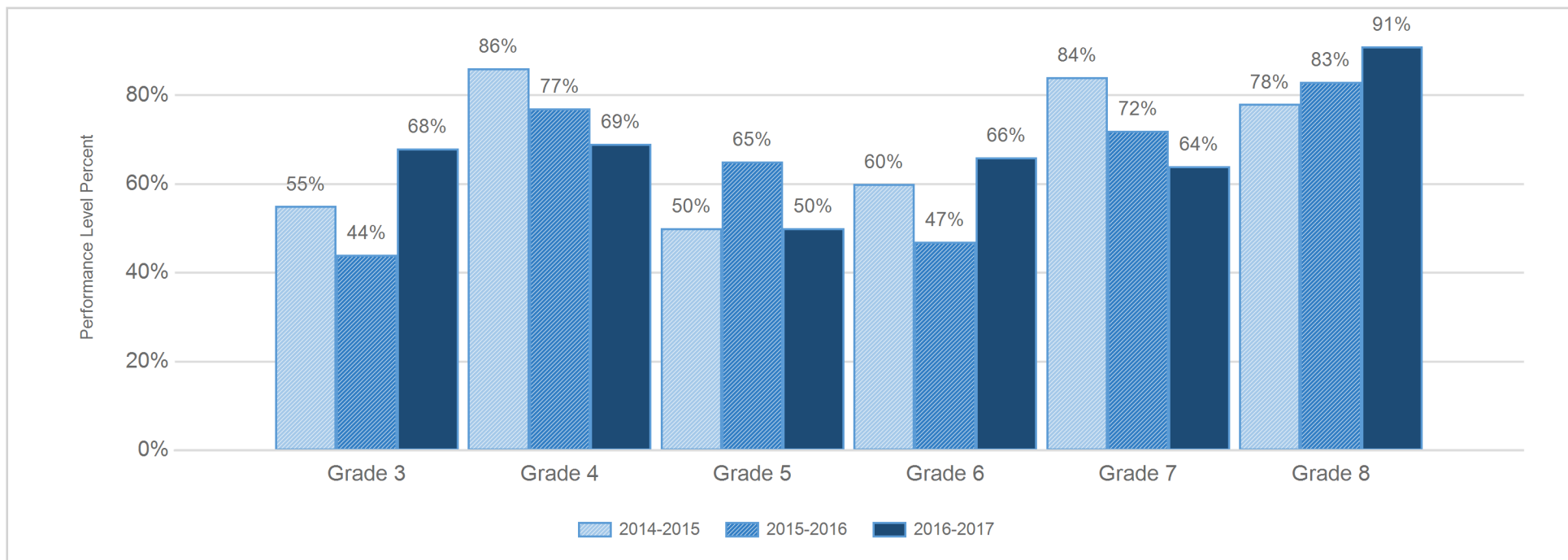

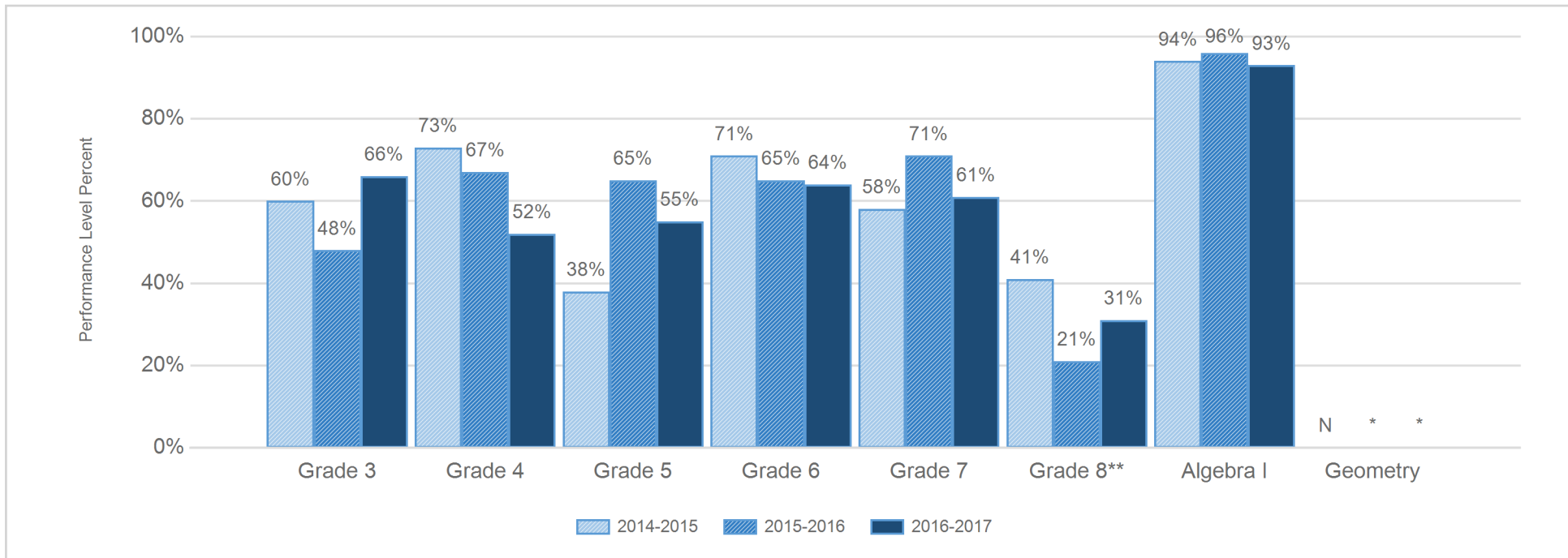

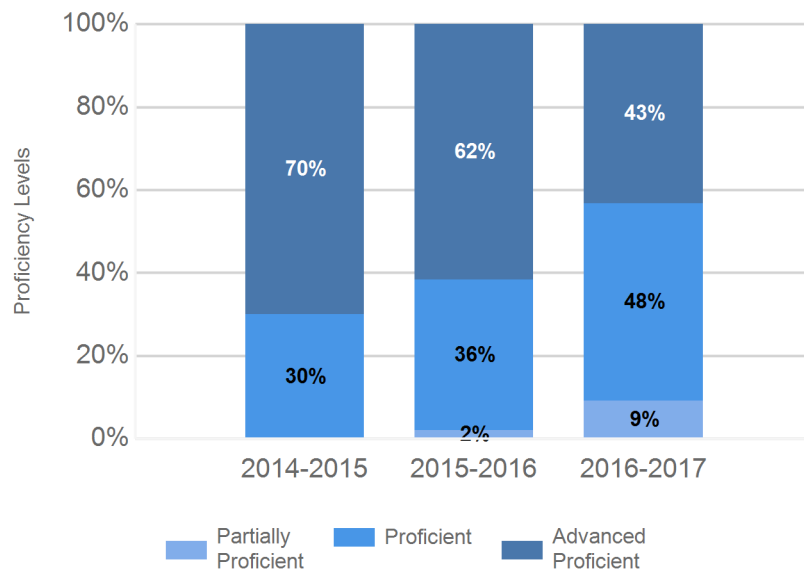

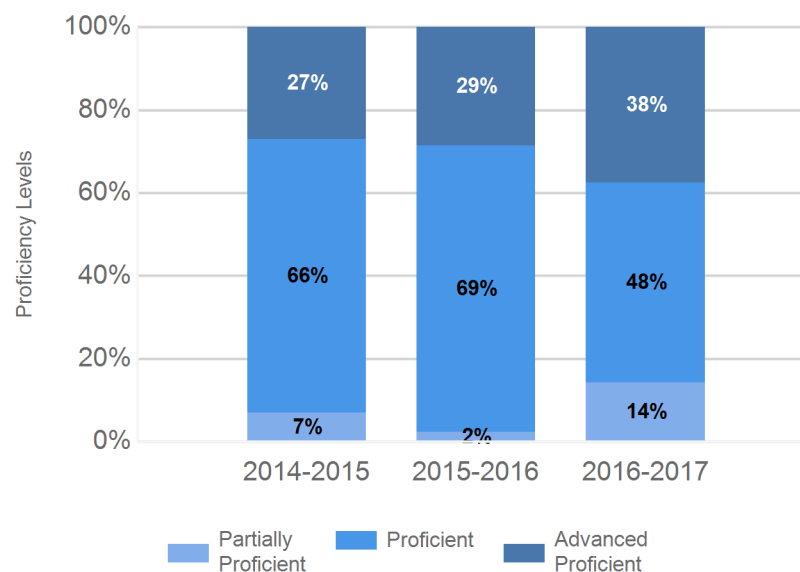

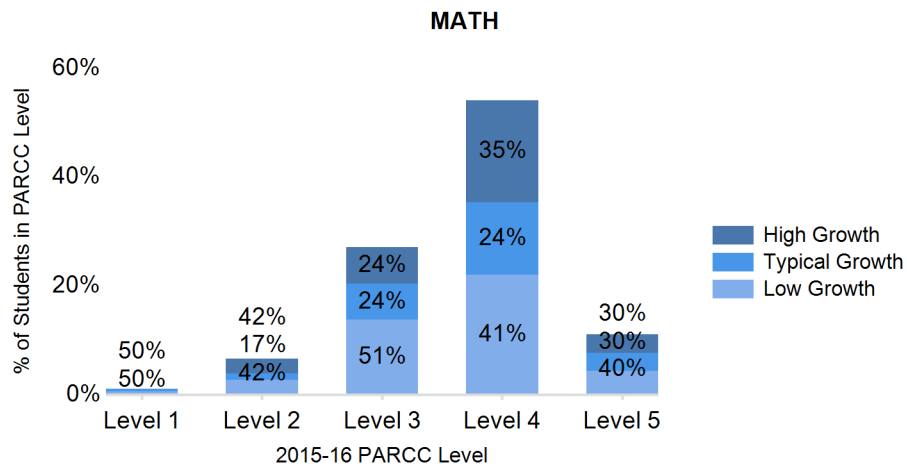
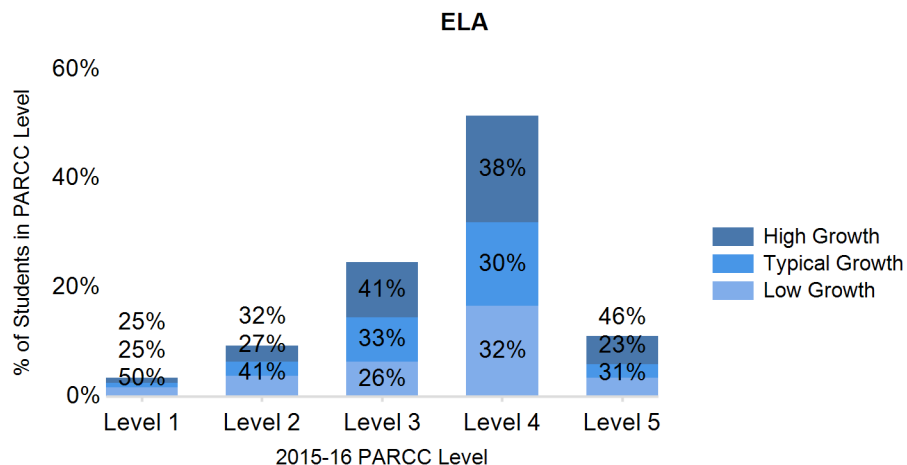

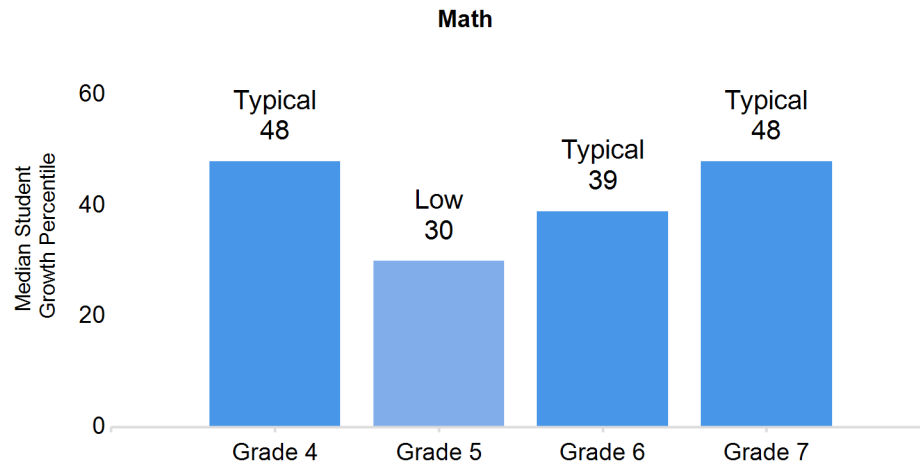
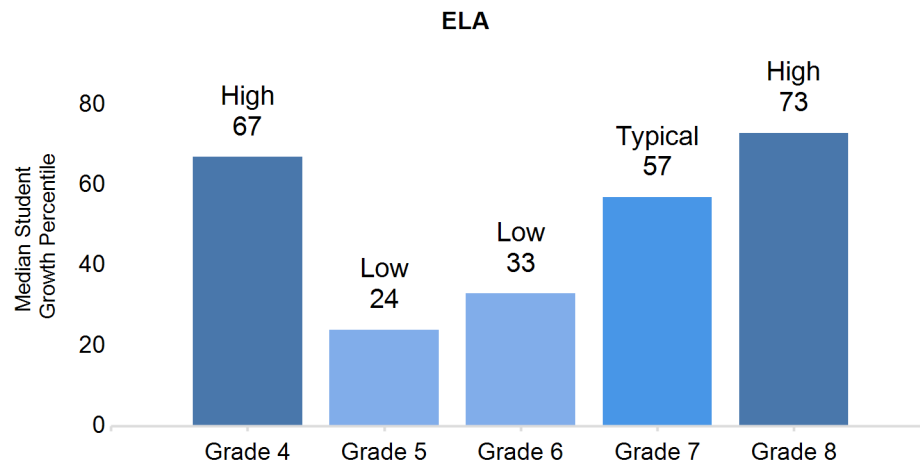

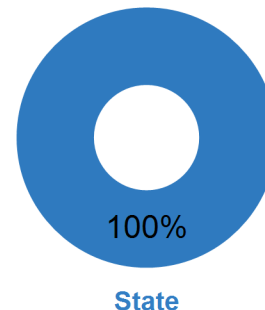
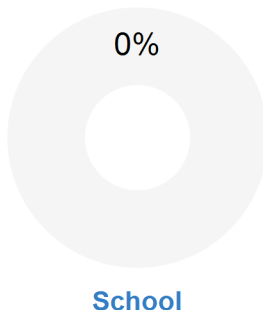

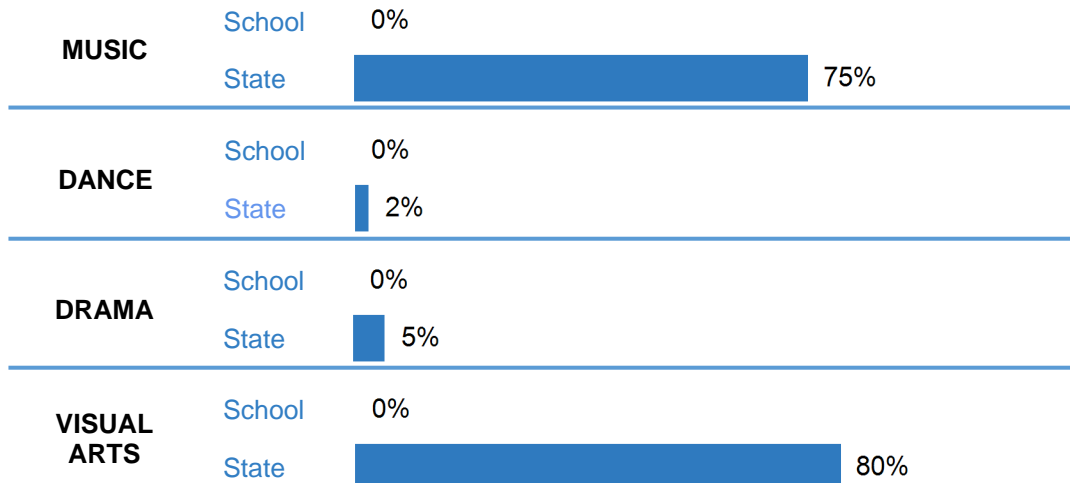

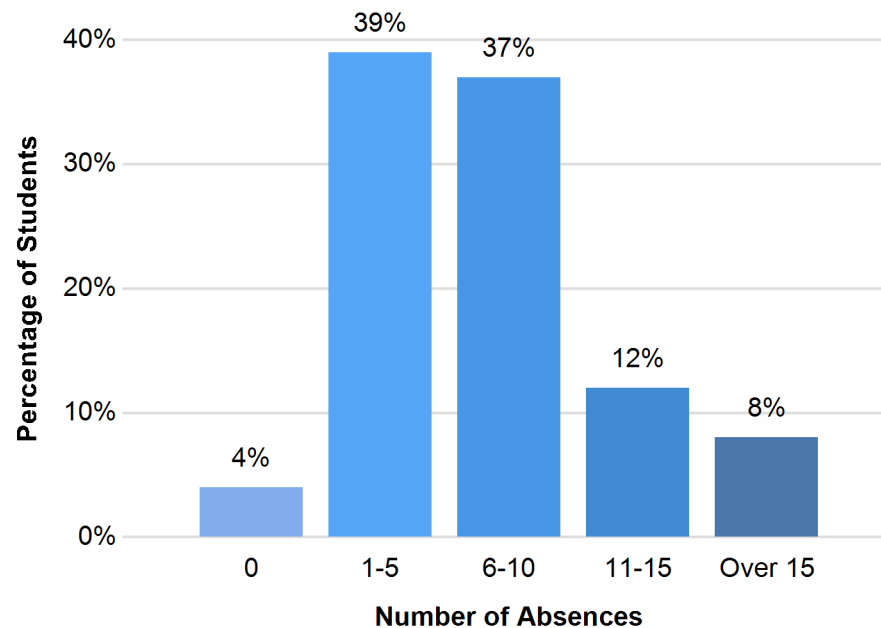

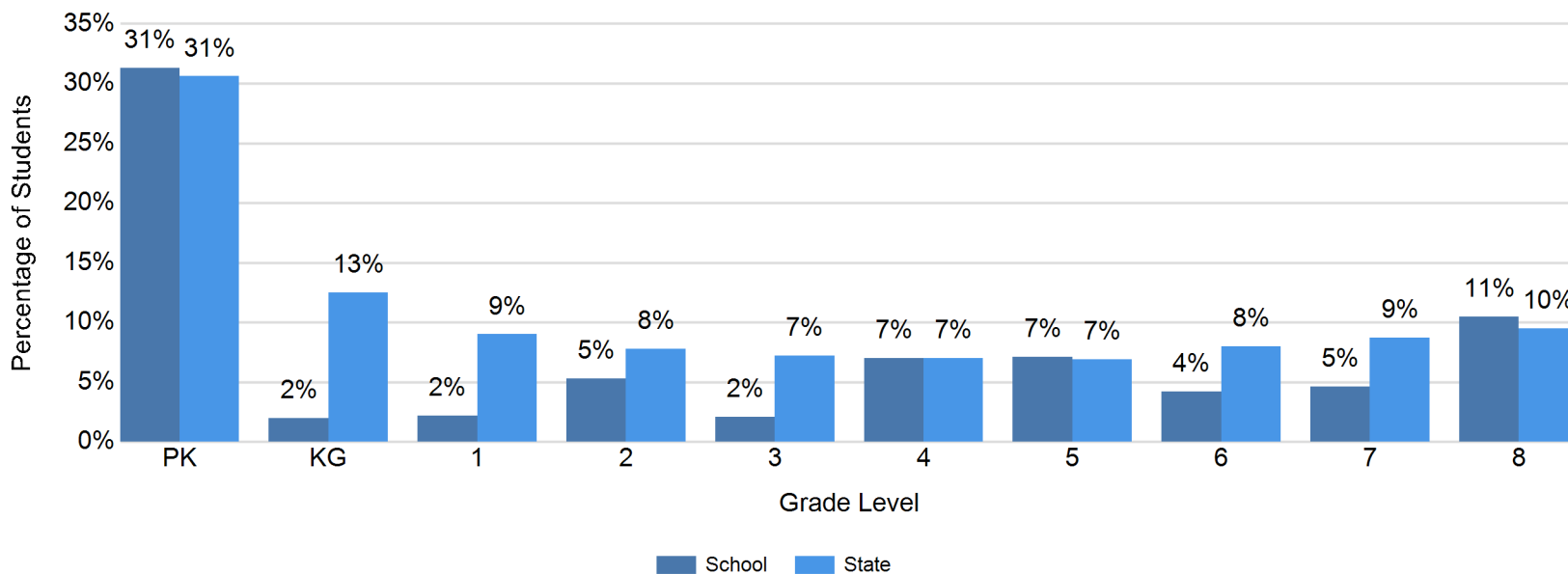

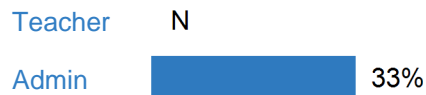

Other Information:

Clinton Public School has a long history of over 125 years of continuous operation. The present building is located on a 9.6-acre site situated at the crest of the School Street hill just east of Leigh Street in the Town of Clinton. The original frame building consisted of four rooms, which housed all eight grades and four years of high school. The school was remodeled and enlarged in 1910, and a drawing of that building is currently hanging in the main office of the school. A fire destroyed that building on Sunday, March 19, 1922, and the current brick structure was built and occupied by the Elementary and four-year High School in September 1924. Four additions have been added to the 1923 brick building. The 1963 wing includes our kitchen, All-Purpose Room and two classrooms. Our 1969 addition includes our library and eight classrooms, as well as several small offices. A third addition opened in 1995. It includes a full-sized gymnasium, an art room, a computer lab, a modern science lab, and several classrooms. Also in 1995, the school campus was wired for voice, data, and video. Television monitors, telephones with voice mail access, and a school-wide data network was added in 1996. Our final addition, completed in 2001, included the construction of five new classrooms, one renovated classroom, new front entrance/front office, renovated library, kitchen, all-purpose room, and a new HVAC system in the 1923 section. Until North Hunterdon Regional High School opened in 1951, Clinton served as the High School for the surrounding area. Numerous tuition pupils were accepted from nearby communities, and between 1951 and 1982 Lebanon Borough sent its 7th and 8th grade pupils to Clinton. From September 1983 through June 2009, the entire Glen Gardner student population attended CPS on a sending-receiving tuition basis. As of July 1, 2009 these two towns have joined together forming a single school district.
