


## NOTICE TO THE BAR

### COVID-19 -- DISCRETION FOR ALL GRAND JURIES TO MEET VIRTUALLY

In light of current and projected COVID-19 trends, the Supreme Court has authorized all grand juries to meet virtually through January 17, 2022. Counties will exercise discretion as to the format for county grand jury panels, and the Attorney General will determine how State Grand Jury panels will convene. The Court's December 30, 2021 Order is attached.

## SUPREME COURT OF NEW JERSEY

The Supreme Court in a series of Orders has authorized virtual grand juries on a temporary basis during the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, the Court in its [May 11, 2021 Order](#) required that as of August 1, 2021, all counties were to have at least one in-person grand jury panel, in addition to any optional virtual grand jury panels. In light of current COVID-19 surge and projections, the Court is temporarily suspending that requirement.

Accordingly, it is ORDERED that the following provisions are effective immediately through January 17, 2022:

1. Counties shall have discretion for all grand juries to meet virtually.
2. State Grand Jury may convene in person or virtually.
3. All other provisions of the Court's May 11, 2021 Order regarding grand juries remain in effect.
