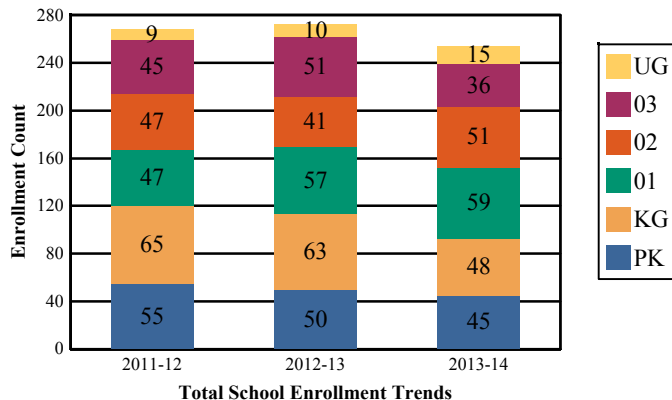

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.



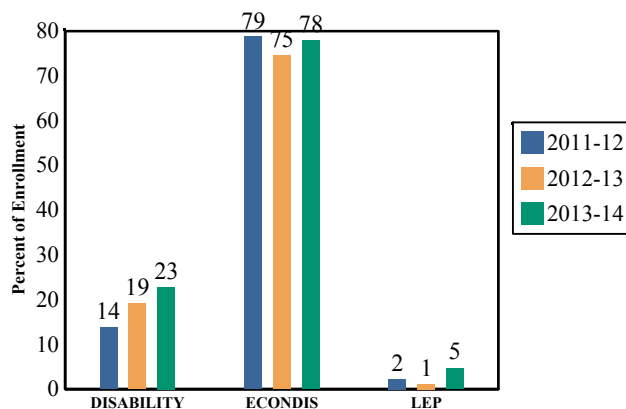
Total School Enrollment Trends

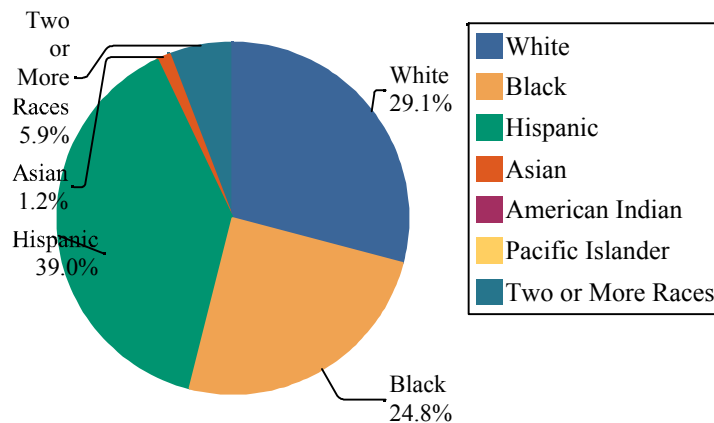

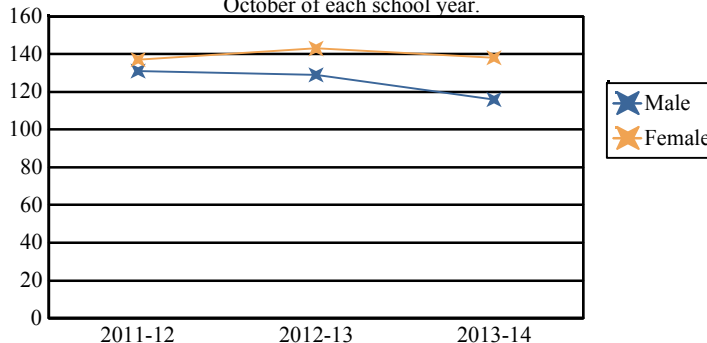
Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup

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ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT

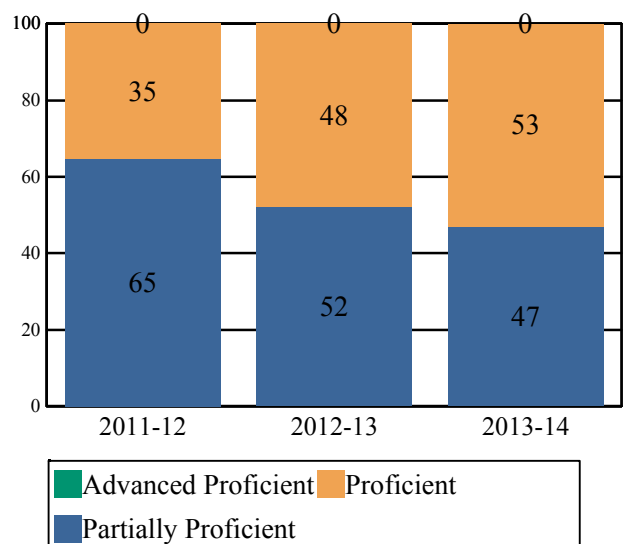

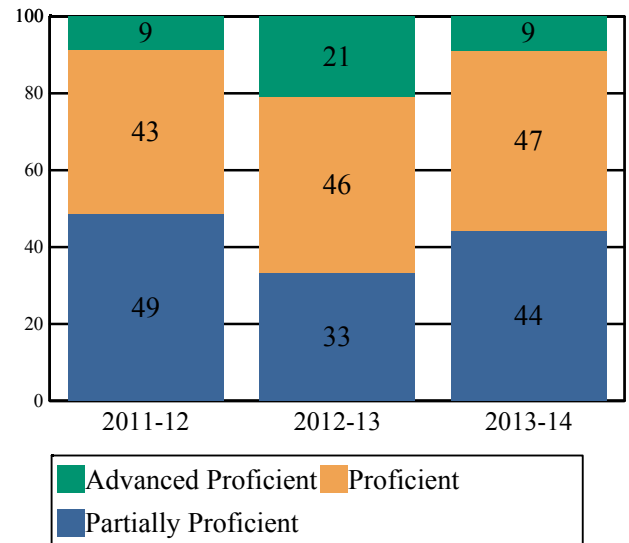

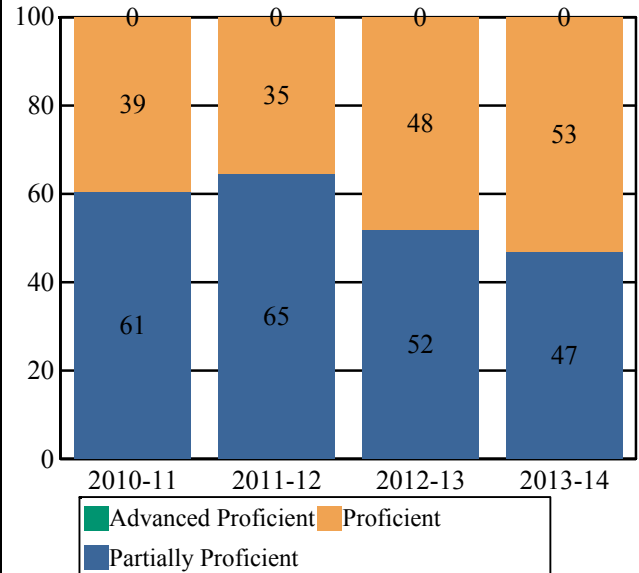

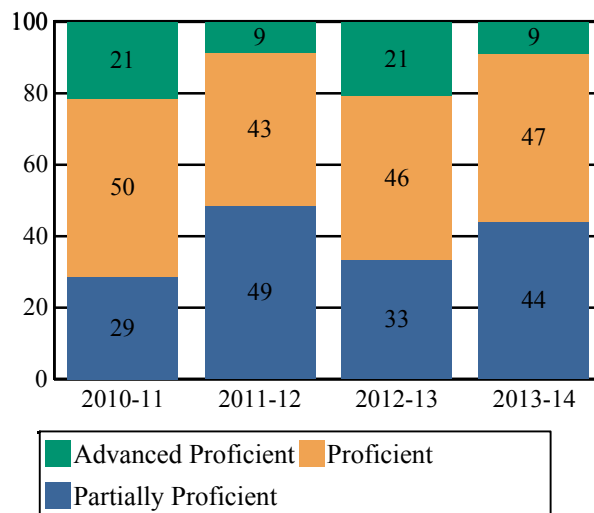

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Students in both elementary and middle schools begin to demonstrate college readiness behaviors long before they even enter high school. Among the behaviors that research has shown to be indicative of success and college and career readiness are regularly attending school and challenging themselves with rigorous course work. The table presents the percentage of students who were chronically absent during the prior school year. 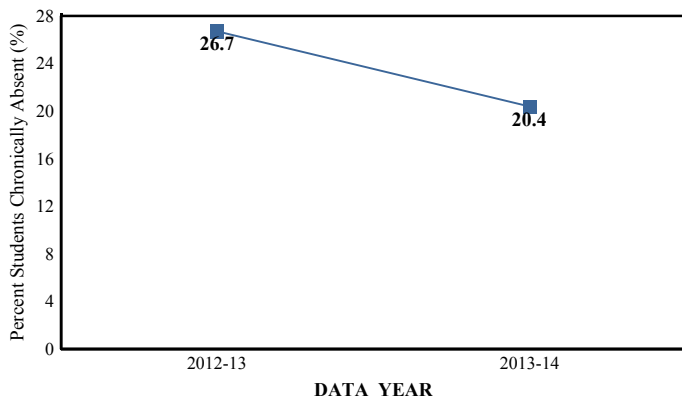

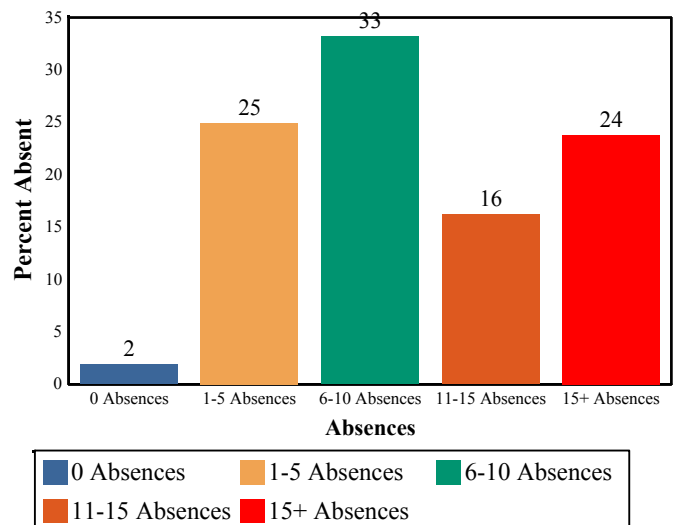
Chronic Absenteeism Trend

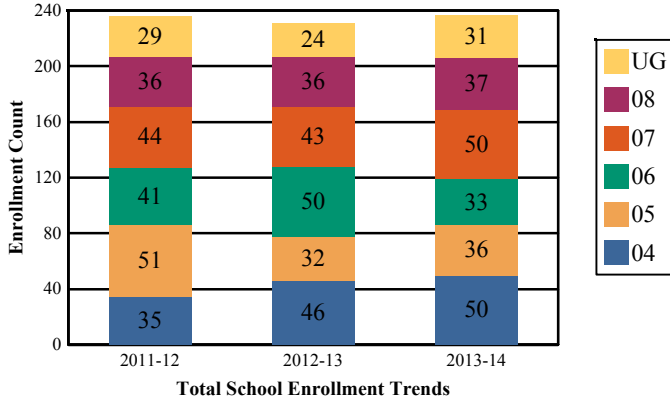

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.

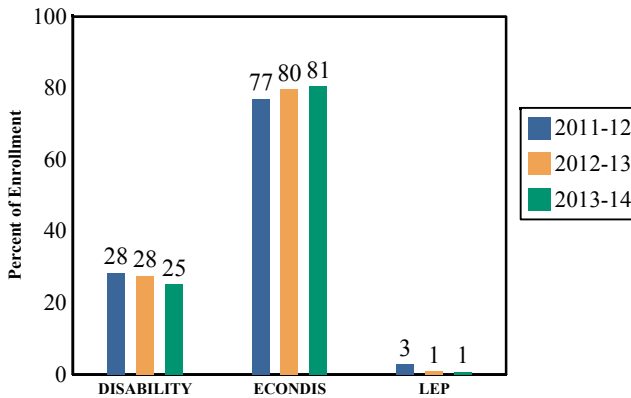


Total School Enrollment Trends

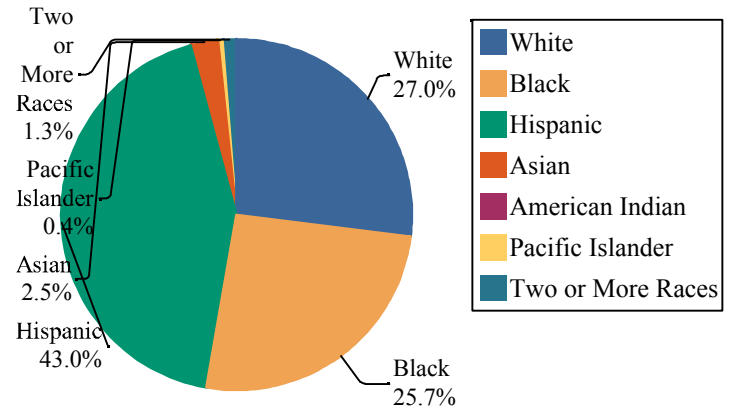

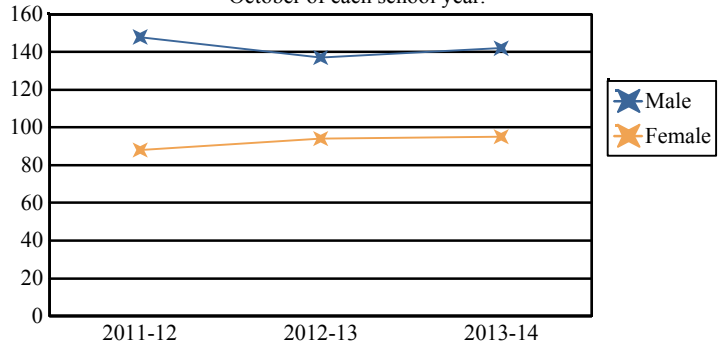

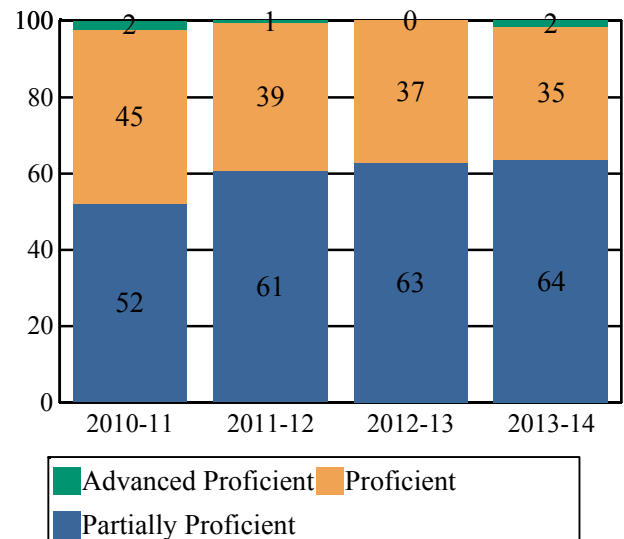

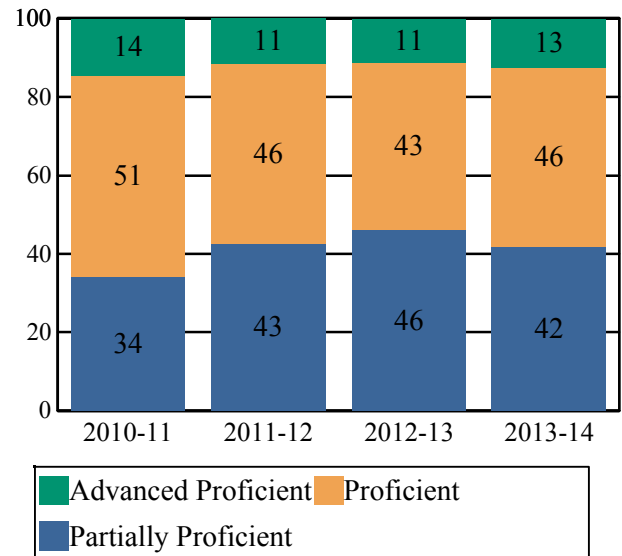

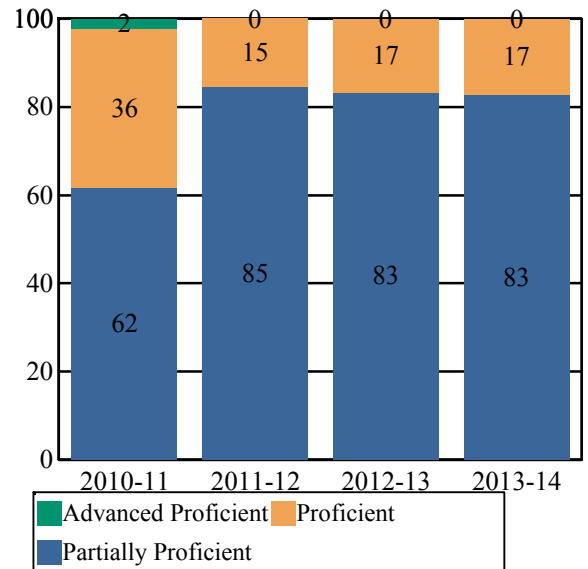

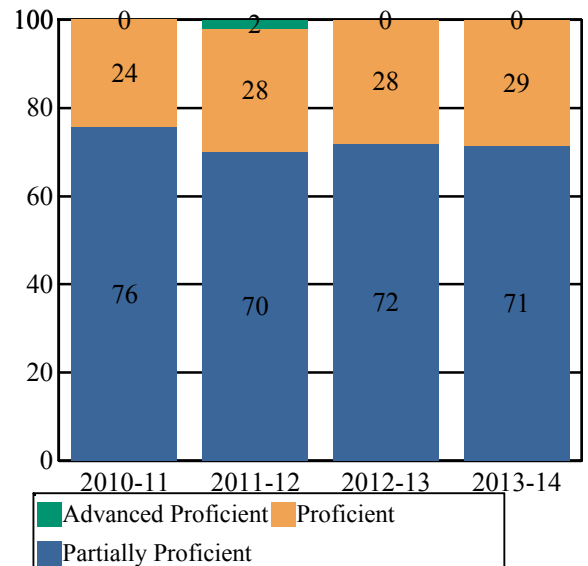

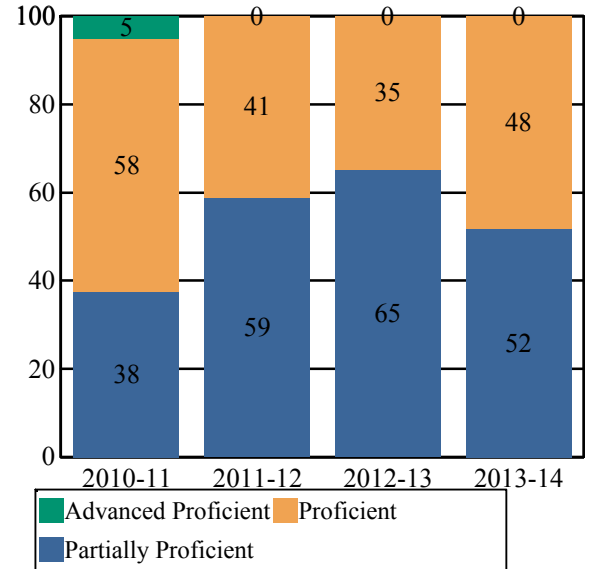

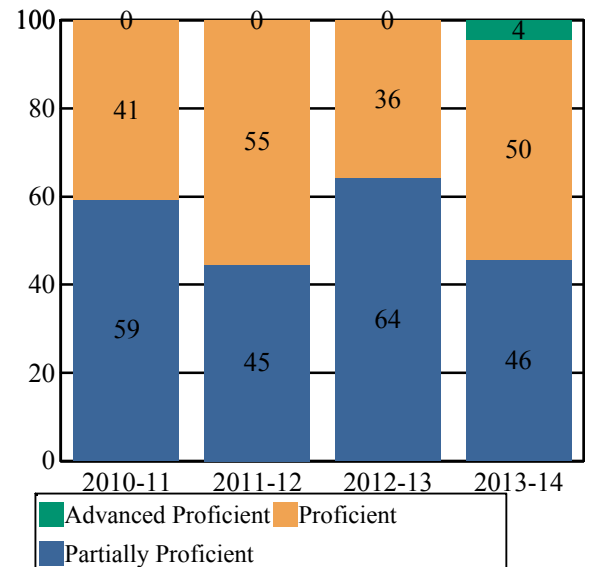

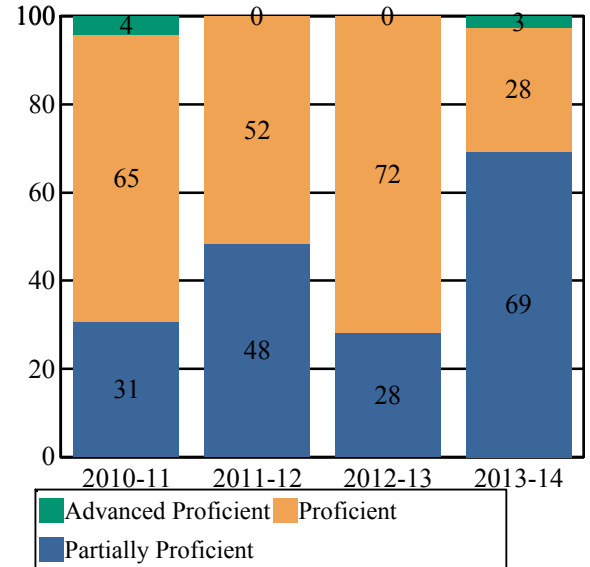

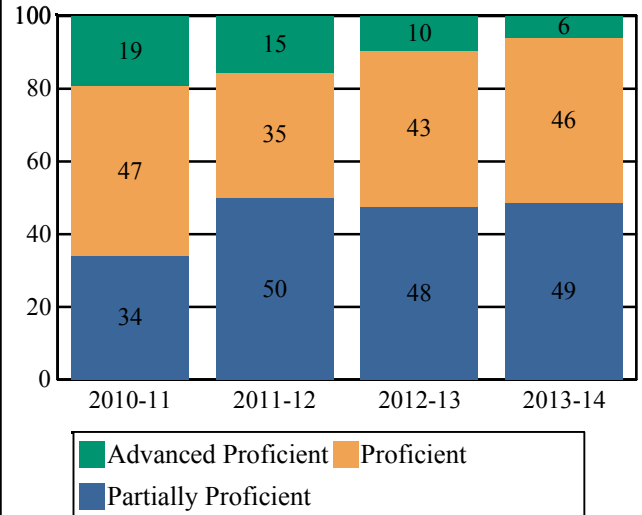

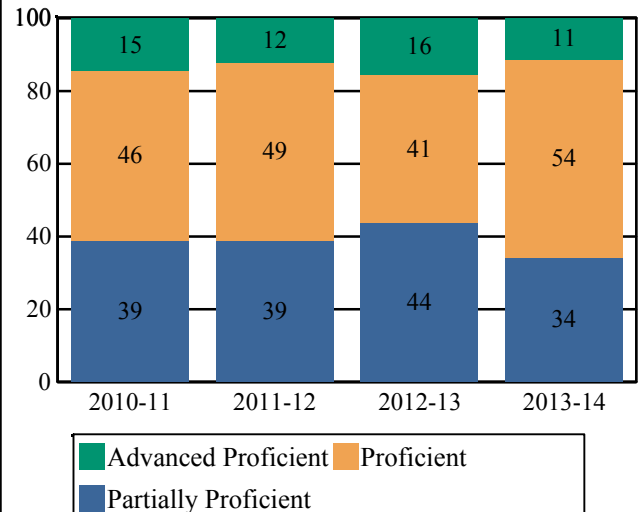

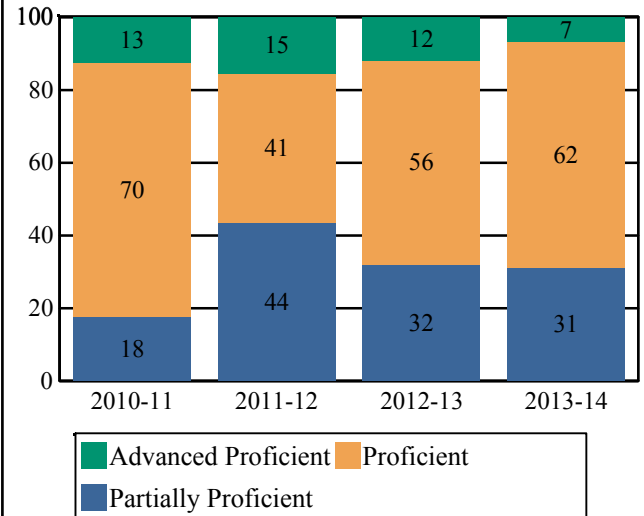

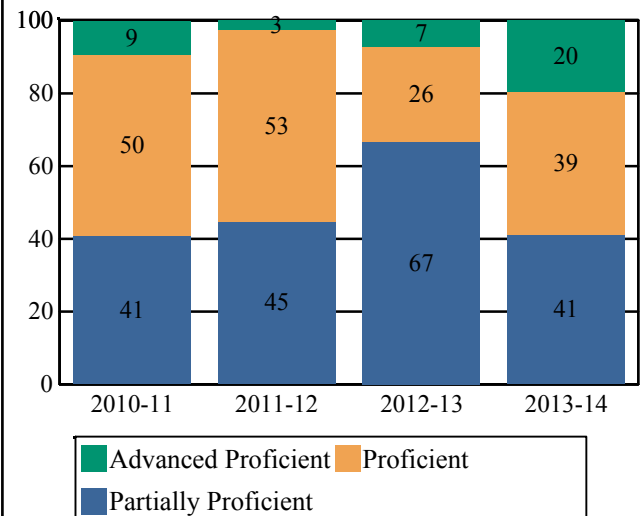

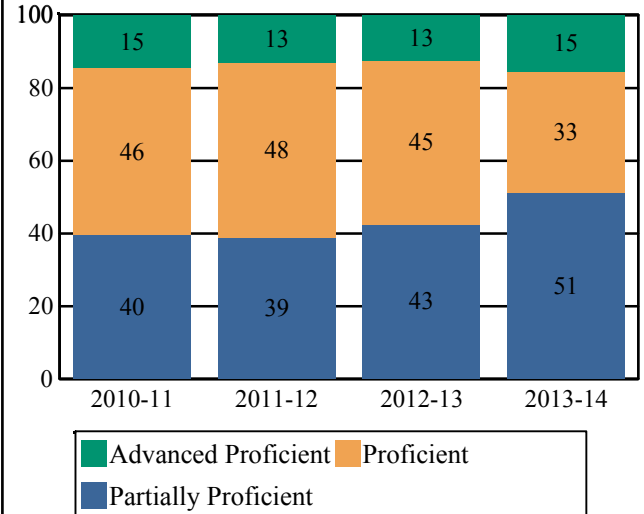

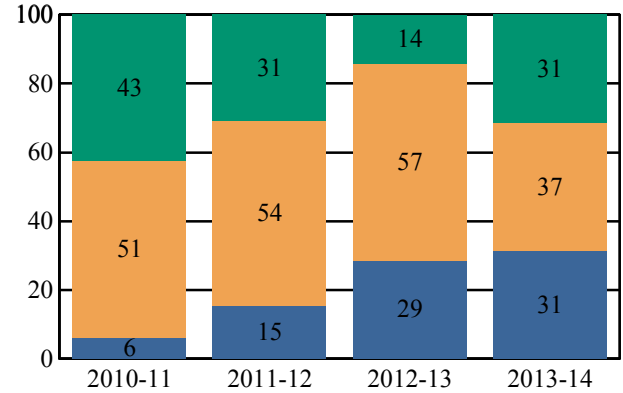

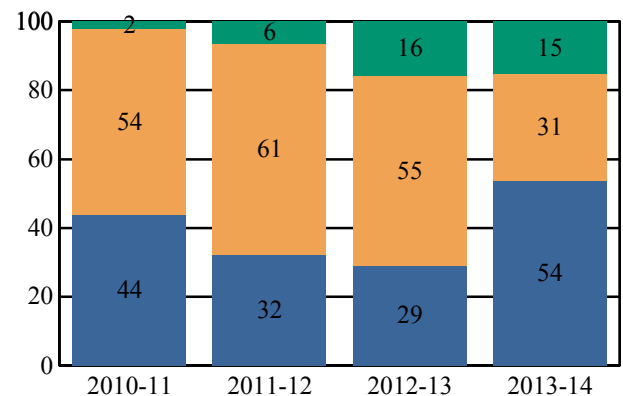

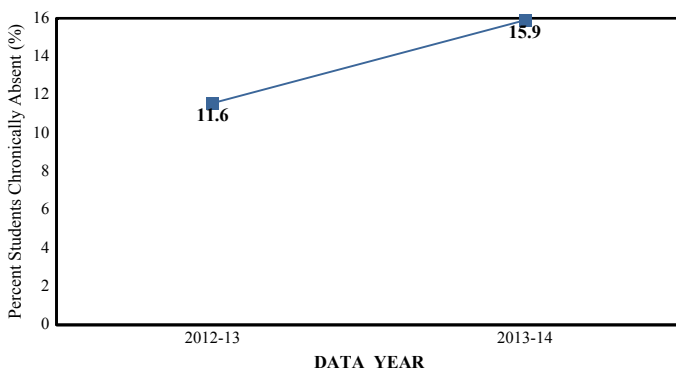

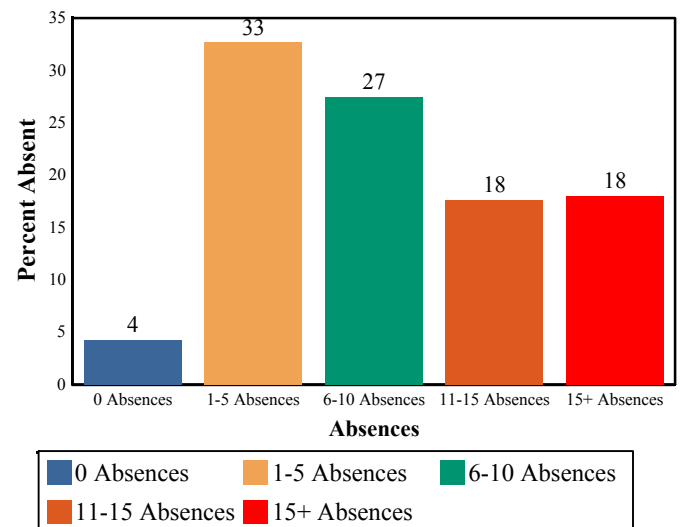
