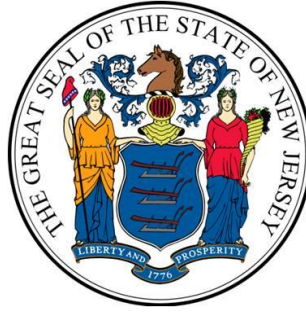

Work In Progress

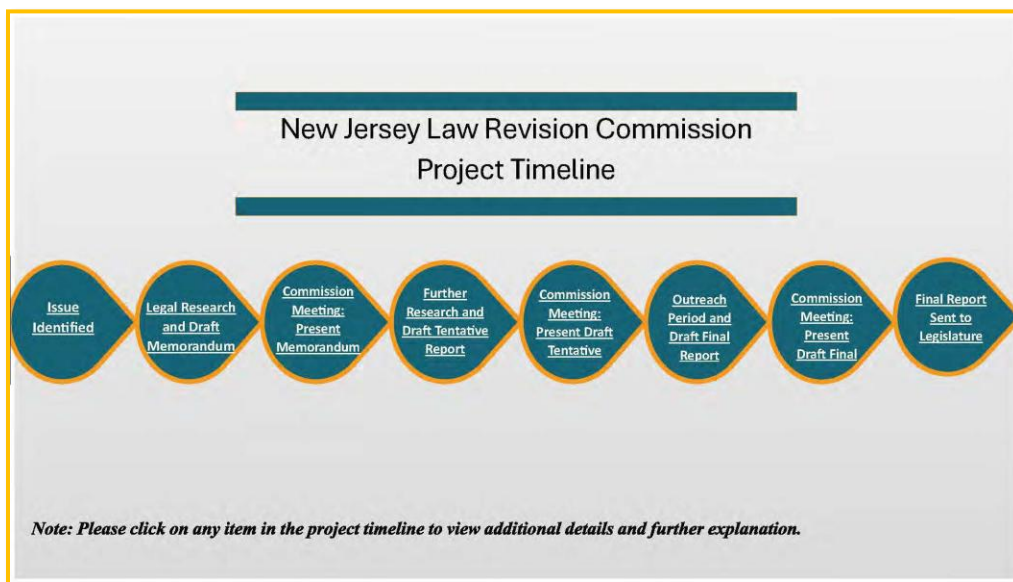

Enactments Reflecting the Work of the Commission

- **Application of EV Credits to Parking Requirements in Redevelopment Plans** - [S3740/A4375](#) - Specifies electric vehicle parking space calculation is rounded up if it includes a fraction of a whole number and rounded-up parking spaces cannot reduce overall parking supply by more than 10 percent - enacted as P.L.2026, c.51.
