Annual Report

Hon. William N. Runyon, Governor of New Jersey:

SIR:—Herewith is presented the annual report of the New Jersey State Library for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1919. Also, report of the accessions and expenditures of the Library for the period from November 1, 1917, to June 30, 1918.

ACCESSIONS.

The total number of books and pamphlets of a permanent character added to the State Library stock for the year ending June 30, 1919, was 4,149, and the total for the period from November 1, 1917, to June 30, 1918, was 2,658. These additions bring the total number of books and pamphlets of a permanent character in the State Library as of June 30, 1919, up to 113,934, divided almost equally between the Law Library and the General Reference Library.

The following table will show more in detail the accessions for the two periods already mentioned.

APPROPRIATIONS AND EXPENDITURES.

The total appropriation available for the maintenance of the State Library during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1919, was \$11,900, practically all of which was expended.

The following table will show the itemized appropriations and expenditures for the fiscal year just ended.

The total appropriation made for the fiscal year from November 1, 1917, to October 31, 1918, as the fiscal year existed at that time, was \$11,800, almost identical with the appropriation for the fiscal year which has just expired. Owing to legislation in 1918 this fiscal year was curtailed to expire on June 30, 1918, thus reducing the "year" from a period of twelve months to a period of eight months. The expenditures for this period of eight months were just slightly in excess of two-thirds of the amount appropriated for the twelve months period, as will be shown more fully by the following table:

GENERAL REMARKS.

The operation of the State Library, except for a single instance, has not been characterized by anything outside of the general routine of an institution of this character. The single exception is the creation by the Legislature of 1919 of a War History Bureau (see Chapter 22, Laws of 1919) as an adjunct to the State Library to be under the general supervision of the State Librarian. As the appropriation under this law does not become available until July 1, 1919, there is nothing to be said about the work of said Bureau, as a part of this report, except that plans are under way to carry on this work to a successful conclusion.

As will be noticed in the figures previously mentioned, the major part of the money expended for new books and other publications was paid out for works placed on file in our Law Library, which is recognized as one of the best working Law Libraries in the country, and which we seek to keep entirely up to date, because of the extensive use that is made of it by members of our Courts and by lawyers generally, as well as by State officials and departments.

We are able to keep our General Library fairly up to date, with a rather limited expenditure of money, for the reason that we receive a vast amount of literature of a desirable

and timely character from the United States Government free of charge and from various States in exchange for publications of our State; also, for the added reason that our General Library, which is essentially a reference library, does not carry any fiction.

Our Legislative Reference Department, which is operated as a part of our State Library, and not as a separate institution as is the case in some of the States, continues to well serve the purpose for which it was created, and it is being made use of more and more by members of our Legislature and by State officials, departments and institutions.

During the past year the State Library sent out to those on its mailing list about 800 copies of volume 30 of the First Series of the New Jersey Archives. The Archives, as fully explained in the State Library report for 1917, are compiled under the direction of the New Jersey Historical Society, with the expense of publication borne by the State. The distribution of this publication, aside from the copies furnished to the New Jersey Historical Society, is under the direction of the State Library.

PERIODICALS IN STATE LIBRARY.

During the past few years the State Library has augmented somewhat its file of periodicals that are bound for preservation for permanent reference use, particularly in the line of political and social science. In order that the patrons of the State Library may better know what has been done in this respect, there is appended to and made a part of this report a list of the periodicals we have on file. This follows the plan carried out in the report of 1917, giving a list of the newspapers we have on file.

Among the persistent efforts of the management of the State Library is to make the Library of more and more use to its patrons and particularly to State officials and departments, and we are pleased to note that this is being accomplished through the greater use that is continually being made of the information, which is to be found on our shelves and we take this occasion to express our appreciation of the spirit of mutual cooperation that exists between the State Library and the various State departments and institutions.

The State Librarian also wishes to acknowledge with thanks and appreciation the invaluable aid and service rendered in the compilation and preparation of this report by John P. Dullard, former State Librarian. Mr. Dullard was in charge as Librarian during the greater portion of the period which this report covers.

DONATIONS.

Thanks are due to a large number of persons and institutions who favored us with gifts of books, newspapers and pamphlets of various kinds. In this connection we would ask still greater thoughtfulness upon the part of the people of our State in furnishing the State Library the publications, generally of pamphlets and booklets, which contain much that is valuable in the way of local history.
