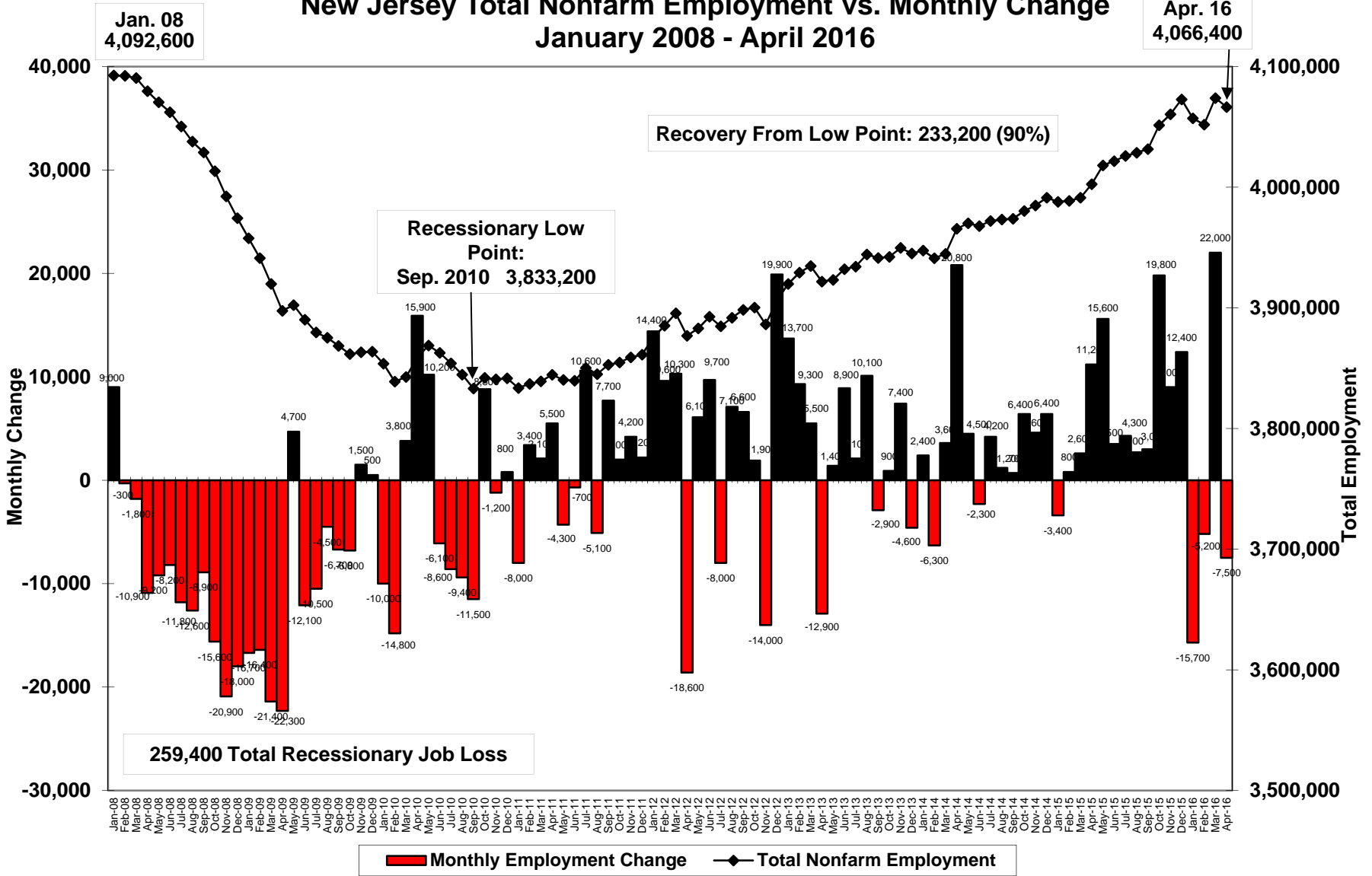

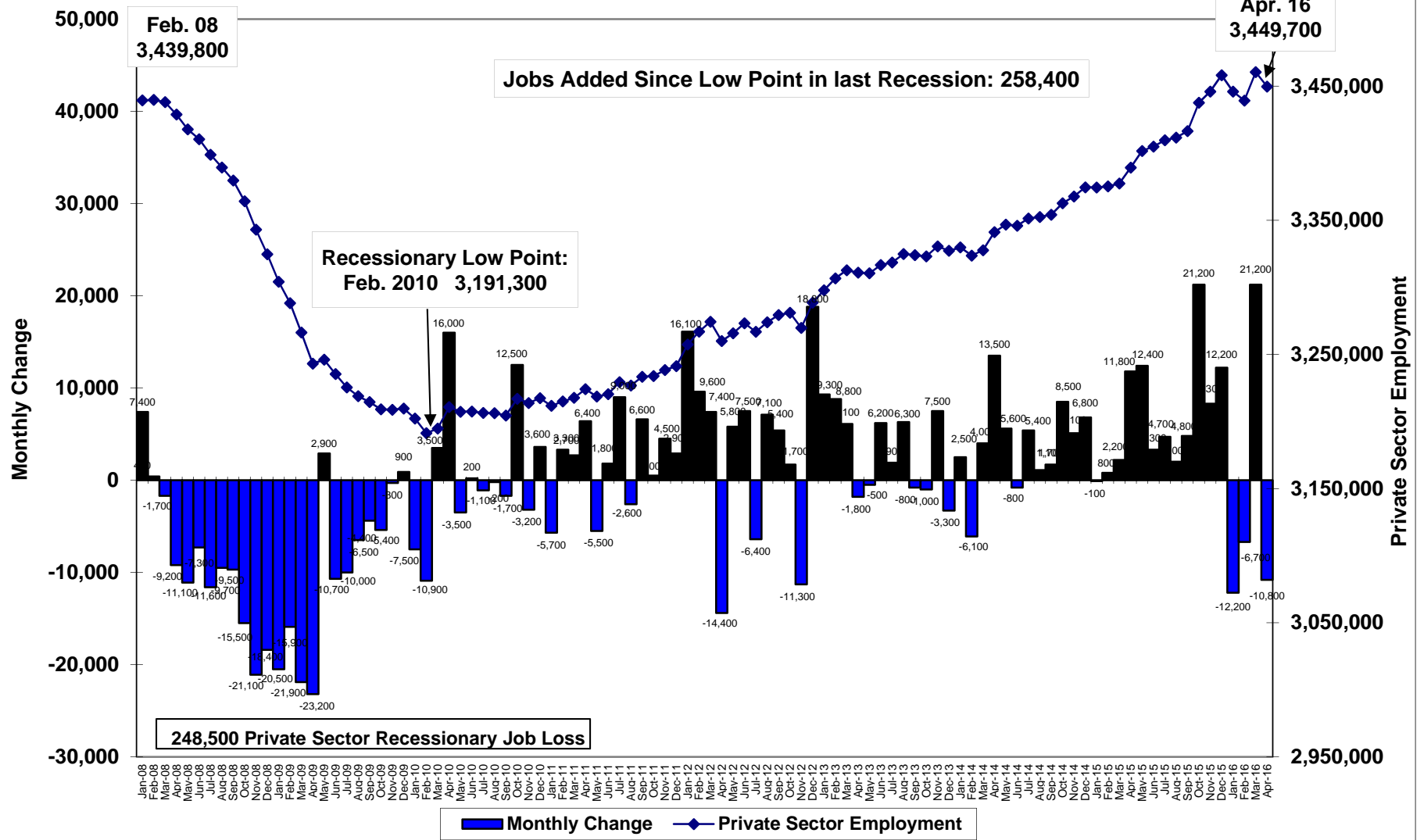

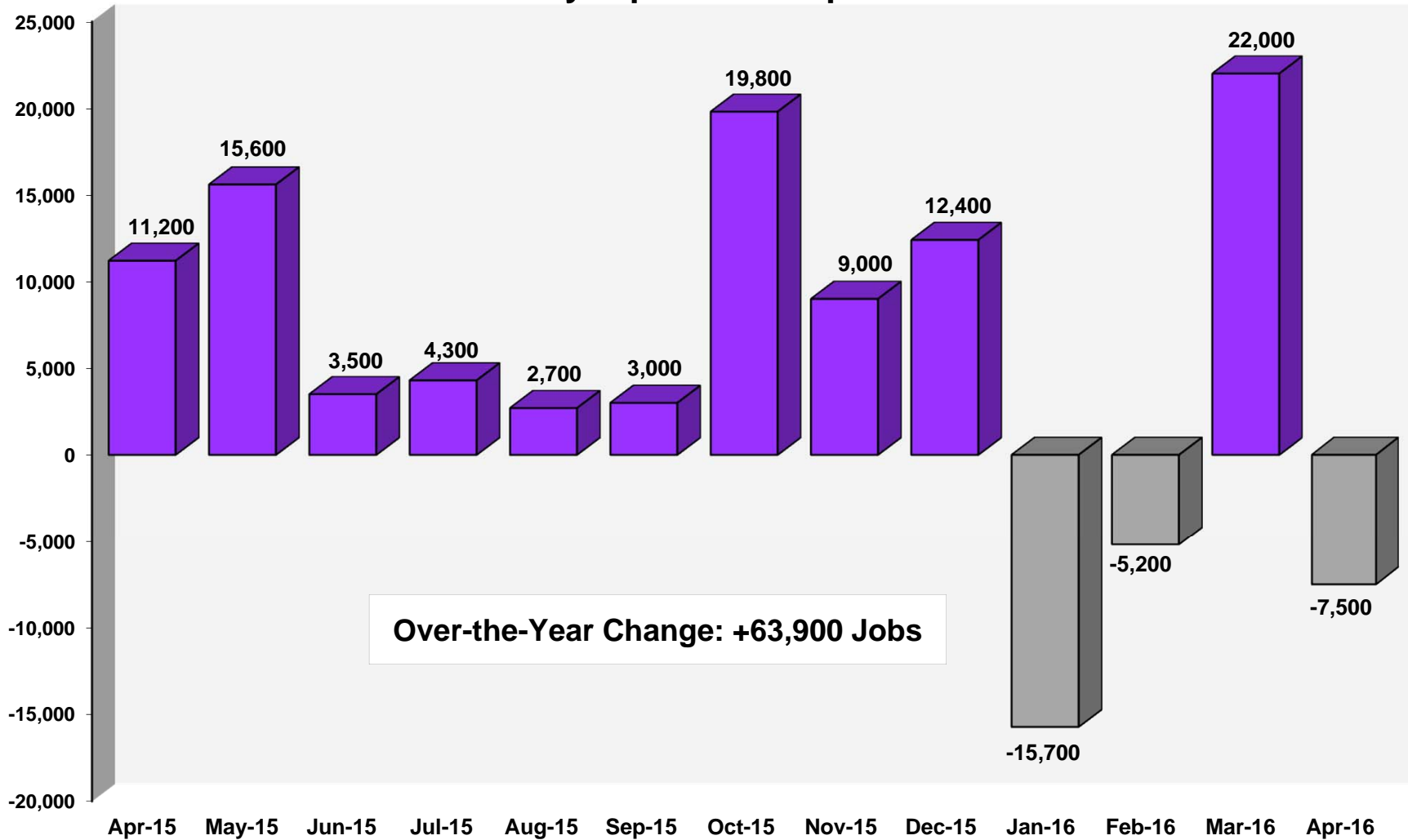
New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - April 2016



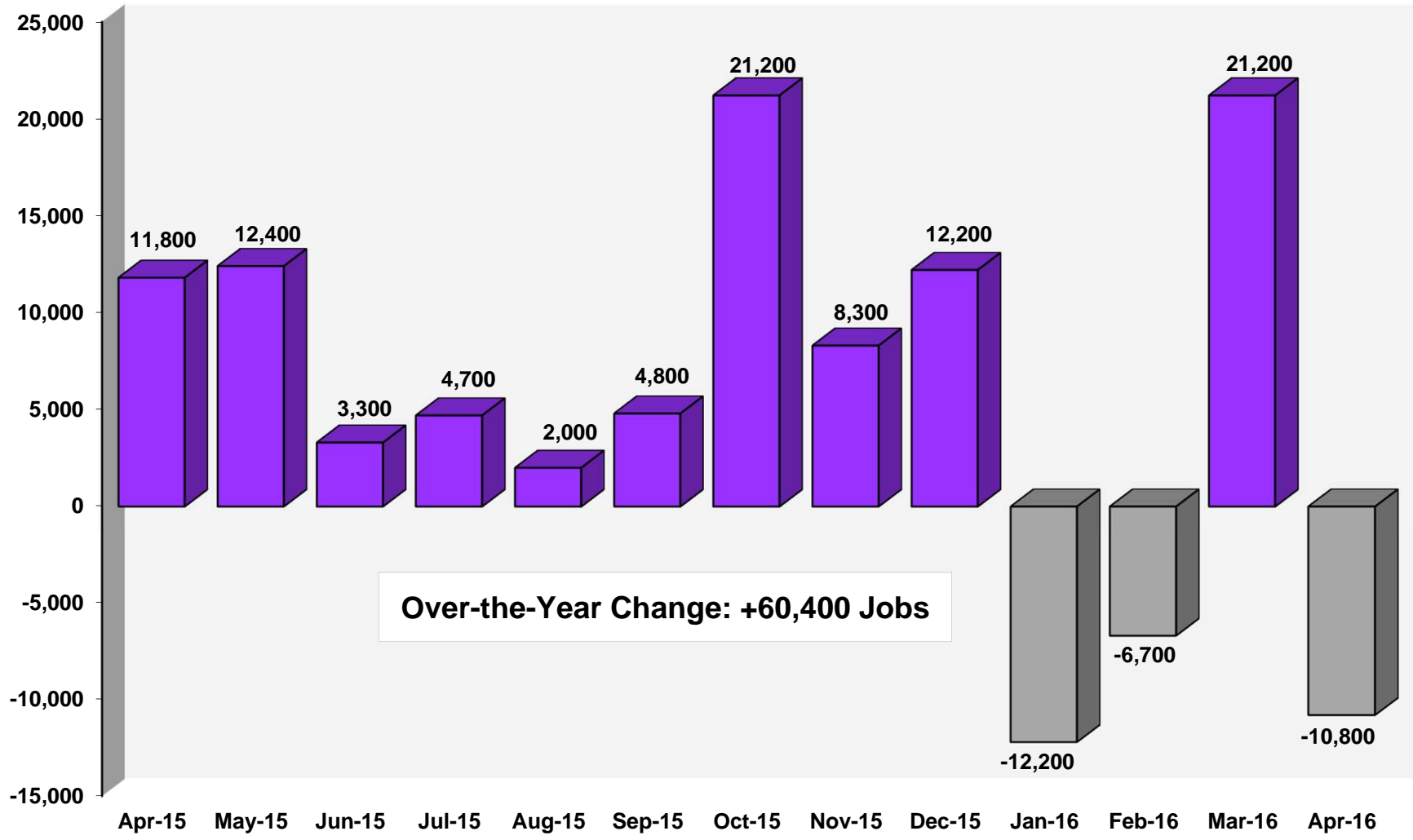
New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - April 2016



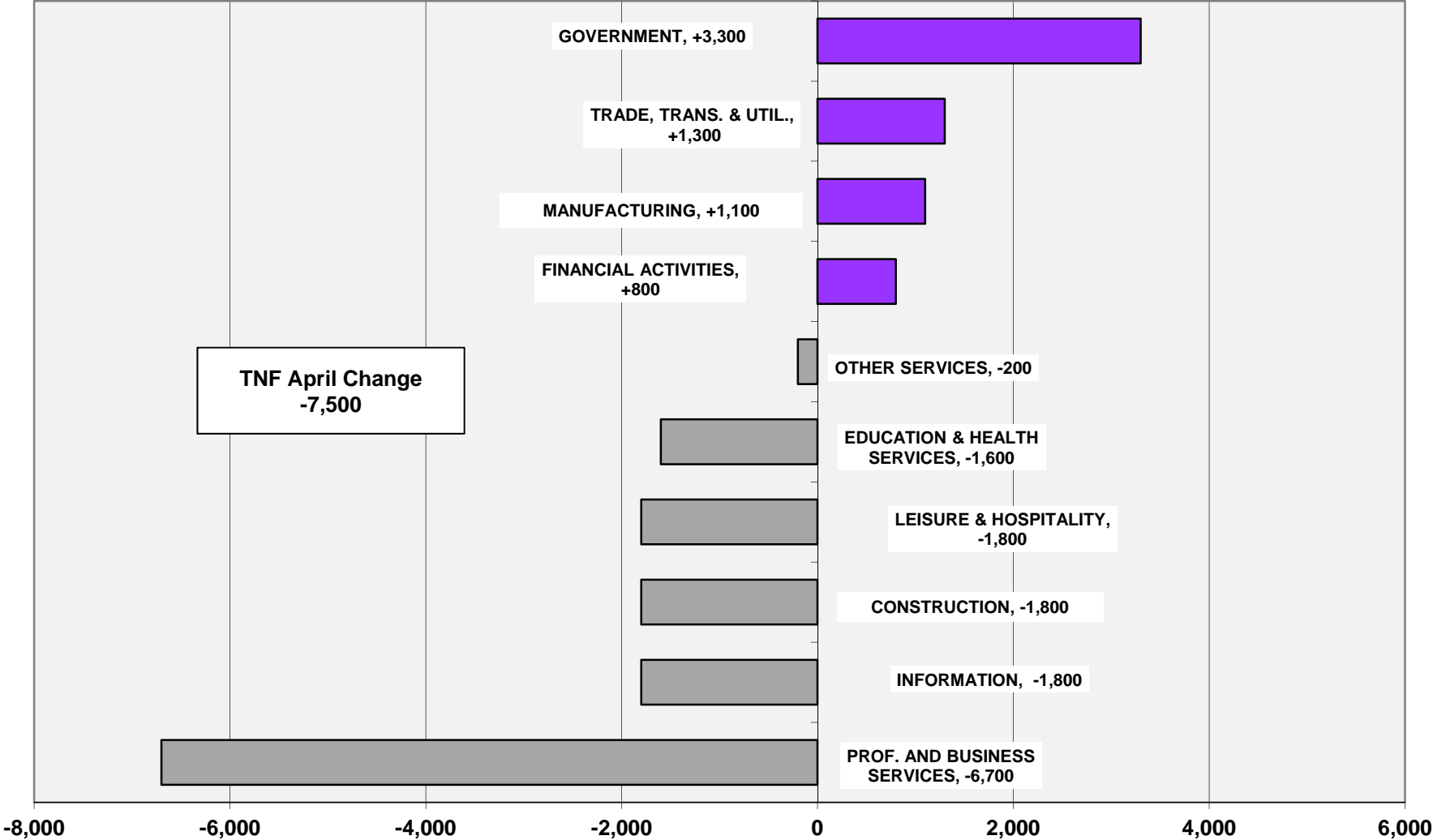
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: April 2015 - April 2016



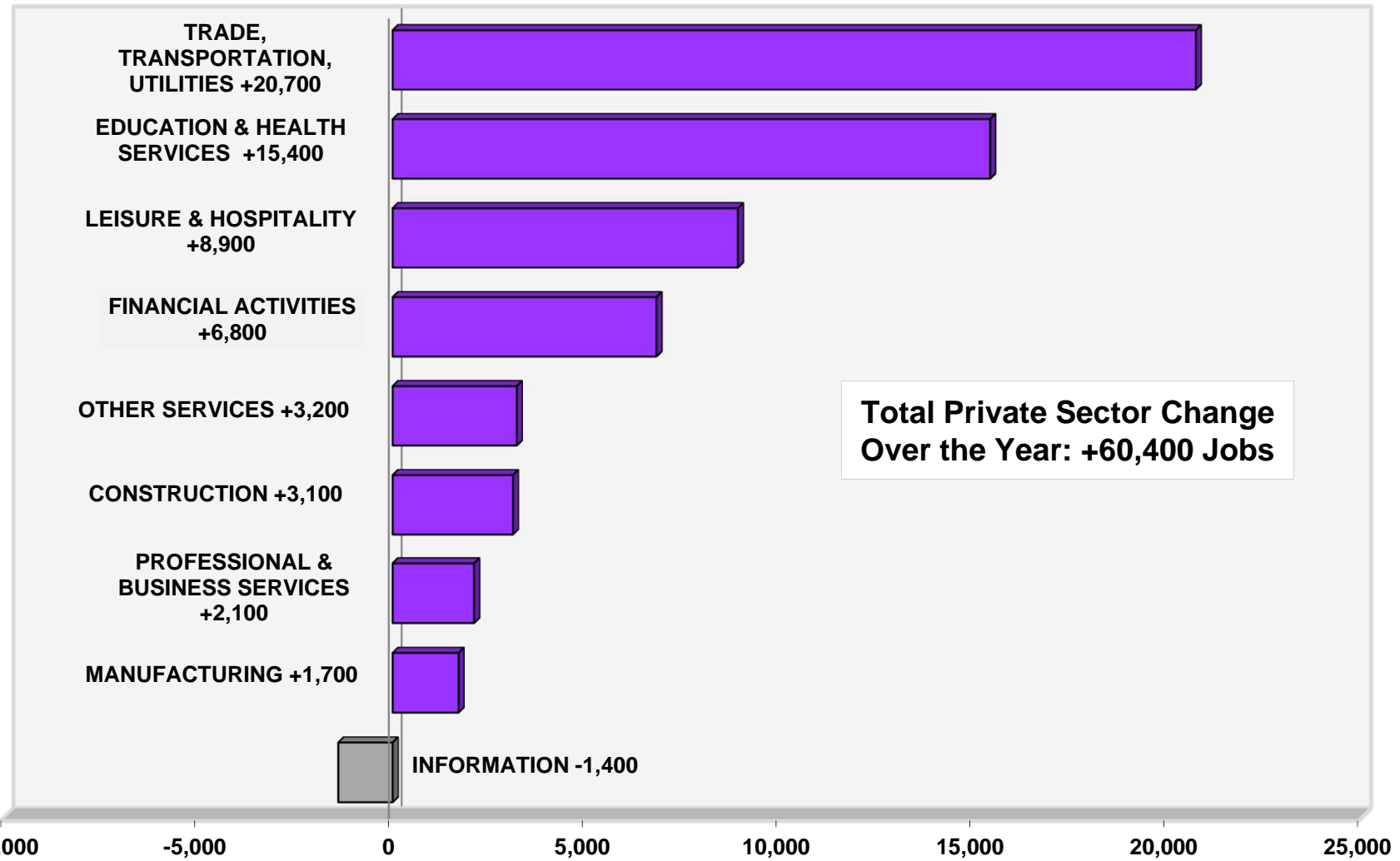
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change April 2015 - April 2016



Monthly Employment Change: April 2016



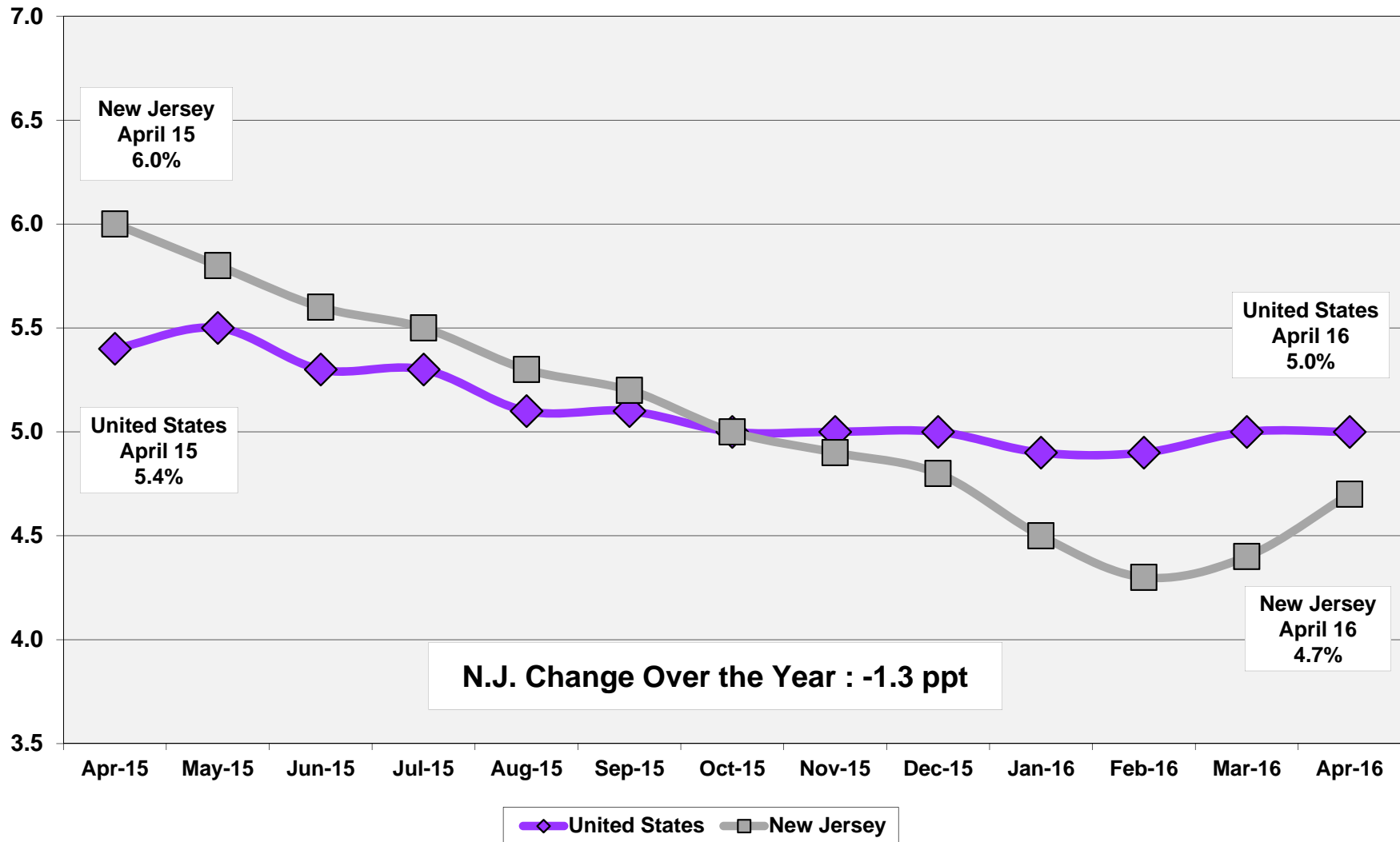
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry April 2015 - April 2016



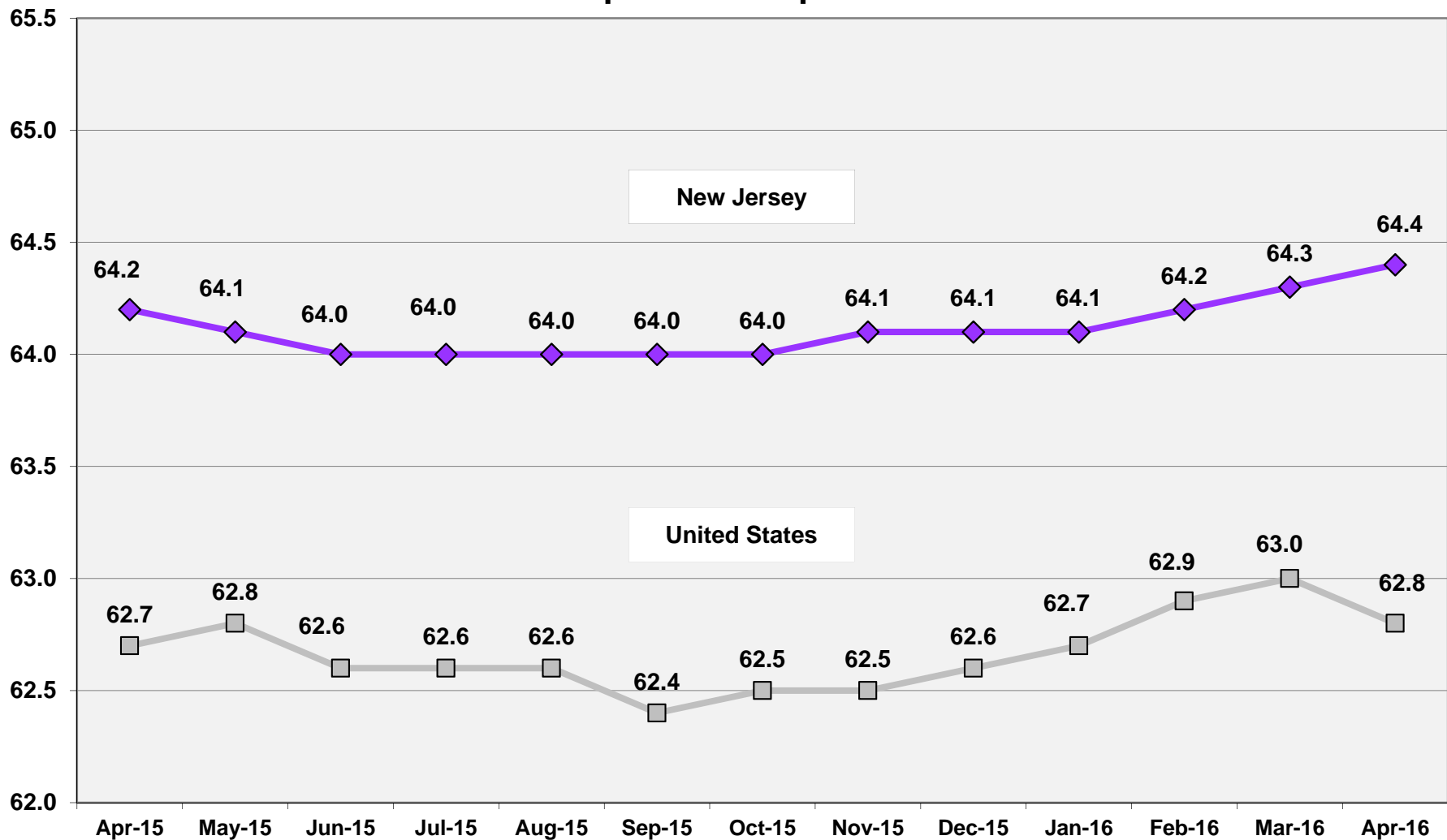

Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: April 2015 - April 2016



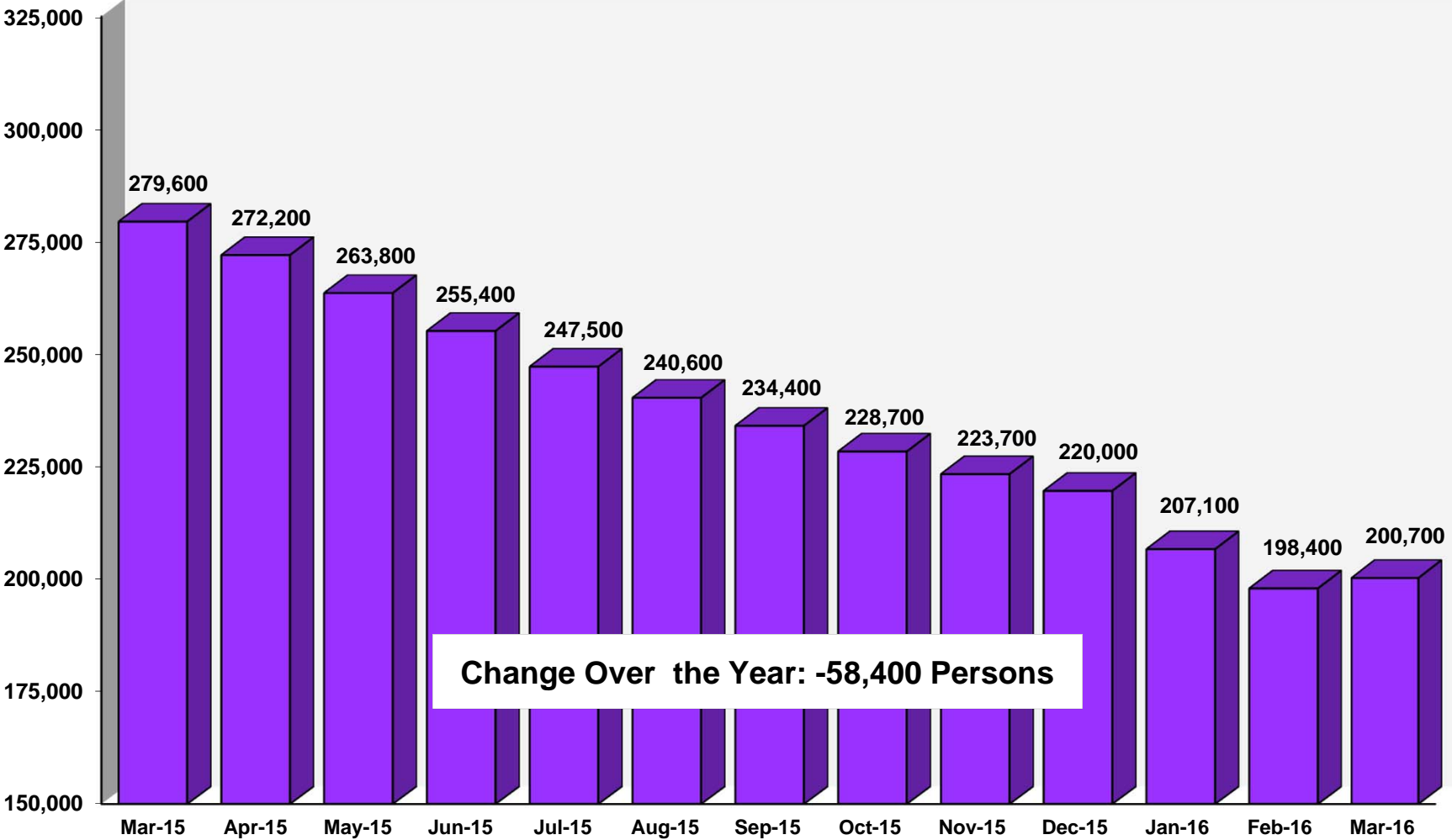
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: April 2015 - April 2016



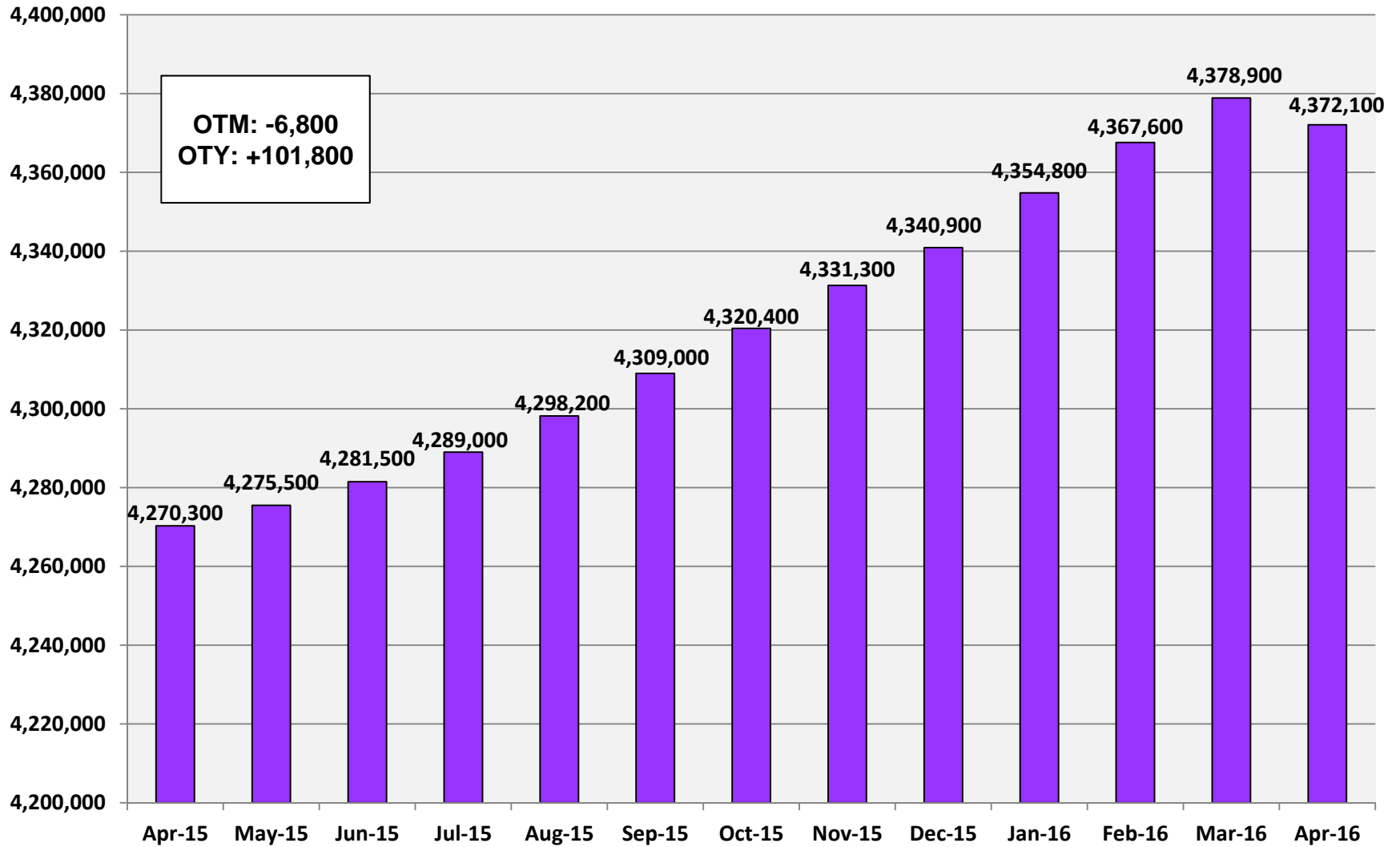

Unemployed New Jersey Residents April 2015 - April 2016

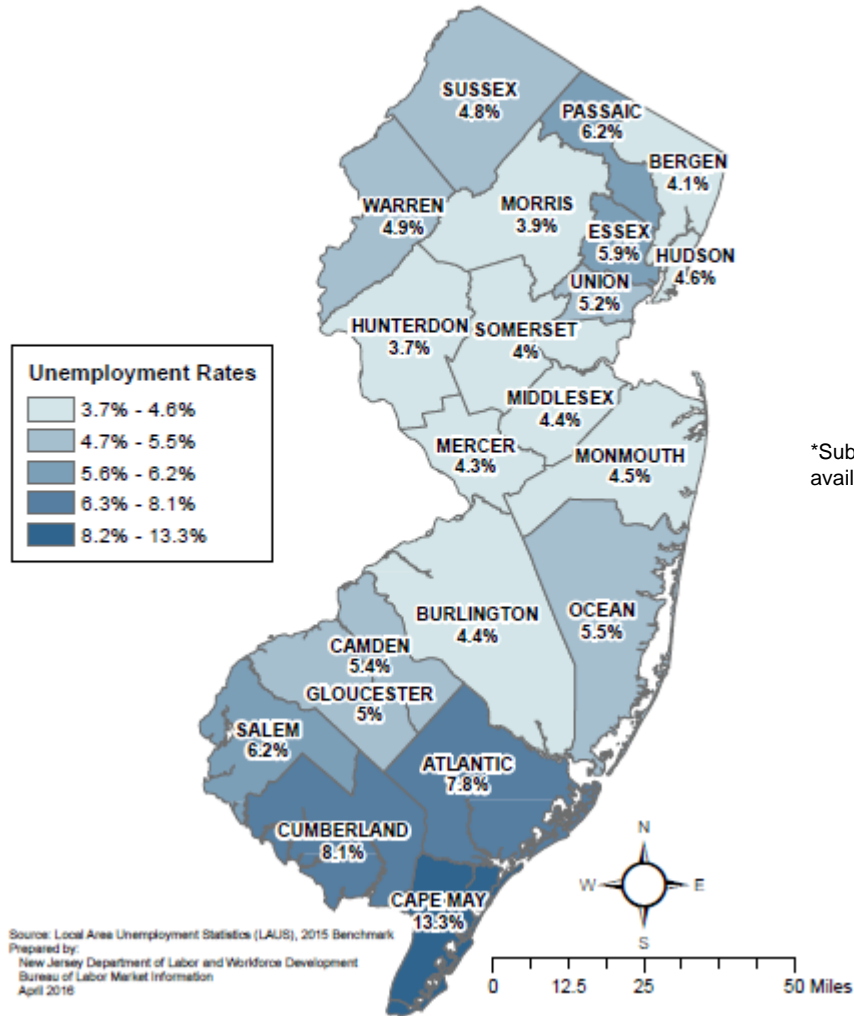


New Jersey Employed Residents: April 2015 - April 2016



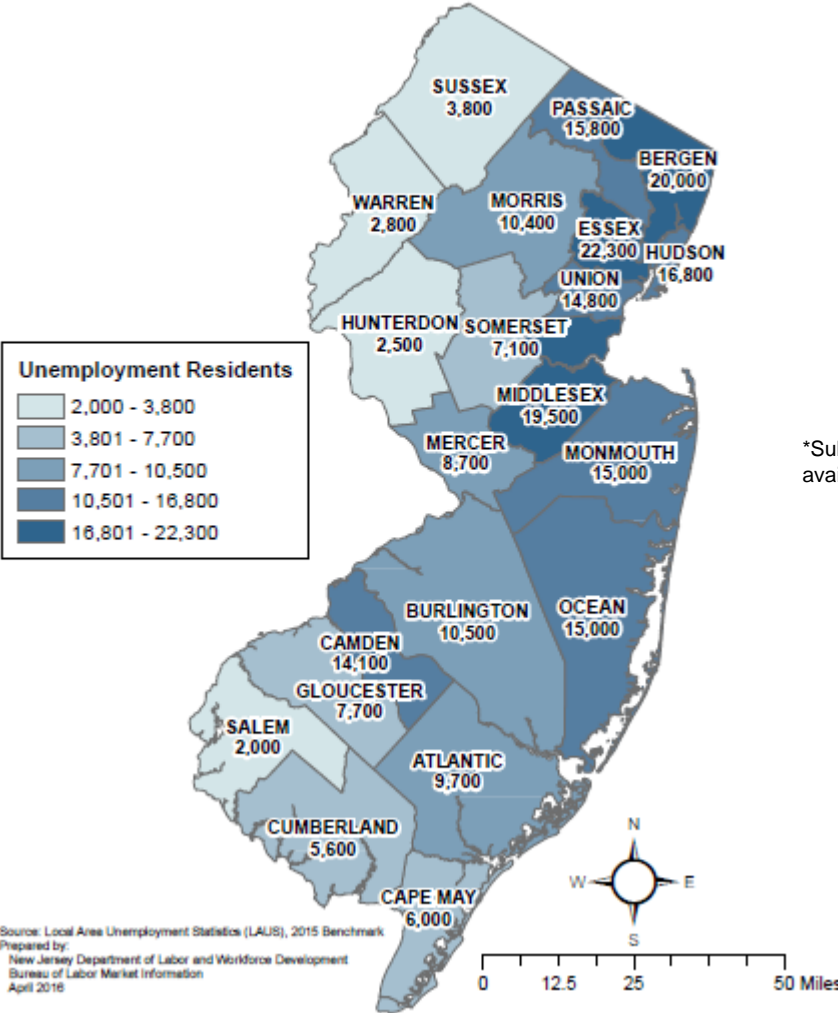
New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - March 2016

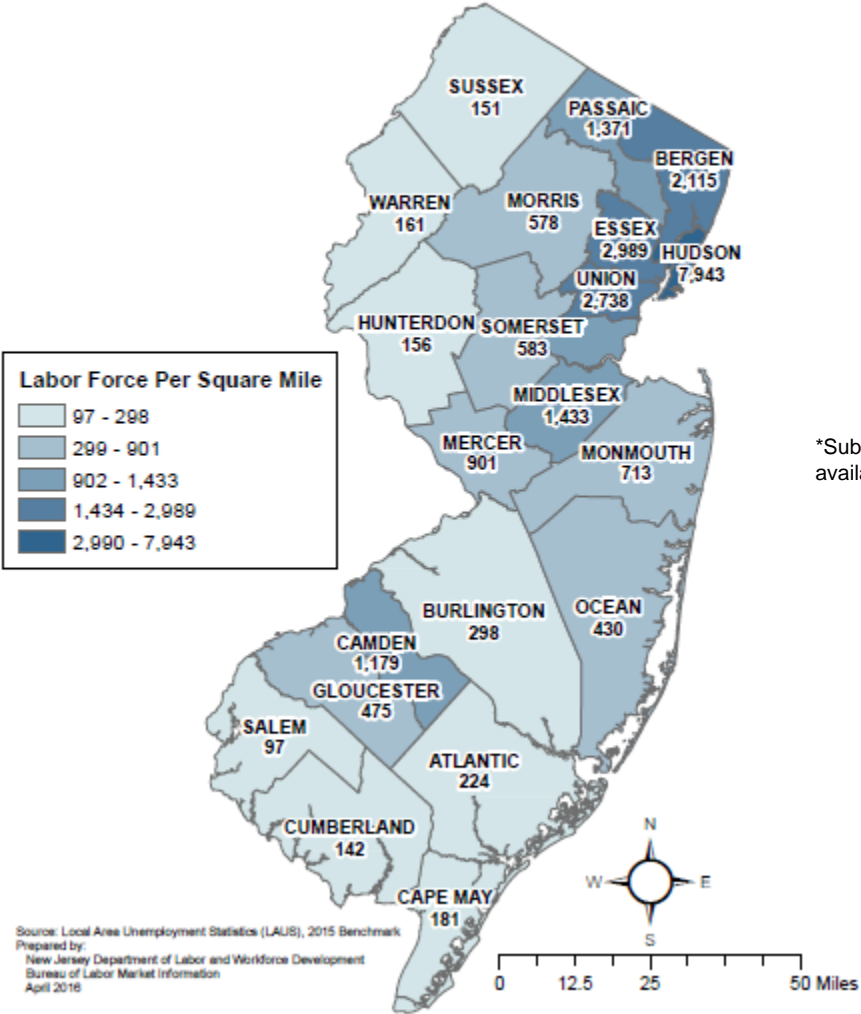

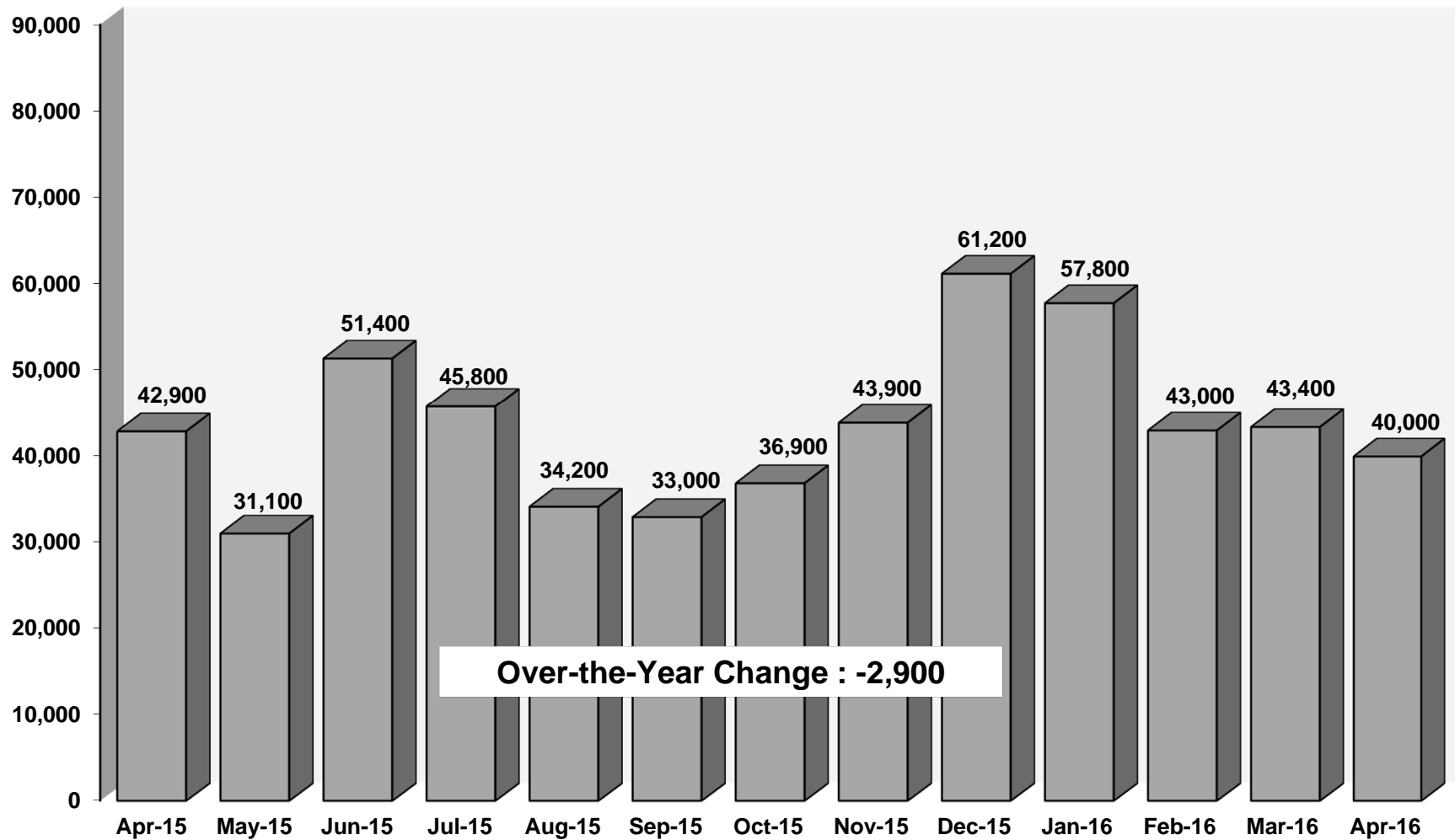
