Transcript:

When you look at the men and the women who are displayed here, and the ones that I mentioned, it should tell them that there's absolutely nothing that they can't accomplish if they put their mind to it. And I also have, I think, a real predisposition to the edge that New Jersey people bring as well. No. not only from a governmental perspective but culturally as well. New Jerseyans fascinate American. I can tell you as I travel around the country I get asked all the time about some of our great folks here who have culturally taken over areas of this country-not only with their talent but with their personality. And, you know, whether you're talking about the late James Gandolfini and what he did as a Rutgers alum and the star of The Sopranos or whether you're talking about the late Whitney Houston, who charmed the entire world with her extraordinary gifts and talents-add it to all these other folks we talked about, New Jersey has put forward to the public, not only from an intellectual perspective but from a cultural perspective, some extraordinary folks. And I'm incredibly proud to be the Governor of this state and to be involved in this project.
