To His Excellency, Joseph D. Bedle, Governor and Commander-in-Chief:

SIR:—Agreeably to the provisions of “An Act for the organization of the National Guard of the State of New Jersey, making it the duty of the Quartermaster General to report annually to the Commander-in-Chief, the number and condition of the arms and equipments belonging to the state; the number loaned out; in whose hands, and whether they remain under proper responsibilities, including in said return all camp equipage in his charge,” I have the honor to transmit my report, showing the number and condition of the same in the State Arsenal, on the thirty-first day of October, eighteen hundred and seventy-five, together with the issues of arms and equipments to uniform companies, and the receipts from all sources, at the Arsenal, since the date of my last annual report. The daily routine business of the office, during the year, has been transacted as promptly, considering the nature of the business, as it has been possible to perform it.

ARMS IN THE STATE ARSENAL.

The whole number of arms, serviceable and unserviceable, in the Arsenal, is seventeen thousand nine hundred and eighty-six. A detailed statement of the character and kind, will be found in the appendix, Statement A.

ISSUES.

There have been issued from the Arsenal, for the use of the uniformed companies of the National Guard, upon requisition and bond, pursuant to the statute, nine hundred and sixty-eight stand

of arms Seventeen companies of the National Guard have been armed with the Springfield rifles, calibre 45, breech loaders. For a detailed statement, showing the companies to which these arms have been distributed, you are respectfully referred to Statement E, in the Appendix.

RECEIPTS.

There have been turned into the Arsenal during the past year, one thousand one hundred and ninety-six arms. For a particular statement, showing from whom these arms were received, you are respectfully referred to Statement D, in the Appendix.

ANNUAL RETURNS.

It is gratifying to report the fact that sixty-eight out of seventy-one uniform companies, troops and batteries of the National Guard, furnished with public arms and accoutrements, have made returns to this office. Printed forms of returns, with the law annexed, requiring reports to be made annually to the Quartermaster General, were forwarded to all the companies, through the respective regimental and battalion headquarters. They are, therefore, informed and reminded of their obligation, and cannot offer the plea of either ignorance of the law, or forgetfulness in excuse for their failure.

The three delinquent organizations were :

Company C, 4th Regiment, Jersey City.

Company D, 7th Regiment, Trenton.

Battery B, Camden.

It is made the duty of the Quartermaster General to compare the number and condition of the arms in possession of companies, with the number actually loaned out, and if the number does not fully appear on the respective returns, or their good condition is not manifest, or upon failure to make returns, he is directed, as soon as may be, to cause the said public arms to be returned to the Arsenal. The returns from the respective companies, as required by law, are more complete than in previous years. The whole number of muskets and rifles loaned out and in possession of the National Guard is three thousand seven hundred and eighty.

THE NATIONAL GUARD.

The importance of a well organized, armed, disciplined, and efficient militia force is appreciated, and receives from the legislature the care and attention necessary to keep it in good condition, to meet all the exigencies which may arise. The National Guard consists of two brigades, divided into eight regiments and two battalions of infantry, two batteries of artillery, and two troops of

of cavalry; also, one regiment of colored infantry, unassigned. A comparison of the returns made by the several companies is herewith presented, showing the number of arms charged against each, and the number reported on hand, and their condition on the 1st day of December, 1874:

EXPENSES ON ACCOUNT OF MILITIA.

In the Appendix, you will find a statement of the amount paid by the State Treasurer, on account of the state militia, from November 1st, 1874, to October 31st, 1875. The total amount paid by the State Treasurer is \$44,725.22.

Appropriation for armory rent, &c., by act of the legislature, approved March 9th, 1869, \$31,249.18.

Arms, accoutrements, and camp and garrison equipage, \$8,249.10.

Current expenses of militia, for 1875, \$5,226.94.

By a comparison with the expenses of the preceding year, it will be seen that they have been reduced to the extent of thirty-two thousand three hundred and forty-one dollars and thirteen cents, while the current expenses of the militia have been reduced ten thousand three hundred and five dollars and eighty-eight cents.

BREECH LOADERS.

On the fourth of January, the state received its first invoice of eight hundred Springfield rifles, calibre 45, on account of indebtedness of the United States, for quotas due the state under the act of Congress of 1808, appropriating two hundred thousand dollars for arming the militia. The entire amount of indebtedness payable in muskets, on this account, including the quota for the present year, amounting to forty-seven thousand three hundred and twenty-three dollars and ninety-four cents, was promised to be furnished as soon as "they could be got ready." This amount will produce about three thousand five hundred stand, and together with the amount of sixty-three thousand six hundred and eleven dollars and forty-five cents standing in the treasury of this state, to the credit of the State Arsenal, the proceeds from sales of unserviceable arms and equipments, the property of this state acquired by purchase, sold under the act approved April 17th, 1868, and to be specially applied to the purchase of ordnance and ordnance stores, is sufficient to re-arm the National Guard. The first issue of breech loaders was made on the eighteenth of February, to Company C, 3rd regiment, that company having previously returned the arms in its possession. Subsequently, the 7th and 6th regiments were re-armed, in compliance with special orders Nos. 8 and 10, Head Quarters, National Guard, state of New Jersey, dated April 12th, and May 18th, 1875, the entire instalments of eight hundred being in the hands of that portion of the National Guard.

In this connection, it is not improper to say that the amount now in the treasury of the United States, above referred to, is the accumulation of quotas for the last twenty years, since the undersigned, as Quartermaster General, took charge of this department, and it is due to great care, economy and foresight in the management of

this fund, as well as the amount in the treasury of this state, for furnishing the means to re-arm the militia with the most improved arm in use, without a charge of one dollar to the state treasury.

In the Appendix will be found a statement in detail of this accumulation, giving the amount of the annual quotas in muskets, and the amount drawn from the general government annually, on that account, from the year 1854 to 1875.

WAR CLAIMS.

On the 6th of January, after making repeated efforts to obtain a re-examination of the suspended and disallowed war claims, I determined to send for Doctor Trimble, claim agent in Washington, to come immediately to Trenton, for the purpose of conferring with him, and obtain his opinion of the explanations, and arguments necessary to secure a favorable decision on the adverse ruling of the department, and the probable amount that would be allowed to the state on her war claims.

He reached this place on the thirteenth of January, and materially assisted in the preparation of explanations and arguments to the suspended and disallowed vouchers.

On the sixteenth of February, full explanations of the first to the sixteenth instalments were forwarded to Washington, and were immediately placed in the hands of the proper accounting officers of the treasury, who, upon examination, allowed a special settlement of ten thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine dollars and twenty cents, which amount was forwarded on the 10th day of August, by a draft, payable to your Excellency.

The balance still claimed at this date is twenty-two thousand and twenty-one dollars and ninety-two cents.

Statement H, ammunition expended in firing salutes, during the year.
