Airmen learn Soldiering skills

Fifty Airmen from the 177th volunteered to be members of the Air National Guard Quick Reaction Force (ANG QRF) capable of rapidly mobilizing in the event of a state emergency.

They have joined a select group of 100 Airmen - 50 from the 177th and 50 from the 108th Air Refueling Wing - ready to aid the citizens of the great state of New Jersey at a moment's notice.

These Airmen already bring skill sets unique to their "high-demand" AFSC's (Air Force Specialty Codes) such as civil engineering, security police and others. Now they will have basic knowledge of traditional "Soldiering" skills including clearing and securing a building.

The idea originated with Col. Ronald Alfors, Chief of Staff-Air, as an evolution of the extensive support the Air Guard has always provided in state emergencies. "We have always provided a specialized capability to state response by leveraging our members' AFSC training," stated Alfors. "If Airmen are needed to put boots on the ground for these other types of missions, they would go through a 72 hour just-in-time training program at the Joint Training and Training Development Center (JT2DC) before hitting the street."

While the doctrine and plans were in place for this eventuality, the scenario was never exercised. "This puts a core of 100 people through that just-in-time training up front, while still maintaining the ability to provide training to many more if needed."

Taking that vision to reality was a joint effort led by Lt. Col. Randolph Slaughter, Officer in Charge of Plans and Programs and Chief Master Sgt. Richard Bouffard, NCOIC of Plans and Programs on the Air side with Lt. Col. Brian Sharkey and Capt. Scott Hofstetter on the Army side. They worked with New Jersey's Joint Task Force Commander, Col. Stephen Hines, to identify ten core Military Support to Civilian Authorities (MSCA) tasks. Based on time and resources available to conduct the training, indoctrination into six of the ten was included in the syllabus for the basic course.

The actual training responsibility to make sure that the Air Guard team is ready fell to the NCOs of the first battalion of the 254th Regiment led by Sgt. 1st Class Paulo Amado. His team of instructors spent several months planning the curriculum leading up to the training exercise. Their expertise ensured that the ANG QRF is ready to respond to any MSCA event.

The first course was conducted on June 9-10. Fifty Airmen from the 108th Air Refueling Wing received hands-on training both in the classroom at the JT2DC and at the MOU (Military Operations on Urbanized Terrain) site at Range 12 on Fort Dix.

For the Jersey Devils the weekend was spent learning and practicing the skills thousands of their fellow guardsmen used in New Orleans after Katrina. The basics covered everything from patrolling streets to knowing what they can and cannot do when the situation gets desperate.

Much of the training they received this weekend is what they would need in any type of state response. They all remember the pictures of National Guardsmen conducting house-to-house searches in those areas of New Orleans devastated when the levees

Real world training

EXERCISE - Two New Jersey National Guard UH-60 Blackhawk Helicopters swooped in to deposit members of the Middlesex County Special Operations Reaction Team (SORT) right in the middle of the Rutgers New Brunswick campus. The SORT immediately fanned out and advanced on one of the student buildings. Gunshots follow.

Under different circumstances this would be the beginning of a frightening situation reminiscent of what took place at the University of West Virginia campus several months ago. But this was not a real hostage situation, just an exercise that involved numerous state and local law enforcement and emergency services agencies. The goal of the exercise was to solidify the cooperation between agencies which may be called upon to work together on short notice during a real terrorist threat.

"Our specialization in Homeland Security is providing support to law enforcement," explains Lt. Col. John Sheard of the New Jersey National Guard. "So primarily from the aircraft side of the house, [support] with the lift aircraft is to bring the Special Operations teams to a location so they can deploy more rapidly and with a show of force."

While transporting law enforcement reaction teams is important, knowing where to transport them is just as important.

"With the reconnaissance aircraft, we have the capability of taking photos from the air, day or night, video downlink technology, from the tactical side of the house, to vehicles at the site, and strategically, we can send that signal throughout the state, to the Adjutant General's office and to the New Jersey State Police office, which is where this all centralizes from," notes Sheard.

Helping to provide that signal is Chief Warrant Officer Jerry Steber of the 2-104th Service and Support Aviation Battalion. Steber, who manages the equipment that receives the video signal from the helicopter, has worked with law enforcement before. "Most of the law enforcement agencies that I've had a personal interface with really look to us for the support that they don't have," says Steber. "It's a definite asset for them as far as visual and electronic information being provided to the task force commanders and the command posts when they're doing these types of operations."

With the help of the New Jersey National Guard, this exercise ends well according to Detective Douglas Sprague, Deputy Task Force Commander of the SORT.

"We had information that there were three active shooters somewhere in the building, we assembled the SORT into 20-man assault teams, and we cleared four floors of the building and took the bad guys down outside the building."

All in all, a good day for the good guys, with a little help from the New Jersey National Guard.

Pilots gain survival training edge

Pilots from 119th Fighter Squadron held their water survival training at Six Flags Hurricane Harbor in Jackson on July 17.

United States Coast Guard water survival specialists along with the pilots trained at Hurricane Harbor because the wave pool gave a greater degree of realism to the training than what is afforded at a regular swimming pool.

This year's training included getting into the one-person life raft, swimming out from underneath a floating parachute (during World War II, more deaths were attributed to drowning while caught under a parachute in water than any other cause) and climbing inside a large life raft.

According to Operations Group Commander Col. Vyas Deshpande, the training was a success due to its realism based on the conditions the pilots would encounter if they were forced to parachute over a body of water.
