Academic Achievement measures the content knowledge students have in language arts literacy and math. For high schools, this includes measures of the school's proficiency rate on both the Language Arts Literacy and Math sections of the New Jersey High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA). A proficiency rate is calculated by summing the count of students who scored either proficient or advanced proficient on the assessment and dividing by the count of valid test scores.

College and Career Readiness

This school outperforms 39% of schools statewide as noted by its statewide percentile and 25% of schools educating students with similar demographic characteristics as noted in its peer school percentile in the performance area of College and Career Readiness. Additionally, this school is meeting 20% of its performance targets in the area of College and Career Readiness.



College and Career Readiness measures the degree to which students are demonstrating behaviors that are indicative of future attendance and/or success in college and careers. 

This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup






Proficiency Trends - Math



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


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Graduation Pathway Rates





This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends












NJASK Proficiency Trends - Language Arts Literacy -Grade Level - 05












Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup












NJASK Proficiency Trends - Math - Grade Level - 03






Chronic Absenteeism Trend



This graph presents the count of students who were 'on roll' by grade in October of each school year.




Total School Enrollment Trends




Enrollment by Ethnic/Racial Subgroup


















Chronic Absenteeism Trend
