Subject: Compliance with Requirements of the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Act

Reference: N.J.S.A. 4:24-39 et seq. N.J.A.C. 5:23-1.4

Effective implementation of the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Act of 1975, as amended, depends upon cooperation between municipalities and the local soil conservation districts. A developer frequently becomes aware of the requirements of the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Act only when he or she approaches a municipality for development approval. Without cooperation between municipalities and soil conservation districts, securing compliance with the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Act becomes very difficult.

For a project covered by the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Act, a construction permit should not be issued unless a soil erosion and sediment control plan has been certified by the local soil conservation district. In addition, no certificate of occupancy should be issued upon completion of the project without a report of compliance from the soil conservation district. In municipalities that have a soil erosion and sediment control ordinance approved by the State Soil Conservation Committee, the required prior plan certifications and reports of compliance must be issued by the responsible municipal official. A Temporary Certificate of Occupancy may be issued if a Report of Compliance or Report of Compliance with Conditions has been issued.

The help of local construction officials in implementing this procedure is essential. Contact your local soil conservation district (see listing provided) if you need to determine whether a project is covered by the Soil Erosion and Sediment Control Act, and for additional information.
