## AIRMEN AND FOURTH GRADERS BRING HOLIDAYS TO VETS

THIS TIME OF THE YEAR, THE RESIDENTS AT THE NEW JERSEY VETERANS MEMORIAL HOME IN VINELAND GET A SPECIAL VISIT.

ND, NOT FROM SANTA CLAUS.

EVERY YEAR, FOR THE LAST 16 YEARS, AIRMEN FROM THE 177TH FIGHTER WING, NEW JERSEY AIR NATIONAL GUARD, TEAM UP WITH FOURTH GRADERS FROM SEAVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN LINWOOD, N.J., TO BRING THE HOLIDAY SPIRIT TO THE VINELAND HOME RESIDENTS.

THIS YEAR WAS NO DIFFERENT ON DEC. 13, 2016, 18 AIRMEN AND MORE THAN 80 GRADE SCHOOLERS SANG CAROLS AND PASSED OUT CARDS TO THE HOME'S RESIDENTS DURING THE 16TH ANNUAL HOLIDAY "SONGFEST." IT ALSO GAVE THEM THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONNECT WITH VETERANS WHO HELPED SHAPE THIS NATION'S HISTORY.

THE VINELAND RESIDENTS ARE A MIXTURE OF VETERANS FROM WORLD WAR II, THE KOREAN AND VIETNAM WARS, AS WELL AS OPERATIONS' DESERT STORM/DESERT SHIELD AND VETERANS' SPOUSES.

"THESE VETERANS HAVE A LOT OF STORIES TO TELL; THEY HAVE DONE THINGS I NEVER DREAMED OF DOING, JUST LISTENING TO THEM IS AN EXPERIENCE," SAID STAFF SGT. EILER GOMEZ MEJIA, 177TH LOGISTICS READINESS SQUADRON AND JUNIOR ENLISTED COUNCIL PRESIDENT.

THAT WAS THE CASE FOR MASTER SGT. JAMIE NIEVES, 177TH CIVIL ENGINEER SQUADRON, ALONG WITH 227TH AIR SUPPORT OPERATIONS SQUADRON MEMBERS TECH. SGTS. STEVEN HASKINS AND KANE LAWLOR, STAFF SGT. HARRY NIEVES, AND AIRMAN 1ST CLASS JOHN CUCCI, WHEN THEY MET RESIDENT

#### AND WORLD WAR II ARMY VETERAN, ED LEHENY.

LEHENY, WHO IS 95, SHARED WITH THEM HIS STORY About how he met his brother, Led, on christmas day during the battle of the bulge. Leheny had not seen his brother since the war began.

THE STORY HAD APPEARED IN THE MAGAZINE VETERAN JOURNAL AND HAD PHOTOS OF ED AND LEO IN THEIR UNIFORMS. THE FACT THAT NIEVES, HASKINS, LAWLOR, AND CUCCI WERE CLOSE TO THE SAME AGE AS THE TWO BROTHERS IN THE PHOTOS WAS CERTAINLY NOT LOST ON THEM; IT ALSO GAVE THEM A DIFFERENT PERSPECTIVE ABOUT CHRISTMAS.

"MY FAMILY IS FROM ALSACE LORRAINE," SAID NIEVES. Alsace lorraine was the site of some of the Heaviest fighting during the battle of the bulge.

AS IN YEARS' PAST, THE AIRMEN AND THE FOURTH GRADERS DIVIDED UP INTO GROUPS AND TRAVELLED THROUGHOUT THE HOME SINGING CAROLS AND PASSING OUT CARDS TO THE RESIDENTS.

"WE MET AT SEAVIEW; WE PICKED UP THE KIDS' DONATIONS AND BROUGHT THEM HERE, AND NOW We're going to sing some carols and hand out some cards," said staff sgt. Stacey Lazaro, 177th Logistics Readiness Squadron.

LAZARO, THE 177TH JUNIOR ENLISTED Council's vice president, was in charge of coordinating this year's event.

"THE 177TH IS DONATING \$200 TO ONE OF THE (HOME'S) ONGOING FUNDS, WHICH PROVIDES MONEY FOR THE VETERANS TO ATTEND SPORTING AND ENTERTAINMENT EVENTS," SAID LAZARD.

"I THINK IT'S A GREAT CAUSE," SAID GOMEZ MEJIA. "THIS IS THE OPPORTUNITY TO GIVE THEM Something back for their service."

# NJNG & ROWAN U. Perfect together

Arlington, Va. -- It's no secret that the partnership between the New Jersey National Guard and Rowan University has saved taxpayers millions of dollars and provided coveted real-world experience to bright college students.

Now, the program is getting national recognition.

At a ceremony in the Pentagon's Hall of Heroes on Tuesday, Under Secretary of the Army Patrick Murphy and Lt. Gen. Gwen Bingham recognized New Jersey and Rowan for forming one of the five best Army community partnerships in the nation.

"We are very proud of your efforts," Murphy said. "When we're asked to do more with less, the successful path forward is with partnerships like yours."

The Guard-Rowan partnership began seven years ago with an affiliation the university's nationally-recognized geographic information systems (GIS) program, a move that has yielded more than \$1.5 million in federal reimbursements for facilities upkeep, and now includes use of interns for audits of energy and water use as well as for wildlife management. Savings from those programs has exceeded \$300,000.

"There are so few qualified energy auditors at the moment and great demand for the service, so we wouldn't be able to afford it without the interns," said Col. Mike Lyons, the New Jersey National Guard's construction and facility management officer.

"It is a benefit to the university and students because of this great demand," he added. "They have graduates going out into both the public and private sector with recent and relevant experience."

William Riddell, a civil engineering professor at Rowan University, said the intern program offers that real-world experience to both undergraduate and graduate students.

"The projects reflect all of the complexity and ambiguity students will face in practice," Riddell said.

Christopher Moore, a former intern who became the energy manager for the New Jersey Department of Military and Veterans Affairs Construction and Facilities Management Office, is living proof of the rewards offered by the internship program.

"I believe that helped me hit the ground running when taking my current position because I already knew a lot about the Guard and their unique energy challenges," he said of the program.

Maj. Jeanne Falchek, CW5 Thomas Comyack and Riddell accepted the award at the Pentagon ceremony.

The national recognition for the National Guard, DMAVA and Rowan did not end on Tuesday.

On Wednesday, the organizations were honored by the U.S. Department of Energy with the 2016 Federal Energy and Water Management Award at a ceremony in Washington, D.C.

Falchek, Moore, and Comyack accepted the award along with DMAVA employees Joan McClosky and Vernon Hicks and Sam Valentine of Rowan University.
