Gale, A Cengage Company Financial Development Award Application Open

Applications are open for the American Library Association's Gale, A Cengage Company Financial Development Award. This annual award consists of \$2,500 and a 24k gold-framed citation presented to a library organization to recognize an innovative, creative and well-organized project that successfully developed income from alternative sources. The alternative sources may include, but are not limited to: individual gifts, foundations, endowments, "challenge" grants and related efforts. Any public, school or academic library is eligible to apply. The [application](#) deadline is Feb. 1, 2020.

Libraries Transform Communities Engagement Grant Application Open

The American Library Association is accepting applications for the Libraries Transform Communities Engagement Grant. The grant provides support for a school, public, academic, tribal or special libraries to expand their community engagement efforts. One library will be selected to receive \$2,000. The grant period may be one to two years in length. The [application](#) deadline is Feb. 3, 2020.

Grants for Arts Projects Application Open

Application information is available for the National Endowment for the Arts's Grants for Arts Projects category. Through project-based funding, NEA supports public engagement with, and access to, various forms of excellent art across the nation, the creation of art that meets the highest standards of excellence, learning in the arts at all stages of life and the integration of the arts into the fabric of community life. Project disciplines include Literary Arts, Folk & Traditional Arts and Music, among others. Matching grants range in amounts from \$10,000 to \$100,000. The [application](#) deadline is Feb. 13, 2020.

Miss Rumphius Award Application Open

The New Jersey Center for the Book seeks nominations for its 2020 Miss Rumphius Award. Based on the title character of Barbara Cooney's book, Miss Rumphius, winner of the National Book Award in 1983, this award honors public librarians, school media specialists, and educators who are exemplary in spreading ideas about literacy.
