Nonfarm wage and salary employment in New Jersey rose slightly by 1,600 from May to June to a seasonally adjusted total of 3,072,700. The return to work by 8,100 of the approximately 12,000 strikers in the construction industry and larger than seasonally expected growth in services were primarily responsible for the increase. Overall, job gains were reduced by additional cutbacks in government sector.

Private sector employment increased by 6,000 over-the-month, to a seasonally adjusted level of 2,557,800 offsetting the 4,400 drop in government employment. Federal funding cutbacks caused additional terminations and less-than seasonal hiring in the local government sector. This was the eighth decrease in government employment in as many months, dropping the level to 514,900 jobholdings.

Contributing to the June employment rise was construction which went up by 4,400 to a seasonally adjusted level of 105,800. Construction benefitted from regional returns to work in north and central New Jersey by striking masons, affecting the special trades sector. However, approximately 4,000 carpenters were still on strike during the June survey week.

Adding to the gain, service employment on a seasonally adjusted basis registered a 4,700 increase over-the-month to 648,100, an all-time record high for this sector. Due to rapid growth centered in business services and casinos, jobholding in the services sector has increased every month since April 1979. Additionally, greater-than-seasonal hiring in most service industry lines contributed to the large monthly increase.

In the manufacturing division seasonally adjusted employment decreased by 2,800 to 773,000, mainly as a result of scattered strikes and layoffs in both the durable goods and nondurable goods sectors. The largest decline was registered in apparel, down by 1,200 because of less-than-seasonal hiring and a closing which affected 400 workers. The leading over-the-month gainer was paper products, which rose by 500, primarily because of returns from strikes in the paperboard mills sector.

The weekly earnings of manufacturing productions workers averaged \$325.48 in June, an increase of \$3.63 from May and of \$30.51 from a year ago. After seasonal adjustment, the average workweek registered 41.0 hours, down by 0.1 hour over-the-month.

LABOR AREA COMMENTS

Total nonagricultural wage and salary employment increased in all but one of the state's ten major labor areas in June. Only the New Brunswick-Perth Amboy-Sayreville Labor Area registered a decrease, dropping by 200 over-the-month. The most substantial gain in jobholdings was recorded in the Newark Labor Area, which rose by 6,600 over-the-month. Other large increases were recorded in the Hackensack and the Atlantic City Labor Areas, each rising by 5,200.

The Newark increase was noted in the nonmanufacturing division, rising by 4,000, primarily in construction as striking masons returned to work. Returns from construction strikes also accounted for the increase in Hackensack. In Atlantic City, services and trade accounted for the 5,600 rise in manufacturing.

In the manufacturing division, activity was varied over-the-month, with six areas showing increases of from 200 to 2,600, one area decreasing by 400, and three areas remaining the same. The Newark Labor Area, which registered the largest increase, up by 2,600, mainly because of scattered recalls and returns from strikes.

Seasonally Adjusted

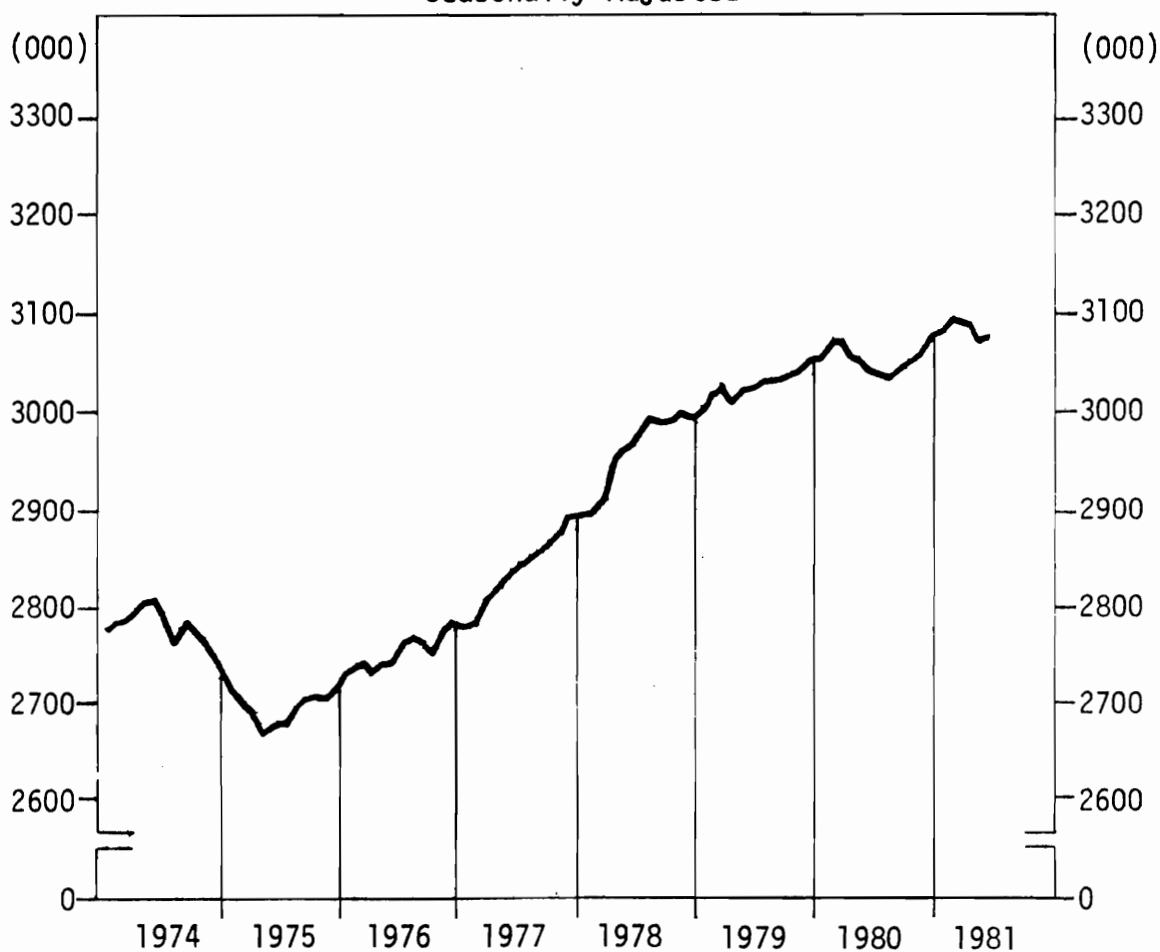

TECHNICAL NOTES

Nonfarm Wage and Salary Employment

Employment data refer to persons on establishment payrolls who received pay for any part of the pay period which includes the 12th of the month. The data exclude proprietors, the self-employed, unpaid family workers, farm workers, and domestic workers in households. Salaried officers of corporations are included. Government employment covers only civilian employees; federal military personnel are excluded.

Persons on an establishment payroll who are on paid sick leave (when pay is received directly from the firm), on paid holiday or paid vacation, or who work during any part of the pay period but are unemployed or on strike during the rest of the period, are counted as employed. Not counted as employed are persons who, during the pay period which includes the 12th, are laid off, on leave without pay or on strike for the entire period, or who are hired but do not work during the period.

Average Hours and Earnings

Hours and earnings data are derived from reports of payroll and man-hours for production and related workers in manufacturing. When the reported pay period exceeds one week, the payroll and man-hour figures are reduced to a weekly basis.

Average hourly earnings for manufacturing are on a "gross" basis, reflecting not only changes in basic hourly rates, but also such variable factors as premium pay for overtime and shift work, and changes in output of workers paid on an incentive plan. Excluded from average earnings are irregular bonuses, retroactive items, payments of various welfare benefits, and payroll taxes paid by employers.
