 2011

This report itemizes all orders for purchases made for the month of March 2011, showing the divisions chargeable for the expense and the source of authority for issuance of the purchase order. This authority is broken into three categories:

- (1) By authority of the Commission
- (2) By authority of the Executive Director or his designate
- (3) By authority of the Superintendent

The purchasing activities for the month culminated in the preparation and placement of 95 purchase orders. To secure competitive prices on items being purchased, 121 price inquiries were sent out for 46 of the requisitions leading to purchase orders, an average of 2.63 per order ($121 \div 46$). Significant procurements for the period are highlighted below:

- Eleven Purchase Orders were let at the request of Operations, in the total amount of \$303,279.73, for eight vehicles and seven pieces of maintenance equipment.
- At the request of IT, two POs were issued, in the total amount of \$15,512.84, for software.
- A Purchase Order was let, in the amount of \$8,136.82, for the required annual inspection and repairs of the Commission's under bridge inspection unit.

In addition to the practices employed incidental to purchase of materials, etc., from vendors on a direct basis, the Commission also purchases via direct utilization of the purchasing processes of the State of New Jersey, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and other joint purchasing arrangements.

During the month of March, 2011 the Director of Policy and Planning participated in a number of communications and meetings that explored the following:

The Director attended the Delaware River Joint Toll Bridge Commission Communications Department Meeting for February.

The Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber of Commerce Transportation Committee heard updates from the following individuals: Gerald Fry, Senior Associate, Johnson, Mirmiran, & Thompson Engineering (Keystone Funding Coalition's legislative visits to lobby for a comprehensive solution to the highway and public transportation funding problem in Pennsylvania); Ron Young, PennDOT District 5 Chief Press Officer (Pot Holes and the Great Pennsylvania Clean-Up); Carol Halper, District Director Charlie Dent (R-PA15) United States House of Representatives (Federal Transportation Legislation); Steve Bliss, Executive Director Renew Lehigh Valley (New Jersey Transit Central New Jersey/Raritan Valley Transit Study/ Pennsylvania Component); Armando Greco, Executive Director Lehigh and Northampton Transportation Authority (LANTA) (Moving LANTA Forward Program); and the Director (Delaware Water Gap Toll Bridge Open Road Tolling and Bearing Remediation/Rehabilitation Projects; Easton/Phillipsburg Route 22 Toll Bridge Rehabilitation Scoping/Concept Study; and the I-78 Express E-ZPass/Open Road Tolling Project 2011 Diamond Award Certificate for Design Build Services).

The Greater Pocono Chamber of Commerce Government Relations and Public Policy Committee heard and discussed Legislative Reports concerning a variety of items (Marcellus Shale, Regulatory Excess, Transportation, and the Proposed 2011-2012 Commonwealth Budget) from Pennsylvania State Representatives Rosemary Brown (R-189), Michael Carroll (D-118), Mario Scavello (R-176); Monroe County Commissioner Janet Weidensaul (R) and from members of the staffs of United States Representative Louis Barletta (R-PA11) and Pennsylvania State Senator John Blake (D-22).

The Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission (DVRPC) Planning Coordinating Committee and Regional Transportation Committee included a presentation by Stanley Platt, DVRPC Manager, Office of Transportation Operations Management. Mr. Platt presented a Data Sharing Agreement Memorandum of Understanding (pending DVRPC Board approval) that will permit the DVRPC to construct a data interface to access PennDOT's Road Condition Reporting System (RCRS), which is a statewide database where PennDOT Traffic Management Centers enter information about highway crashes, construction and maintenance activities, as well as, other events that impact traffic flow. With construction of the data interface, DVRPC's Regional Integrated Multi-Modal System (RIMIS) will be able to directly import PennDOT incident information and make it available to regional transportation agencies, county 911 call centers, local police, and fire responders. Users will be able to view situational information about highway conditions unavailable to the public in 511PA. The goal is to complete this project by July/August 2011, and at that time the Commission should be able to participate.

 - a. Next Generation Technology Procurement
 - i. Testing expected to be completed in April 2011
 - ii. Complete data analysis in May 2011
 - iii. Complete evaluation and scoring by the end of June 2011
 - iv. Selection Committee meets for 2 to 3 days in mid July to make final decision.
 - v. IAG Board approves selection in August / September; first agency agreement to occur in September.
 - b. All agencies have an existing agreement with MARK IV/Kapsch that expire on August of 2011, except for the PA Turnpike, their agreement expires in August 2012. The NYSThruway will approach Mark IV/Kapsch to discuss a three (3) month extension, with additional three (3) month options. This extension will include a termination convenience clause with a 30 day notice. It is intended that this extension will allow agencies to continue to purchase Mark IV transponders and readers until the new vendor is selected.
2. Participated in the E-ZPass Interagency Group Strategic Planning workshop. I am drafting the following sections of the Strategic Plan:

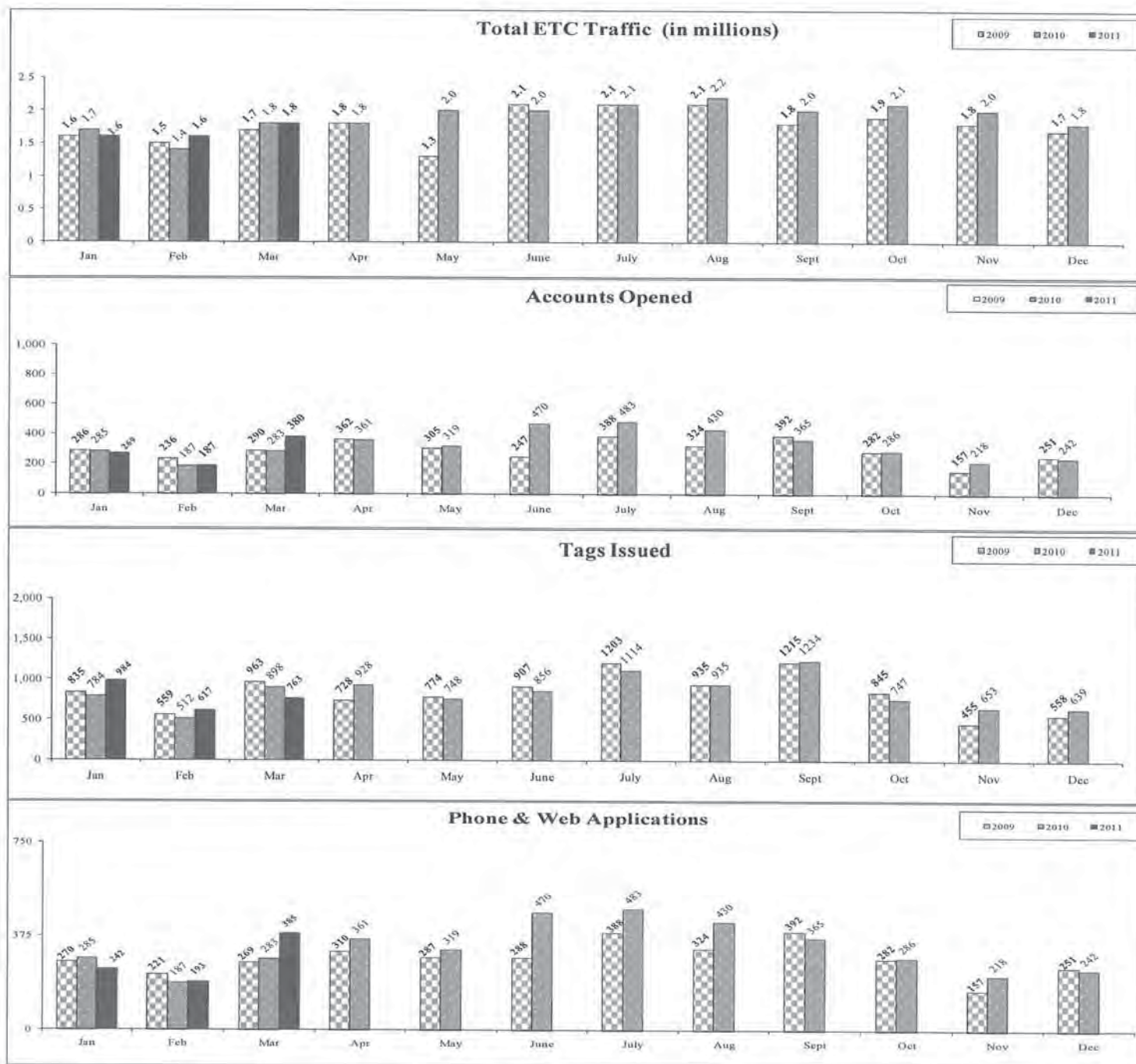

ELECTRONIC SECURITY AND SURVEILLANCE REPORT MONTH OF MARCH 2011

The below-listed items represent meetings, communications, tasks, and projects involving Electronic Security and Surveillance:

Radio System

- On March 22, 2011, ESS personnel worked with New Jersey State Police radio technicians to upgrade the ESS Primary Control Center (PCC) radio console.
- ESS personnel continue to pursue the installation of radio equipment at the Foxtown Hill communications tower located at the Delaware Water Gap. Currently, ESS personnel are exploring the possibility of enhancing the radio reception by installing the equipment higher up on the tower than initially planned.
- ESS personnel are currently working with the New Jersey and Pennsylvania State Police, NJDOT, and District II personnel to conduct a radio interoperability training exercise concerning a mock event on I-78.
- ESS arranged for various radio installations throughout the Commission and reviewed the recently submitted District radio inventories for accuracy and accountability.
- ESS personnel investigated various other DRJTBC radio issues both during, and after normal working hours.

Access Control System

- On March 2, 2011, ESS personnel performed a security check and fire alarm test at the I-78 Toll Bridge Facility to ensure both systems are functioning properly.
- On March 3, 2011, ESS personnel developed an egress and remote lock/unlock procedure for the Primary Control Center to follow during fire alarm activations at the seven toll bridge facilities. The plan and procedure identifies various doors to be unlocked and locked during a fire alarm activation.

The **Environmental Assessment (EA)/Draft Section 4(f) Evaluation** for the project was circulated for public comment on 12/9/09 and was made available for public review on the Commission's project website and at a number of publicized locations. Public comments were accepted until 2/4/2010, the end of the requisite public comment period.

In conjunction with the EA review process, a Public Hearing was conducted in compliance with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Act of 1970, and Section 128 Title 23 of the United States Code, Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, as well as New Jersey Department of Transportation policies and procedures. The design consultant AECOM, with HNTB as their Environmental Team Sub-consultant, has prepared responses to the comments received during the public comment period, which have been reviewed by the Commission. To initiate the process of requesting a NEPA Decision (FONSI) from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), these responses have been submitted to PennDOT, NJDOT, and FHWA for review.

At a meeting held with FHWA and PennDOT representatives on June 11, 2010 the Commission was informed that tolling will have to be made part of the proposed action for the project and the impacts from tolling the bridge will have to be addressed as part of the current EA process. The FHWA will not issue a NEPA decision (FONSI) for the project until the impacts from tolling have been assessed. A subsequent meeting/conference call on August 25, 2010 with FHWA, PennDOT and NJDOT representatives confirmed that an addendum to the current EA document will have to be prepared to address the tolling impacts to the project, and make tolling of the SFB part of the proposed action for the project. The re-evaluation of the EA and the addendum thereto, has been prepared by AECOM under the C-502A I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project DMC Services contract, Task Order Assignment C-502A-2C.

The EA/Draft Section 4(f) Evaluation Document was also distributed to each of the involved transportation agencies (FHWA, PennDOT and NJDOT) and the Cooperating Agencies (US Army Corps of Engineers, US EPA, PA DEP and the National Marine Fisheries Service) for their review. The Section 4(f) Evaluation, which is part of the EA, was forwarded by FHWA to their Washington D.C. Office for the Conditional Legal Sufficiency Review. This review has been completed by FHWA, and the request for the final executed Programmatic Agreement has been made by FHWA to issue Legal Sufficiency. The EA/Draft 4(f) Document has been revised to address all comments received from the review agencies and to reflect tolling of the SFB as part of the proposed action. Upon resolution of all comments on the EA the final EA/4(f) Document will be submitted to FHWA's Washington D.C. office along with a fully executed copy of the Programmatic Agreement for a final Legal Sufficiency review.

Both NJ and PA State Historic Preservation Officers (SHPO) have issued determinations of effects for project effects on historic and archaeological resources. A **Programmatic Agreement** to stipulate future actions required under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act has been executed for this project. This document identifies the mitigation measures to be taken as a result of the finding of Adverse Effect to the Delaware & Raritan Canal cultural resource in NJ; and potential for adverse effect to archaeological resources in PA and NJ. These mitigation measures have been coordinated, and agreed upon by, the environmental regulatory agencies and transportation agencies on the project.

The PA has been fully executed with the receipt of FHWA's signature on January 6, 2011. The PA bears executing signatures from FHWA, New Jersey Historic Preservation Officer, and Pennsylvania Historic Preservation Officer; and concurring signatures from the Commission, NJDOT, and PennDOT. The PA copies bearing original signatures has been distributed to the signing Agencies, and will now be incorporated into the Final Section 4(f) Evaluation Document for final Legal Sufficiency review by FHWA. As part of the EA Addendum process, the state HPO's must provide concurrence that the Commission's decision to Toll the Scudder Falls bridge will not adversely affect the cultural resources in the vicinity of the project. Letters to the HPO's requesting this concurrence were sent on March 24, 2011.

The FHWA recommended additional consultation with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) on the EA. Accordingly, a **Biological Assessment Report** (BA) was prepared for threatened and endangered (T&E) species impacts and was submitted to the NMFS in September 2008. On June 11, 2010 the Commission received the final Biological Opinion from NMFS, which includes a determination of 'No Jeopardy' from NMFS. This completes Section 7 consultation.

FINANCIAL/LEGAL ADVISORY SERVICES FOR A P3 FOR SCUDDER FALLS BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

STUDY Contract No. C-393G-1R

At the Commission's special meeting on August 17, 2010 the Commission announced the issuance of a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Financial/Legal Advisory Services for a P3 for Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge project. This RFP was posted on the Commissions web site on August 20, 2010.

On August 27, 2010 a Non-mandatory Pre-proposal conference call with interested financial/legal firms was held at the Commission's New Hope Facility. Twenty-two (22) firms participated in the conference call. An additional 38 firms listened to a digital replay of the conference call which was available through September 3, 2010.

On September 17, 2010 ten (10) proposals were received in response to this RFP. Oral interviews were held October 18 and 21, 2010.

Review of the C-393G -1 Proposals resulted in a revised RFP. An RFP for C-393G-1R was issued on November 23, 2010 requesting five firms to resubmit a Technical and Price Proposal to provide the Commission within 90 days of receipt of Notice to Proceed sufficient information/counsel to make a "**GO/NO GO**" decision on a P3 for its Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project. And, should it make a "**GO**" decision its recommendation as to form of a P3 which is most feasible from an economic/legal perspective. The revised proposals are currently under review.

DMC TOLLING STRATEGY DEVELOPMENT & IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT SERVICES

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2C

The Commission at its April 26, 2010 Meeting authorized the Executive Director to move expeditiously to accomplish the Goals and Short Term Activities enumerated in the *Statement of Intent for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project*. This Statement of Intent, amongst other things, included the development of a strategy to implement All Electronic Cashless tolling (AECT) on the Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge.

AECOM received a Limited Notice-to-Proceed letter was issued on May 14, 2010 effective April 26, 2010. The Limited NTP allowed work on the following tasks;

- Establishing a timeline for tolling implementation;
- Preparation of tolling applications and/or agreements with FHWA;
- Commencing the Toll/Traffic Diversion Study;
- Preparation of the RFLOI for the Traffic and Revenue Study.

On July 26, 2010 the Commission's New Jersey Counsel, Florio Perrucci Steinhardt & Fader, L.L.C. and Pennsylvania Counsel, Fox Rothschild LLP, after review of the Commission's Compact, each provided a favorable opinion as to the Commission's authority to toll the Scudder Falls Replacement Bridge. These letters of opinion from each counsel were sent to FHWA. FHWA provided a response to these letters on January 26, 2011. FHWA concurs that the Commission has the authority to toll the bridge, but a Tolling Agreement will be required. FHWA's response was forwarded to the Commission's Pennsylvania and New Jersey Counsel offices for review in January. Commission's Counsel has reviewed the response from FHWA, and concurs with their opinion on the need to enter into a tolling agreement .

AECOM has prepared a draft Expression of Interest as a first step in preparing a draft Tolling Agreement in parallel with the efforts required to obtain the NEPA decision (FONSI) from FHWA.

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION

In June 2010 FHWA directed that tolling will have to be made part of the proposed action for the project, and the impacts from tolling the bridge will have to be addressed as part of the current Environmental Assessment (EA) process. The FHWA will not issue a NEPA decision (FONSI) for the project until the impacts from tolling have been assessed. The inclusion of tolling into the proposed action requires re-assessing the EA, the Section 4(f) Evaluation, and the Project Point-of-Access (POA) Study. This re-assessment will result in an addendum to the EA, which must meet the approval of the transportation agencies - FHWA, PennDOT, and NJDOT, and the cooperating agencies - USEPA, USACE, NMFS, and PADEP.

As the initial step in re-assessing the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement project EA a Traffic Diversion Study was prepared by the AECOM team. The final draft of this report was submitted on August 25, 2010. AECOM briefed the Commissioners at the September 2010 Commission Committee Meeting as to the findings of the study. On December 10, 2010 the Scudder Falls Bridge Final Traffic Diversion Study, dated September 8, 2010 was sent out to the transportation agencies reviewing the EA Addendum. Subsequent to the submittal of the Traffic Diversion Study, the following documents were submitted to the transportation agencies on the noted date, for review:

- EA Addendum January 7, 2011
- Final Section 4(f) Evaluation January 7, 2011
- POA Study Addendum January 27, 2011

On January 31, 2011 Commission and AECOM staff met with the transportation agencies FHWA, PennDOT, and NJDOT to 1) discuss comments from each agency to the EA Addendum, Section 4(f) Evaluation, and Traffic Diversion Study; and 2) Review the schedule for obtaining the NEPA decision (FONSI) on the environmental documentation. Details of the schedule were discussed, and input from the agencies received. The target date for receipt of the FONSI remains at August 4, 2011. Commission and AECOM staff held a conference call with the transportation agencies on February 3, 2011 to continue discussions on comments to the Traffic Diversion Study.

Review comments were received from the Transportation Agencies between January 28 and February 28, 2011 on the various documents. Responses to these comments are being prepared, although, there are still comments due from the agencies to complete agency reviews. Commission staff is in continuous contact with the lead agency FHWA to obtain these comments and move the project forward. However, PennDOT continues to question the validity of the traffic model that was produced for the TDS. The model is a hybrid utilizing the North Jersey transportation model along with traffic input from DVRPC. This model has been prepared by Jacobs Engineering, and calibrated by using traffic information in the project area from DVRPC. FHWA has reviewed the model, which they support. Additionally, an informal approval of the model has been received from DVRPC. However, since it is not the DVRPC model, which PennDOT is used to seeing; PennDOT has provided multiple iterations of comments requesting details of the model input not normally provided. Commission and CPMC staff are working with PennDOT Managerial staff in District 6-0 to bring resolution to this issue.

DMC ADVANCED ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR PRIORITY ITEMS OF WORK

Task Order Assignment No. C-502A-2D

The Commission at its April 26, 2010 meeting authorized the Executive Director to move expeditiously to accomplish the Goals and Short Term Activities enumerated in the *Statement of Intent for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Improvement Project*. This Statement of Intent, amongst other things, included the advancement of schedule-critical engineering/permitting activities to meet the objectives outlined in the Statement of Intent.

This TOA was fully executed by the Commission on July 1, 2010 and includes the necessary professional services to complete certain priority items of work that are critical to the overall schedule of the project. These priority tasks include environmental permitting; right-of-way (ROW) acquisition; archeological work necessary to obtain cultural resource clearance for the project; Stormwater Management design and permit plan preparation; and transition of key public involvement tasks from the Environmental Assessment Phase (Commission Contract C-393A) to the Design Management Consultant (DMC Contract C-502A).

In addition, this TOA includes DMC Services to support the Commission's two-step Professional Services procurement process. This process includes the preparation of a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) document and a Request for Proposal (RFP) document for Final Design and Construction Services for the I-95/Scudder Falls Bridge Replacement Project using the traditional design bid build method of project delivery. A Draft RFQ has been prepared and is ready if/when needed. AECOM continues preparing the draft RFP, and developing the project work scope with Commission staff.

Permit Pre-application Meetings have been held with the Pennsylvania DEP, USACE, NJDEP, the D&R Canal Commission, NJDEP Green Acres, the Bucks County Soil Conservation District, and the Delaware River Basin Commission, to date. A review meeting was also held with Lower Makefield Township to discuss their stormwater design requirements. Requirements of these entities will be addressed in the development of the Permit Plans, which will be submitted back to them for review and approval. AECOM submitted is preparing the DRAFT 'Pre-Application for Parkland Diversion', which includes Commission review comments. This document will ultimately be submitted to NJDEP – Green Acres Program as a result of project impacts to NJ State Park Lands for review and approval.

Field work for property surveys associated with impacted properties has been completed. Impacts to properties are being refined, along with the progression of the roadway design, and will be reflected in right-of-way plans. AECOM has prepared information outlining protocols for the right-of-way taking process. These documents are based upon the PennDOT and NJDOT processes for each respective state, and are being submitted to Commission counsel for review.

DELAWARE RIVER JOINT TOLL BRIDGE COMMISSION

The Phase III data recovery for the NJ site began in early October, and the field work was completed in January. AECOM is performing data analysis and documentation on the findings at this time. Phase III data recovery work for the Pennsylvania site requires a permit from the Bucks County Soil Conservation District (BCSC), due to the amount of excavation and soil storage that will be performed on site. The soil erosion and sediment control permit was received from Bucks County Conservation District in March. Phase III data recovery work at the PA site started on March 30th, with support from Commission staff. Due to the nature and location of the Phase III work, the Commission issued letters to local elected officials and nearby residents, notifying them of the work taking place at the site. Workers on the site have been issued information cards to provide to members of the public that approach the site with questions on the work.

Work continues on the storm water design. Supplemental field survey work for natural drainage features to support the storm water drainage design and permit plan preparation has been completed. A 'Boring Program' consists of test pits and geotechnical borings to obtain sub-surface data necessary to support the storm water management design. The HOP's from each state were received in February, and the AECOM team began drilling along the I-95 corridor in support of the stormwater management design in March.

AECOM continues to perform Public Involvement activities, which consist of responding to questions from the public on the project Hot Line. AECOM staff met with Commission staff, including the Deputy Director of Communications, in February to coordinate 1) update of the Commission's Scudder Falls Project website; 2) develop a public outreach strategy for notification of the upcoming Phase III Archeological dig along River Road in Pennsylvania in March; 3) Schedule the release of the next project newsletter; and 4) Discuss the schedule of the Public Hearing required as part of the Environmental Assessment Addendum review process.

General

During the March, 2011 the Commission received its third award for the Compact Authorized Investment projects. This award was as *Special Recognition Transportation Award* from the Hunterdon County Planning Board for CAI projects funded in Hunterdon County. Commissioner Daniel Hart attended the event held at Razberry in Frenchtown, and he was also honored with an award for a rehabilitation project he completed in the City of Lambertville. Deputy Executive Director of Communication, Joseph Donnelly and The Compact Authorized Investment Director, Julio Guridy, who completed the award application, received the award on behalf of the Commission. This award opportunity was referred to the Commission by Director of Policy and Planning, Glenn Reibman.

The CAI department continued processing grantees reimbursement requests, and monitoring the status of the projects under construction, as well as reviewing plans, change orders and contract agreements specifications, and managing CAI project coordination with the municipalities.

Pennsylvania

1. **Milford Borough, PA** – In March 2011 the CAI director attended the preconstruction meeting for the *Storm Water Restoration Project*. The Borough received the Highway Occupancy Permit (HOP) from Penn DOT for said project and the construction start date was scheduled for April 4, 2011. It is currently anticipated that project construction will be completed in late Spring/early Summer 2011, weather permitting. To date, the Borough has been reimbursed \$6,402.41 of \$163,475.00 (4%) by the CAI department.
2. **Smithfield Township, PA** – The Township continues to make progress on completing the plans and specifications for the *Intermunicipal Trail Project* in order to obtain the necessary permits from the County Conservation District, the Pennsylvania Historical Museum Commission (PHMC) and the PA Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) to complete the project. It is currently anticipated that the project will be completed in the Summer of 2011. To date, the Township has been reimbursed \$45,869.87 of \$584,500.00 (8%) by the CAI department.

The Township has indicated that the construction of the original *Pedestrian Improvements Project* is complete and a final inspection has been completed by PennDOT. However, written documentation from PennDOT indicating that they have accepted the modified work is still forthcoming from the Township. To date \$751,863.18 of \$779,000.00 (97%) has been reimbursed to the Township.

3. **Delaware Water Gap Borough, PA** – The *Local Roads Paving Project* was completed in December 2010 by Bracalente Construction, Inc. for a total construction cost of \$115,831.60. The streets that were repaved included Waring Drive, Oak Street, Parkway Drive, Croasdale Drive, Walnut Lane and Shepard Avenue. To date, the Borough has been reimbursed \$109,243.43 of \$130,000.00 (84%) by the CAI department. The CAI department will process the Borough's final reimbursement and close out the grant upon completion of a few manhole riser adjustments and receipt of the final payment deliverables from the Borough.

The Borough has indicated that the *Broad Street Sidewalk Improvements Project* is complete, but closeout of the Highway Occupancy Permit (HOP) by PennDOT still remains to be completed. A site meeting was recently held with representatives of the Borough, PennDOT, the contractor and the due diligence engineer to discuss the latest punch list items received from PennDOT. PennDOT is requiring the replacement of the detectable warning surfaces on two (2) of the constructed curb ramps prior to close out of the HOP. It is currently anticipated that the project will be closed out by PennDOT in April-May 2011. As previously mentioned, the *Waring Drive/Delaware Ave. Drainage Improvements Project* was completed in August 2009.

4. **Portland Borough, PA** – The Borough submitted a revised application, in the amount of \$153,782.66 for *Streetscape Improvements on State Street and Delaware Avenue*, in the hope that the project will be reconsidered by the Commissioners for funding. The revised application is a scaled-down version of their original application, which was submitted in the amount of \$515,701.40. The revised application meets the CAI criteria, but has not been awarded to date. The two other CAI funded projects (*Park & Ride Project* and *Park & Walk Project*) have been completed.
5. **Lower Mount Bethel, PA** – The *Park & Ride Trail Project* is substantially complete. In March 2011, the CAI director spoke with John Mauser, the project Manager who indicated that the municipality is expecting to restart the completion of the project by April or May pending weather conditions. It is anticipated that the project will be completed in the Spring 2011.
6. **Easton, PA** – In February the Commissioners approved the City's request for the reallocation of \$58,000 of its \$891,500 to expand the N. 3rd Street Corridor Improvements project to add four additional streetlights along Pine Street. Albeit the inclement weather, during the months of February and March 2011, the City made significant improvement with its North 3rd Street Corridor Improvements project. It installed all the designated streetlights along Bushkill Street, College Avenue, Cattell Street and N. 3rd Street.

The City of Easton made significant improvements with their CAI projects.

The Larry Holmes Drive Streetscape Improvement, improvements to the N. 3rd Street intersections, and the Decorative Streetlight Improvement Project, which replaced existing streetlights in the downtown area are substantially completed. These projects were to be completed by the end of 2010, but Easton requested an extension until the spring of 2011.

The construction contracts for Phases 1 and 2 of the *Waterfront Improvements project* has been on going through the warmer weather days of the fall and winter months. These includes a “road diet” for Larry Holmes Drive, high visibility pedestrian crosswalks, intersection improvements at Northampton Street and Larry Holmes Drive to improve pedestrian accommodation, along with a sewer line connection from the Commission’s Construction of the ADA Curb Ramps and Decorative Crosswalks, which is part of the *Pedestrian Pathways/Intersection Enhancements and Northampton St. Bridge Bike Path* grant, was completed in September 2009. The City has also purchased and installed the materials for the Bike Path Extension. The curbs and sidewalks abutting the Northampton Street Bridge have been reconstructed. The change order submitted to the CAI department to add new lighting poles in the Scott Park area of the project was approved and completed.

7. **Williams Township, PA** – The *I-78 & Morgan Hill Road Interchange Traffic Signalization Project* was completed in January 2010. To date, \$374,014.13 of \$430,590.00 (87% of total grant amount) has been reimbursed to the Township. The CAI department is still awaiting the Township’s final reimbursement request submission in order to close out the grant.

In the Spring of 2010, the Township submitted six (6) applications that were discussed at past Commissioners meetings, but have not been awarded to date. We would also note that it was previously determined that the Belmont Street Reconstruction and the Hilton Street Improvements projects did not satisfy the required characteristics of the CAI program as they could not be completed by the December 31, 2010 deadline; however, since an extension has been granted, these projects can be reevaluated.

8. **Riegelsville Borough, PA** – During the month of March, the contractor for the *Delaware Canal Footbridge Lighting Project*, Yates Electrical Service, continued construction on the project. It is currently anticipated that project construction will be completed in the Spring 2011. The Borough’s first reimbursement request for the project, in the amount of \$8,149.35, is currently under review by the due diligence engineer.
9. **Solebury Township, PA** – The construction of the *Walton Drive Bridge Replacement Project* is complete. As previously discussed, project construction included the alternate #2 paving work, which was a change of scope approved at the September 2010 Commissioners meeting, to repave the entire length of Walton Drive. The Township’s engineer has indicated that there have been several construction change orders on the project. Back-up documentation for the change orders has been received and is currently under review by the CAI department to determine if the change orders are eligible for reimbursement under the grant.

Construction of the *Route 202 Trail and Park* project began on August 4, 2008 by K.C. Construction, and was completed in September 2009. To date, \$1,485,432.04 of \$1,755,150.00 has been reimbursed by the CAI Department (85%). The Township is currently in the process of preparing their final reimbursement request to the DRJTBC for the project.

10. **New Hope Borough, PA** – Construction of the *Main St. Bridge Lighting Project* is substantially complete by the contractor, Armour & Sons Electric, with only minor punch list items remaining be completed when the weather permits. It is currently anticipated that the project construction will be completed in Spring 2011.

The construction of the *Bridge St. Traffic Signals Project* by Armour & Sons Electric is substantially complete. However, the construction of the ADA compliant pedestrian facilities required by PennDOT still remains to be completed. The Borough has recently indicated the ADA ramp designs were approved by PennDOT and that construction of the ramps will begin this month. To date the Borough has been reimbursed \$412,798.75 of \$446,404.00 (92% of total grant amount).

11. **Falls Township, PA** – The original traffic signal installation and modernization project is complete and a final reimbursement request in the amount of \$77,876.00 was approved in December 2008. The Township utilized \$332,571.00 of the \$335,000.00 grant award.

In the Spring of 2010, the Township submitted another application for the *Tyburn Road & New Falls Road Traffic Signal Upgrade Project*, in the amount of \$108,140.00. This application was considered at past Commissioners meetings, but has not been awarded to date.

12. **Upper Makefield Township, PA** – The Township continues to make progress on completing the bid package for *Gateway Park-Village Streetscape Phase 2 Project*. It is currently anticipated that the project will be advertised for bids in April 2011 and that construction will be completed in Spring/early Summer 2011.

The *Washington Crossing Gateway Project* was completed in the Spring of 2010. To date the Township has been reimbursed \$1,447,000.00 of \$1,447,000.00 (100% of total grant amount).

13. **Lower Makefield, PA** – The *Black Rock Pedestrian Trail Project* is substantially complete. The contractor, S&H Landscaping, will complete the remaining contract items when there are warmer weather conditions in early Spring 2011. The Township's engineer has indicated that there have been several change orders on the project. The CAI department is currently reviewing the change orders to determine if they are eligible for reimbursement under the grant.

The Traffic Signal project at the intersection of Yardley-Newtown Rd & Creamery Rd is complete. A final reimbursement request has been processed by the Commission and the original grant is closed out.

14. **Bristol Borough, PA** – The construction of the *Traffic Signals Revitalization Project* was completed by Armour & Sons Electric in July 2009 and the project has been closed out. The Borough utilized \$1,333,843.28 of \$1,334,450.00 grant (99.9% of total grant amount). In the Spring of 2010, the Borough submitted another application for the *Decorative Crosswalks Project*, in the amount of \$423,126.12. This application was considered at past Commissioners meetings, but has not been awarded to date.
15. **Yardley, PA** – The CAI department has reimbursed the entire grant amount of \$234,217.00 to the Borough for its *Yardley Borough Road Improvements Project* and the project has been closed out.

The Borough of Yardley in conjunction with the Landmark Towns organization submitted an application to install Wayfinding Signage to/from and through New Hope Borough, Bristol Borough, and Morrisville Borough in the amount of \$872,969.00. This application has been discussed at past Commissioners meetings, but was not awarded.

16. **Morrisville, PA** – The construction work in Morrisville Municipal Authority CAI project on the *Moreau Street Rehabilitation project* is progressing well in spite of inclement weather. Recently, the MMA representatives have indicated that the project is under budget by nearly \$70,000 and would like to request an extension of work onto another road. In February, the Commissioners approved the reallocation of \$70,000 to expand the Moreau Street project to Bank Street (between Moreau and Green Streets). The plans, specifications and cot estimate have been received for the additional work.

The *Bridge Street Curb and Sidewalk replacement project* is still completing its engineering design work. However, the four originally funded projects in Morrisville are completed.

New Jersey

1. **Montague, NJ** – The relocation of the emergency heliport from the Park & Ride location has been completed. The construction of the Park & Ride was to begin the week of October 25 and is scheduled to be completed by the end of November 2010. The projects have been completed and only a few punch list items are pending. No further progress during the month of February. The FAA has licensed the emergency heliport that had to be relocated for the construction of the Park & Ride. Project is complete.
2. **Knowlton, NJ** – The Township is proud to announce that The Paulinskill Trail extension has been completed! The underpass is a wonderful addition to the community. Hikers and bikers from New Jersey and Pennsylvania will now be able to link the Paulinskill Trail to the Columbia/Portland pedestrian bridge and enjoy the beautiful scenery along the Delaware and Paulinskill Rivers. No further progress during the month of February.

3. **Belvidere, NJ** – The Water Street Improvements project was completed and closed out in May of 2010. In May the final reimbursement request has been processed and the project is in the process of being closed out.
4. **Phillipsburg, NJ** – The second phase of the project started construction in May 2010. The sidewalk, road reconstruction, and lighting part of the project were completed, the only pending parts of this job are the trees planting and few punch list items. The agreement for the Extension of South Main Street project Phase 3 is next, and the municipality requested a project completion extension until the Spring of 2010. This project was awarded a grant for \$997,962 at the Commissioners' February meeting. The CAI department continues to process the reimbursement requests for this project. The Town (CFO) requested a meeting with the due diligence engineer to review the project's remaining funds. This meeting was coordinated for the month of March. CAI along with the CFO and engineer for Phillipsburg met to clarify funding and project expansion issues. The project will restart construction as soon as the weather permits.

The original, Phase I project, was completed and a ribbon-cutting ceremony was held on December 3, 2008.

5. **Pohatcong NJ** – A new application was received by the CAI Department for *Resurfacing of River Road*. This application was presented to the Commissioners at their February 2010 meeting. This request was not awarded. The two granted projects to Pohatcong Township have been completed.
6. **Holland, NJ** –Holland was awarded a CAI grant for the resurfacing of Mt. Joy Road and has requested an extension for the work to be completed by the spring of 2011. The Township is gearing to advertise the project for bids the project in March. The final plans and specifications have been received for the project.

Holland completed and was fully paid for its previous CAI project. This project is in the process of being closed out.

7. **Milford, NJ** –The Borough was awarded a grant for the repair and resurfacing of Honeysuckle Lane off of Bridge Street. The Borough scheduled a Preconstruction meeting for March 1, 2011.

The Township received the construction bids for the project, awarded the contract to Line Construction, held a preconstruction meeting and it is expected to start construction in March or early April weather permitting.

The Bridge Street Improvements project is complete.

8. **Frenchtown, NJ** – In January, Commissioners approved the reallocation of \$240,000 from its previously allocated budget for the Village Green project to the improvements of Bridge St.,

South Harrison St. and Race Street. This was a request of the municipality of Frenchtown. Due to no major development had been noted for over 2 years regarding the acquisition of the property for the Village Green Park, the CAI department met with Mayor Ron Sworen to discuss the disposition of this project. Mayor Sworen submitted a new application for resurfacing and pedestrian improvements of Bridge St., Race St. and South Harrison Street. This new application is being reviewed by the due diligence engineer and appears to meet the requirements of the CAI program. The application was presented to the Commissioners at their December meeting. A resolution was introduced for the commissioner's consideration at their January meeting and approved.

The Frenchtown Park and Ride project is complete.

9. **Lambertville, NJ** – In February the Commissioners approved a \$12,300 reallocation of funds request from Lambertville to be used for a survey and base mapping for a drainage basin of South Franklin Street. The CAI department is working with members of the City's staff to gather the needed information to close out several completed projects, such as the *Swan Street Traffic Signal, Quarry Street, Ferry Street, Kline's Court, Jefferson Street, Blair Tract and Mount Hope Street*.

The City has also been working on the projects that were extended from the 2010 construction completion date to the December 31, 2011 completion date. These projects include: Perry St. Road Reconstruction project, extended to the Spring of 2011. The pending projects are *Delevan Street Rd. Reconstruction project, McGreary's Alley Reconstruction project, and South Franklin Street Traffic Calming and Drainage project*.

The City of Lambertville has completed eight projects since the beginning of the CAI program.

10. **Stockton, NJ** – The funded CAI projects for the Bridge Street Improvements project is completed. The municipality received a transportation construction project award for its CAI project.
11. **West Amwell, NJ** – The Township submitted two additional applications: The reconstruction of Old York Road Section I for \$85,000, and the reconstruction of Old York Road Section II for \$285,000. These applications have been presented to the commissioners, but no actions have been taken on them. The application for *Rocktown Hill Road Improvement Project* to the approach to the intersection of Route 31 was approved for \$100,000 by the Commissioners at their January 25, 2010 meeting. This project is in construction and progressing well. Due to inclement weather the Township requested an extension to complete this project in the Spring of 2011.

The Section 11 of Rocktown-Lambertville Road Reconstruction project is now completed. The Section 12 and Section 13 Road Reconstruction project are also completed. Reimbursement requests continue to be processed for sections 12, and 13 of the completed projects.

12. **Delaware Twp, NJ** – The Township received a new grant for the Improvements and *Resurfacing of Federal Twist Road*, and to install drainage improvements and erosion control within the existing road right of way. Maser Consulting Engineering is working on the design of this project. Delaware Township has indicated to the Commission that the plans are complete and ready for bid. CAI is awaiting plans for final review.

The Previous CAI projects were completed. The CAI department and the municipality are in the process of closing out the projects. The municipality made a request to utilize the remainder of its grant to chip seal the grant project and the due diligent engineer is still working with the municipality to ascertain the CAI qualification of the additional project cost

13. **Hopewell, NJ** – The Township was approved for a grant application for the design and construction of sidewalk replacement in the Village of Titusville. This application was awarded a grant by the Commissioners at their April 2010 meeting. The Township requested an extension until the spring of 2011 to complete this project. No major progress was made in this project during this month.

The ADA Ramps and Walkway project was complete. The CAI department is in the process of closing out of the project.

14. **Ewing, NJ** – In February, the Commissioners approved a reallocation of funds request of \$25,418 for a change of scope of work by extending the project another 600 LF of road improvements on Wilbertha Road. Last October, this project was awarded an extension to be completed by the Spring of 2011.
15. **Trenton, NJ** – in March 2011, the CAI director spoke with Michelle MacKinnon, project Manager of AECOM USA, Inc., and the engineer for the City of Trenton on this project who indicated that the project plans have been completed. The AECOM engineers are to meeting with the City to advertise the project for bids in April and award at the end of April. She also indicated that the project is still on schedule and weather permits it will be completed by the beginning of the 4th quarter of this year. The director is waiting for a copy of the full plans as there were some changes and delays due to plans of the landscaping part of the project.

The new person from the City of Trenton I charged of the project is Henrietta Owusu, director of Housing and Economic Development. It appears that the project is still on schedule to be completed by October 2011. A reimbursement request for design work in the amount of \$464,971.85 was received by the CAI department on December 14th and the due diligence engineer is reviewing it.

16. **Alpha NJ** – The Alpha's and Pohatcong's Reconstruction of Edge Rd. project has been completed and is in the process of being fully reimbursed and closed out.
17. **Kingwood, NJ** – The Township's Reconstruction of Tumble Falls Road was awarded a grant for \$373,000.00 and the contract agreement has been executed. The project has been awarded and most of the construction was completed by December 31, 2010. Most of the construction work, especially the roadway repaving, was done by municipal forces. The CAI Department continues to work on the reimbursement requests of the invoices for this project.
