Report of the Quartermaster General

To the Governor:

SIR:—I have the honor to submit herewith the report of the operations of this department for the fiscal year ending October 31, 1914.

QUARTERMASTER CORPS.

General Orders No. 1, Adjutant General's Office, dated January 2, 1915, authorizes the warranting of ten sergeants, first class, as an addition to the Quartermaster Corps. It is intended to meet this requirement by having the several organizations of the State nominate non-commissioned officers qualified in supply work for appointment by the Quartermaster General.

Memoranda of instructions are being prepared for distribution to the commissioned officers of the Quartermaster Corps prescribing the action to be taken by them in connection with equipping, transporting and subsisting, and providing horses for the several organizations of the State in event of call into the United States service. These instructions will familiarize the officers of the Quartermaster Corps in advance of the duties that must be performed by them in connection with the mobilization of the National Guard, and the instructions can be made operative immediately upon authority from the War Department, thereby avoiding any delay in the mobilization plans, and distributing the work ordinarily performed by this office in such manner that its several branches can be handled concurrently by all officers of the Corps.

The cooperation of the regimental supply officers is urged, and it is intended to provide for their information and guidance a memorandum of duties that would fall upon them in connection with the mobilization plans in order to insure a uniformity and understanding of their part of the work.

PROPERTY ACCOUNTABILITY.

The annual inspections of 1915 will be conducted, insofar as the State is concerned, principally for the purpose of making inventory of all public property held by the several organizations, in order that comparison may be made with the charges on the books of this office, and action taken toward the accounting for deficient and un-serviceable stores. Immediately after the inspection is completed, all organizations will be furnished with a comparative statement showing a detailed list of property of all classes passed upon by the inspecting officers, together with a list of charges upon the books of this office, in order that the deficiency may be determined and an adjustment made with the War Department for the deficient stores.

ARMORIES.

During the fiscal year just ended, armories have been completed at Camden for Battery B, Field Artillery; at Red Bank for Troop B, 1st Squadron, Cavalry; at Orange for Companies H and I, Fifth Infantry; and at Bridgeton for Company K, Third Infantry. Plans are in course of preparation for buildings at Asbury Park for Company H, Third Infantry, and at New Brunswick for Company H, Second Infantry. These buildings should be completed and equipped by April 1, 1915.

APPROPRIATIONS.

The Appropriation Committee at the last session of the Legislature saw fit to curtail the fixed allotments for expenses of the annual encampments and manoeuvres, rifle practice, etc., for fiscal year beginning November 1, 1915. As the allotment made by the National Government for the Organized Militia depends upon every organization of the National Guard participating for a certain number of days in out-door encampment or manoeuvres, it is hoped that the Legislature will at its coming session restore the amounts deducted from the allotments for the current year. An earnest effort will be made by this department to have this action taken by the Appropriation Committee when it meets in January.

ENCAMPMENTS AND RIFLE PRACTICE.

A camp of instruction for infantry and medical officers was established at Sea Girt June 15th to 20th, 1914, inclusive.

A camp of instruction for officers and enlisted men students at the School of Musketry was established at Sea Girt June 29th to July 1st, 1914, inclusive.

The regular rifle camp of instruction in rifle practice was established at Sea Girt for the season dating from July 11th to August 22d, 1914, inclusive. In addition thereto, the National Matches for Divisional Competition were held at Sea Girt from August 24th to September 8th, inclusive.

The annual encampments and practice marches of the organizations of the State were held at the places and on the dates indicated in General Orders No. 21, A. G. O., c. s., from July 18th to August 22d, 1914, inclusive:

- At Sea Girt—July 18th to 25th, inclusive—1st Brigade Headquarters, 1st Infantry, 5th Infantry.
 July 25th to Aug. 1st, inclusive—2nd Infantry, 4th Infantry.
 Aug. 1st to 8th, inclusive—3rd Infantry, 1st Field Hospital.
- At Tobyhanna, Pa.—July 6th to 15th, inclusive—Battery A, Field Artillery, Battery B, Field Artillery.
- Practice Marches—Aug. 15th to 22nd, inclusive—Troop A, 1st Cavalry, Troop B, 1st Cavalry, Troop C, 1st Cavalry.
 Aug. 8th to 15th, inclusive—1st Field Co., Signal Corps.
