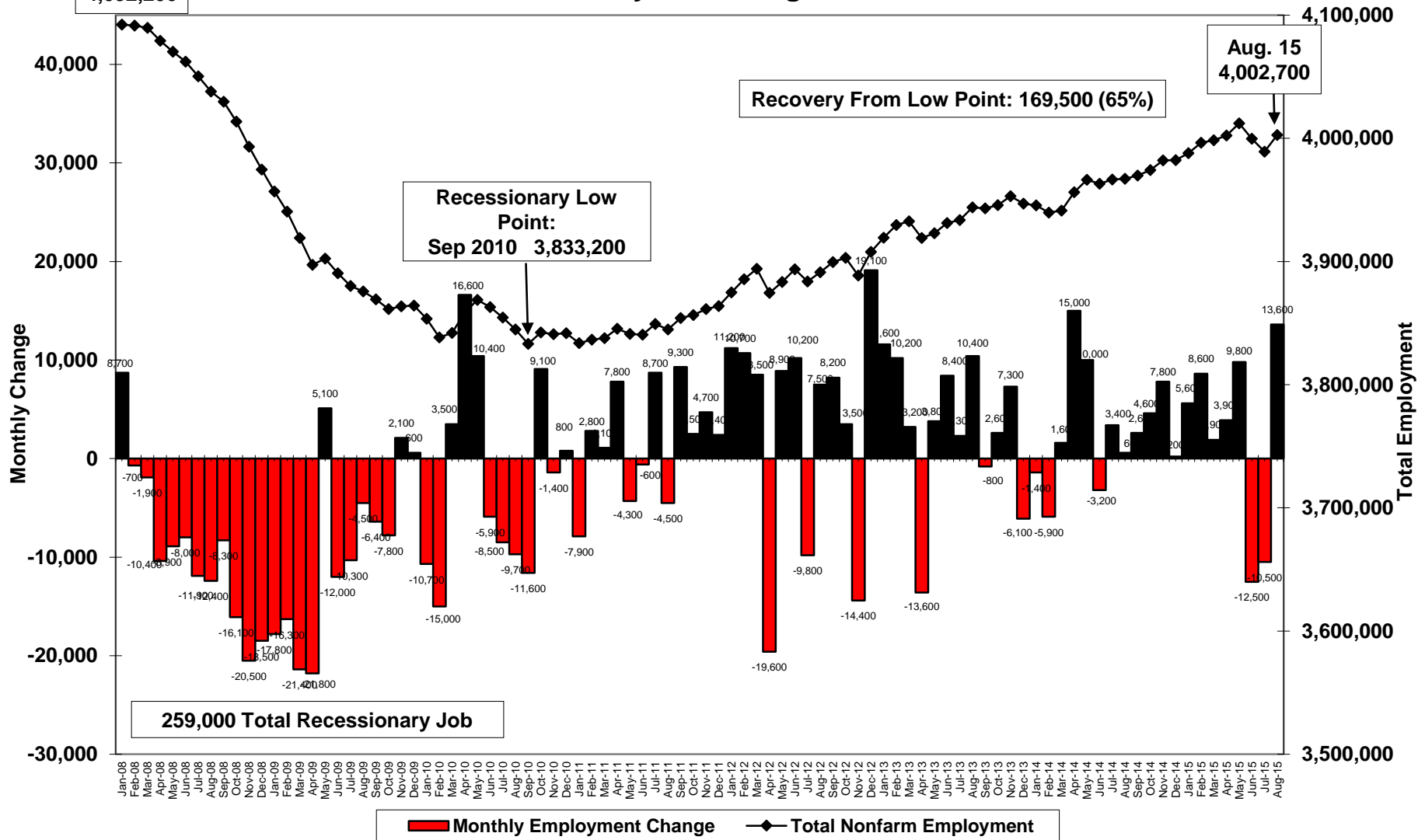

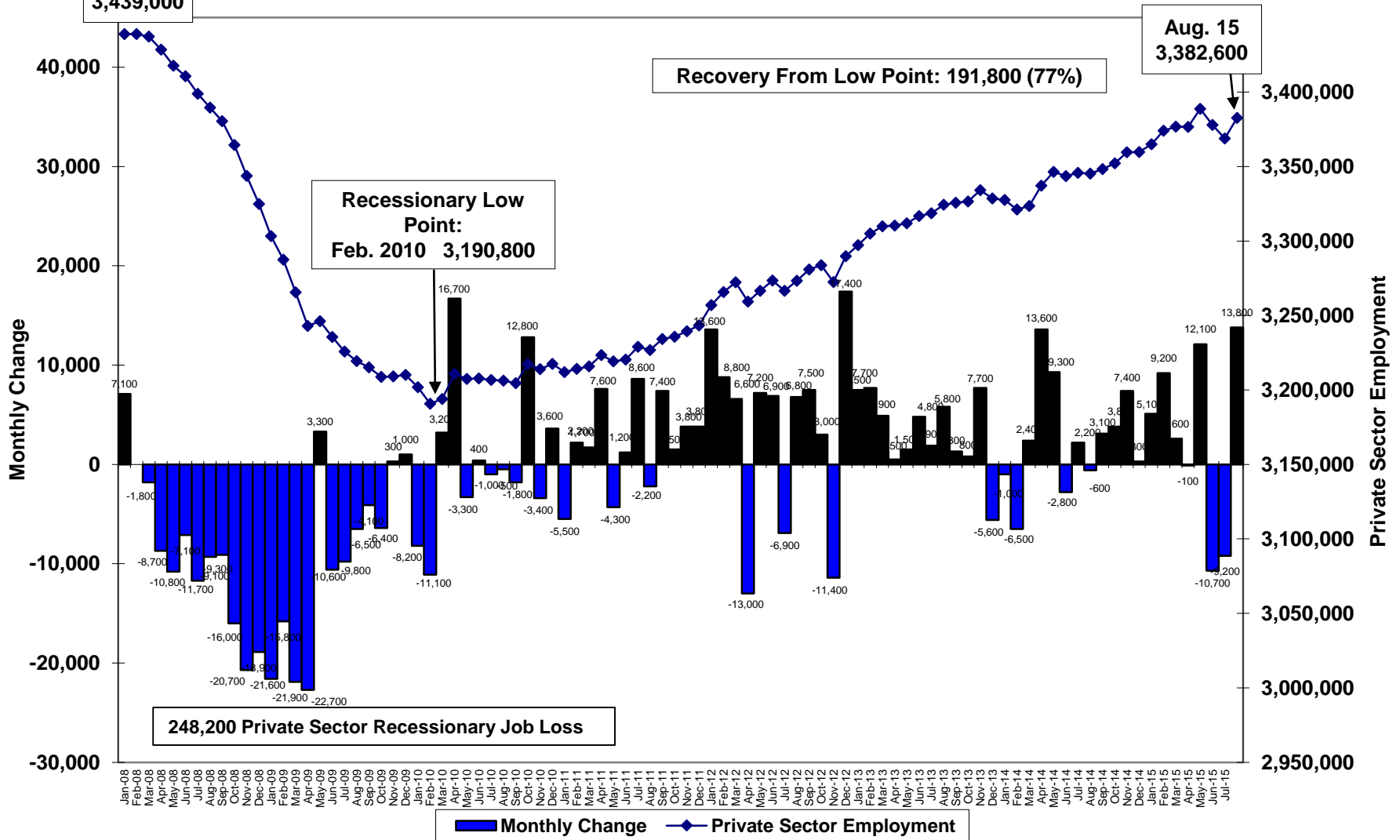


New Jersey Total Nonfarm Employment vs. Monthly Change

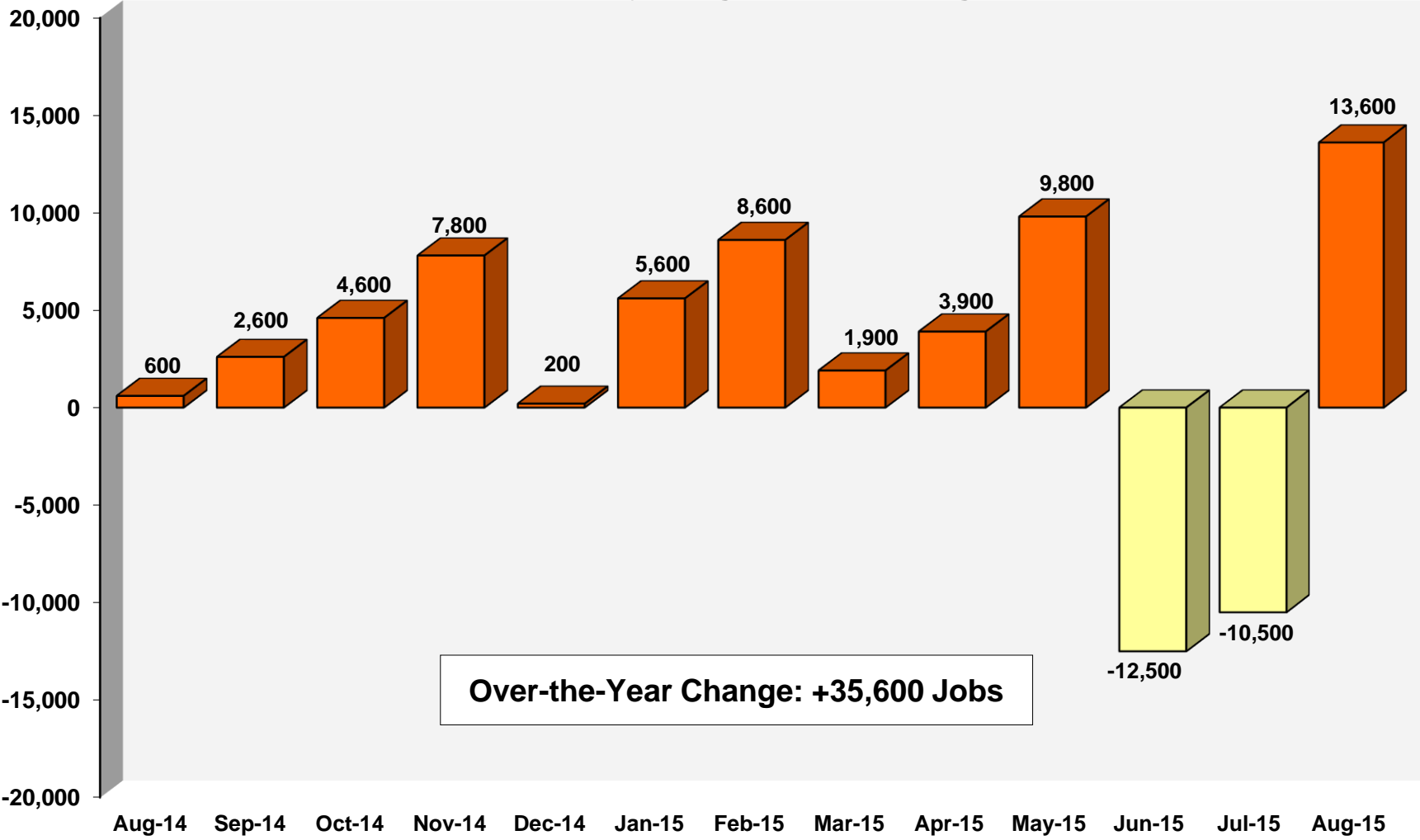
January 2008 - August 2015



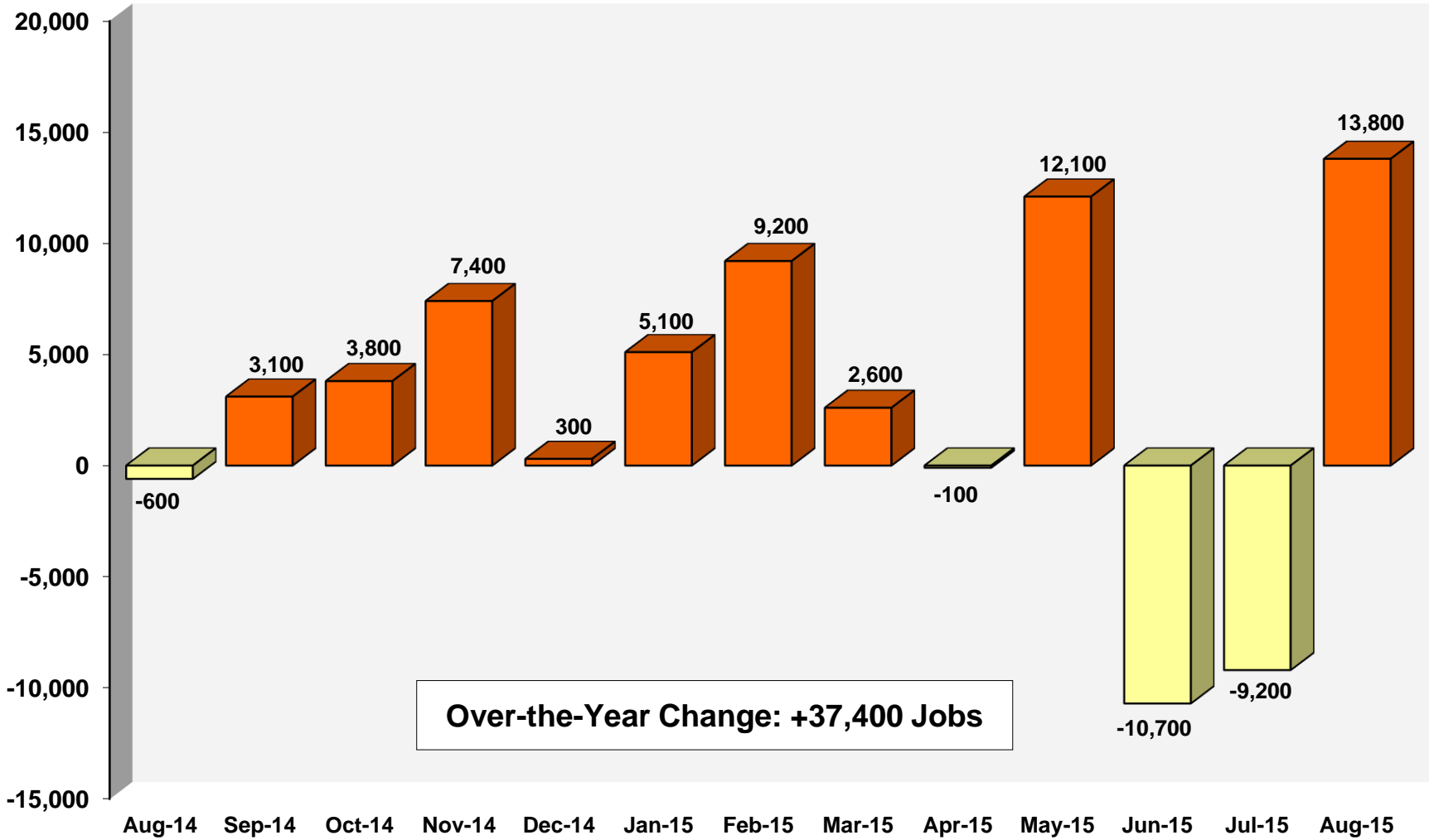
New Jersey Private Sector Employment vs. Monthly Change January 2008 - August 2015



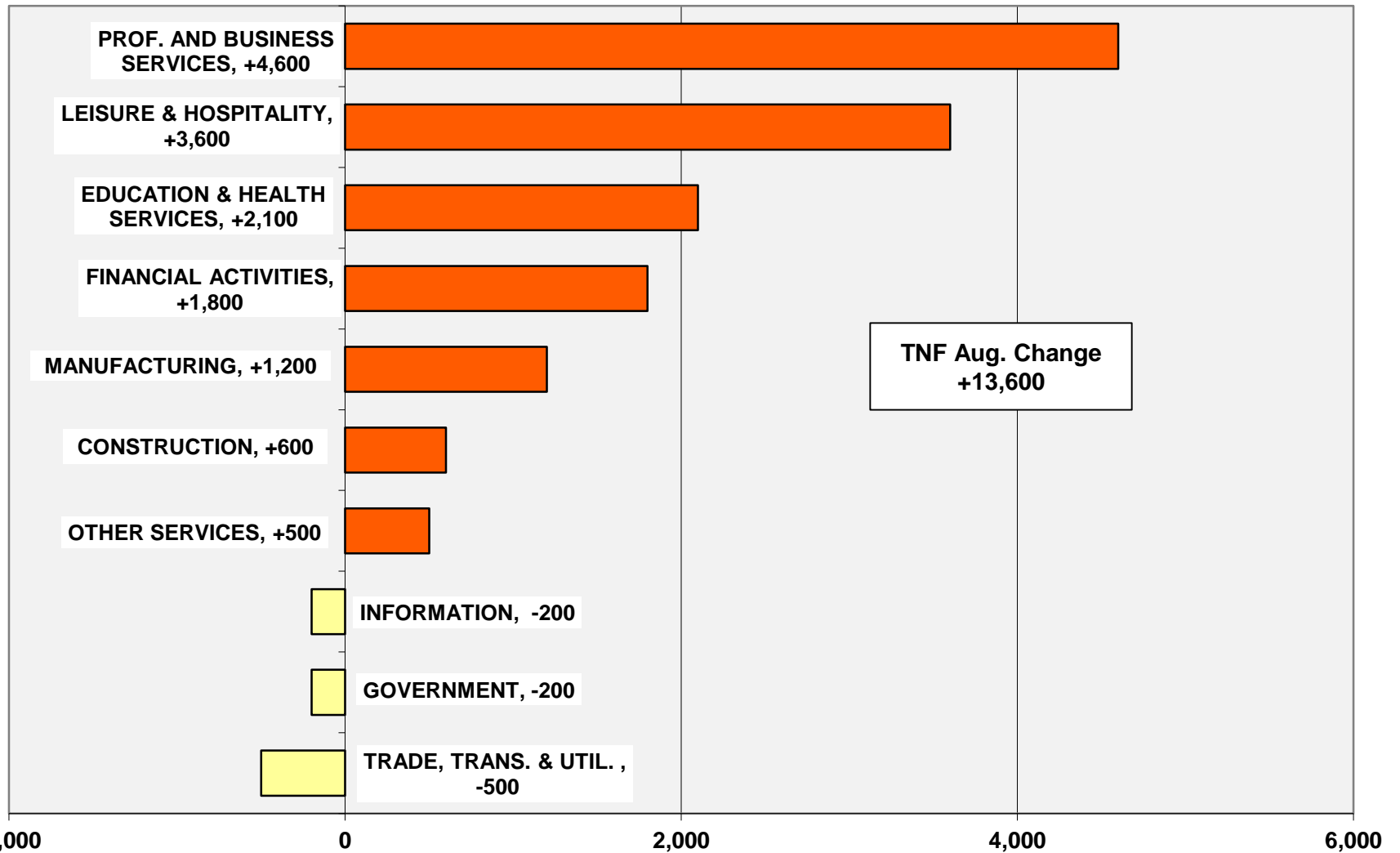
Monthly Total Employment Change New Jersey: August 2014 - August 2015



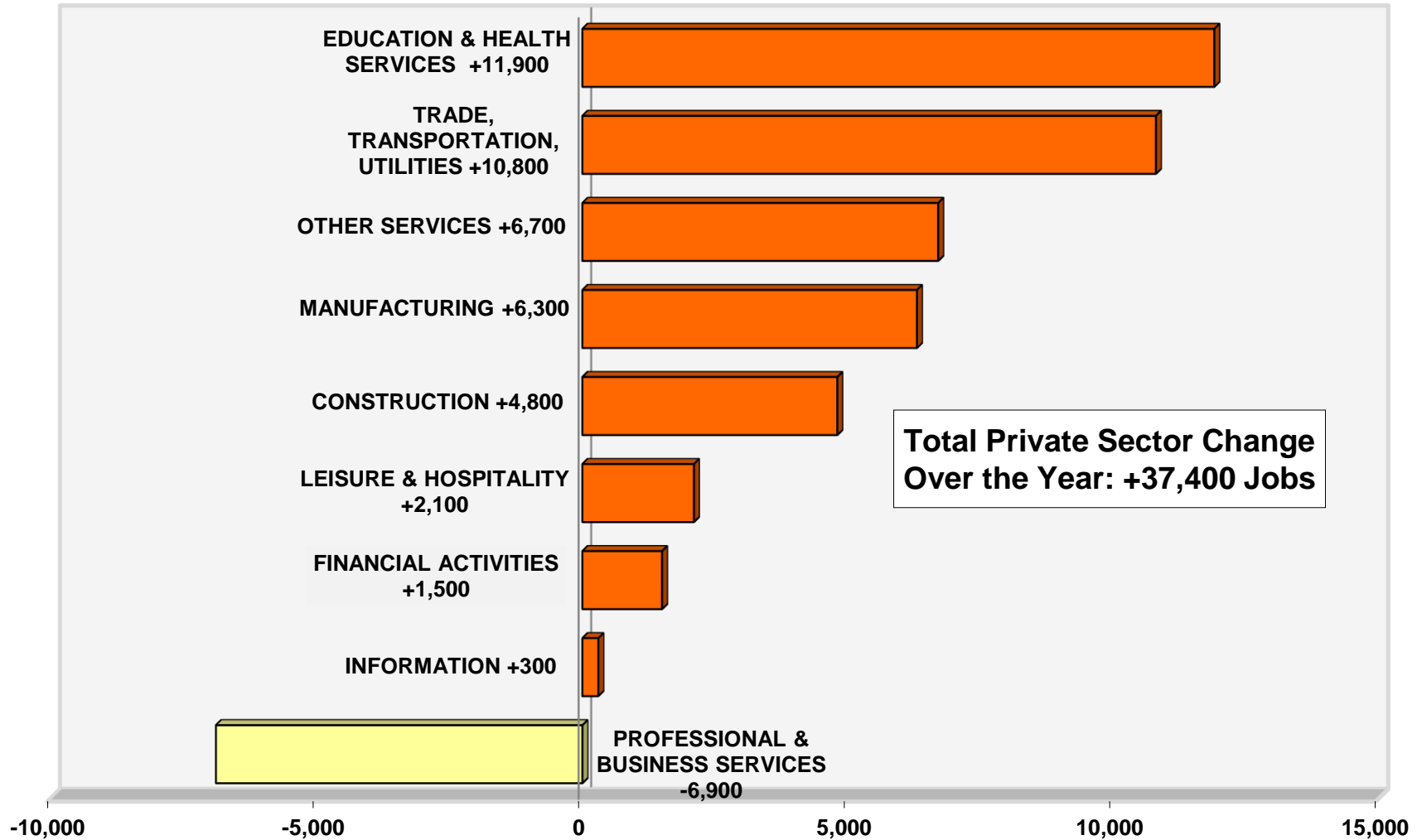
Monthly Private Sector Employment Change August 2014 - August 2015



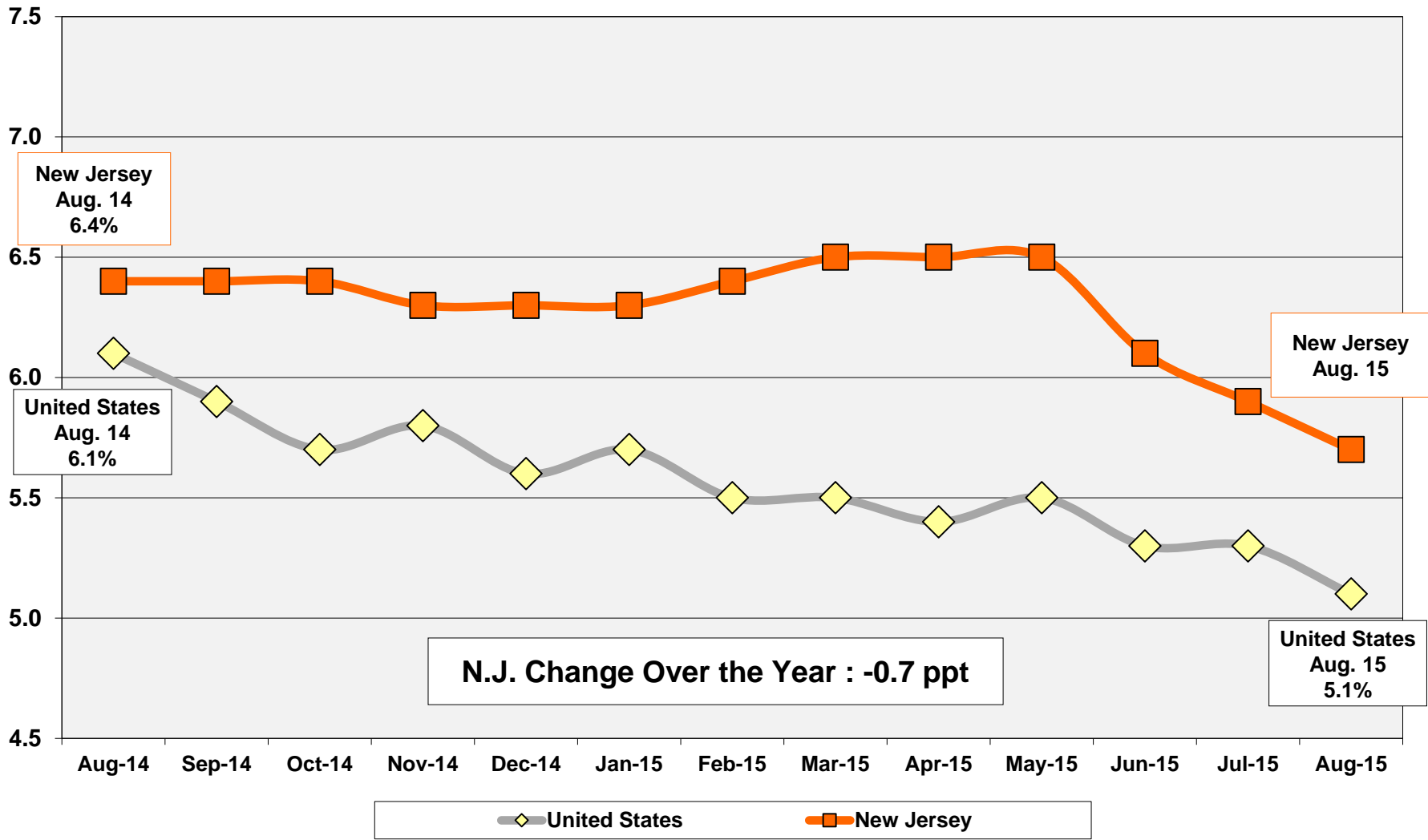
Monthly Employment Change: August 2015



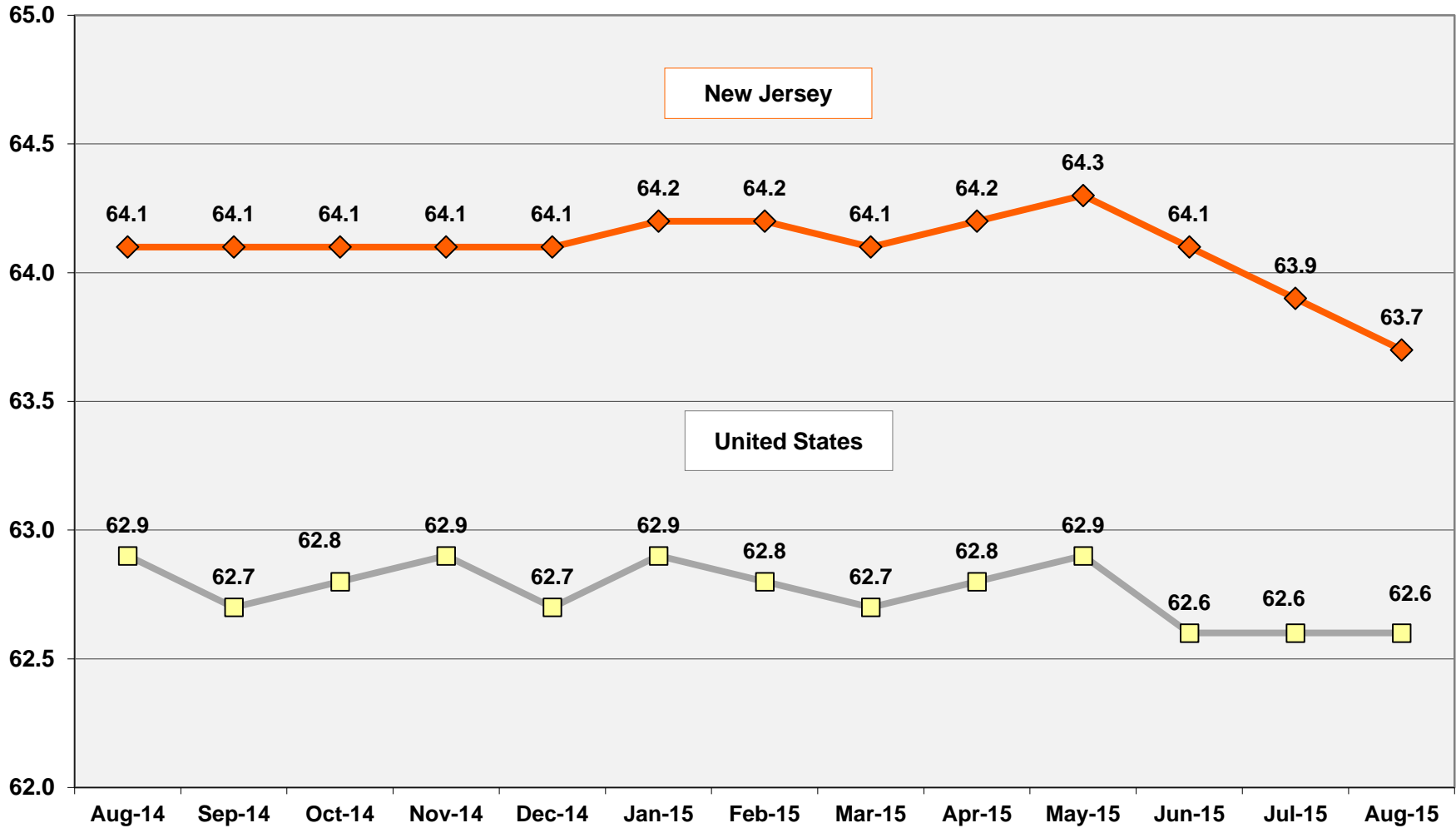
New Jersey Private Sector Employment Change by Industry August 2014 - August 2015



Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: August 2014 - August 2015



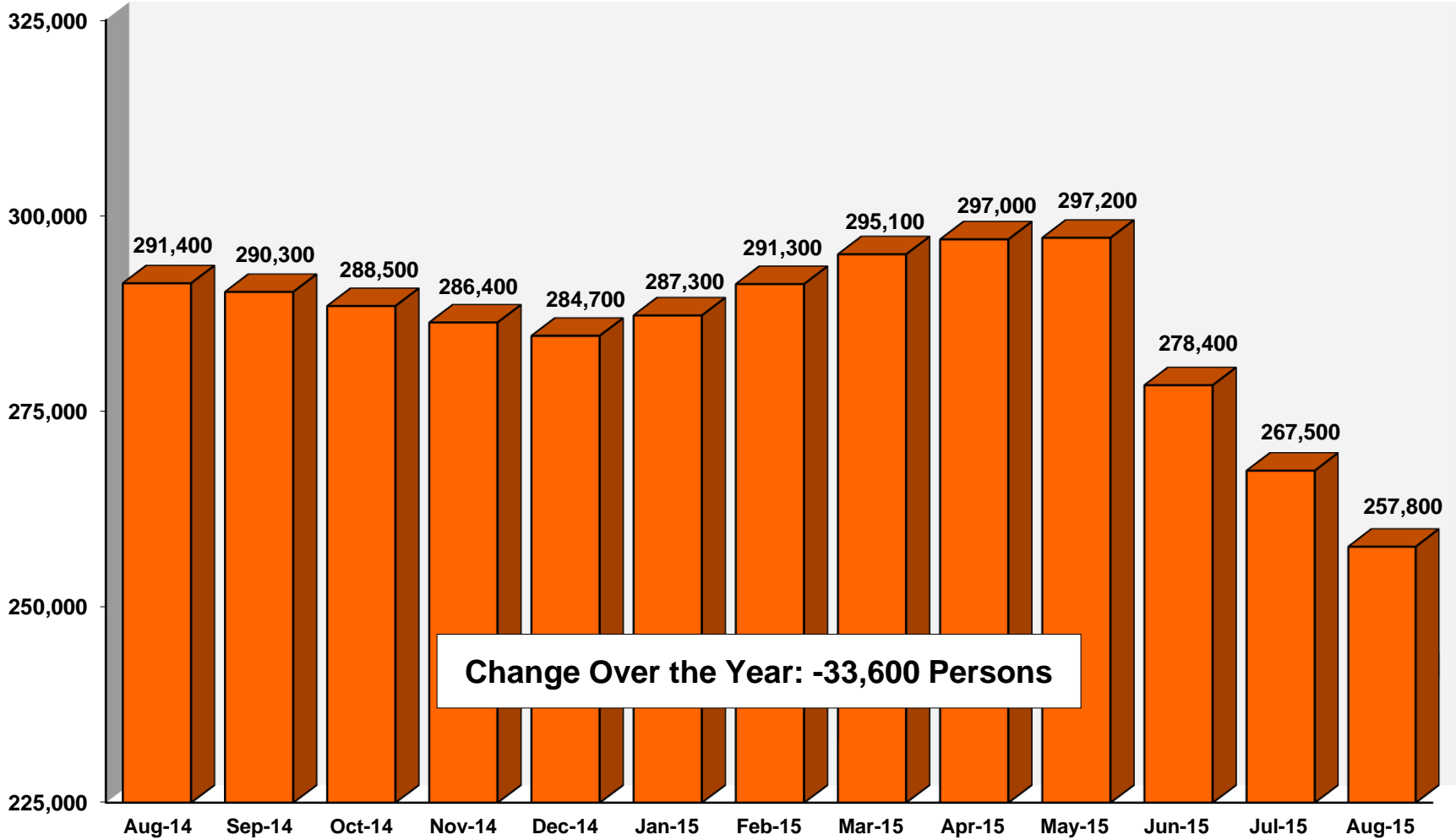
New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: August 2014 - August 2015



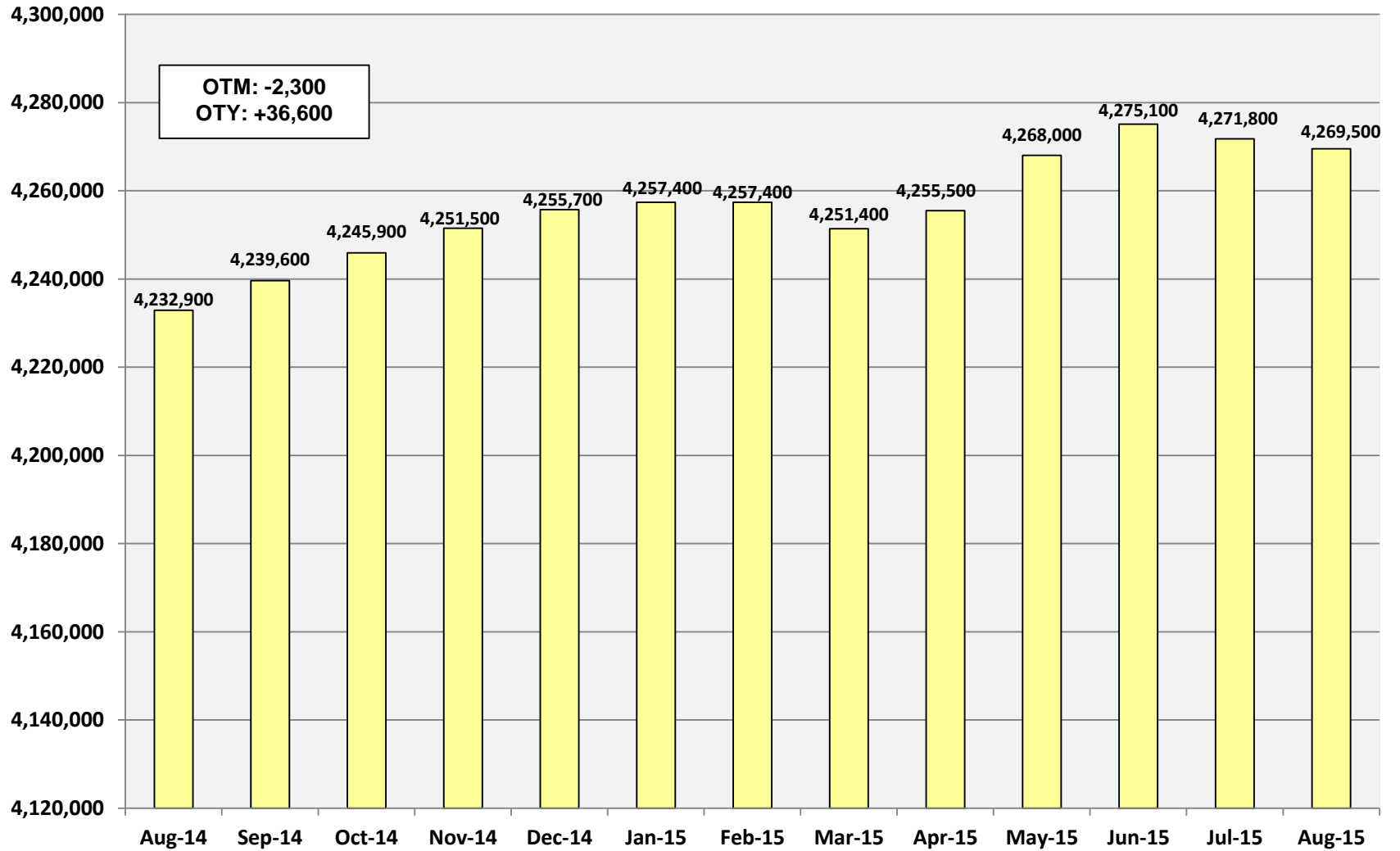

New Jersey Employed Residents: August 2014 - August 2015

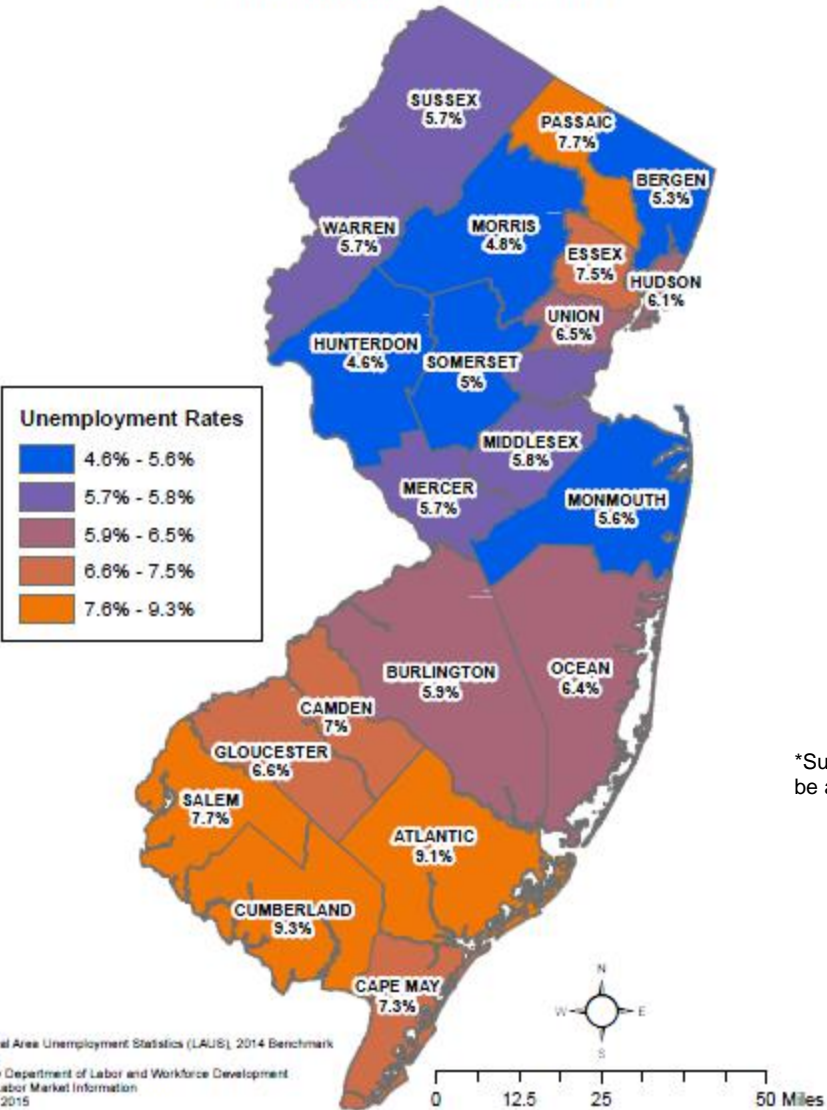


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New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - July 2015

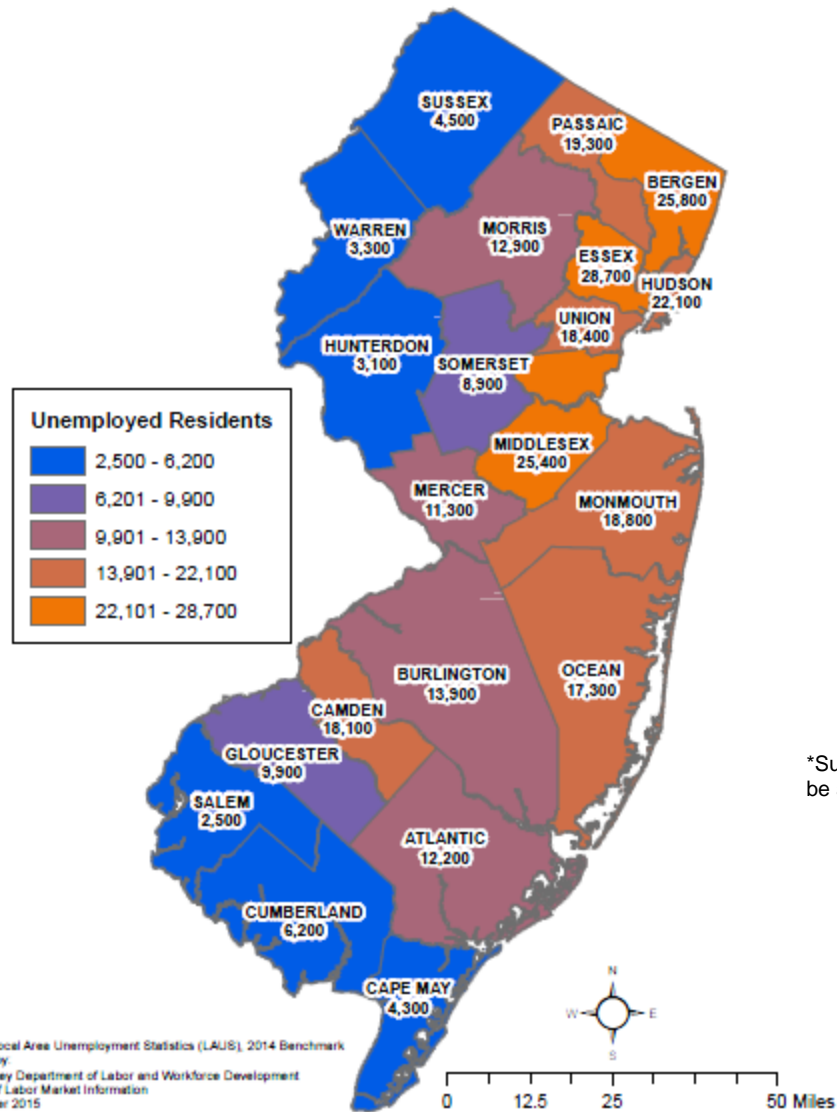

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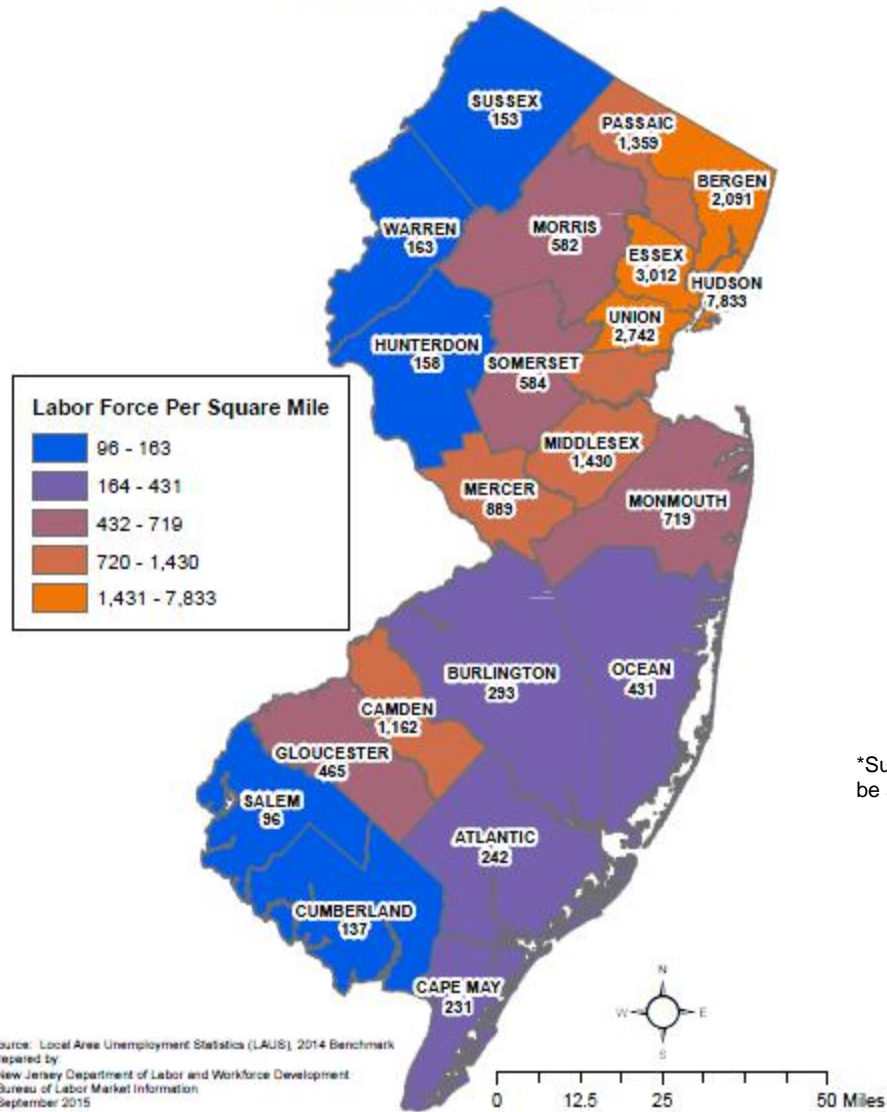

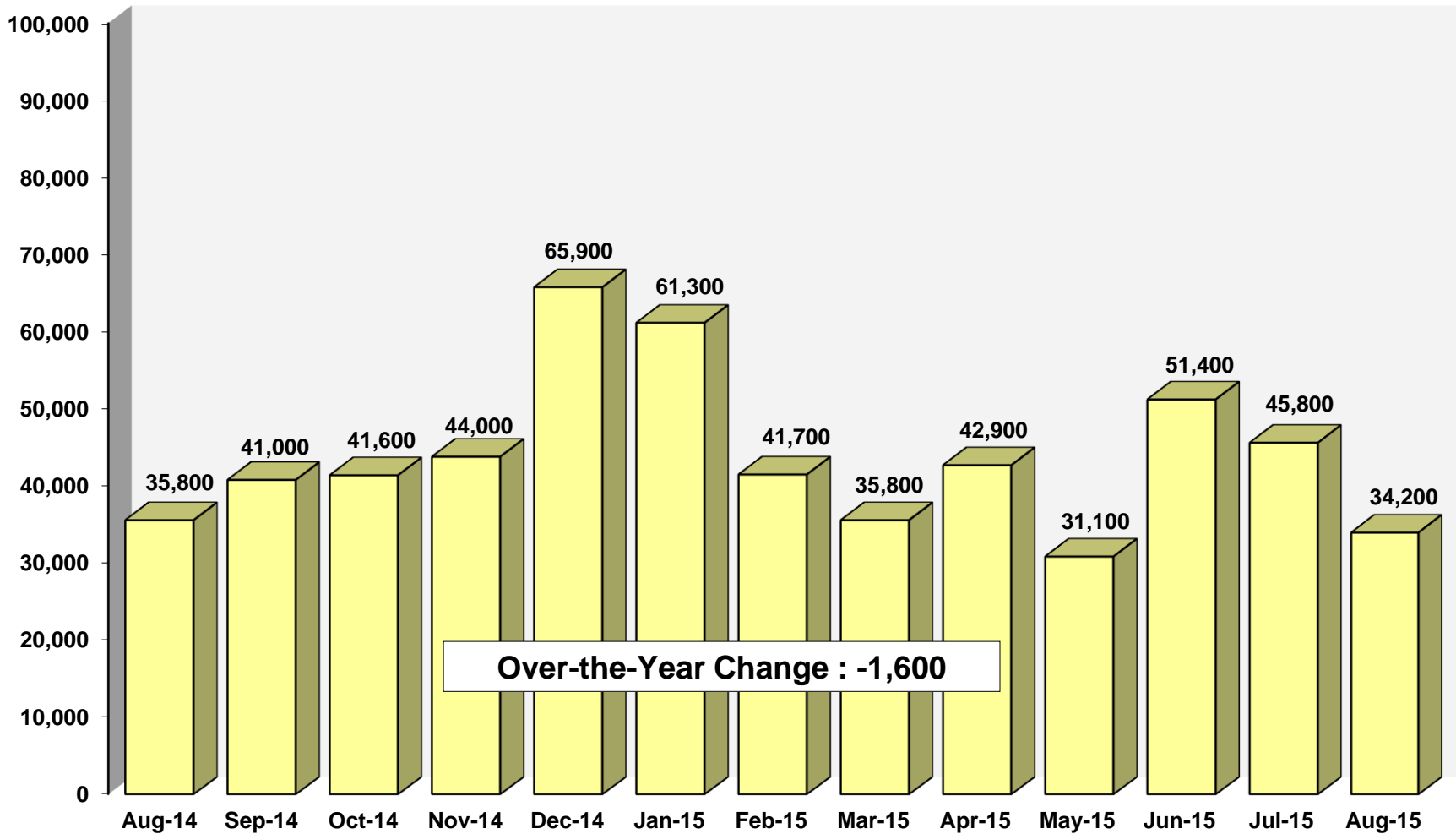
