#### **Academic Achievement**

Additionally, this school is meeting N/A of its performance targets in the area of Academic Achievement.



Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. 

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




**Total School Enrollment Trends**




#### Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup




#### **Chronic Absenteeism Trend**
