### THE NUMBERS DON'T LIE, THE LEGISLATURE MUST ACT ON SICK LEAVE REFORM

\$3.25 Billion	Minimum long-term cost to New Jersey taxpayers of the Democrats' current proposal of a \$7,500 s pay cap.
\$825 Million	Current value of accumulated sick and vacation payout liability for municipalities statewide.
\$74 Million	Estimated total accumulated Sick and Vacation Time owed to public workers in Jersey City alone.
\$43 Million	${\it Cost to New Jersey Taxpayers for Public Employee Sick Leave / Vacation Payouts in 2010 alone.}$
\$1.2 Million	Combined payout to 7 Elmwood Park police officers who retired last week.
\$54,000	Average payout to 700 state workers who received about \$40 million in 2010 for unused sick and vacation time according to a Times Of Trenton study.

\$1,330 Cost per property taxpayer in New Brunswick for accumulated payouts for public workers.

392 Days of legislative inaction since Governor Christie issued Conditional Veto.
