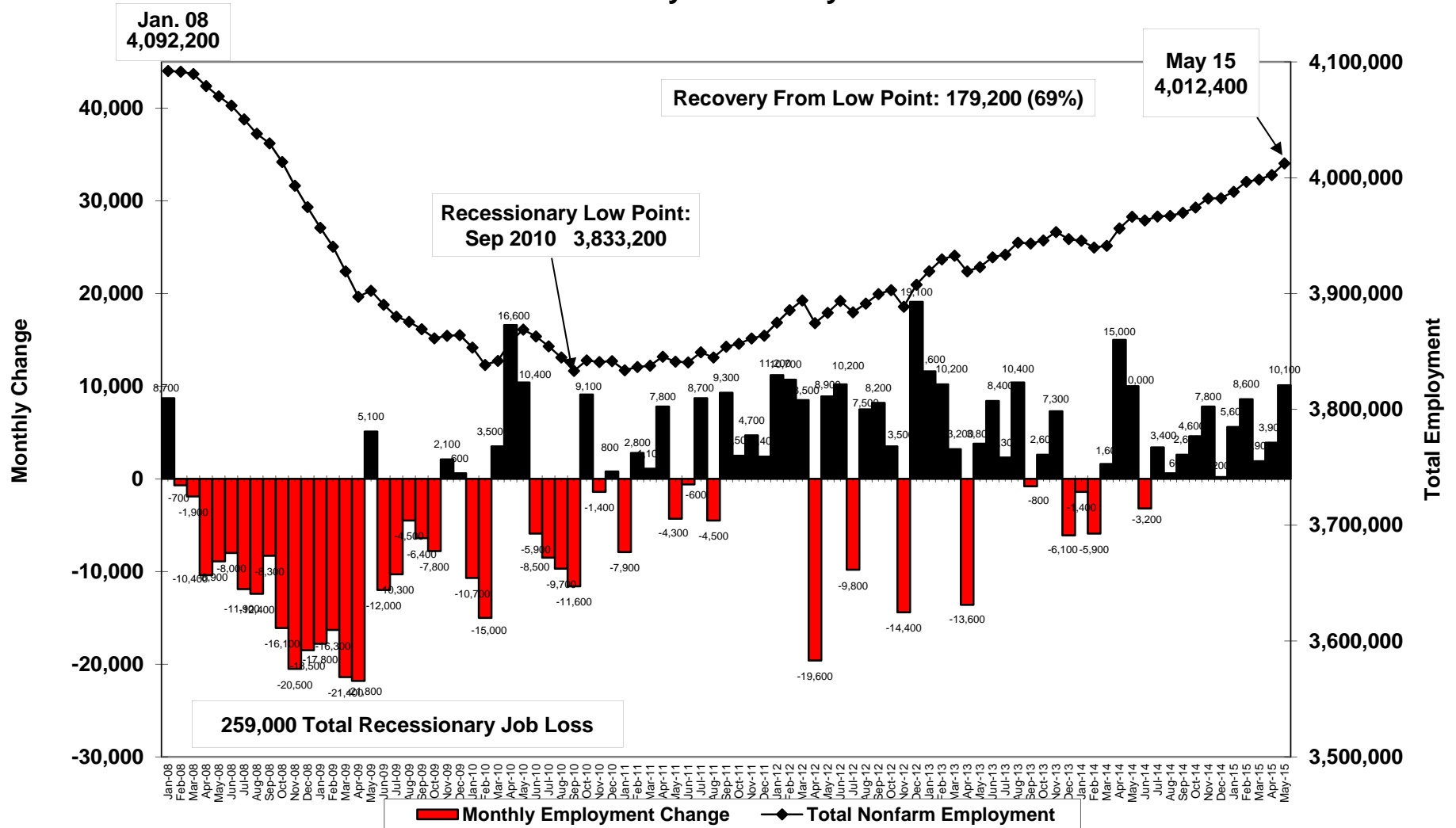

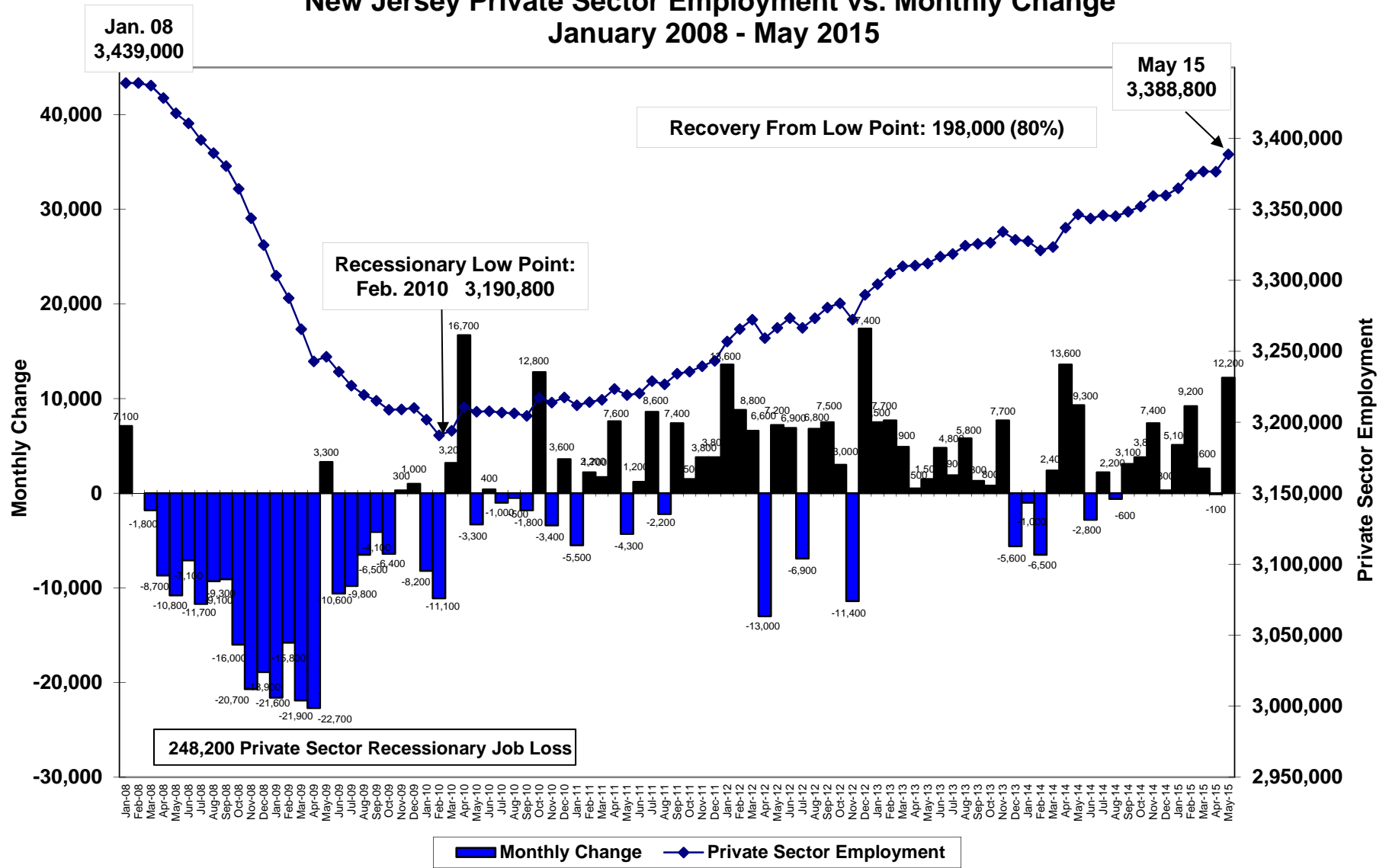

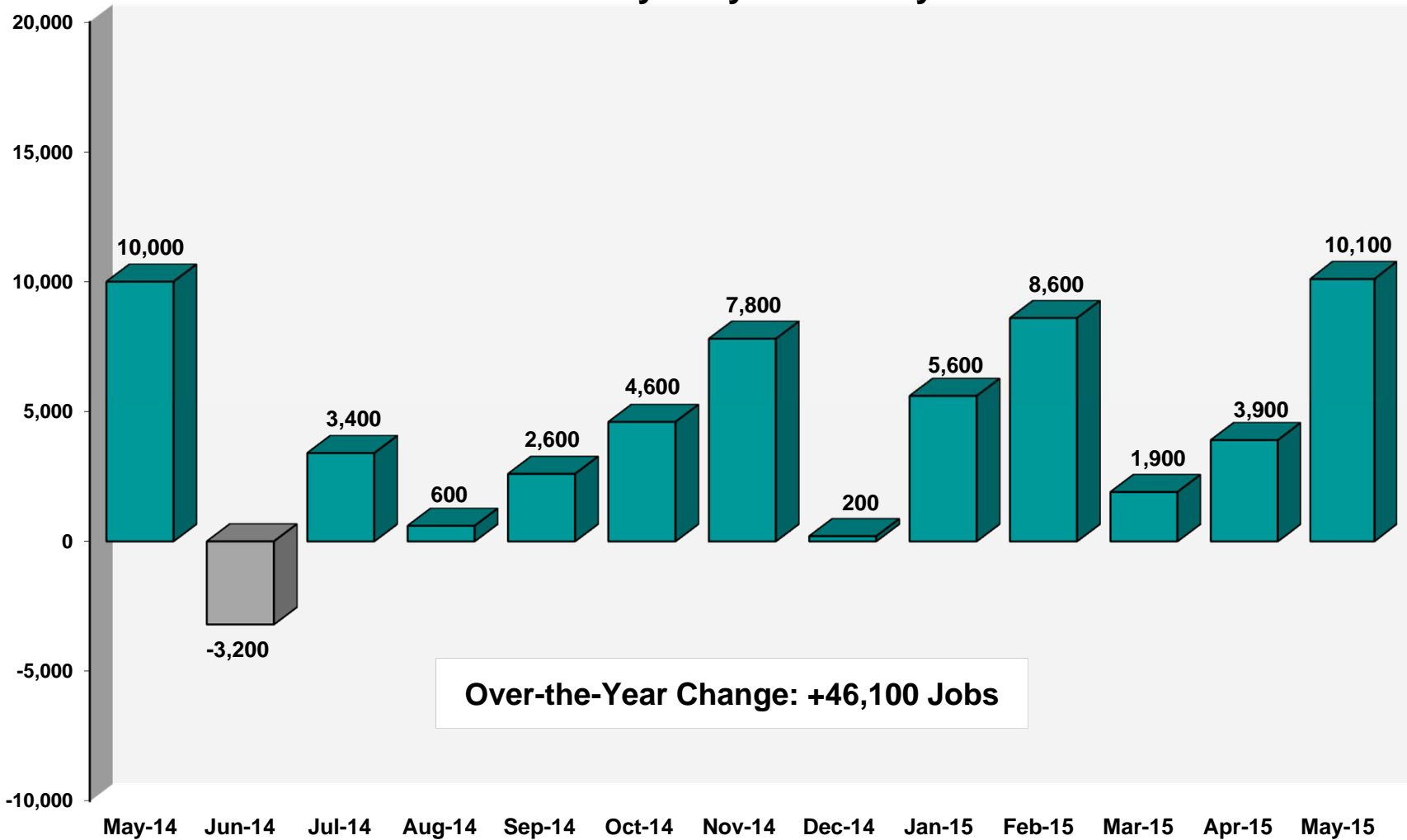
## New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - May 2015



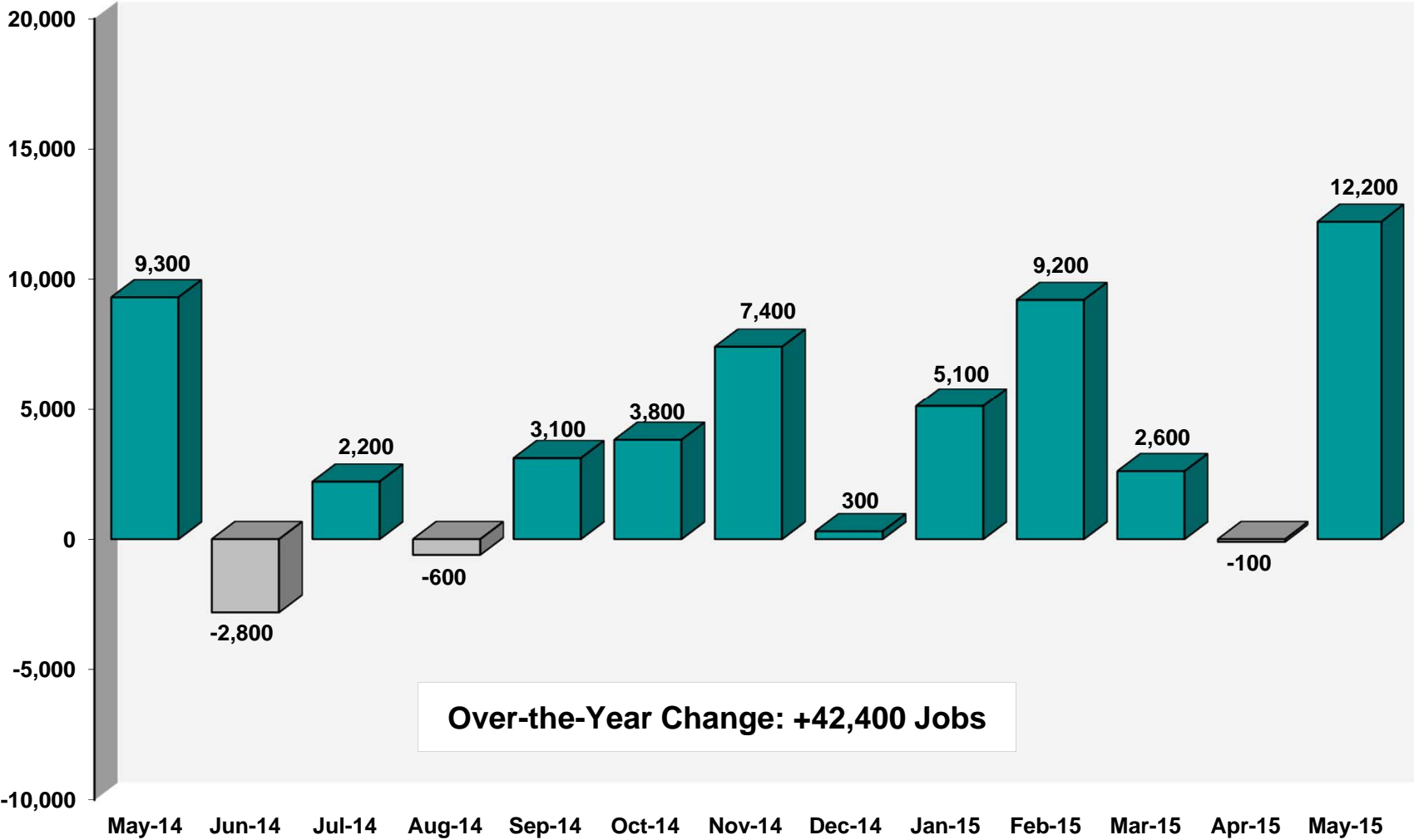
## New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - May 2015



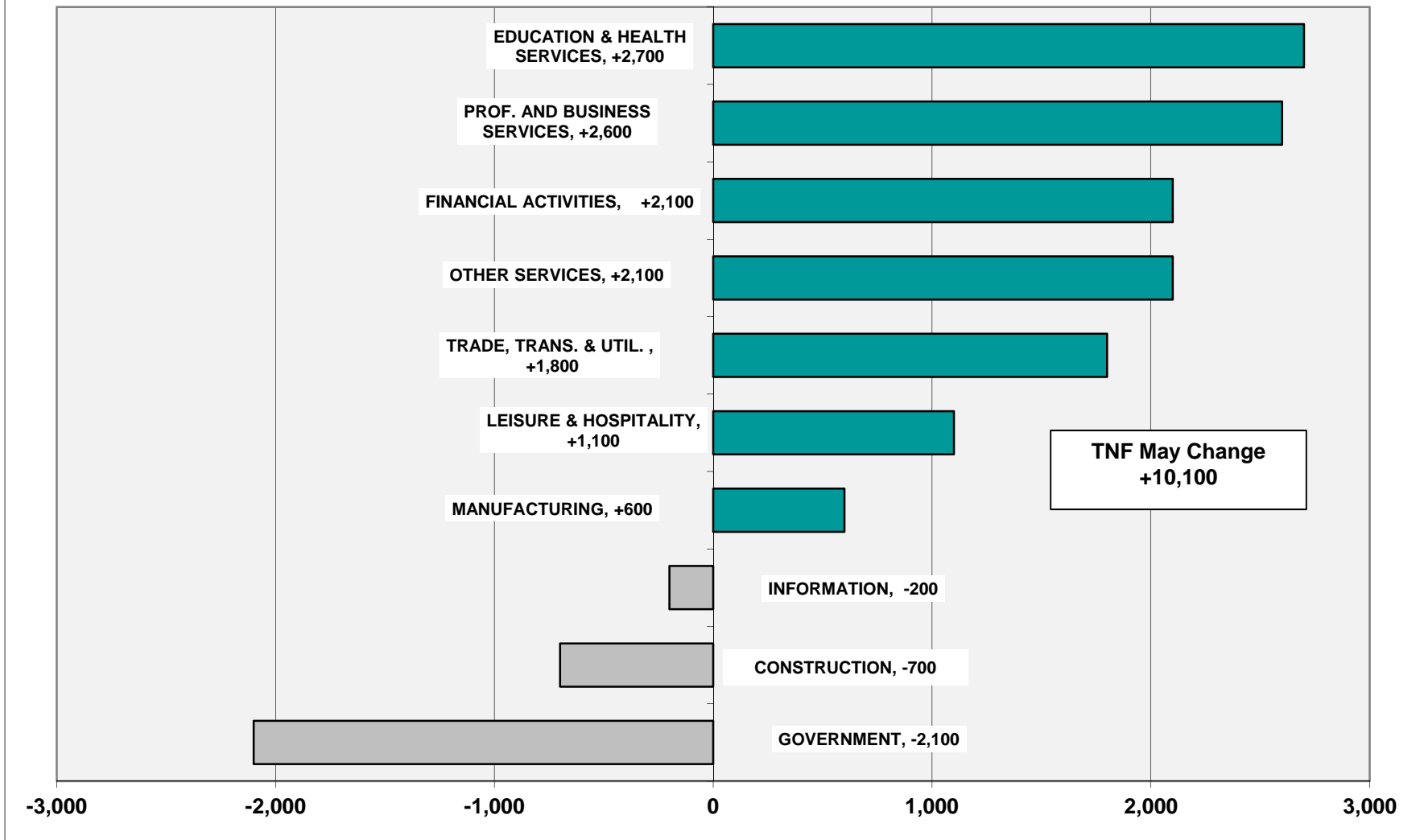
## Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: May 2014 - May 2015



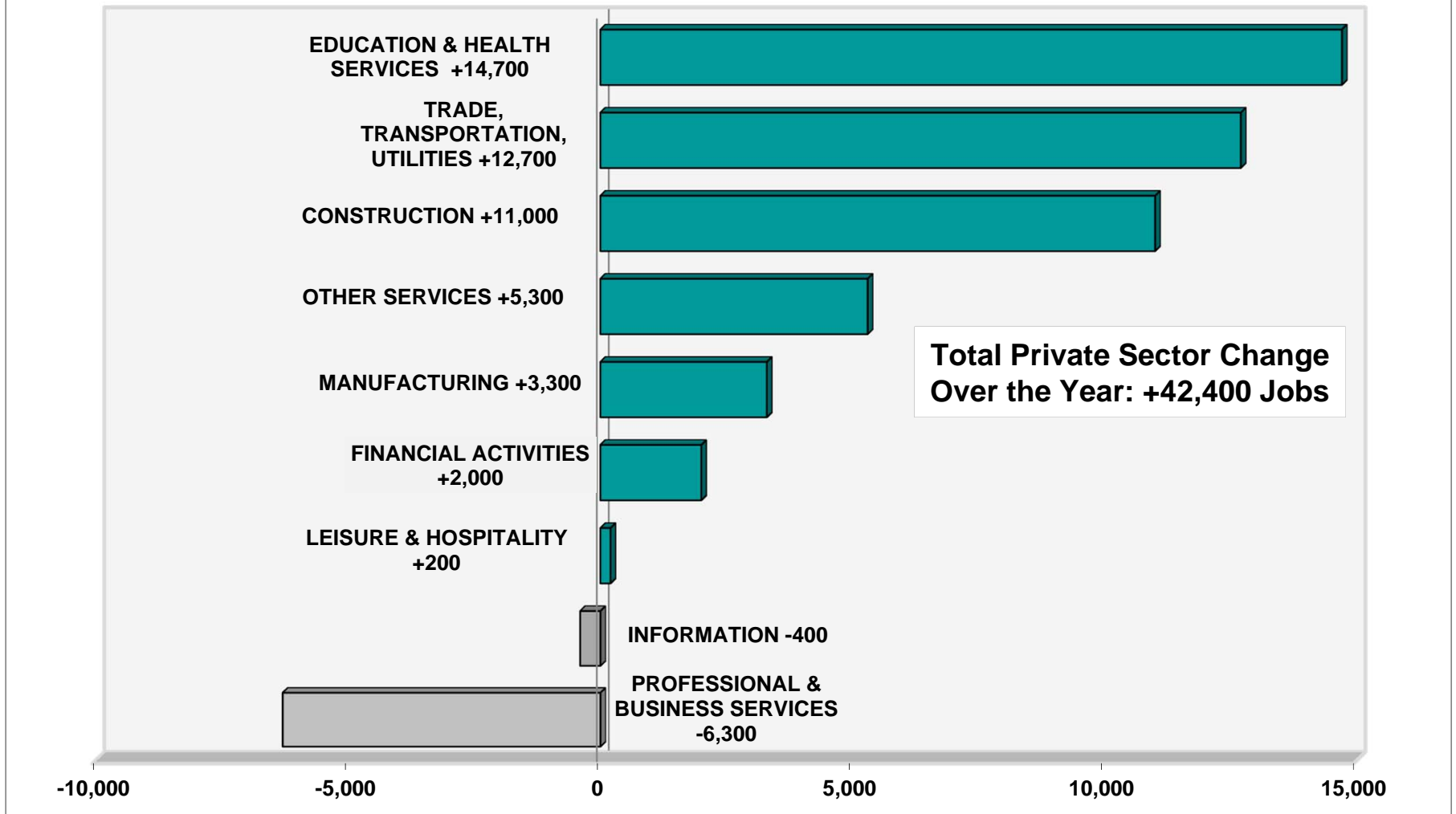
# Monthly Private Sector Employment Change May 2014 - May 2015



## Monthly Employment Change: May 2015



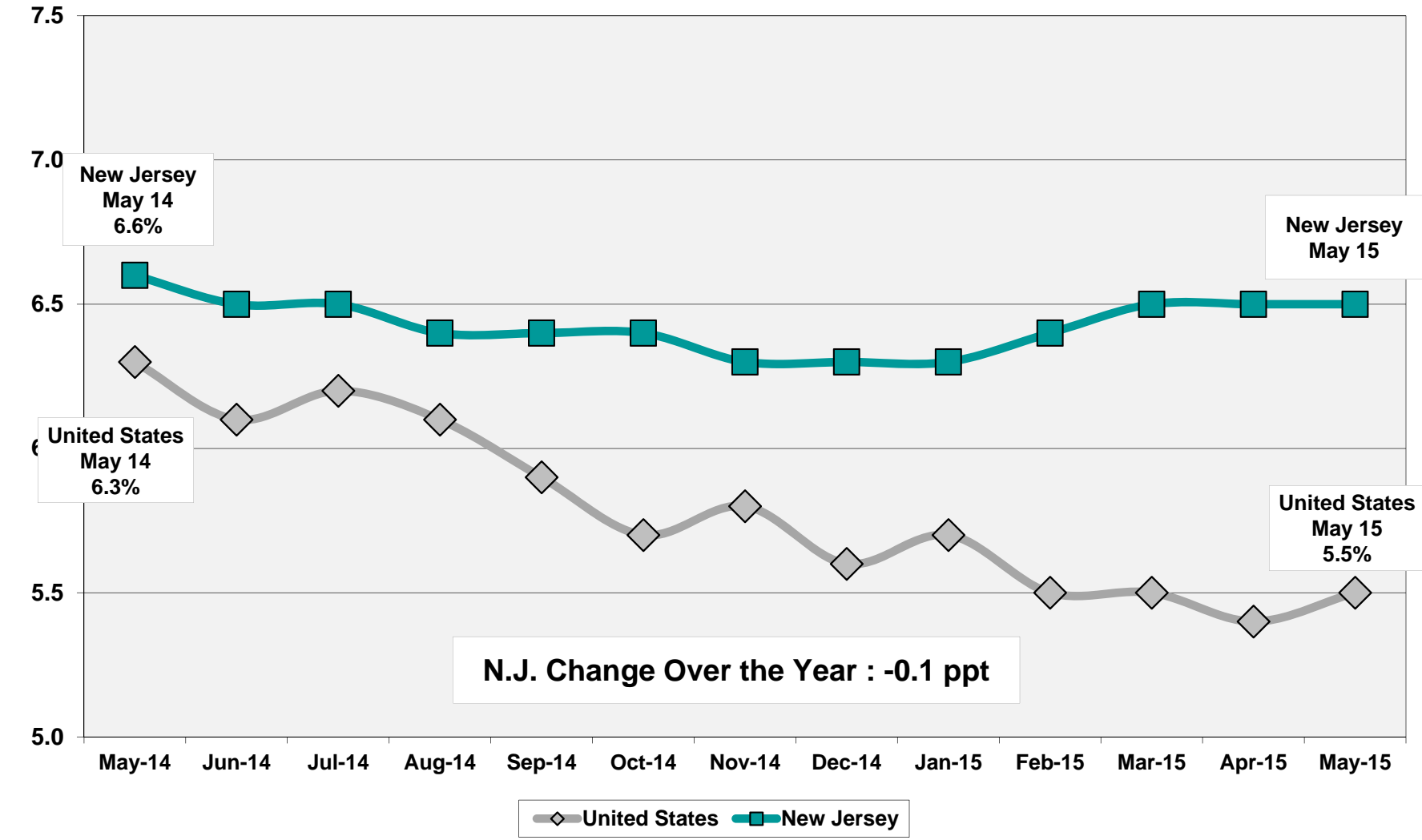
## New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry May 2014 - May 2015



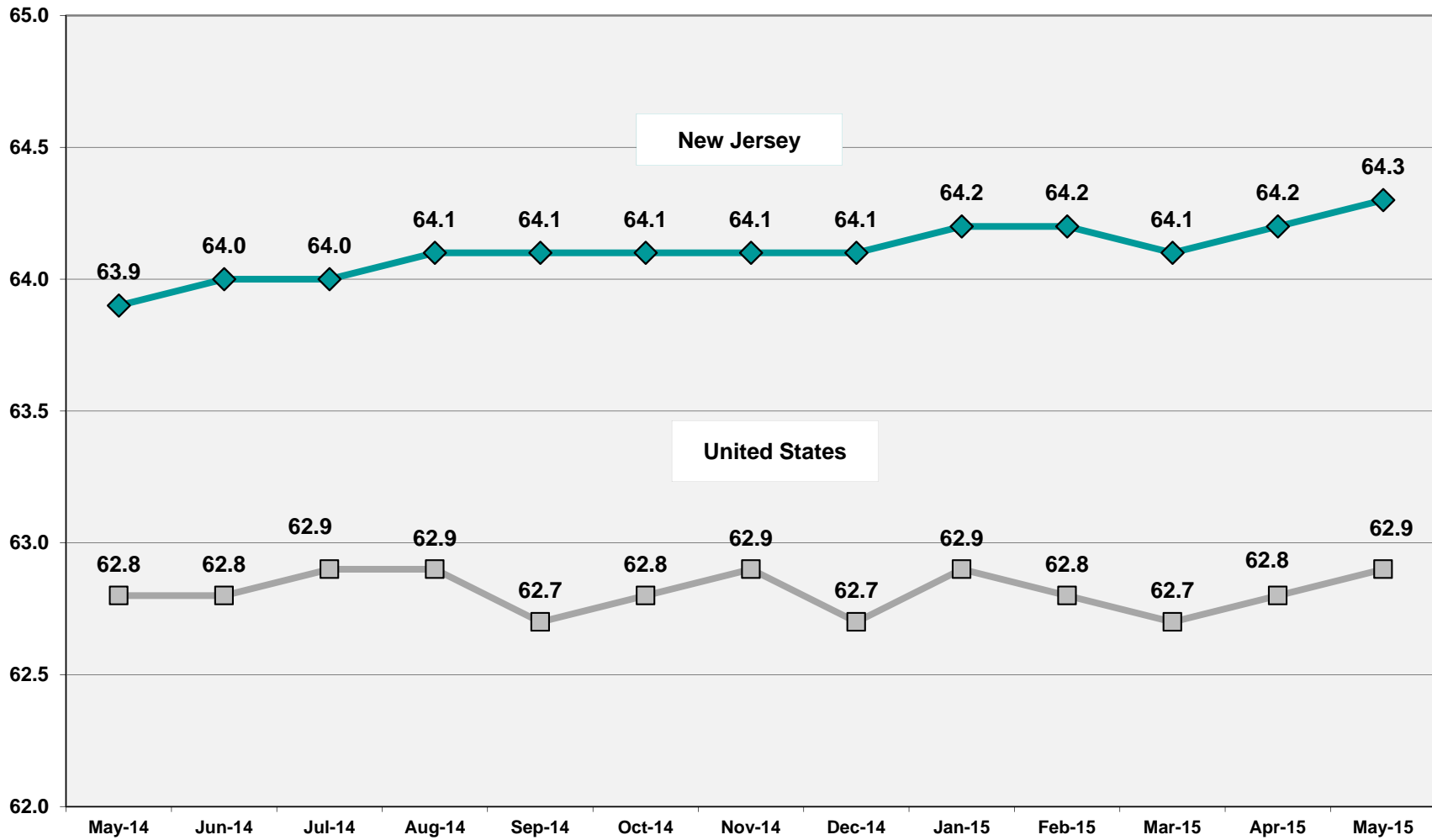

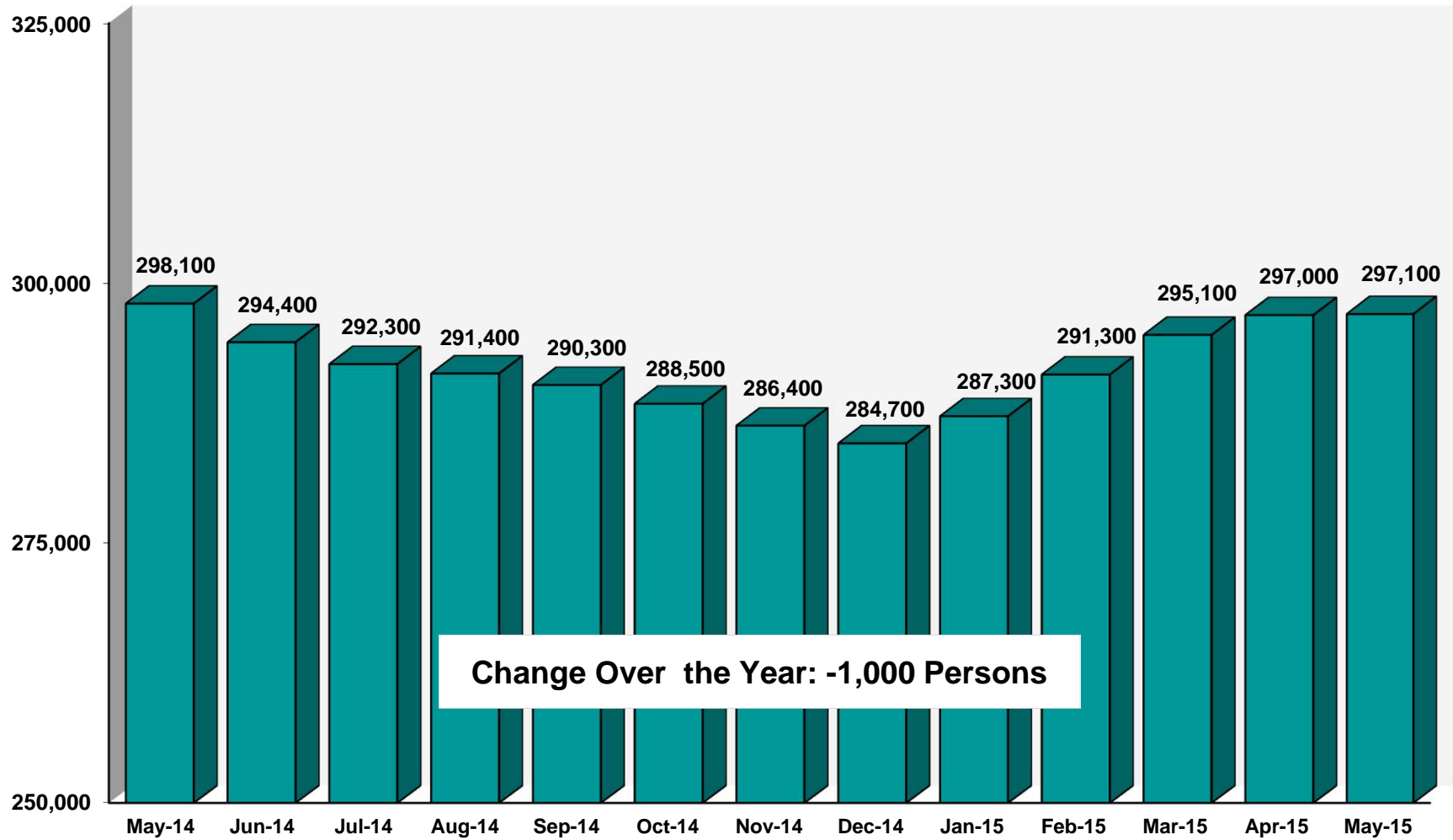
# Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: May 2014 - May 2015



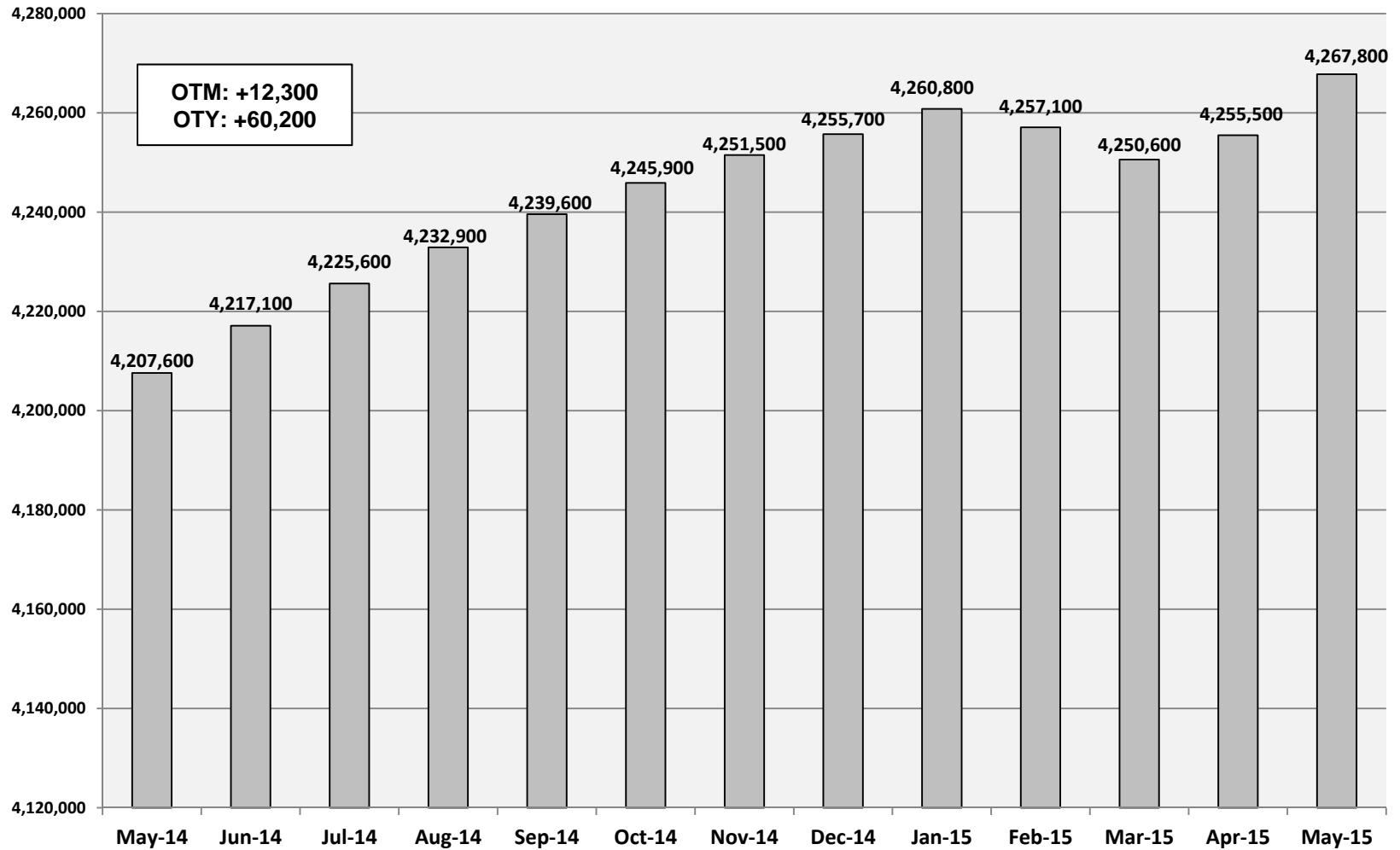
## New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: May 2014 - May 2015



## Unemployed New Jersey Residents May 2014 - May 2015

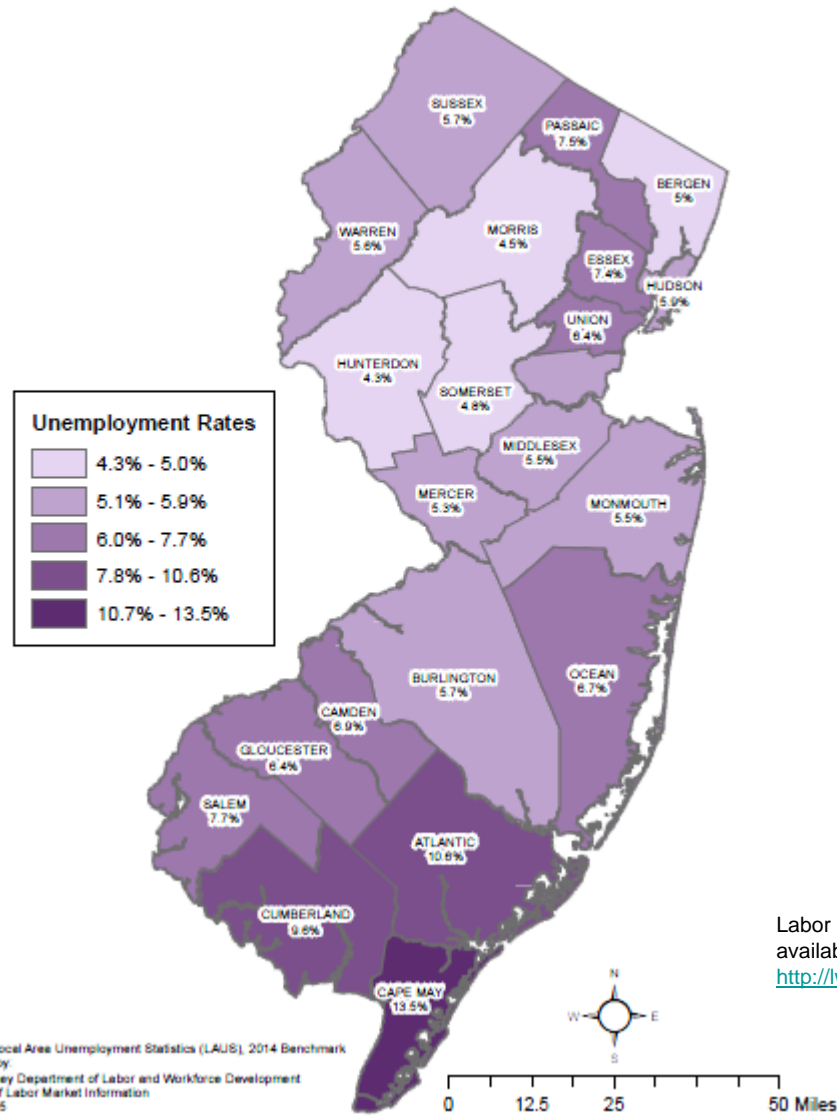


## New Jersey Employed Residents: May 2014 - May 2015

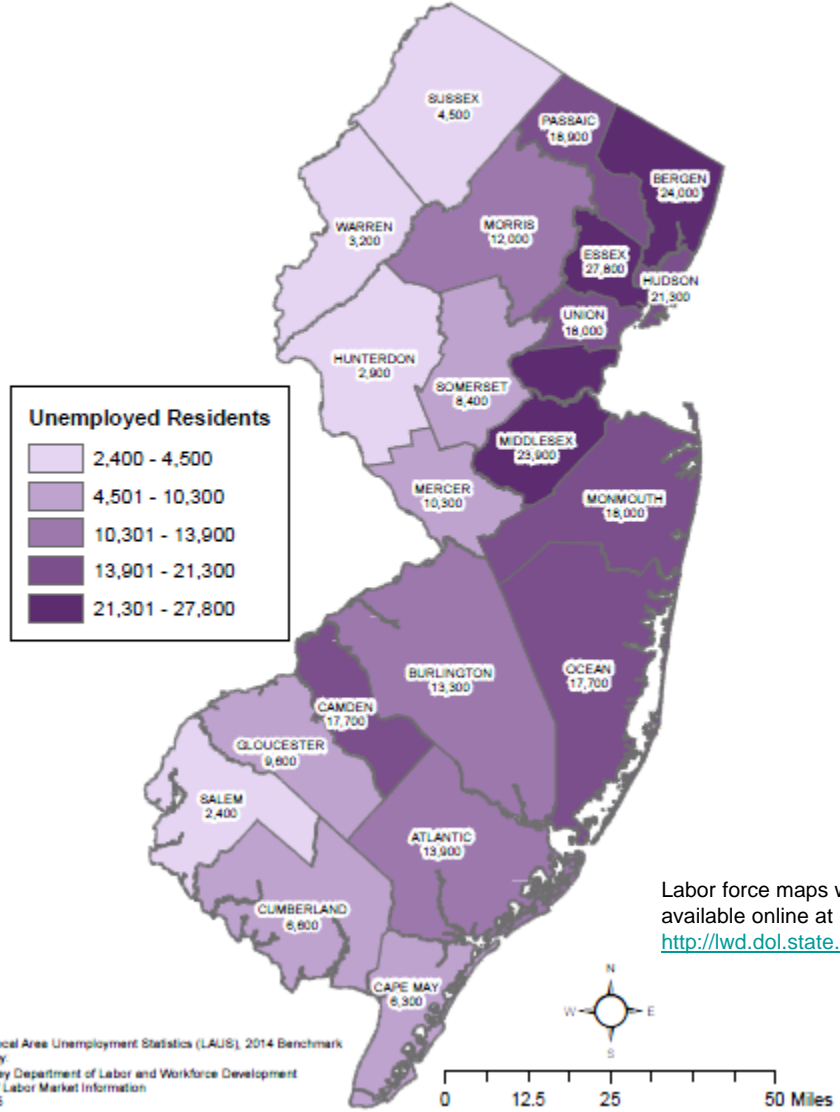

# New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - April 2015

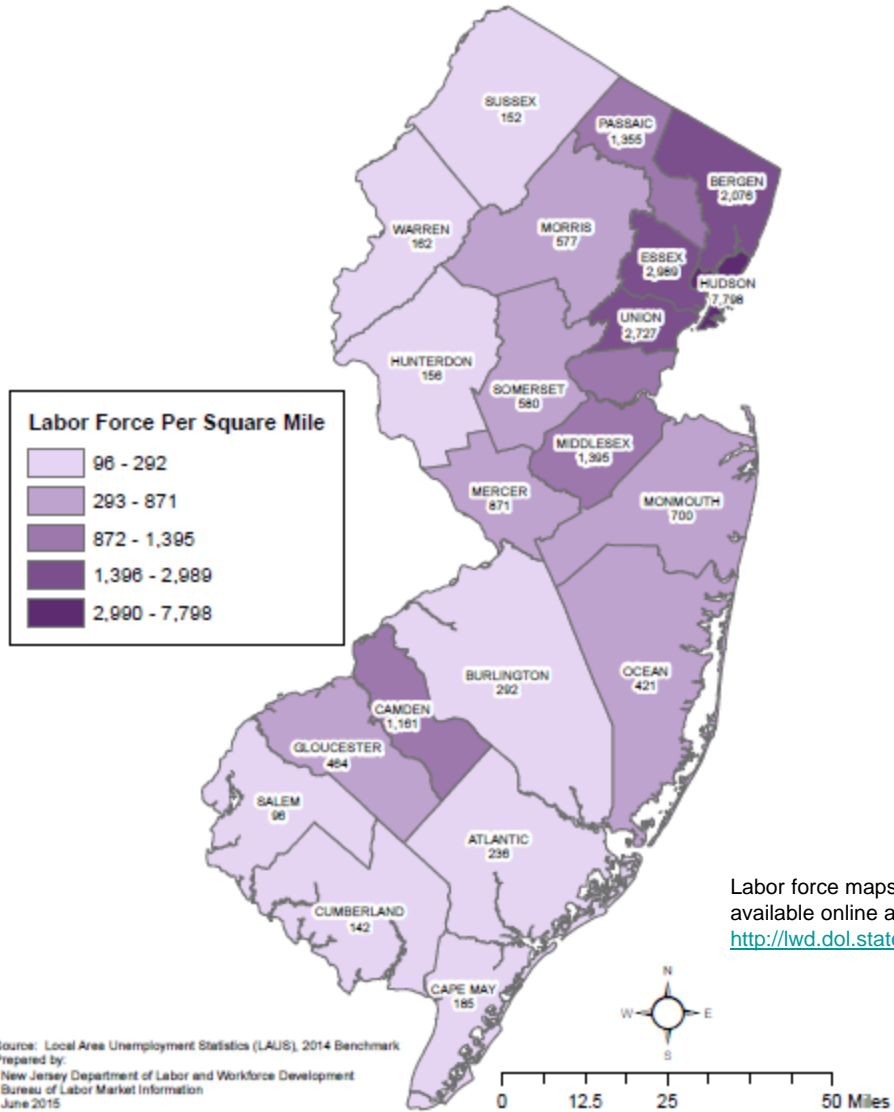

## New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - April 2015 *(Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)*

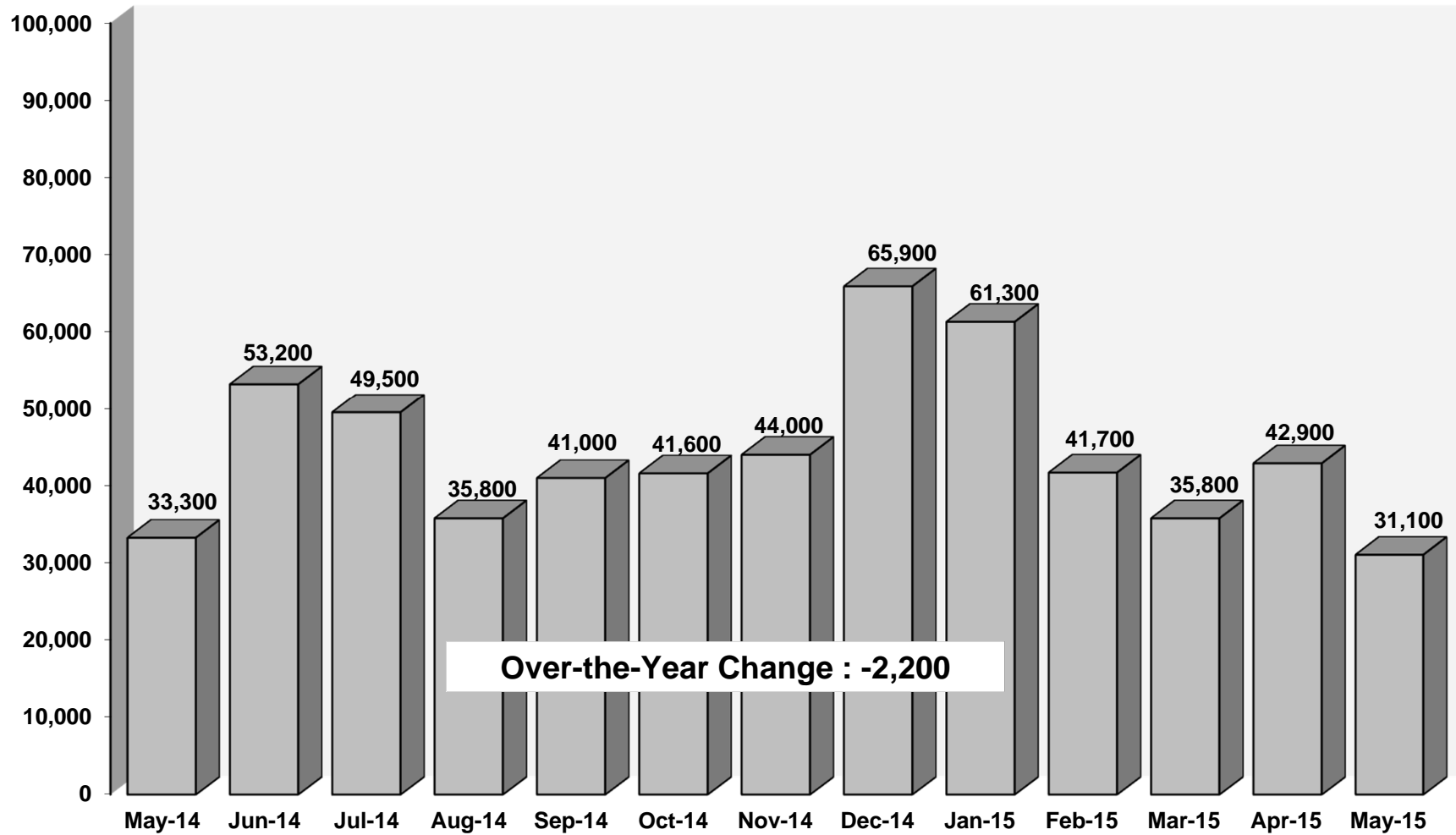
