Nonfarm employment in New Jersey declined primarily due to strikes by 14,100 from April to May to a seasonally adjusted total of 3,074,800. The strikes in May were in the construction industry, affecting about 12,000, and less substantially, in other scattered industries, affecting 1,700 workers.

Although the April-May downturn was the third abatement in as many months, New Jersey's May employment level (after adjustment for strikes), was still 51,600 higher than the August 1980 recession trough and remained close to the February record high.

Total jobs in nonmanufacturing decreased by 12,700 due to the construction strikes and government reductions. Construction employment went down by 13,100 to a seasonally adjusted level of 103,200, mainly because of statewide strikes by carpenters and the regional strikes in north and central New Jersey by masons, affecting the building and special trades sectors.

As was expected, federal funding cutbacks to the local government sector caused total government to decline for the seventh month in a row, dropping in the latest month by 800 to 119,800 jobholdings.

On the positive side, service employment registered an 1,100 increase over the month to 643,300, an all-time record high for this sector. Due to rapid growth centered in business services and casinos, jobholdings in the service sector has increased every month since April 1979.

In the manufacturing division, employment decreased by 1,400 to 776,300, due mainly to scattered layoffs in both the durable and non-durable goods sectors. The largest declines were registered in apparel and nonelectrical machinery, which dropped by 2,100 and 1,000, respectively. The leading over-the-month gainer was chemicals, which rose by 1,000, primarily because of returns from strikes in the inorganic sector.

The weekly earnings of manufacturing production workers averaged \$326.36 in May, an increase of \$4.04 from April and of \$32.82 from a year ago. After seasonal adjustment, the average workweek registered 41.1 hours, up by six minutes over the month.

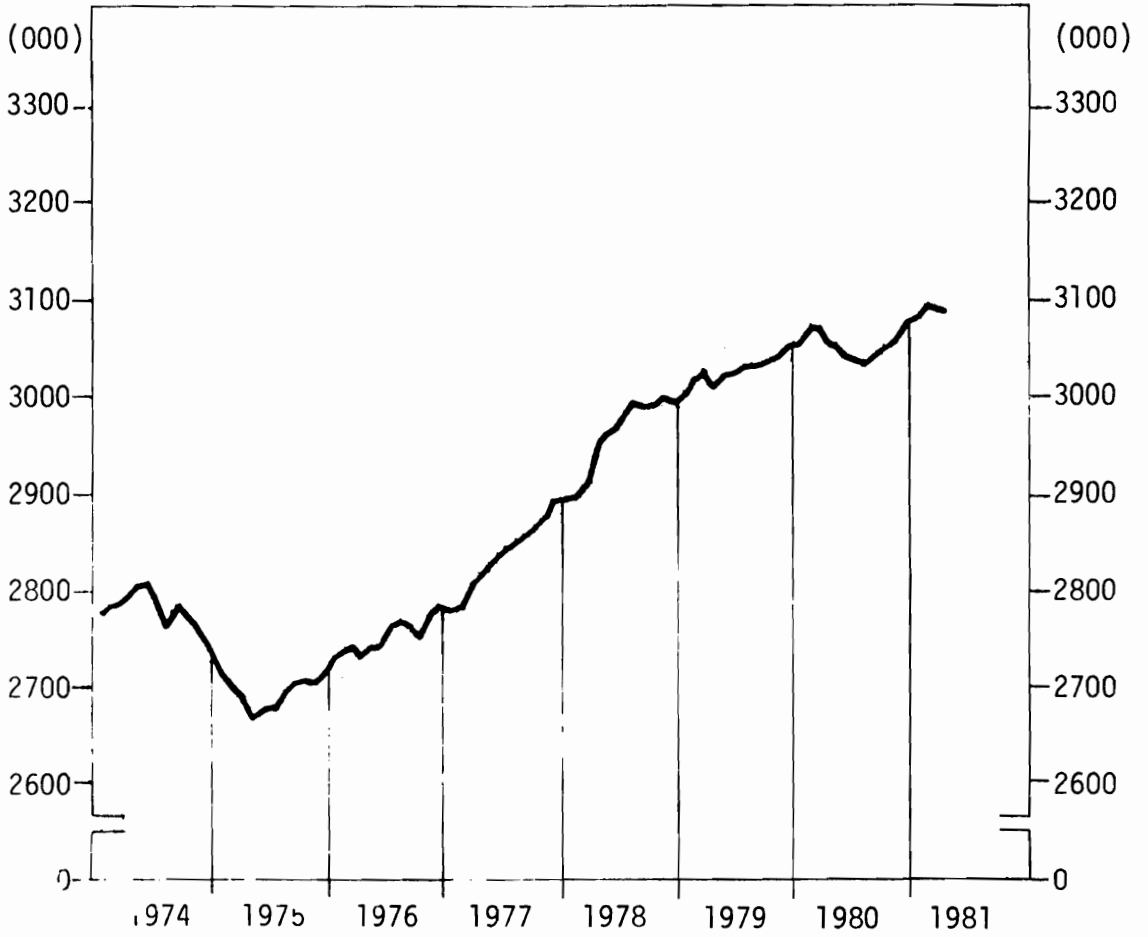

TECHNICAL NOTES

Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.

Average Hours and Earnings

Hours and earnings data are derived from reports of payroll and man-hours for production and related workers in manufacturing. When the reported pay period exceeds one week, the payroll and man-hour figures are reduced to a weekly basis.

Average hourly earnings for manufacturing are on a "gross" basis, reflecting not only changes in basic hourly rates, but also such variable factors as premium pay for overtime and shift work, and changes in output of workers paid on an incentive plan. Excluded from average earnings are irregular bonuses, retroactive items, payments of various welfare benefits, and payroll taxes paid by employers.
