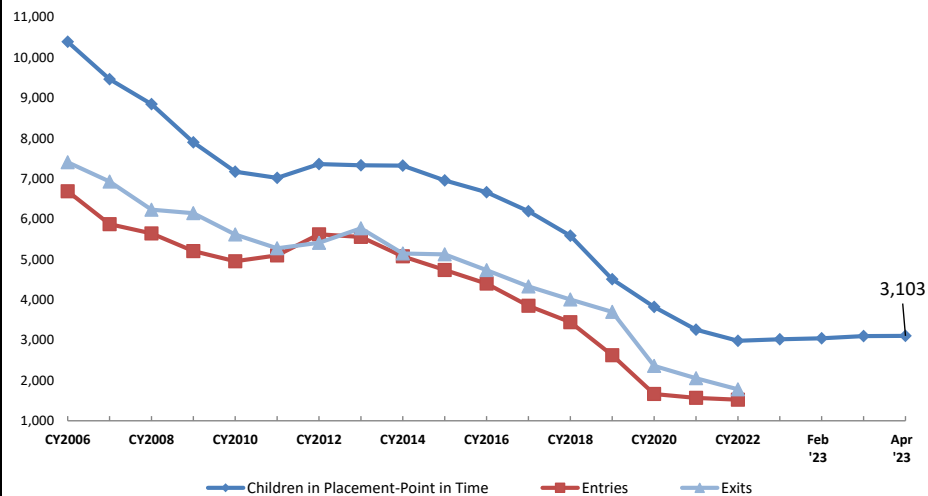

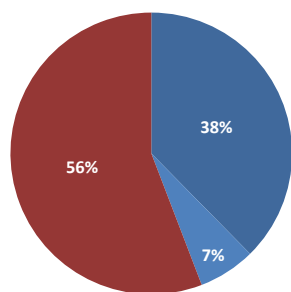

Annual Entries, Exits and Monthly Point in Time Children in Placement



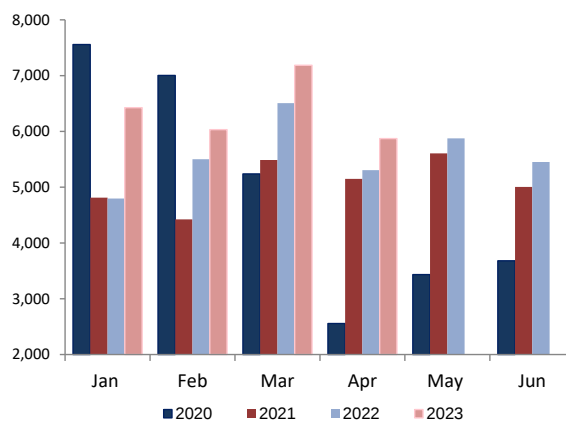

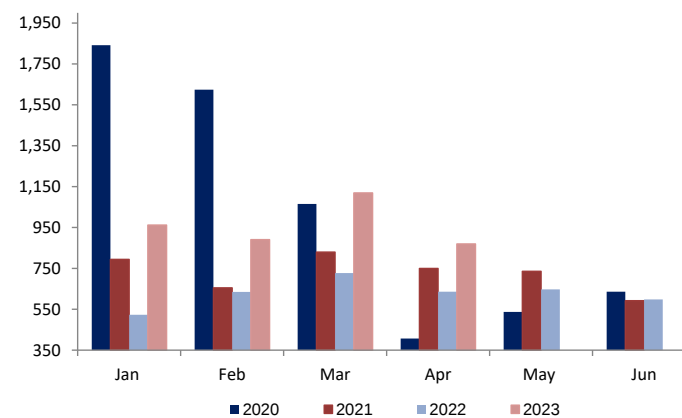

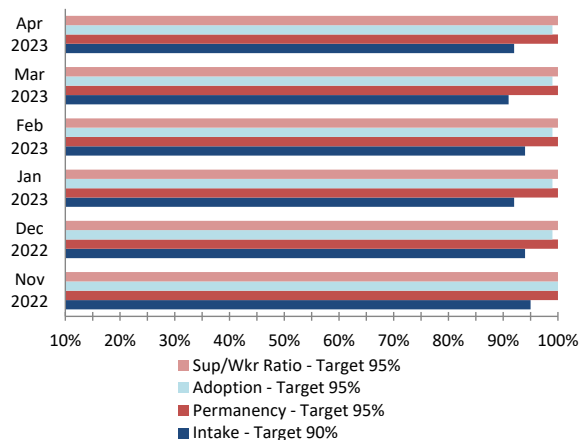


CWS Referrals Assigned to Local Offices

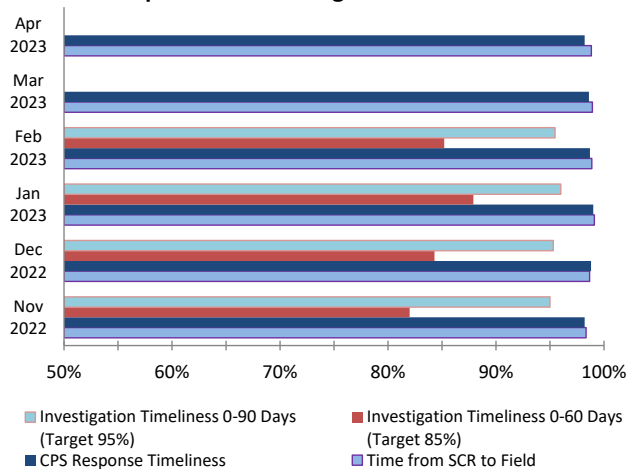

(Individual Worker Level)**

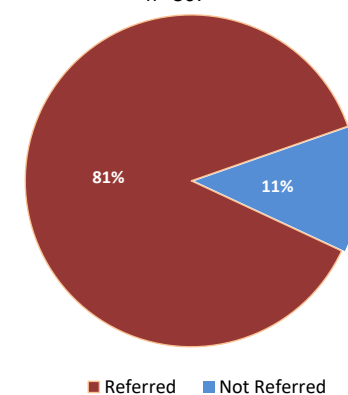


Response and Investigation Timeliness

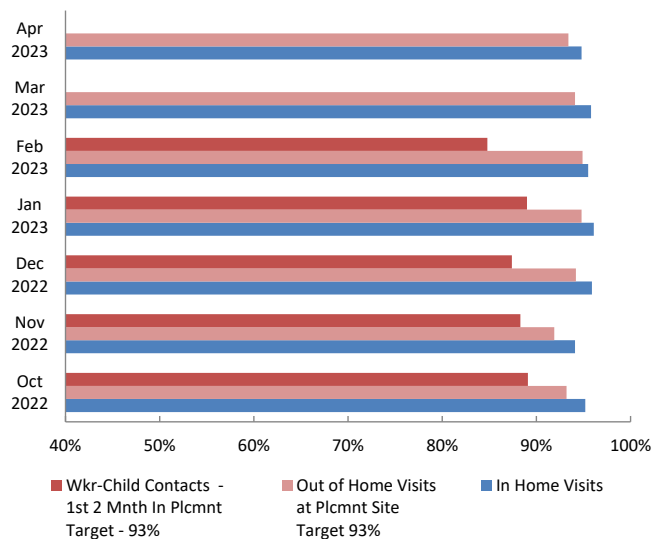


Referrals to Early Intervention

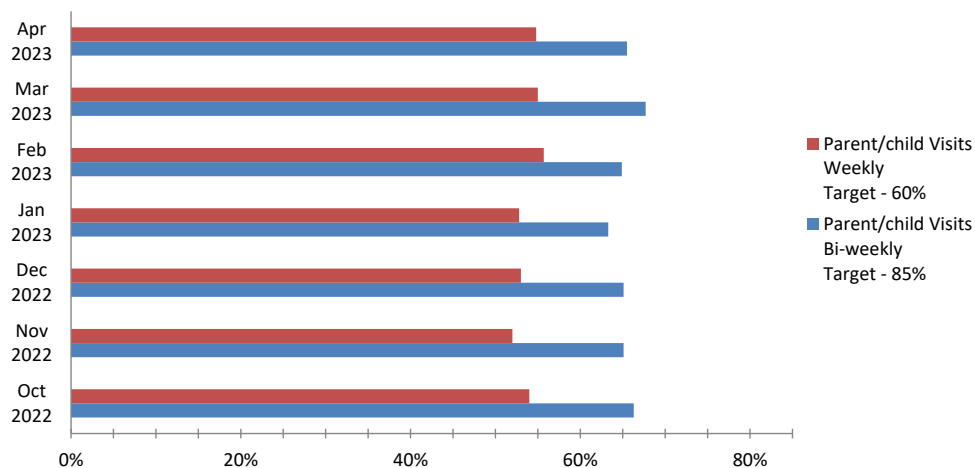

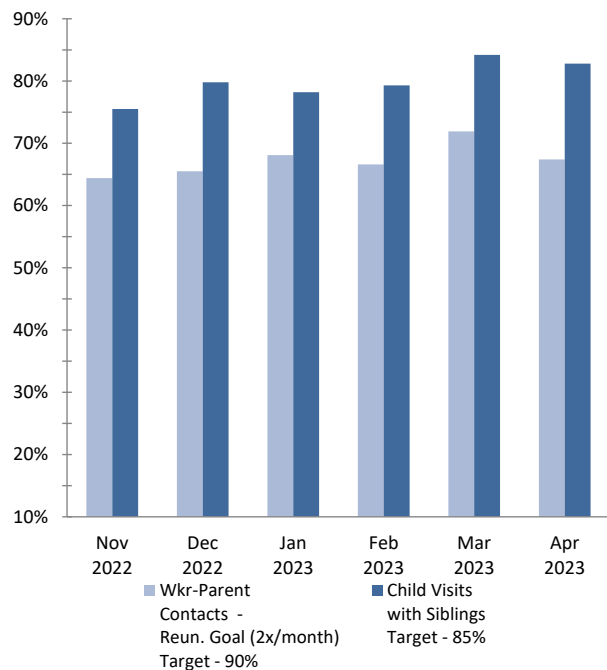


Parent - Child Visits

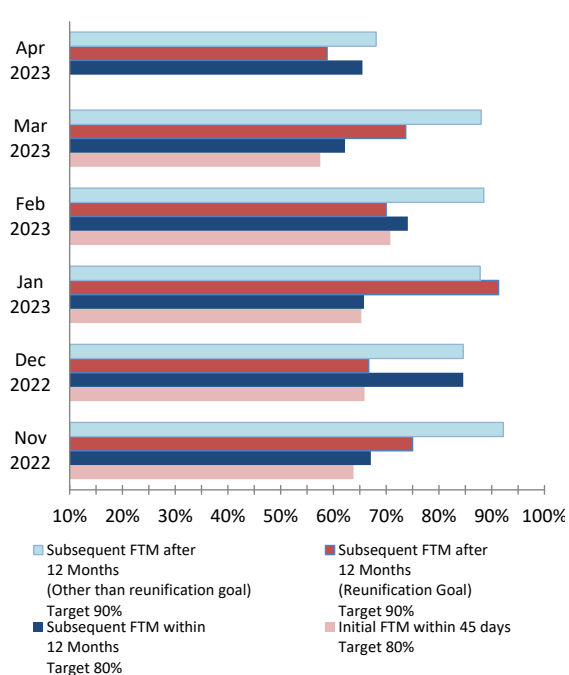

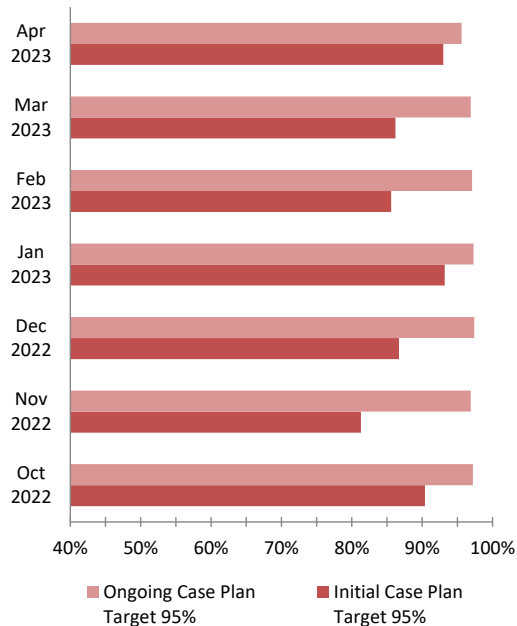

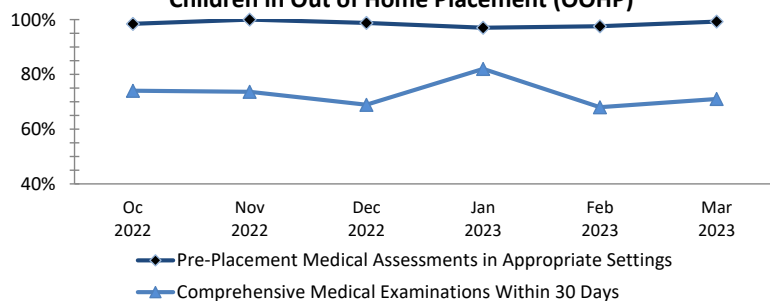

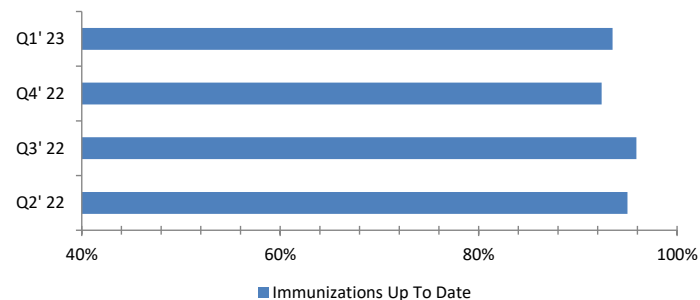

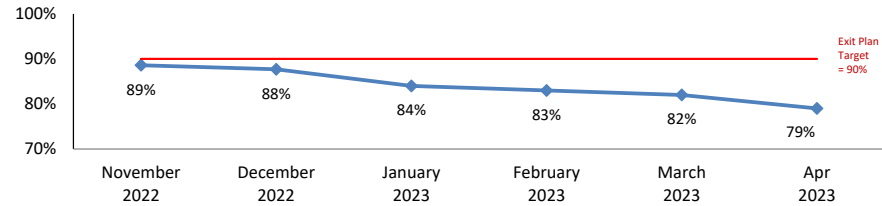

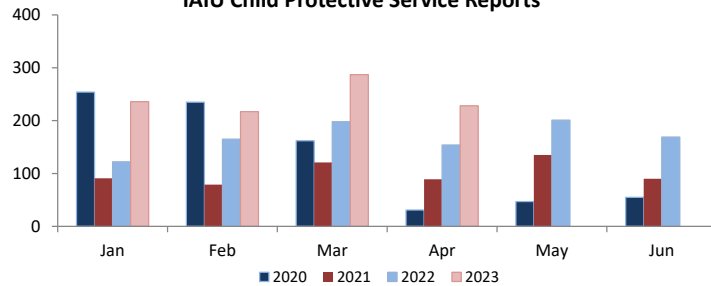

The goal of this ongoing work is to create three meaningful categories for 18-21 year olds 1) Youth in a formal out-of-home placement setting, 2) Youth that achieved permanency, and 3) Youth that never achieved permanency.

of Youth Ages 14-18 years



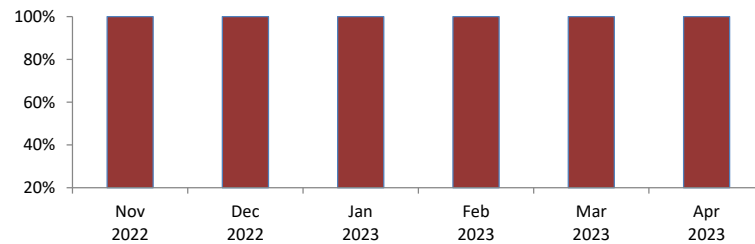

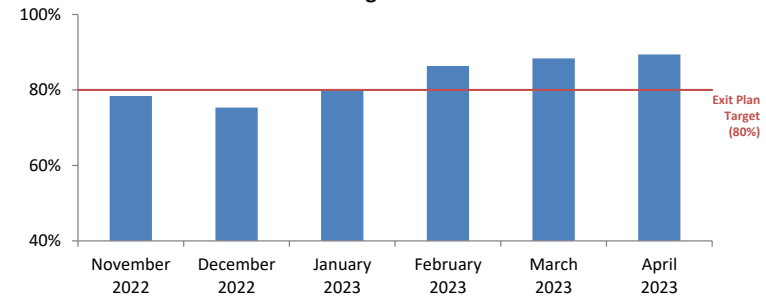

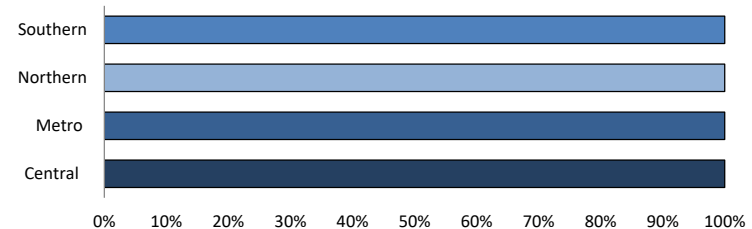

IAIU Investigation Timeliness



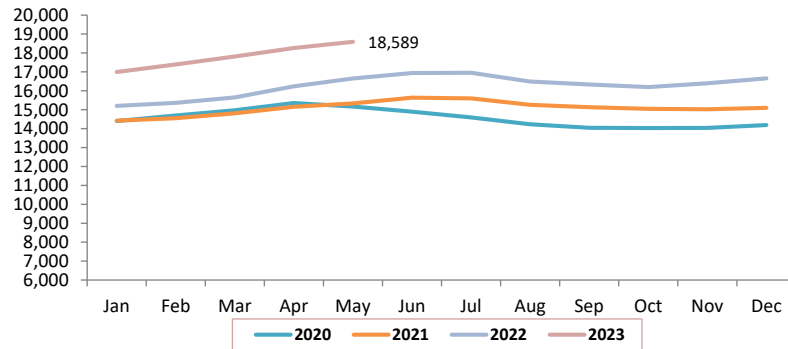
IAIU Caseload Report by Region

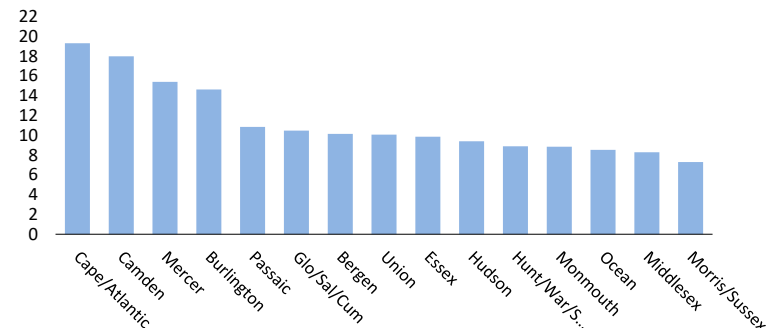

Rate of Children in Care Management by Service Area

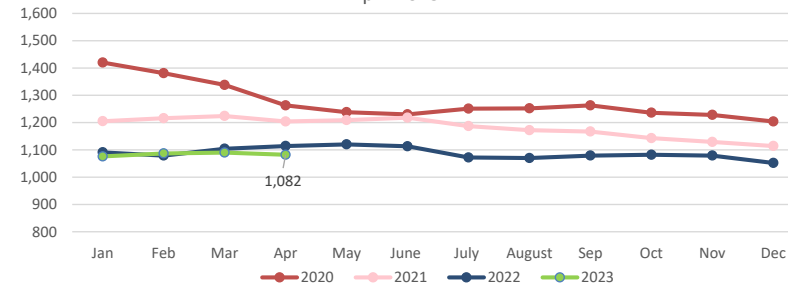

Children in Out of Home Treatment Settings

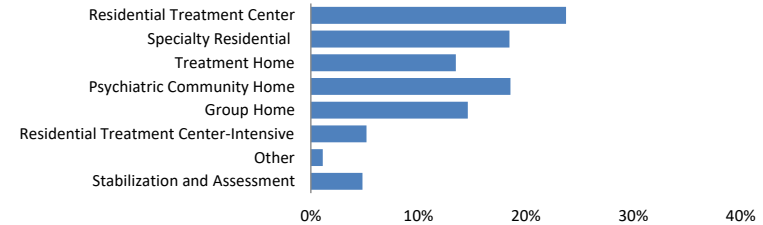

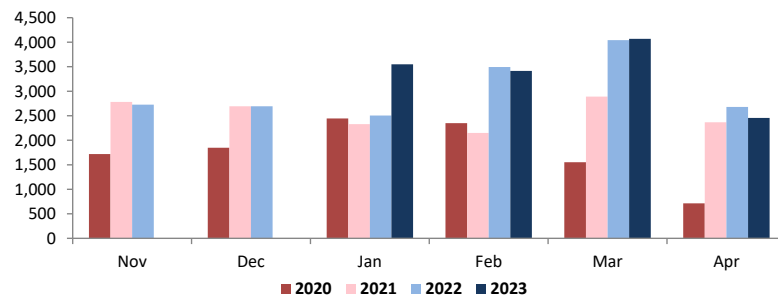
Children in Out-of-Home Treatment Settings

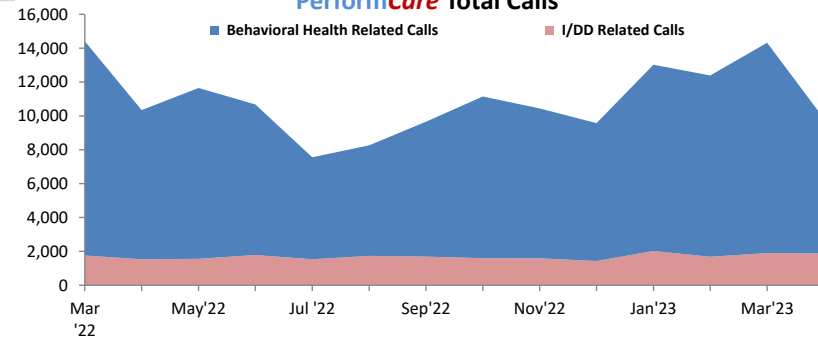


Mobile Response Stabilization Services (MRSS) Dispatched



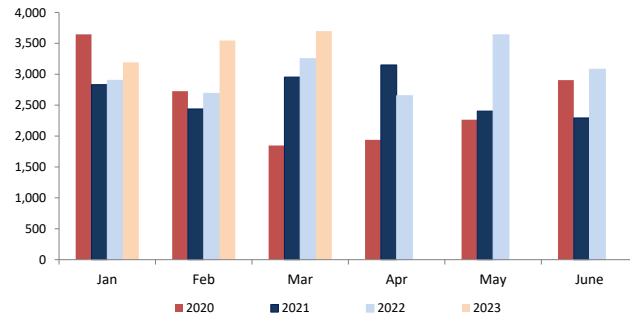
PerformCare Total Calls

Behavioral Health Related Calls I/DD Related Calls

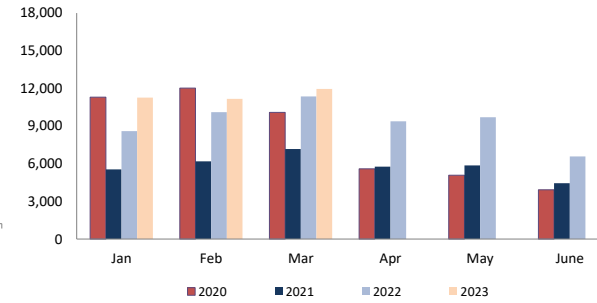

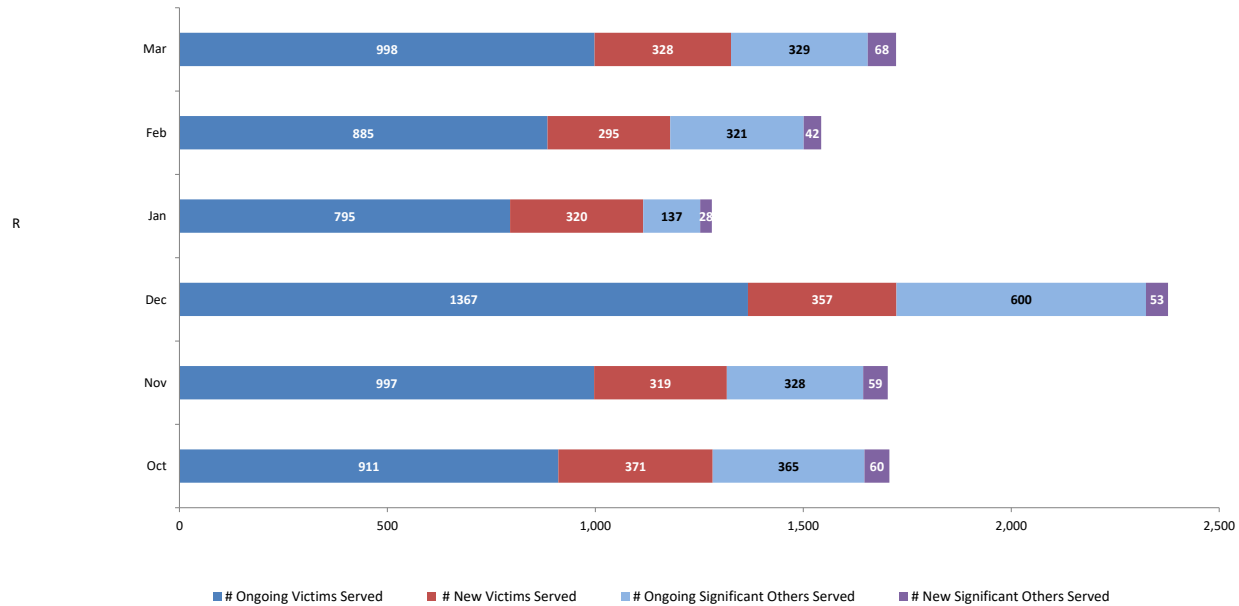


School-Based Youth Services Programs -
New and Ongoing Clients Served



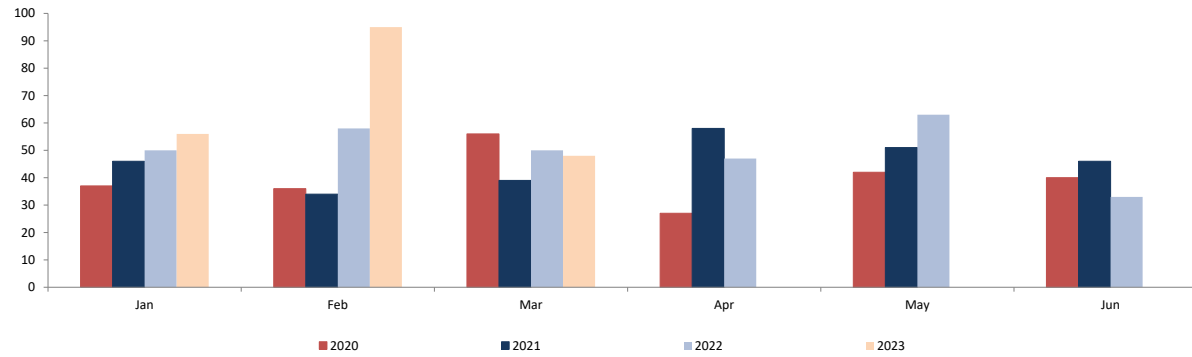

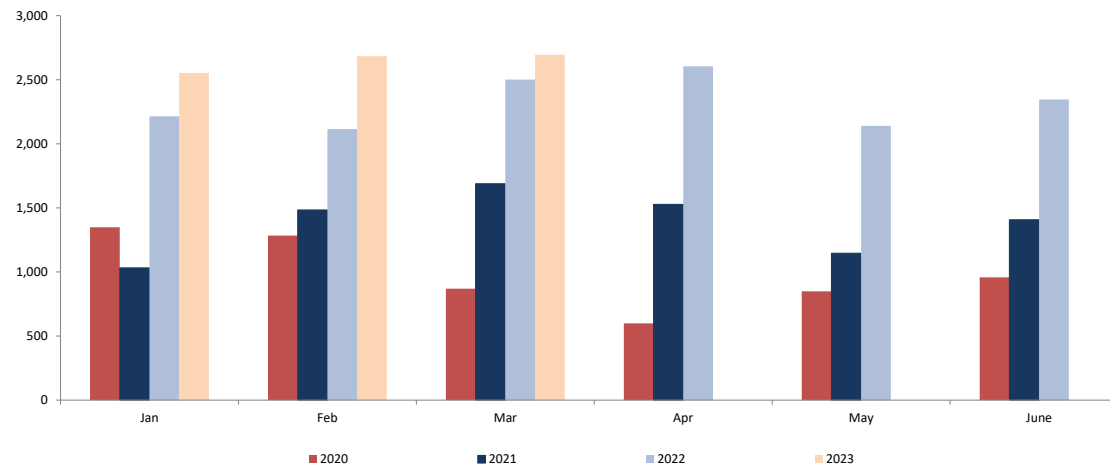

- Adoption worker compliance: % of adoption workers who meet the casead standards of 15 or fewer children. Target = 95%
- Office Compliance: % of offices that meet the casead standards of 15 or fewer children. Target = 95%
- Offices with blank data do not carry adoption caseads, however adoption cases in those offices are handled by other offices in that area.
