























# **Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: September 2015 - September 2016**




#### New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: September 2015 - September 2016






### New Jersey Employed Residents: Sept. 2015 - Sept. 2016




## **New Jersey Counties** Unemployment Rates - August 2016 (Preliminary, Not Seasonally Adjusted)







