Regional Focus: Central Jersey

Data and analysis for the Middlesex-Monmouth-Ocean and Trenton labor areas

(Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth and Ocean counties)

Central Region Leads Statewide Job Growth

Nonfarm employment in the Central Region totaled 1,219,900 in June 2018, a gain of 19,700 jobs or 1.6 percent from the same month a year ago. Jobholding statewide increased at a slightly slower pace over the year (+1.3%). The Central Region contributed the most to New Jersey's employment increase; jobholding was up by 12,500 in the Southern Region and 4,800 in the Northern Region.

Employment growth in the Central Region was concentrated in the service-providing sectors. The most significant job gains were posted in trade, transportation and utilities (+7,000 or +2.8%), education and health services (+5,700 or +2.8%), leisure and hospitality (+5,100 or +4.4%), and professional and business services (+5,000 or +2.5%). Jobholding in construction (-3,200 or -6.9%), manufacturing (-1,000 or -1.8%), information (-800 or -3.5%) and financial activities (-300 or -0.5%) was down over the year.

The state posted significant job gains in the trade, transportation and utilities (\pm 18,700 or \pm 2.1%), professional and business services (\pm 18,300 or \pm 2.7%), education and health services (\pm 13,100 or \pm 1.9%), manufacturing (\pm 8,000 or \pm 3.2%) and the leisure and hospitality (\pm 4,300 or \pm 1.0%) sectors. Trade, transportation and utilities was up due to an increase in warehousing and storage (\pm 13,200 or \pm 27.5%). Amazon's expanding presence in the state is one contributor to the job gain in this industry. Advances in professional and business services were aided by gains in the administrative and support services (\pm 16,200 or \pm 5.5%) industry. Construction (\pm 5,00 or \pm 3.1%), financial activities (\pm 2,400 or \pm 0.9%) and information (\pm 1,000 or \pm 1.4%) shed jobs over the year.

Trenton Labor Area Gains Outpace Middlesex-Monmouth-Ocean

Employment gains occurred in both of the region's labor areas over the year. The

Trenton Labor Area expanded jobholding by 2.5 percent (+6,800) while the Middlesex-Monmouth-Ocean Labor Area added jobs at a rate of 1.4 percent (+12,900).

In the Trenton Labor Area, the job growth leader was professional and business services which posted a gain of 2,700 jobs or 6.2 percent. Increases in professional, scientific and technical services (+1,700 or +6.9%) and administrative, support, waste management and remediation services (+1,400 or +9.3%) contributed to employment growth in the sector.

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







Trade, transportation and utilities (+1,400 or +3.6%) was up from the same month a year ago due largely to an increase of 1,300 jobs or 11.4 percent in transportation, warehousing and utilities. Leisure and hospitality (+700 or +4.2%), construction (+400 or +7.5%), manufacturing (+400 or +4.7%), financial activities (+300 or +1.6%), other services (+300 or +2.9%), and education and health services (+200 or +0.4%) also posted gains. Jobholding in information (-300 or -5.5%) was down over the year.

In the Middlesex-Monmouth-Ocean Labor Area, trade, transportation and utilities (+5,600 or +2.7%) and education and health services (+5,500 or +3.6%) added the most jobs over the year. In trade, transportation and utilities increases in transportation, warehousing and utilities (+6,000 or +12.5%) and retail trade (+900 or +0.8%) offset a reduction in wholesale trade (-1,300 or -2.7%). Employment growth in education and health services was concentrated in health care and social assistance (+4,100 or +3.1%). The largest jobs contractions occurred in construction (-3,600 or -8.8%) and manufacturing (-1,400 or -3.0%).








LABOR FORCE DATA

- In June 2018 the Central Region had a not seasonally adjusted unemployment rate of 4.0 percent, down slightly from a June 2017 rate of 4.2 percent. In comparison, the region's June 2018 rate was lower than the statewide unadjusted rate of 4.3 percent.
- By county, the June 2018 unemployment rates in the region were:
 Monmouth at 3.8 percent, Mercer at 3.9 percent, Middlesex at 3.9 percent, and Ocean at 4.3 percent.



During the second quarter of 2018, there were 41,157 residents claiming unemployment insurance benefits in the Central Region, a figure which represented 25.2 percent of the claimants statewide. The region's claims activity was down by 1,957 claims or 4.5 percent from the same quarter a year ago. Statewide, claims activity declined by 9,971 or 5.8 percent since the second quarter of 2017.



During the second quarter of 2018, Central Region employers in the educational services hospitals, professional, scientific and technical services, food services and drinking places, and chemical manufacturing exhibited the most labor demand based on online job listing activity.

Concentrated in Middlesex and Mercer counties, employers indicated they were interested in filling positions for software developers, registered nurses, retail salespersons, wholesale sales representatives, and tractor trailer drivers. Skills that were actively sought by area employers included customer service, sales, scheduling, project management, and budgeting.

Of those job listings for which educational requirements are advertised, 36.0 percent require only high school or vocational training.
