*To the Governor and Commander in Chief:*

I have the honor to submit herewith the annual report of the operations of this department for the fiscal year ended this day.

From an inspection of the annual returns made according to law, by the Companies of the National Guard, the arms and accoutrements in their possession appear to be in fair condition. Such arms as are reported as needing repairs will be ordered returned to the Arsenal, and accoutrements lost or worn out in the service will be replaced by new ones, provided such losses have occurred "without fraud or culpable negligence" on the part of commandants. There have been no companies disbanded during the year.

Under Special Orders No. 5, Headquarters Division, National Guard, dated at Newark, June 26th, Company G, First Regiment, was transferred to the Third Battalion of the Second Regiment and designated as Company M.

Under Special Orders No. 9, Headquarters Division, National Guard, dated at Newark, July 7th, the company of infantry located at Arlington previously mustered into the service of the State has been attached to the Third Battalion of the First Regiment and designated as Company G. This company has been uniformed, armed and equipped upon requisitions duly approved.

Under Special Orders No. 14, Headquarters Division, National Guard, dated at Newark, October 10th, the company of infantry located at Hoboken previously mustered into the service of this State, has been assigned to the Third Battalion of the Fourth Regiment and designated as Company K. This company will be uniformed, armed and equipped upon receipt of requisitions therefor at this office.

MAGAZINE RIFLE CAL. 30.

According to the report of the Chief of Ordnance, U. S. Army, the full capacity of the Springfield Armory will not be more than eighty rifles per day of this pattern and several causes of delay have arisen in the issues to the regular army. It will be some time before the

government will have a supply sufficient to issue to or exchange with the militia of the several States for the service arm now in use.

The specimen issued to the Governor of this State has been thoroughly tested by a competent board of officers with some excellent results. The piece was without a wind gauge and the sights not graduated for range shooting, or arranged to allow for drift. The government is correcting these defects. When completed it will be a formidable addition to the armament of the regular troops and to the militia of such States as will adopt it.

#### ENCAMPMENT.

The Second Brigade, National Guard, composed of the Third, Sixth and Seventh Regiments, and Gatling Gun Company B, National Guard, together with the First Troop (S. O. No. 15, office of the Adjutant-General, dated at Trenton, June 15th), and Company E, Fourth Regiment (S. O. No. 7, Headquarters National Guard, dated at Newark, June 27th), all under command of Brigadier and Brevet Major-General William J. Sewell, encamped at Sea Girt from July 16th to 21st inclusive.

UNVEILING OF THE M'CLELLAN EQUESTRIAN STATUE AT PHILADELPHIA, OCTOBER 24TH.

New Jersey was represented on this interesting occasion by the Sixth Regiment, National Guard, with Company H; Seventh Regiment temporarily attached, under command of Colonel William H. Cooper; Gatling Gun Company B, Captain John R. Jones, and the First Troop, National Guard, Captain James E. Fleming. Great coats, transportation and subsistence were furnished by this department.

QUARTERMASTER GENERAL'S DEPARTMENT.

The Legislature at its last session passed an act authorizing the Governor and Commander-in-Chief to appoint four deputy Quartermasters-General with the rank of colonel.

Lieutenant-Colonels Loutrel, Early and Felton, of the department, were promoted under this act. The fourth appointment was given to Lieutenant George P. Olcott, late Quartermaster of the Third Battalion, consolidated. Colonel Olcott proved himself during the late encampment to be an efficient officer and a valuable addition to the department.

The Legislature also passed an act authorizing the Commander-in-Chief to appoint a Paymaster with the rank of Captain to be attached to the pay department of this office. Samuel S. Armstrong, chief clerk of the department, received this appointment. Captain Armstrong has performed the duties incident to the Paymaster-General's department for many years and the appointment was a just recognition of his services.

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## REPORTS.

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SOUTH ORANGE, N. J., October 31st, 1894.

GENERAL—I have the honor to report that, in accordance with orders from your department, I reported to your headquarters at Sea Girt, N. J., on the 14th day of July, for duty as Deputy Quartermaster General during the encampment of the Second Brigade, N. G. S. of N. J., ready to perform any and all duties that might come up in the department, which includes the departments of commissary, of subsistence, paymaster and ordnance. I made, by your request, inspections of the commissary department, and also inspections of the mess of the different organizations in camp, and found the rations issued by the State to the troops of good quality and sufficient for each organization for the number of men each organization had in camp. The only suggestion I could make in connection with the subsistence of the troops would be better kitchen facilities.

In accordance with your orders I kept a general supervision of all matters pertaining to the department of Quartermaster-General, &c., carrying out all and every order issued by yourself, from day to day, during the encampment. The preliminary arrangements made by yourself for the conducting of the different departments of which you are chief, were such that your deputies were enabled to perform their duties in such a manner that no just complaint could be made against the departments.

GENERAL—I have the honor to submit the following report: In accordance with your orders, I reported at Sea Girt on Saturday, the 14th of July, and entered at once upon the duty assigned to me,

which was to make a daily, or as frequent as necessary, inspection of the mess houses, mess kitchens, quality and condition of food furnished, the manner of preparing same at the encampment with the Second Brigade, N. G., and such matter in connection with the commissary arrangements of the encampment as might present themselves. Also to report any complaint as to the inadequacy of supplies or mess arrangements.

I found the food furnished by your department to be wholesome in condition and quality and abundant in quantity. Of these facts I also received the personal assurances of the regimental commandants, and those of their quartermasters and assistants. They were especially pleased with the double allowance of fresh fish, as being an excellent substitute for the meat ration.

The mess houses are commodious and comfortable, with good ventilation. I heard some little criticism as to the kitchens being inadequate for the work necessary in the preparation of the rations, but as the complaint was not general, and the mess kitchens are uniform in size and equipment, I am satisfied that the grievance was imaginary, and I know from personal inspection that any such complaint would not be well founded.

SIR—I reported at Sea Girt for duty June 19th, in compliance with your order detailing me to take general charge of the work of constructing camp for the use of the Second Brigade, N. G. N. J. At the time designated for the arrival of the troops the camp was complete and ready for them to occupy. I found it impossible to build the camp to conform to the regulations, owing to the location of the buildings used as officers' mess halls. I would suggest that they be removed before the time for the next encampment.

The question of camp and garrison equipage is somewhat perplexing to handle and I think needs some consideration during the coming winter.

When the troops arrived and during the encampment you assigned me to take charge of the commissary department, detailing as my assistant Lieutenant John H. Hopper, Quartermaster Second Regiment, N. G. N. J. As very few complaints reached me I infer that the quality and quantity of the food was satisfactory.

I most respectfully request that the matter of new and improved facilities for cooking and preparing food for the men while in camp

receive consideration before next season. I am convinced that with modern conveniences the cost of subsistence could be reduced and a greater variety of rations served.

So much more space will be required by the First Brigade when in camp, the extension of the system of water-supply seems imperative.

I remained on duty until the canvas not used by the Department of Rifle Practice was taken down, the camp and garrison equipage and other State property safely stored in the buildings used for that purpose.

MY DEAR SIR—As requested by you, I beg leave to report as to the sanitary conditions of the camp of the Second Brigade last July. After making daily inspections I found everything in as good order as the present arrangements would allow. The new sinks were a decided improvement over the Sibley tents formerly used. The water supply was adequate and of good quality. No trouble arose from lack of drainage. I would recommend for your consideration the need of better kitchens, and that the quartermasters inspect more carefully the cooking and care of garbage. The only complaint I heard in regard to the rations issued, after an examination, proved to be entirely the fault of the cooks.
