#### **Academic Achievement**

Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

#### **College and Career Readiness**

This school outperforms 76% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 35% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 100% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. For all elementary and middle schools, this includes a measurement of how many students are chronically absent. For schools with middle school grades, it also includes a measurement of how many students take Algebra I in eighth grade.

#### **Student Growth**

This school outperforms 86% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 79% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of Student Growth. 

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




**Total School Enrollment Trends**




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03






#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**








#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -**Grade Level - 03**






#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



### **Enrollment by Grade**






#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup






### **Proficiency Trends - Math**









This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. In elementary and middle school, this includes the outcomes of the New Jersey Assessment of Skills and Knowledge (NJASK). The first column - Schoolwide Performance - in the table below includes measures of the total schoolwide proficiency rate in both language arts literacy and math. The second column - Peer School Percentile - indicates where the school's proficiency rate compares to its group of peer schools. For example, a school that has a peer school percentile rank of 65 has a proficiency rate that is higher than 65% of its peer schools. 






### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 06











Students in both elementary and middles schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. First, the table presents the percentage of students, as measured against the school's enrollment in eighth grade, who were reported via NJSMART as being enrolled in Algebra I. The table also presents the percentage of students who were chronically absent during the prior school year. A chronically absent student is a student who was not present for any reason for 10% or more of the total days possible for that individual student.

The first column - Schoolwide Performance - represents the outcomes for these particular indicators in this school. The second column - Peer School Percentile - indicates how the school's performance compares to its group of peer schools. For example, a school whose peer school is 65 in Algebra I Enrollment has a higher Algebra I Enrollment than 65% of its peer group. The third column - Statewide Percentile - indicates how the school's performance compares to schools across the state. The fourth column - Statewide Target - provides the statewide targets for each of these indicators. The last column - Met Target? - indicates whether the School Performance met or exceeded the statewide target.




#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**








## Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup














#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
