

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.
































#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



### **Enrollment by Grade**






#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 07




## NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 07






#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
























#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 05




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03








#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.














#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 03




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -**Grade Level - 05**




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 05






#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.






#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup








#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -**Grade Level - 03**




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -**Grade Level - 05**




#### NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03










#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
