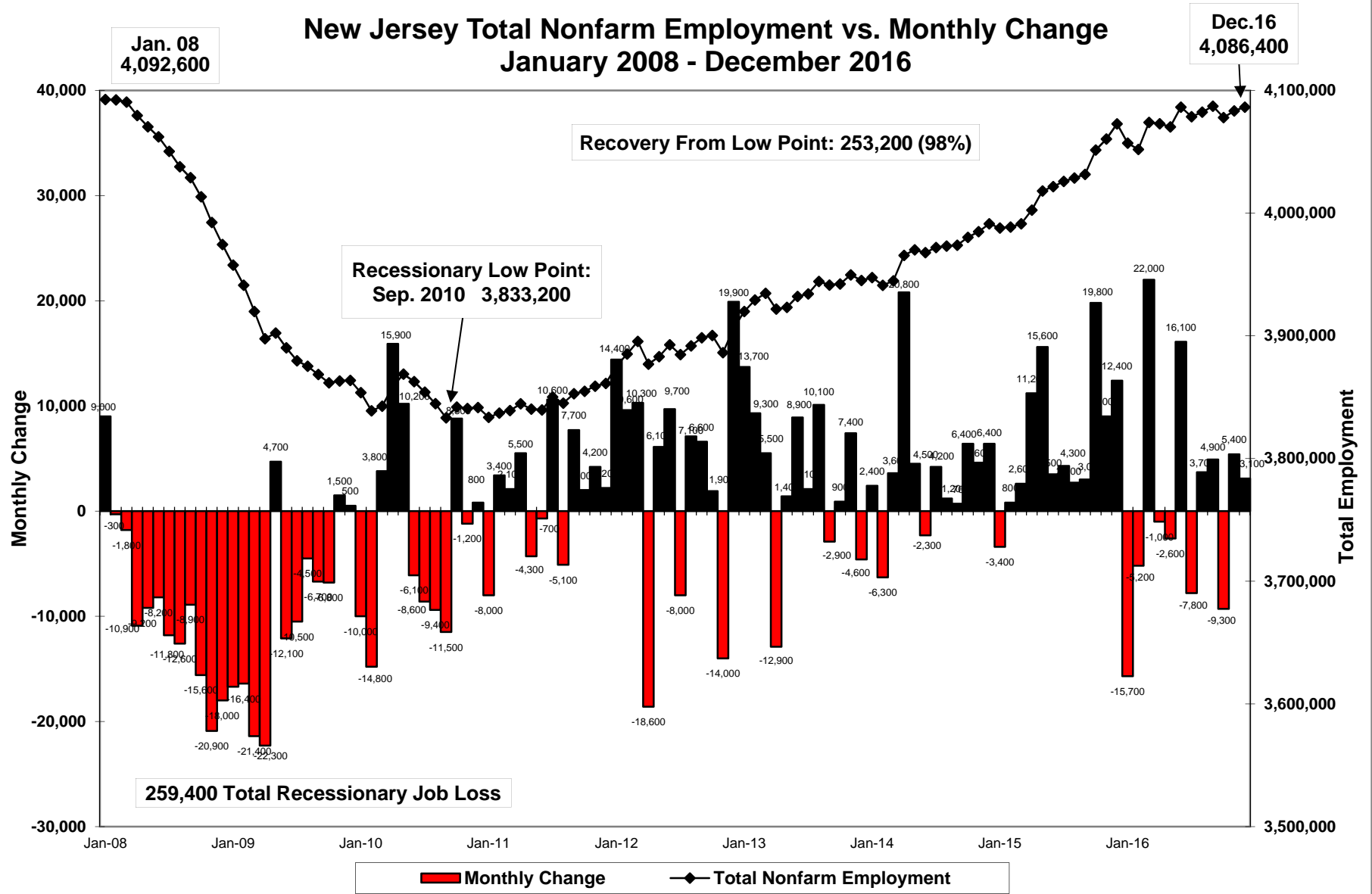

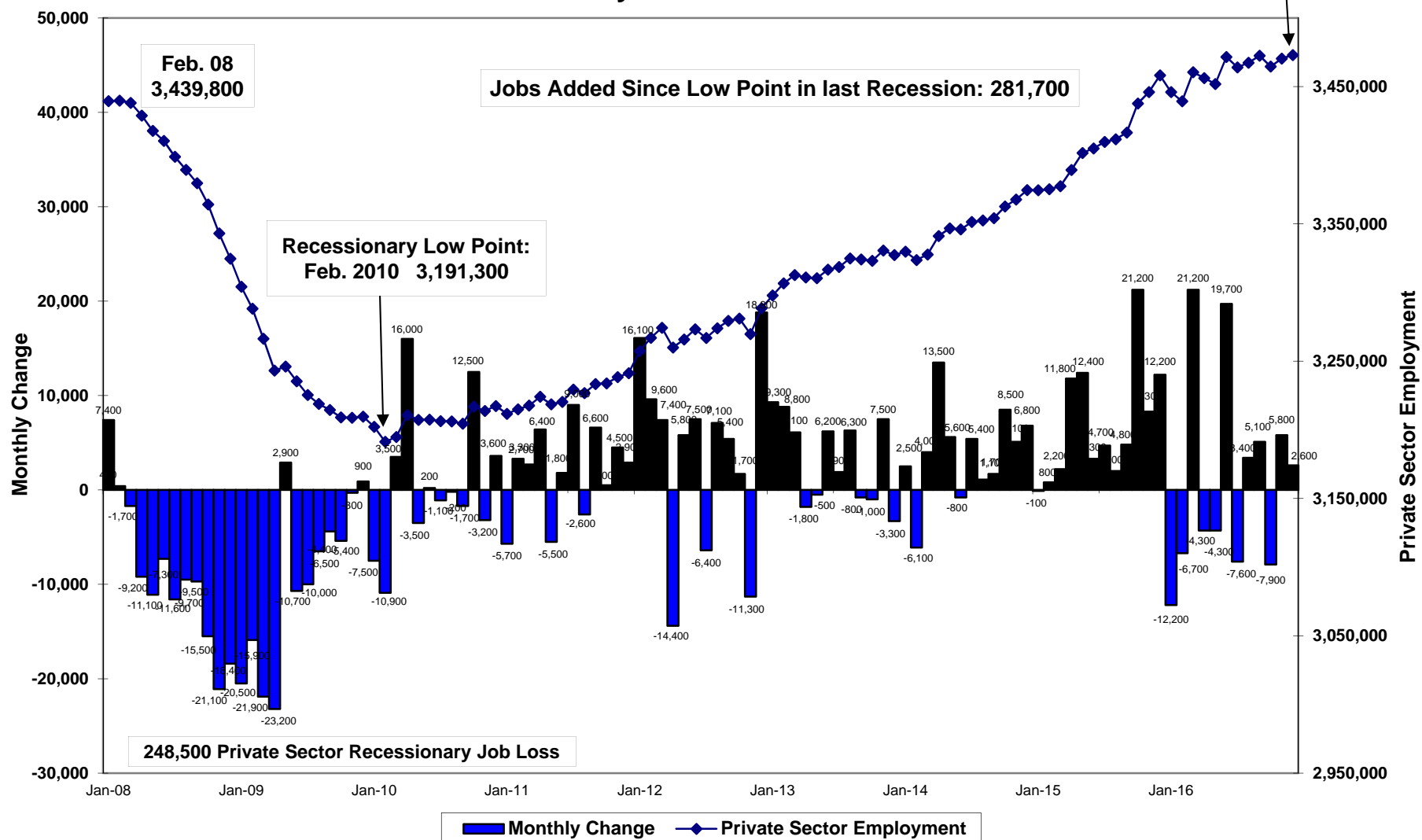

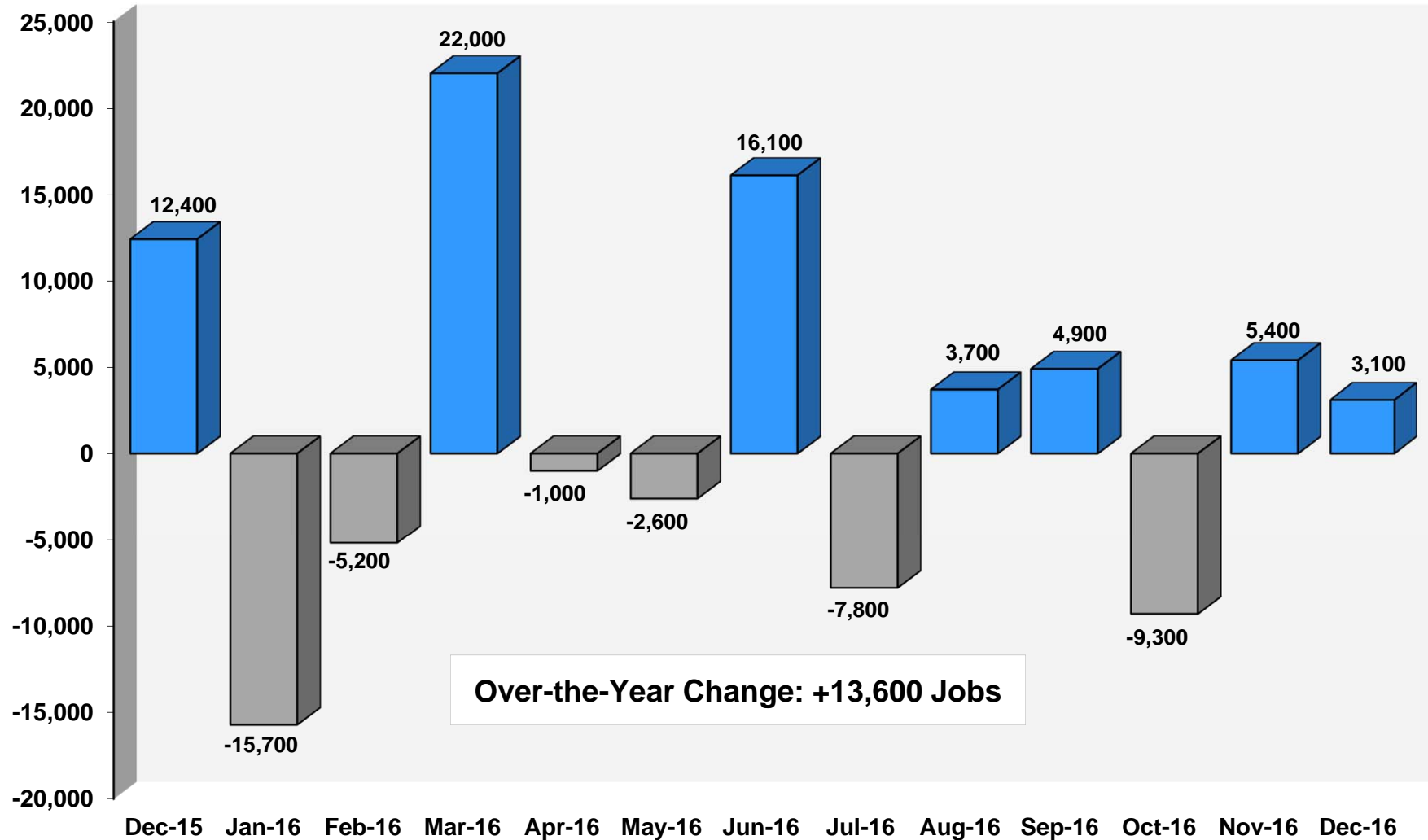
New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - December 2016



New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - December 2016



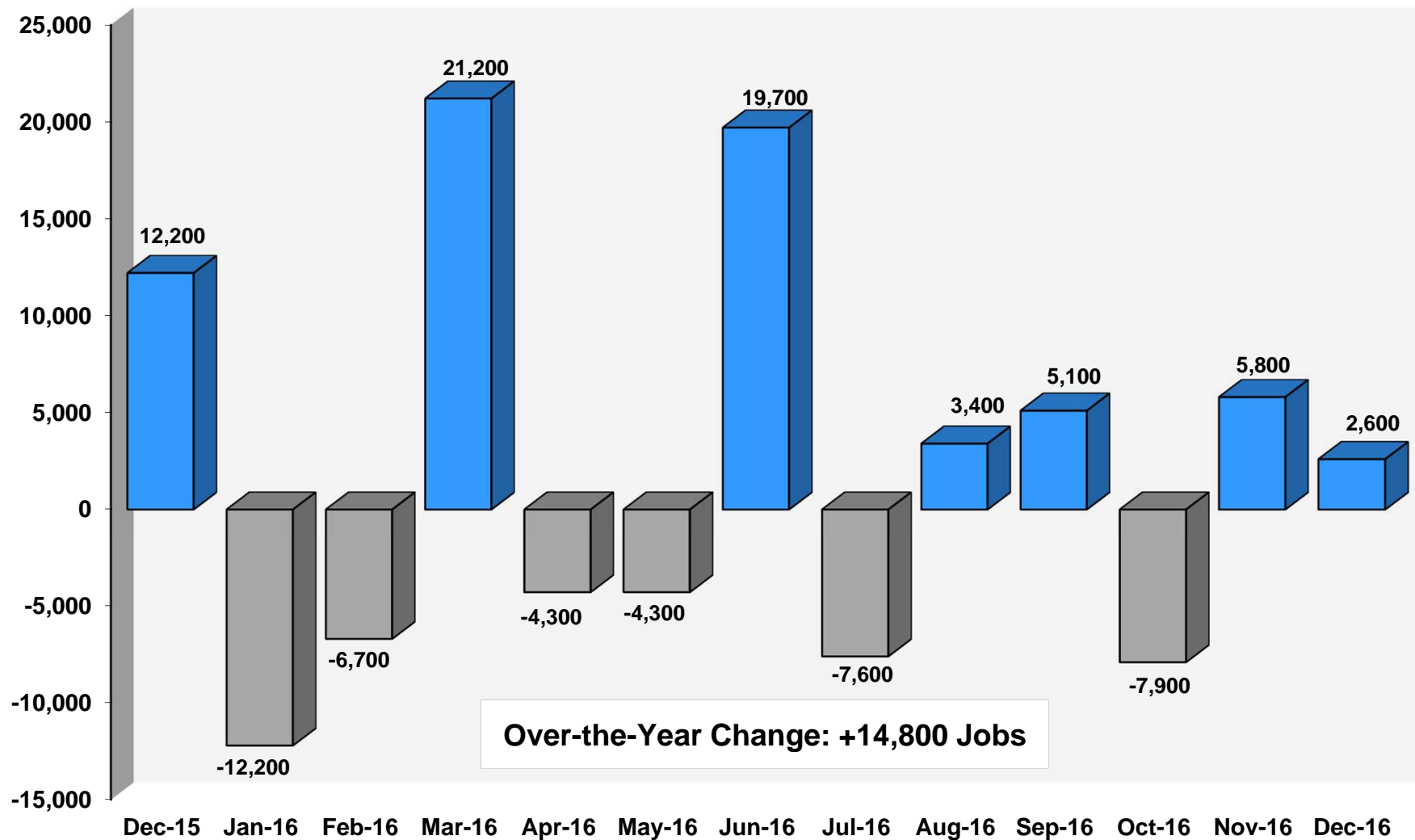
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: December 2015 - December 2016



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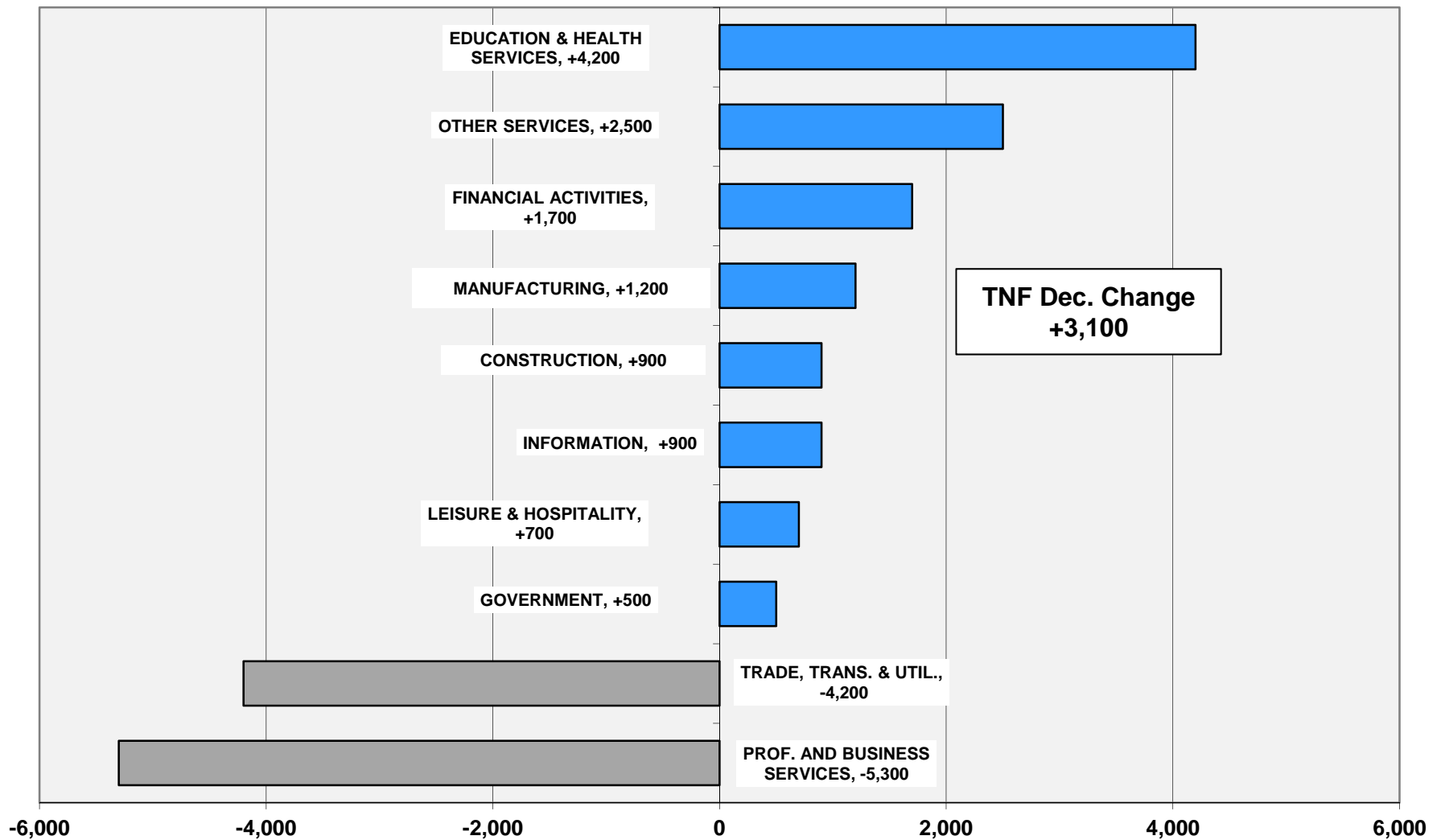
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change December 2015 - December 2016



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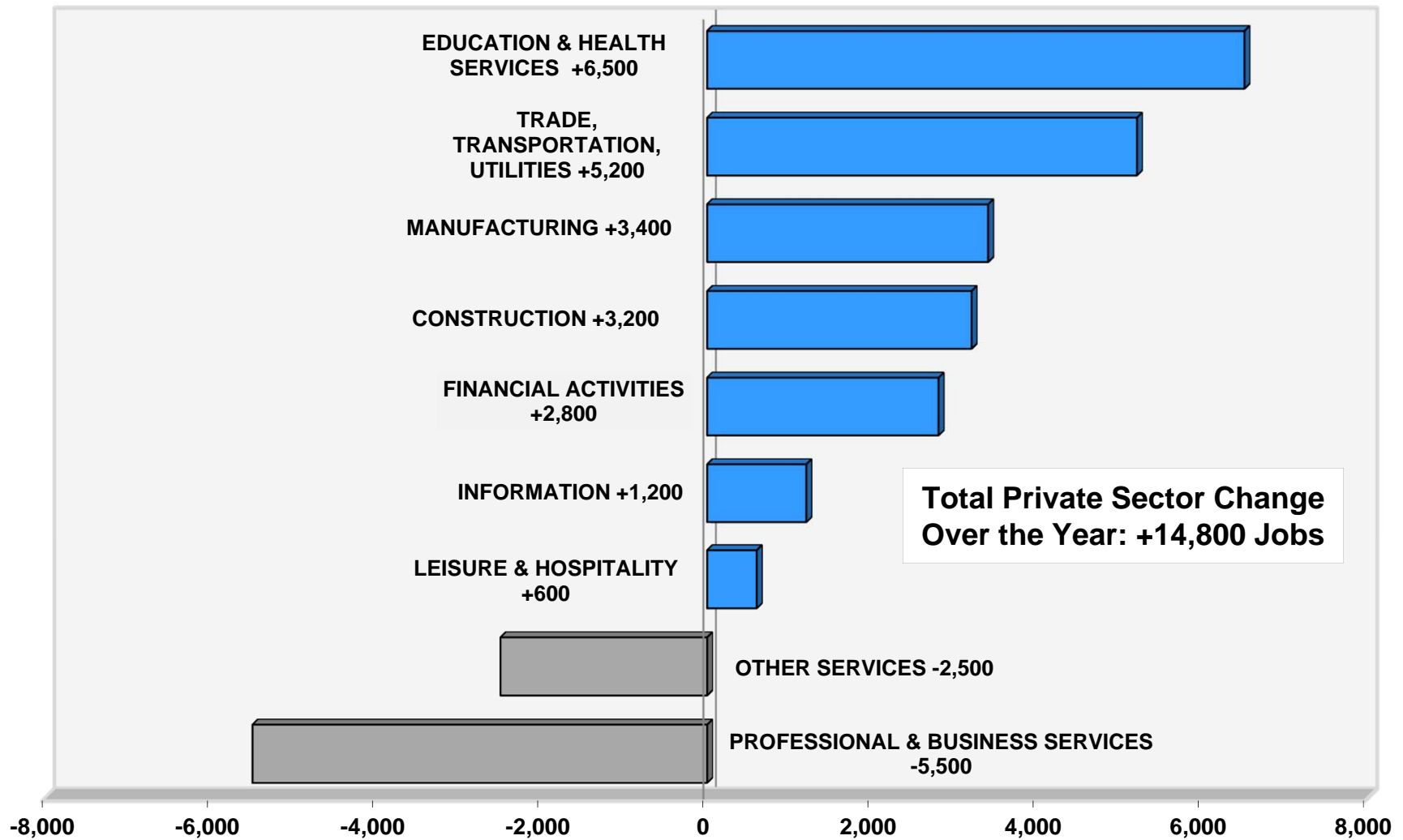

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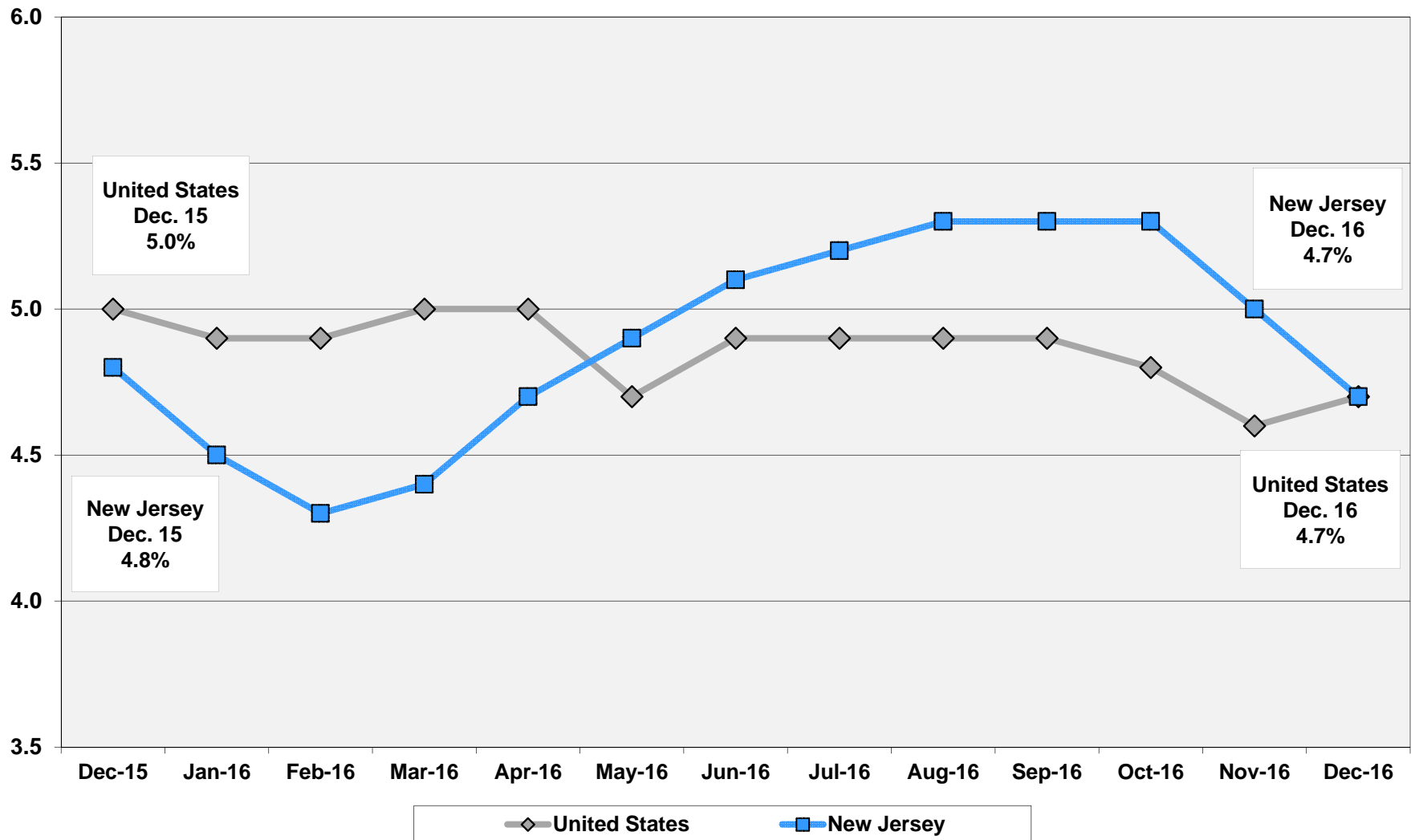
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry December 2015 - December 2016



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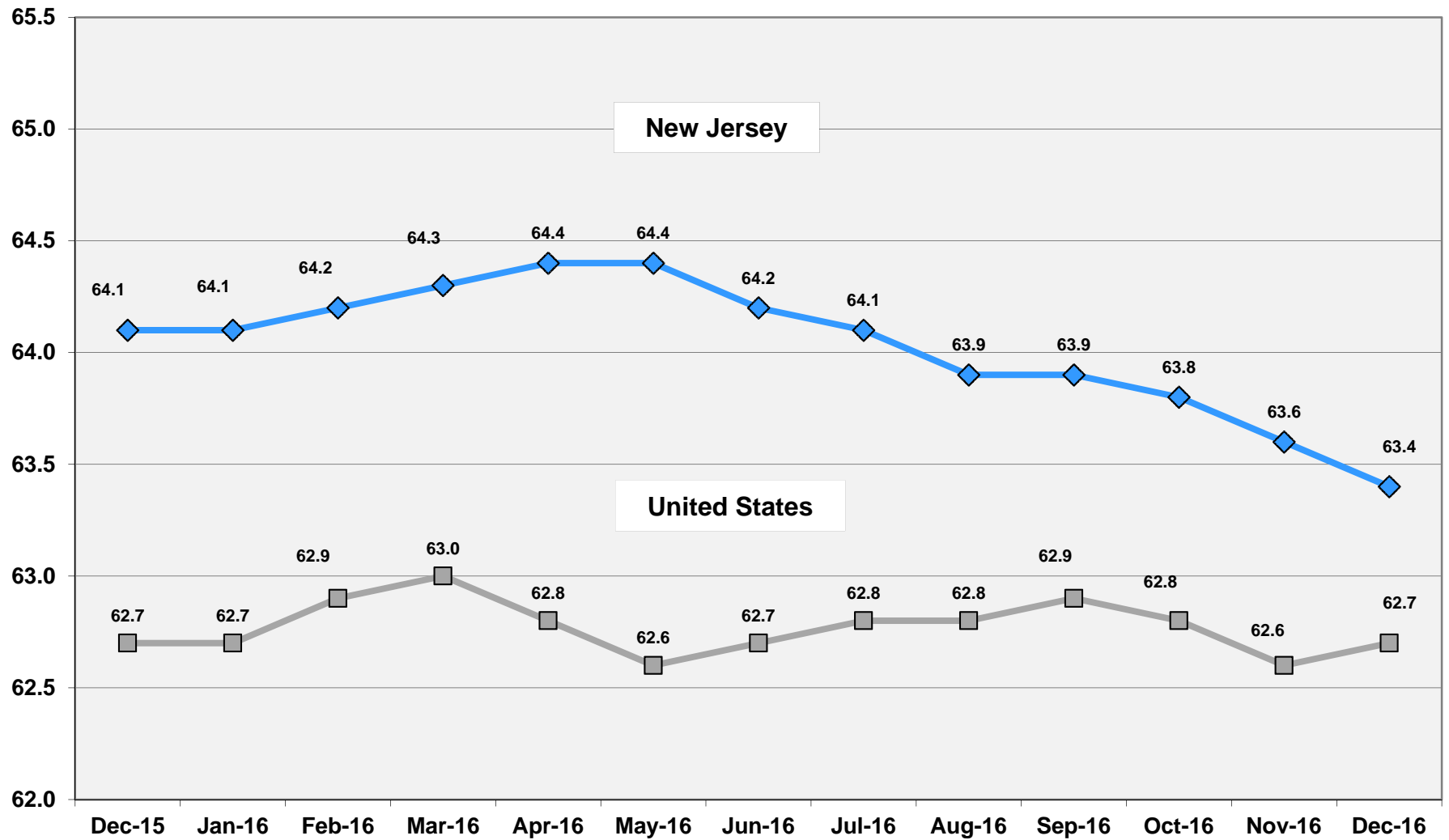
Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: December 2015 - December 2016



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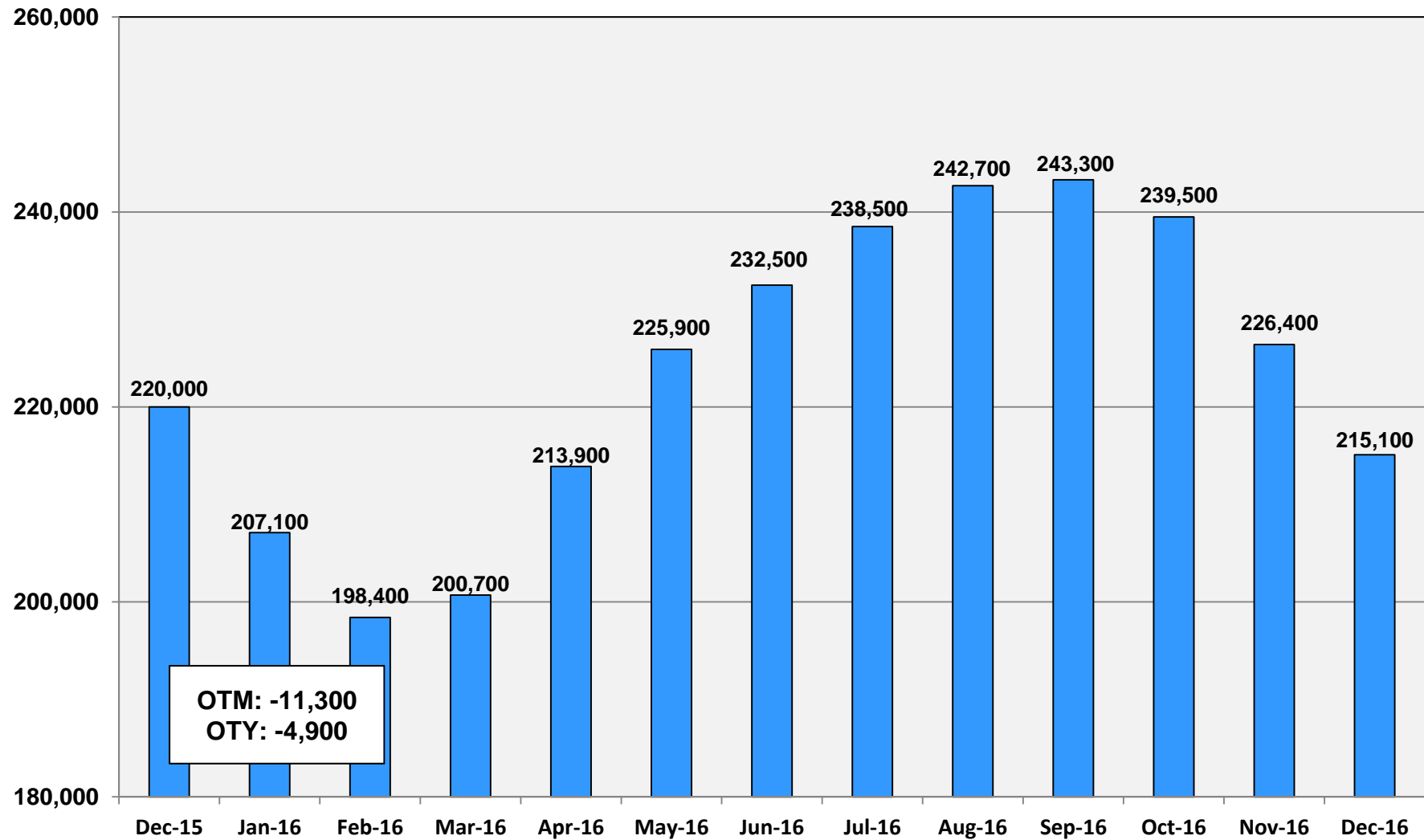
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: December 2015 - December 2016



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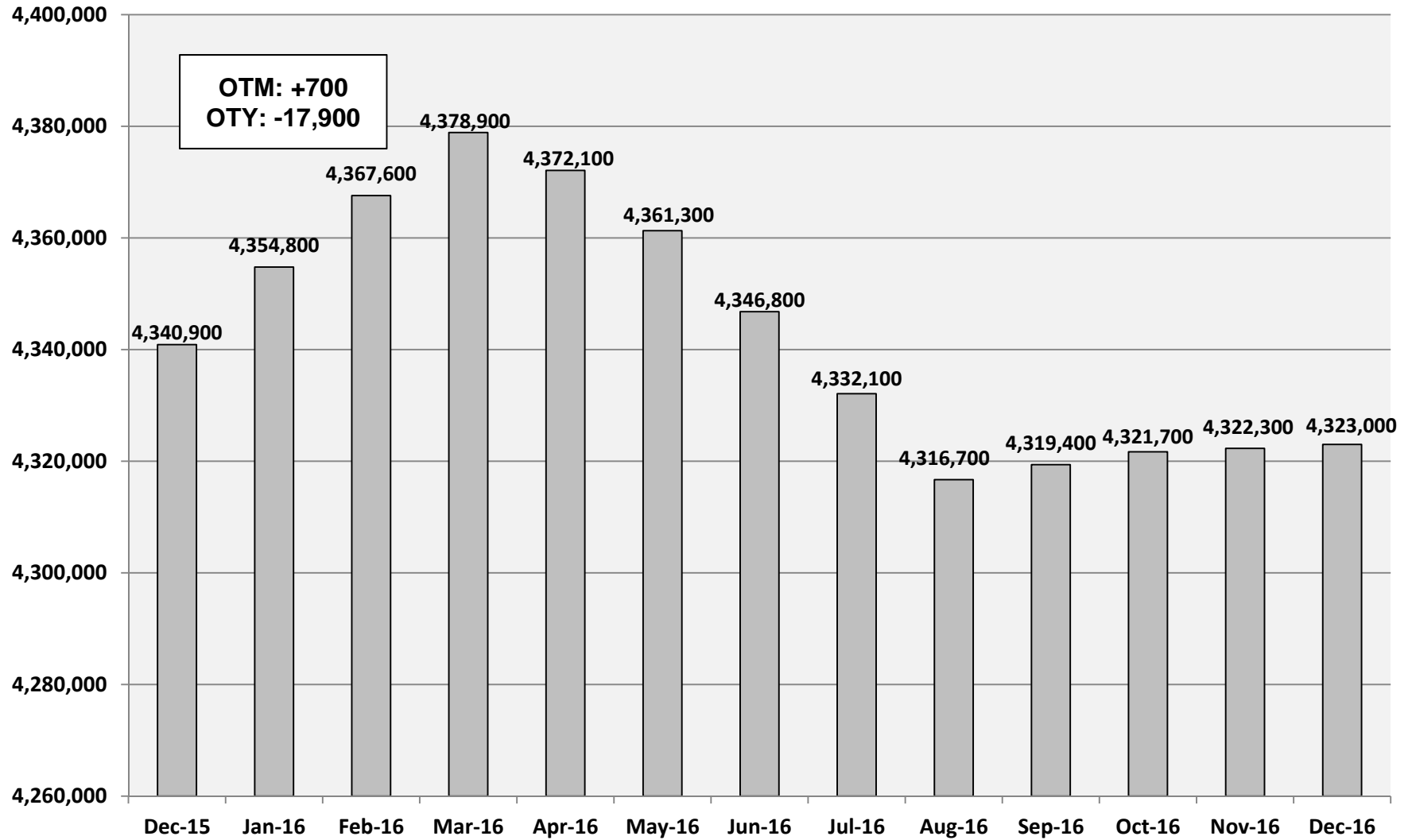
New Jersey Unemployed Residents: December 2015 - December 2016



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New Jersey Employed Residents: Dec. 2015 - Dec. 2016

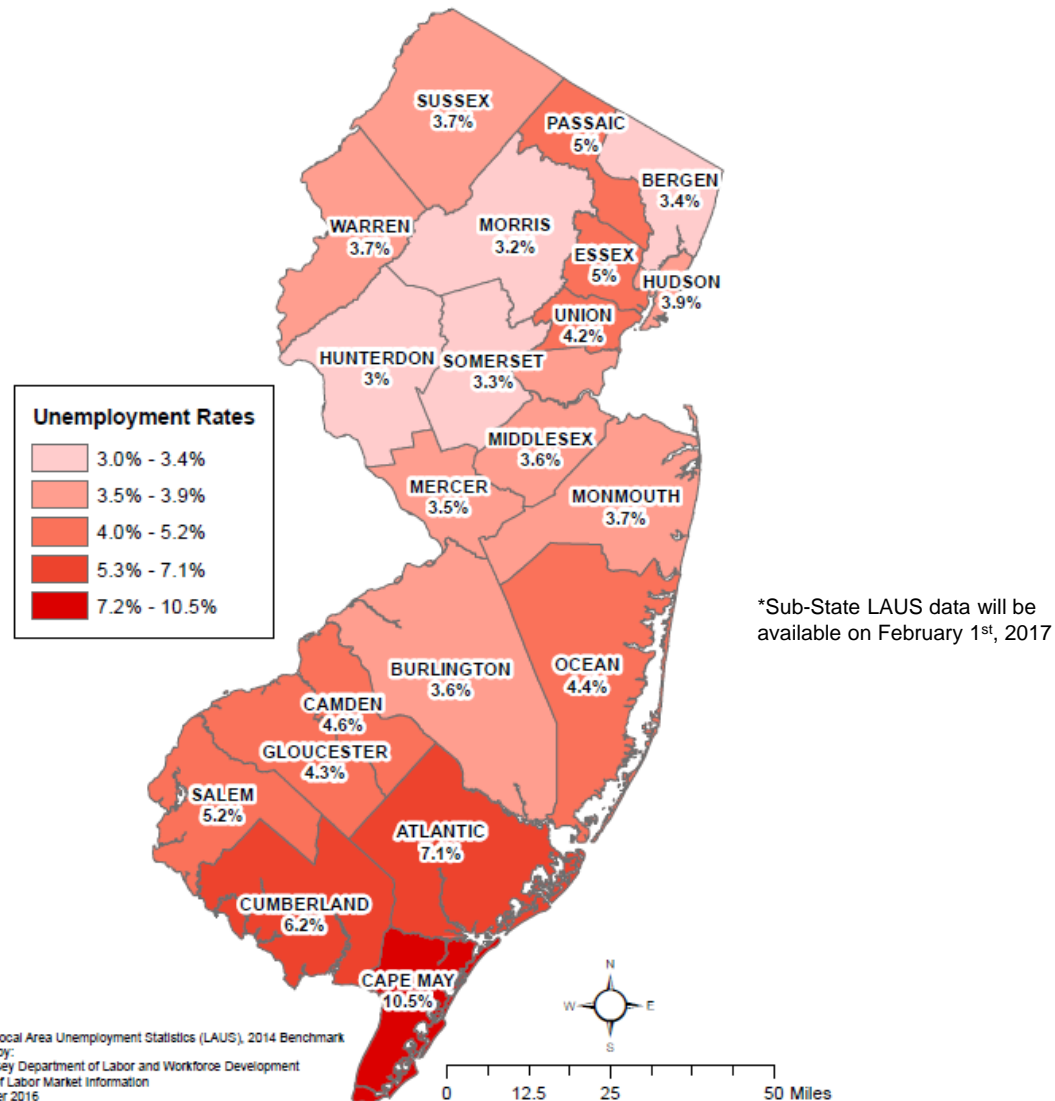


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New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - November 2016

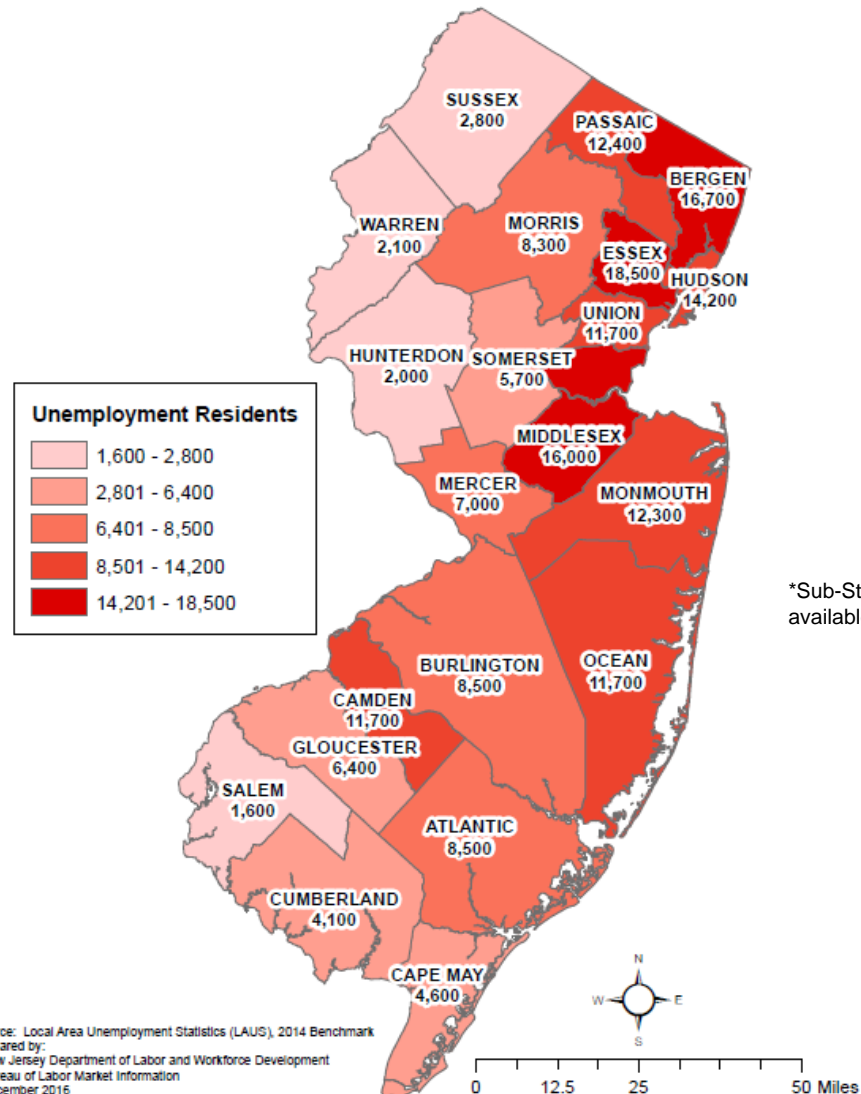


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New Jersey Counties Unemployment Residents - November 2016

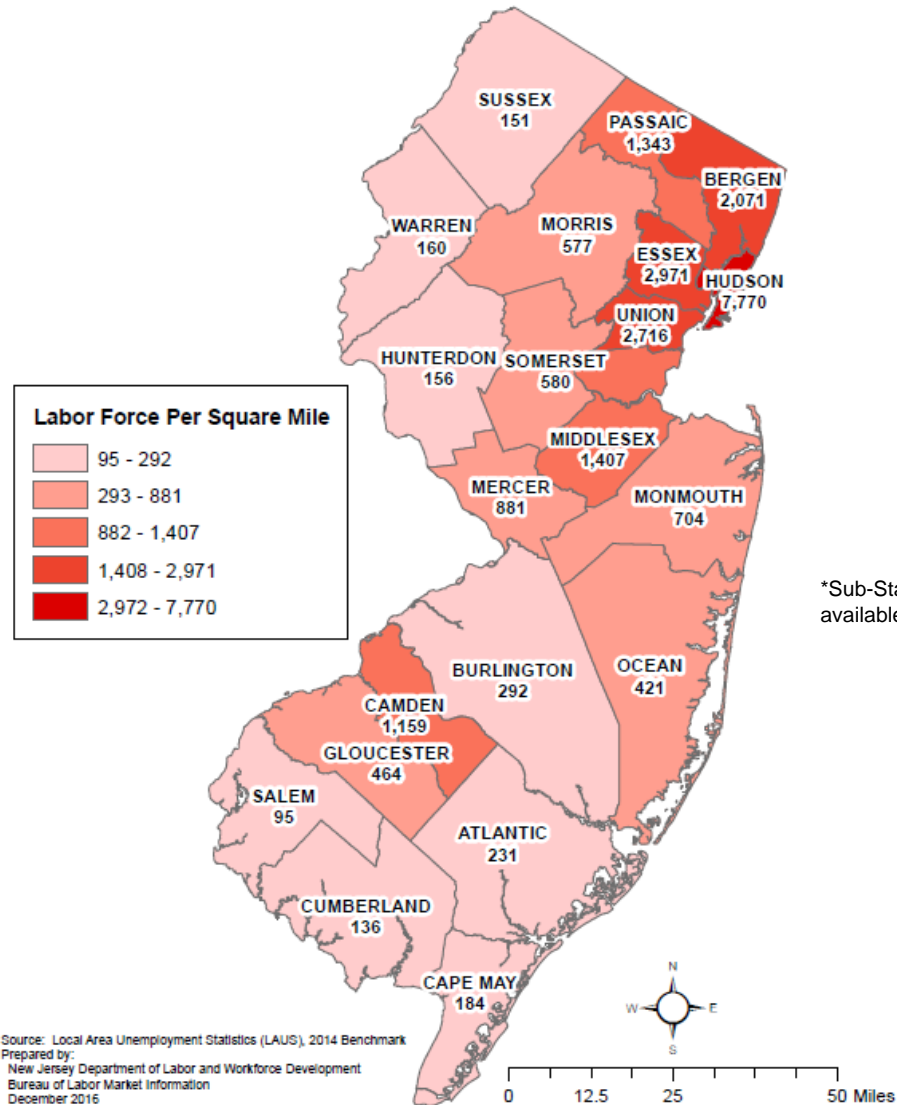


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New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - November 2016

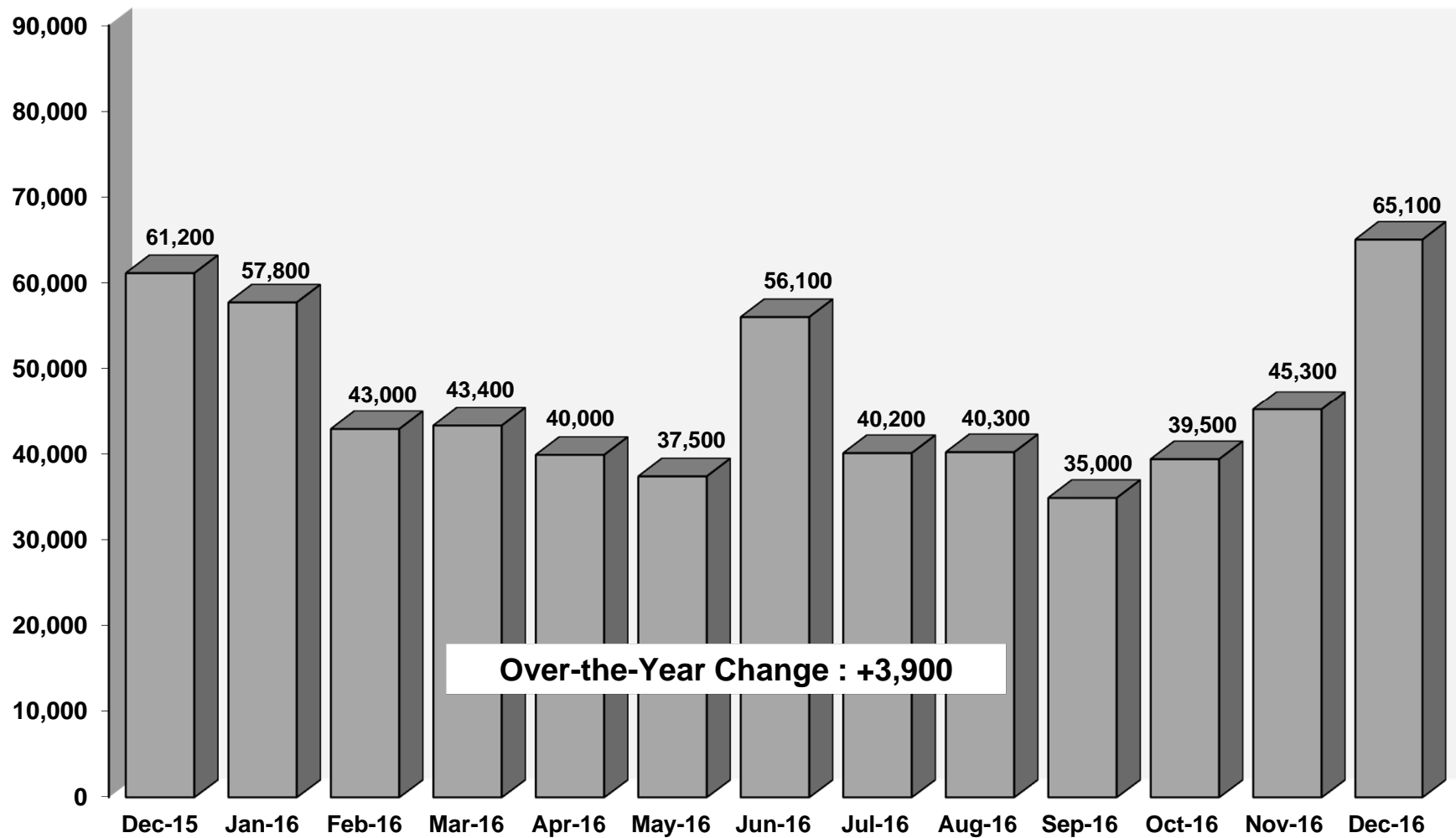
