

Would a Workforce Development Board be eligible to apply to this opportunity as a nonprofit organization?

Yes, a Workforce Development Board would be eligible to apply as a nonprofit organization if they are a 501(c)(3) or (c)(4) nonprofit organization.

Can an applicant request funding for the purpose of strategic planning to help develop future programs that will advance the goals of this NOFO and the State's Green Jobs for a Sustainable Future plan?

No, eligible projects are those that are scalable and include direct services and supports in alignment with the [Green Jobs for a Sustainable Future](#) report.

Can a vocational school serving high school students that offers some post-secondary training programs apply to this grant as a lead applicant?

Yes, if the vocational school is within an eligible category listed on page 5 and 6 of the NOFA. Which includes:

- A local government unit, including boards, commissions, redevelopment authorities, municipalities and counties;
- A nonprofit organization recognized by the Internal Revenue Service under Section 501(c)(3) or (c)(4) of the Internal Revenue Code incorporated and in good standing in the State of New Jersey;
- A college or university;
- Private entities that provide skills-based training in the green economy, including labor unions (The green economy as defined in the Green Jobs for a Sustainable Future report);
- Private entities that provide supportive and wrap-around services; and
- Private sector employers in the green economy.
