


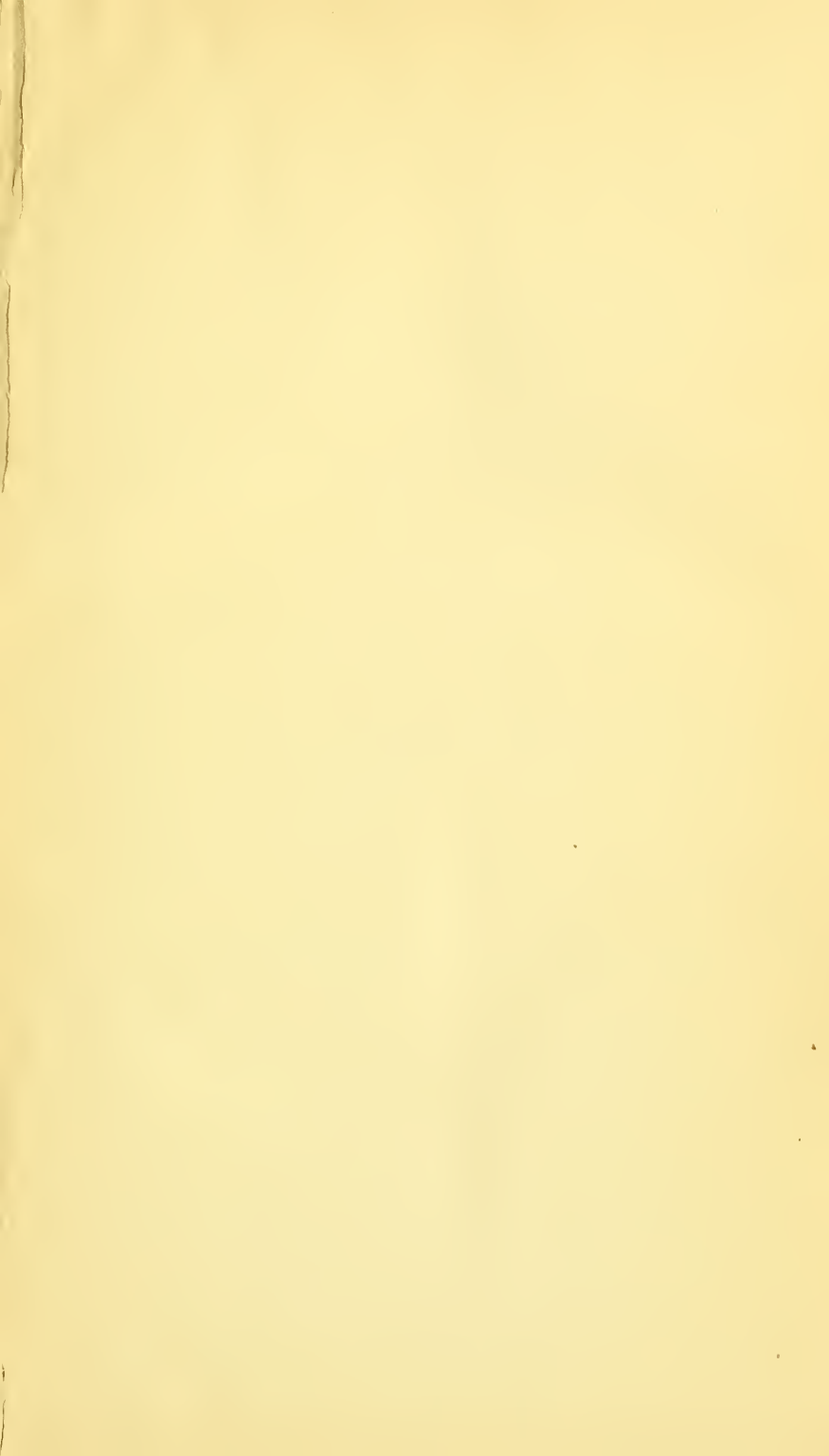

REPORT OF THE QUARTER-MASTER-GENERAL.

*To his Excellency* GEORGE F. FORT, *Governor and Commander-in Chief of all the Military and Naval Forces of the State of New Jersey:*

The Quarter-Master-General of New Jersey respectfully reports the number and condition of the arms and equipments, &c., in the State Arsenal, *viz:*

5752 New brown muskets.

4010 Muskets heretofore issued and returned.

140 Rifles heretofore issued and returned.

Artillery and cavalry stock, tents, &c., the same as stated in the last annual report, since which period, there have been issued by order of your Excellency pursuant to the statute upon requisitions—

36 Percussion rifles with usual equipments and 4 sergent's swords to Capt. Chiswell, for the use of the "Liberty Rifles," of Paterson, Passaic Brigade.

40 Bright flint-lock muskets, &c., to Capt. Harris, for the use of the "Washington Blues," of Hudson.

40 Bright flint-lock muskets to Capt. Donnelly, for the use of the "Emmet Light Guard," of Paterson, Passaic.

20 Percussion rifles, &c., to Capt. Luhmuller, for the use of the "Jefferson Riflemen," of Elizabethtown, Essex.

40 Percussion rifles to Capt. Wimmer, for the use of the "Scott Riflemen," of Elizabethtown, Essex.

40 Bright muskets to Capt. Hand, for the use of the "American Continentals," of Newark, Essex.

40 Percussion muskets to Capt. Osmun, for the use of the "Union Blues," of Orange, Essex.

40 Percussion muskets to Capt. Young, for the use of the "Washington Blues," of Belleville, Essex.

40 Brown muskets to Capt. McQuade, for the use of the "Trenton Irish Volunteers," Mercer.

40 Percussion muskets to Capt. Foster, for the use of the "Shields' Guards," of Belleville, Essex.

40 Flint-lock rifles, &c., to Capt. Kahnweiler, for the use of the "Republican Rifles, of Trenton, Mercer.
