The artificial larynx device enables these individuals to produce speech and to communicate.

NJ DDHH Co-sponsors Deaf Fest 2015

On September 20, New Jersey Deaf Awareness Week (NJDAW) hosted the **13th Deaf Fest** at the Middlesex County Fairgrounds in East Brunswick, NJ. Hundreds descended on the fairgrounds to browse tables from video relay providers like Sorenson and Purple along with wireless provider Sprint Relay. Two tents were available for attendees to learn more about services such as addiction counseling, mental health services, employment, education and advocacy. New Jersey Association for the Deaf hosted a table and visitors could learn more about the **Domestic Violence Advocacy Project** in which NJ DDHH is a partner through the planning process. Vendors also were available to sell clothing, assistive devices, technology, and crafts. Under the main tent, a variety of entertainment captivated the audience.

NJ Division of the Deaf and Hard of Hearing had a booth with a representative answering questions about the equipment distribution program, advocacy, resources, technology, and other topics related to programs and services the division offers. In addition, NJ DDHH was one of several sponsors for the event and provided funding for provision of captioning and interpreters to allow the event to be accessible to all. The next Deaf Fest event will be held in 2017.

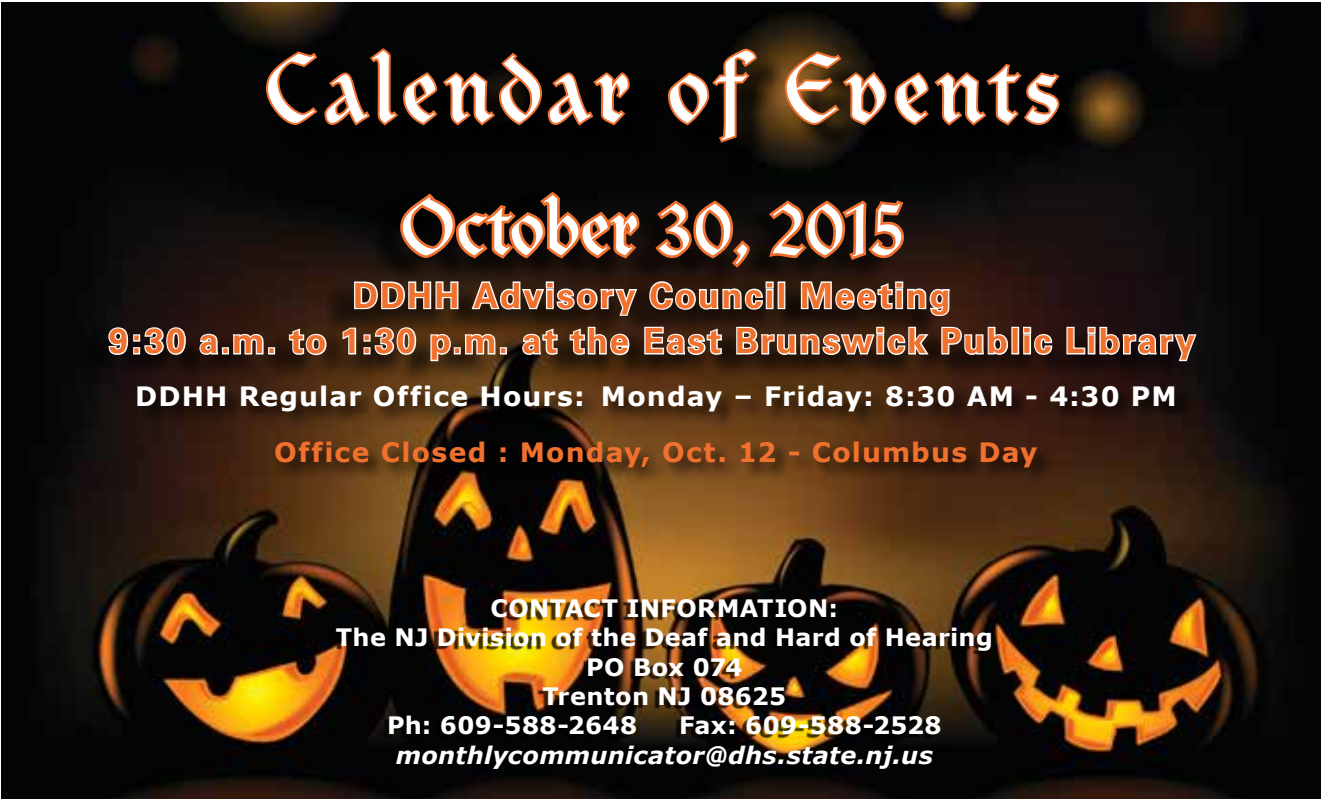
■ First-ever Joint Conference
