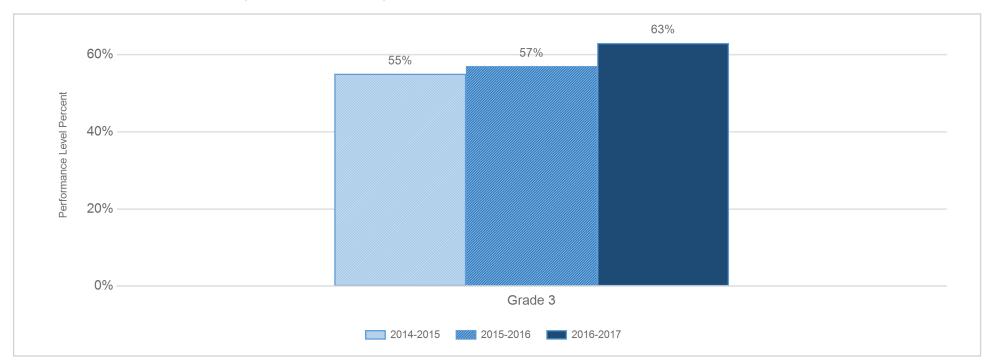

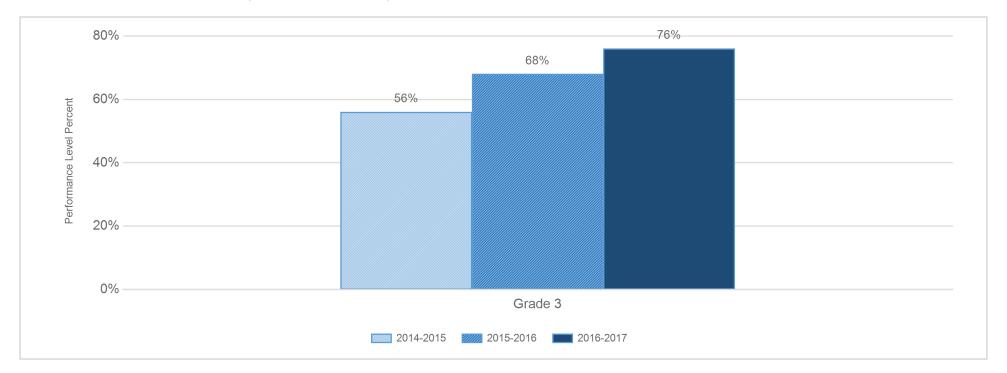

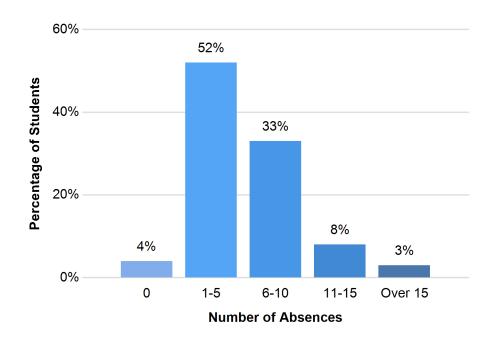

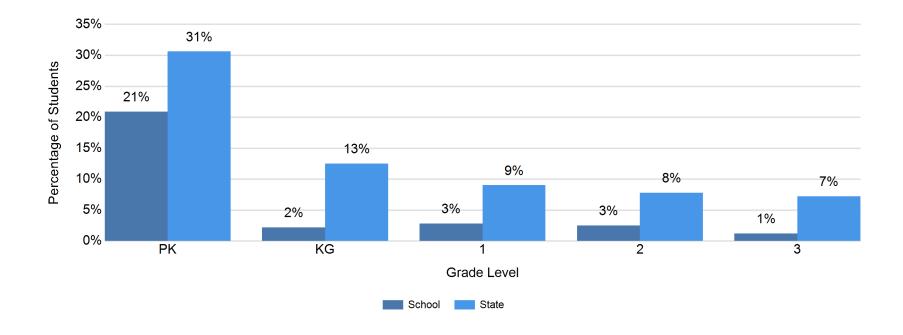

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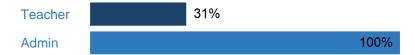

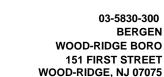

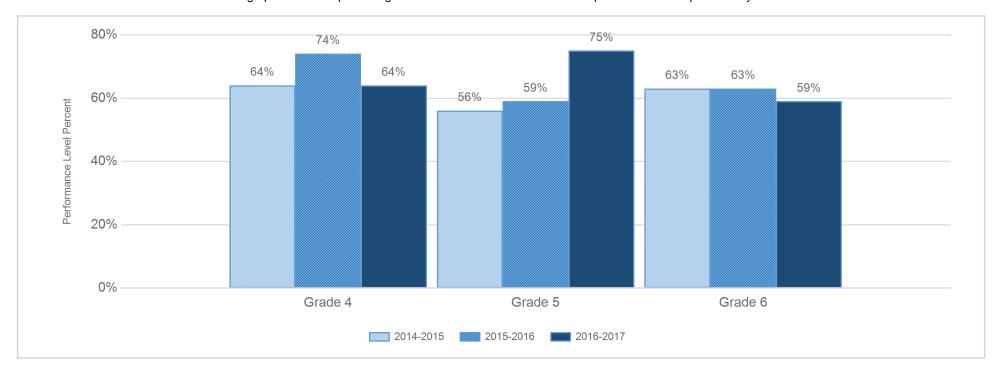

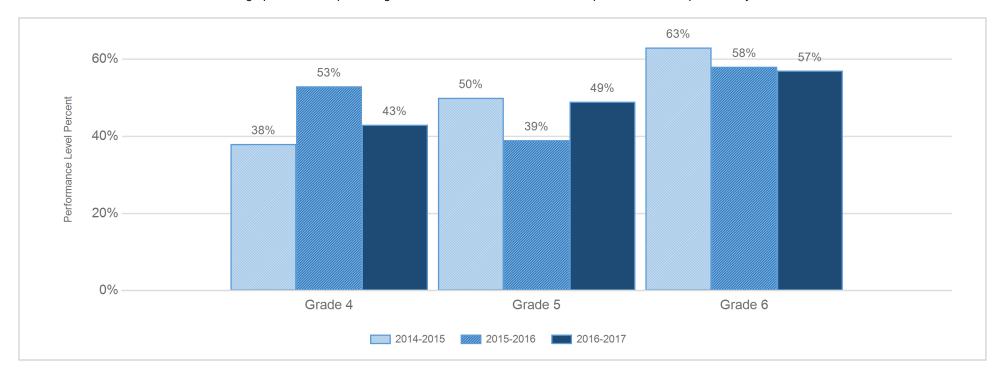

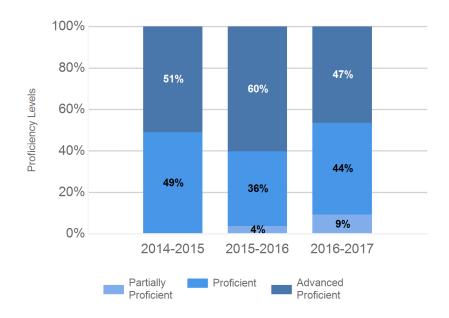

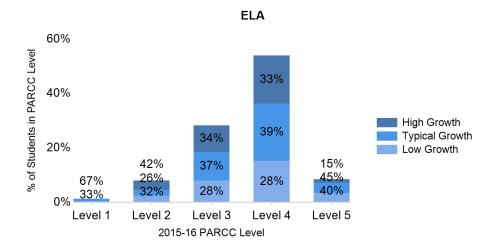

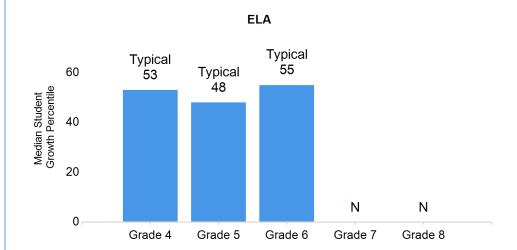
These graphs show the percentage of students by 2015-16 PARCC performance level that fall into each of the three levels of growth based on their 2016-17 test scores.

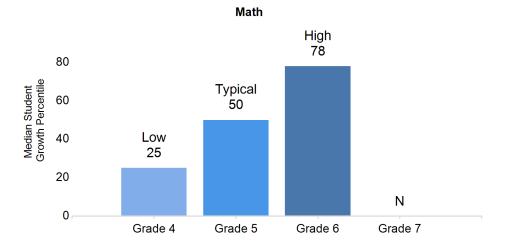




Student Growth by Grade

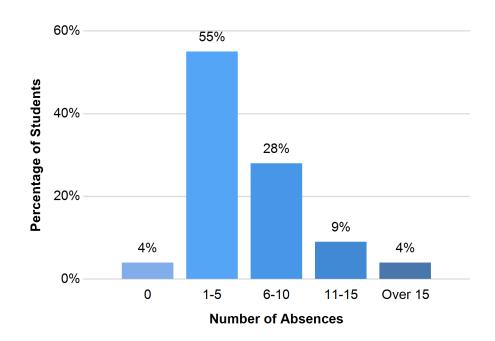

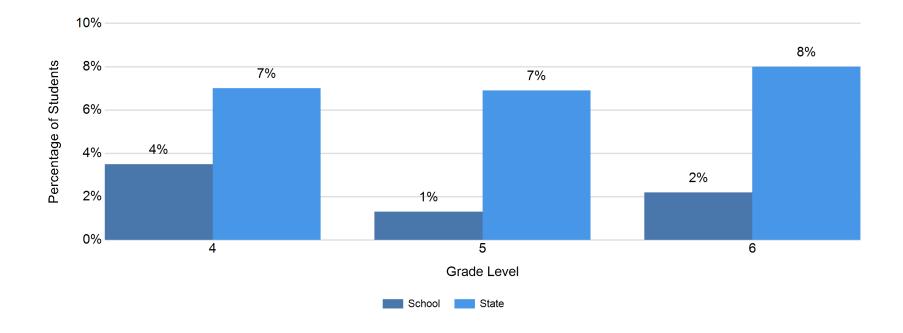

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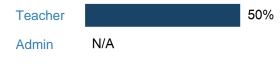

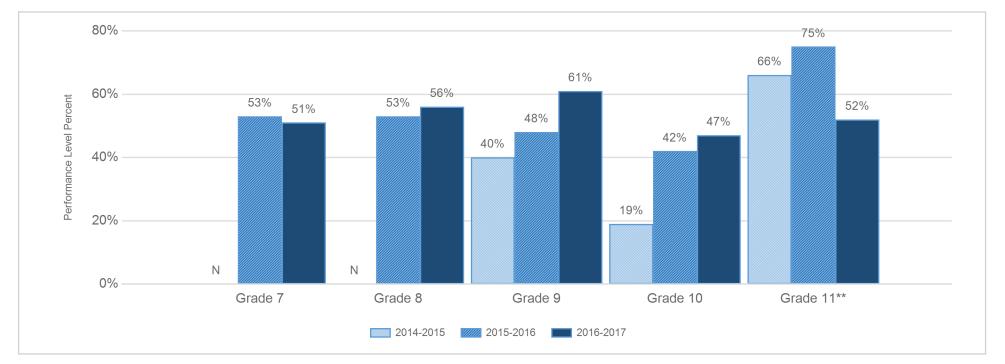

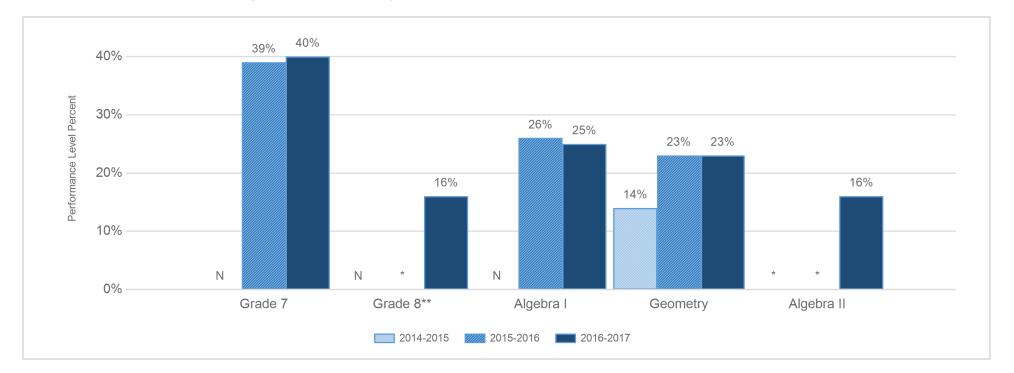

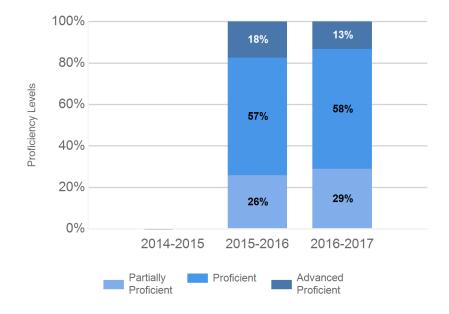

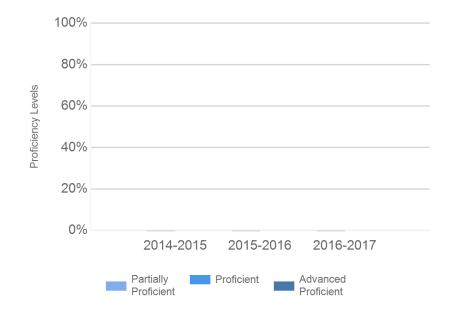

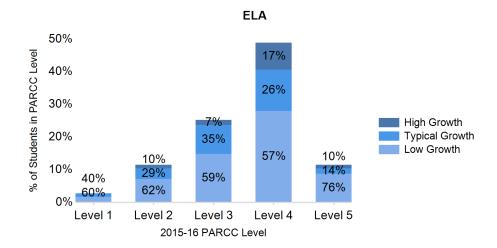

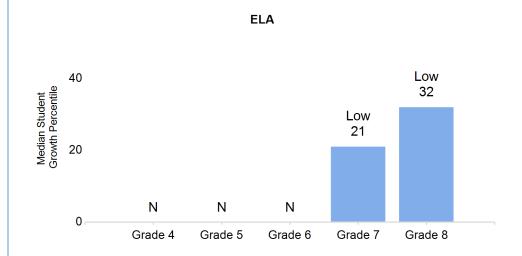
These graphs show the percentage of students by 2015-16 PARCC performance level that fall into each of the three levels of growth based on their 2016-17 test scores.

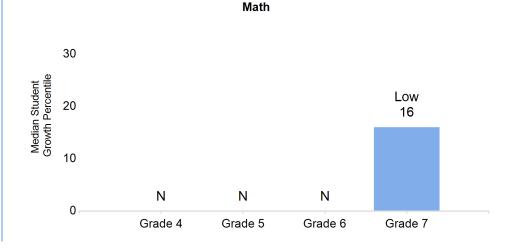




Student Growth by Grade

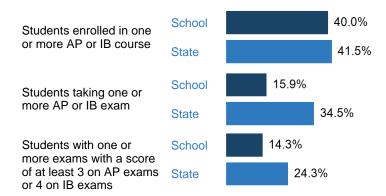

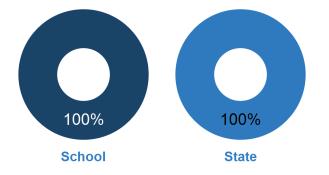

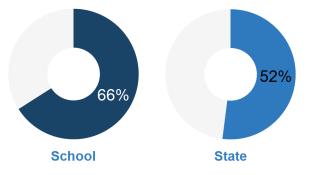


Students enrolled in one or more **visual and performing arts** classes

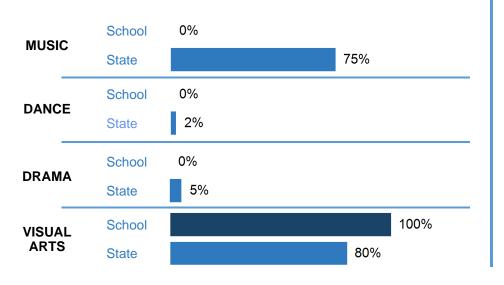

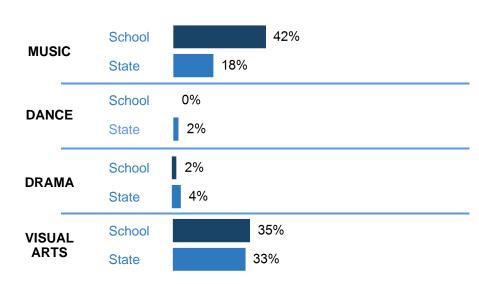

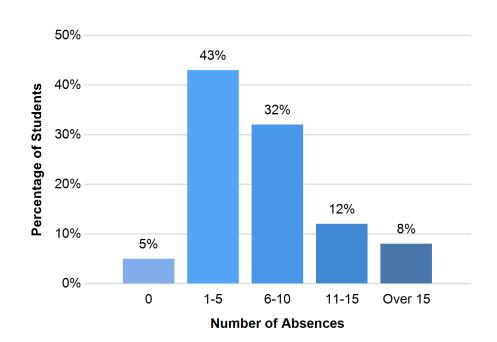

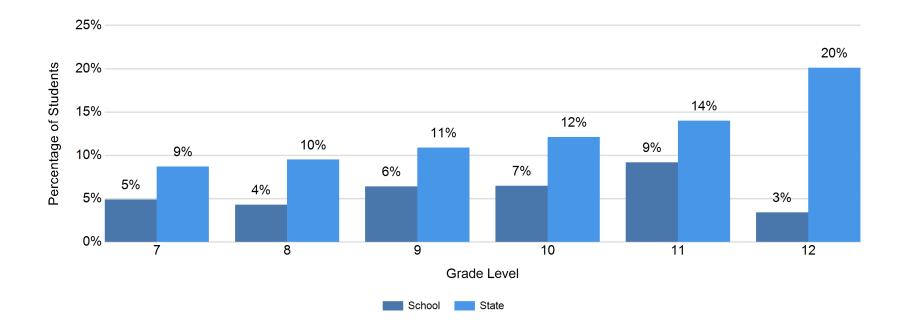

The 2016-2017 School Year has Wood-Ridge Junior/Senior High School implementing a rotating, drop schedule which allows students to enroll in one additional academic class. Wood-Ridge Junior/Senior High School offers a full range curriculum to meet the needs of all students. Through partnerships with local institutions of higher learning, specifically Fairleigh Dickinson University - Middle College Program, students are able to enroll in courses which have been approved for college credit and can earn these credits when successfully completing each course.
